- In 1779 Tampere received its city rights from King Gustaf III of Sweden and Finland
- The city is located on an isthmus between two lakes Näsijärvi and Pyhäjärvi, which are connected by Tammerkoski rapids


- One of the three most rapidly growing areas in Finland



Population, 1990–2007 (at year-end) Projection 2010, 2015 and 2020








Migration, 1995–2008 (quarter of a year)






Net migration by age, 1996–2006






Net migration by age, 2006






Migration by field of activity, 2005




Net migration of students, 2005

10 largest cities in Finland






Students in the major cities, 2006






Families by family type, 1985–2007

There were approximately 1.7 children per family. At year-end 2007 53.6% of the families were childless.






Foreign citizens, 1995–2007






Passengers at the Tampere-Pirkkala Airport 1995–2007




Jobs in ITC Sector, 1993–2005







Dwellings by type of building








Completed dwellings by type of building, 1990–2009*


Completed dwellings by type of tenure status, 1990–2009*

Household-dwelling units in total 107 682 (at year-end 2007), of which 47 % with one occupant only. Average size of a household-dwelling unit 1.8 persons.



Household-dwelling units by size, 1960–2020 (%)




Income Statement / Expenditure, 2007








Income Statement / Revenue, 2007





State grants, 2007




