P R E F A C E

Statistical Yearbook of Belgrade is the principal publication of the Institute for Informatics and Statistics offering official statistical data for the City of Belgrade.

Statistical Yearbook contains data according to the Program of Statistical Surveys. The data are processed applying methodologies, so that are comparable with appropriate data published for the level of the Republic of Serbia.

Besides data from the Program, the Statistical Yearbook contains additional data necessary for observing life and working conditions in Belgrade as the centre with considerable agglomeration of population, and economic and non-economic activities. The additional data refer especially to quality of environment, activity of public community enterprises, business space etc.

Data in the Yearbook refer to the territory of the City of Belgrade, as well to the City Proper and the communes, according to the law legislation pertaining the territorial organization of the City. Data referring to the City of Belgrade are given without a particular denotation whilst for the City Proper is denoted that they refer to that part of the City territory.

In the year 2007 the Institute marked 120th anniversary of the statistical service in Belgrade, thus proving that even in the 19th century statistics was an important segment in Belgrade administration.

The Institute for Informatics and Statistics will be grateful for all remarks contributing to a further improvement of the content, way of presenting data and translation of the Statistical Yearbook of Belgrade.

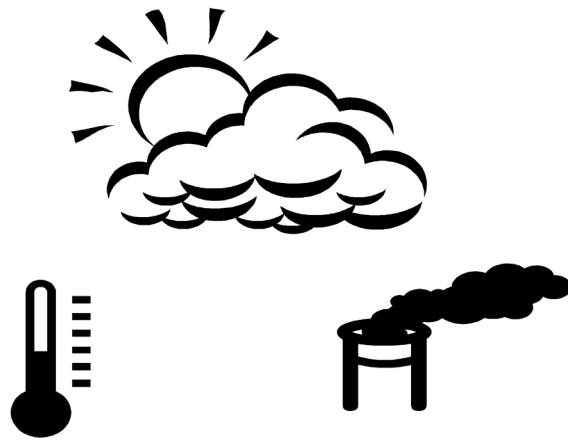

1. TOPOGRAPHY, CLIMATE AND ENVIRONMENT

TOPOGRAPHY

Sources of data collection

The geographical coordinates of the extreme points, the perimeter of the city area, the length boundaries with the adjacent counties, the area of the city territory and the communes, the height of selected points above sea level were obtained from the Republican Geodetic Bureau of Serbia – Centre Belgrade.

CLIMATE

Sources of data collection

Meteorological data are result of monitoring and recording carried out by the Meteorological Station Belgrade-Vračar (height above sea level 131.6 m). Data on water level and temperature of Danube and Sava are result of the measuring by the Hydro meteorological Institute of the Republic of Serbia.

Definitions

Data on temperatures relate to monthly means obtained through daily recording at 7.00 a.m., 2.00 p.m. and 9.00 p.m. local time. Simultaneously are presented the number of tropical days (the highest temperature over 30 °C), summer days (the highest temperature over 25 °C), frosty days (the lowest temperature under 0 °C) and icy days (the highest temperature under 0 °C).

Atmospheric pressure is expressed in millibars (*mb*). Relative humidity is presented in percentages (%). Data on precipitations relates to monthly and annual amounts of downfalls measured in mm. The number of days with precipitations include the days with falls of at least 0.1 mm and is given by kind of falls (rain, sleet, snow).

Sun duration (number of sunny ours) is expressed cumulatively and as a daily average. Visibility (horizontal) is given as a monthly average, and as a percentage of monitoring with visibility over 10 km, and as with visibility between 1 and 10 km. The fog days are those with visibility up to 1 km.

Data on cloudiness are result of measuring based on the scale 0-10, where 0 indicates a completely bright, and 10 completely overcast condition. The bright days include those with cloudiness bellow 0.2, and the cloudy days with cloudiness over 0.8.

Data on wind velocity are obtained by measurement based on the Beaufort scale ranging from 0-12, where 0 indicates calm and 12 hurricane winds. Beside wind vecity, data include the number of days with the strong wind, over 10,8 m/s, as well sa the velocity and direction of the strongest wind. Direction of winds is expressed by the sixteen main compass directions.

ENVIRONMENT

Sources of data

The control of quality of environment is carried out according to the programs of the Secretariat for Protection of Environment referring to monitoring quality of air, water, soil, level of radioactivity and level of communal noise.

Measurements are entrusted to expert and science institutions, such as:

- 1) Institute of Public Health Belgrade,
- 2) Institute of Public Health of Serbia „Dr Milan Jovanović – Batut”,
- 3) Hydrometeorological Institute of Republic of Serbia,
- 4) Institute of Occupational and Radiological Health „Dr Dragomir Karajović”

Methodological explanations

The quality control of air is based on monitoring the level of pollution of air with basic and specific pollutants emitted by stationary sources (furnaces, industry) and traffic.

The quality control of surface waters and drinking water is based on laboratory analyses of physical, chemical and bacteriological parameters.

The soil in the vicinity of heavy traffic roads and in zones of agricultural activities is analyzed for content of hazardous (lead, cadmium, nickel, chromium, mercury and arsenic) and harmful matters (zinc).

The systematic monitoring of external radiation and content of radionuclides in environment is done for the purpose of protection against ionic radiation. The methods of monitoring are: measuring the dose of ionic radiation absorbed in ground level of air; gamma spectrometric testing samples of air, precipitations, soil, river water, drinking water, food-stuffs, milk, feed; specific measuring of strontium 90 (^{90}Sr).

The monitoring of the level of communal noise is carried out through defining equivalent level of noise (level of exposure to noise) for day and night. Permitted level for day is 65 dB (A) and for night 40 dB (A)

All kinds of monitoring are carried out according to the methodologies prescribed by laws or regulations based on laws, and exceptionally to the recommendations of the World Health Organization.

Values of immission are done in the same manner. The marginal value of immission (GVI) denotes the upper allowed limit of concentration of pollutants in air. The concentration over GVI (%) stands for the number of samples which value exceeds allowed limits related to total number of samples.

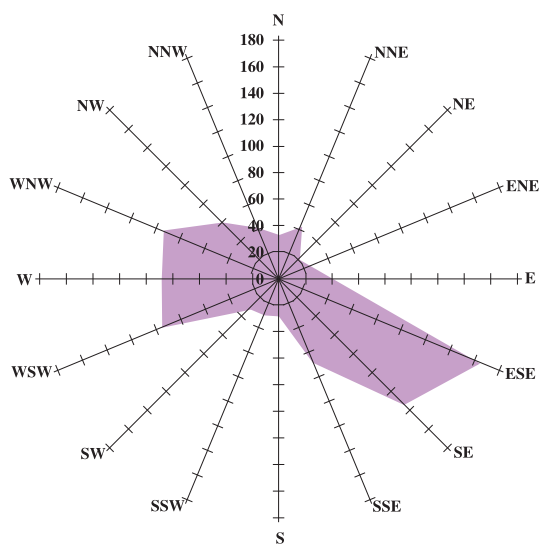

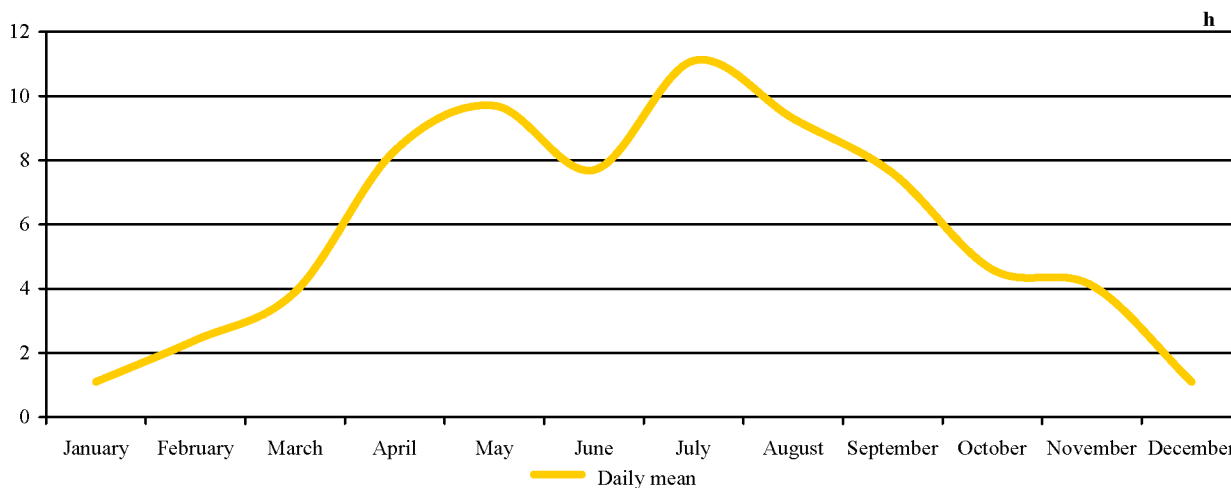

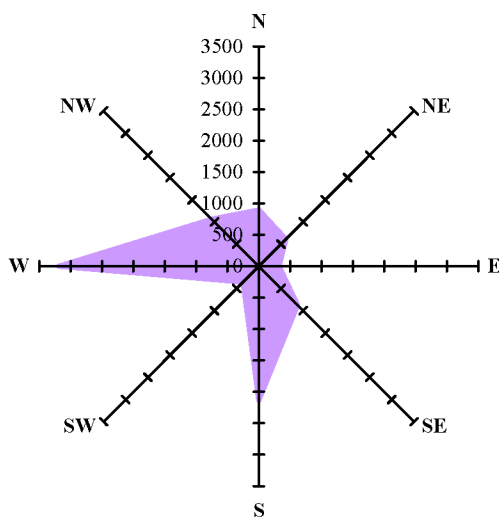
Graph. 1.3. AIR TEMPERATURE, 2009

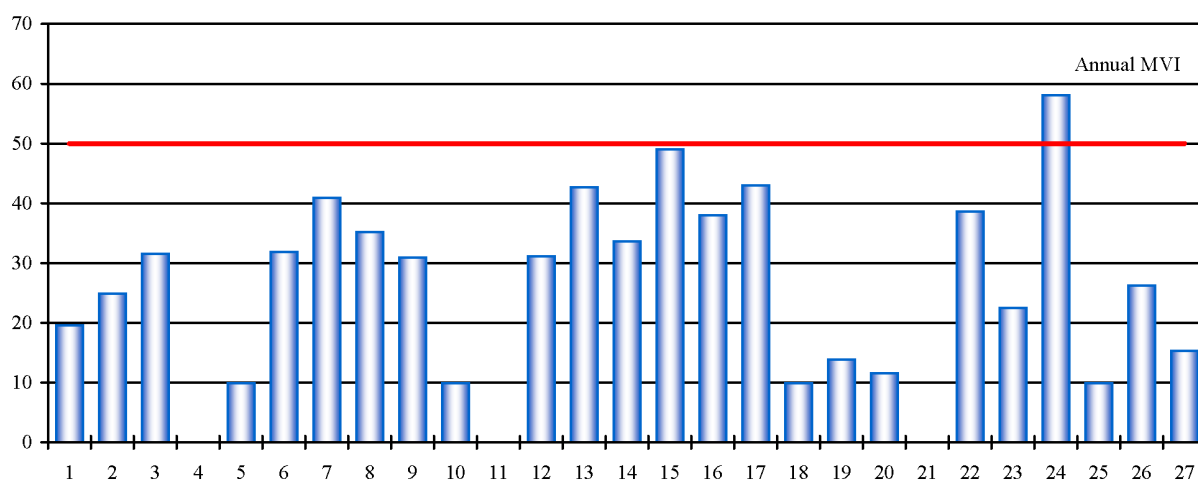

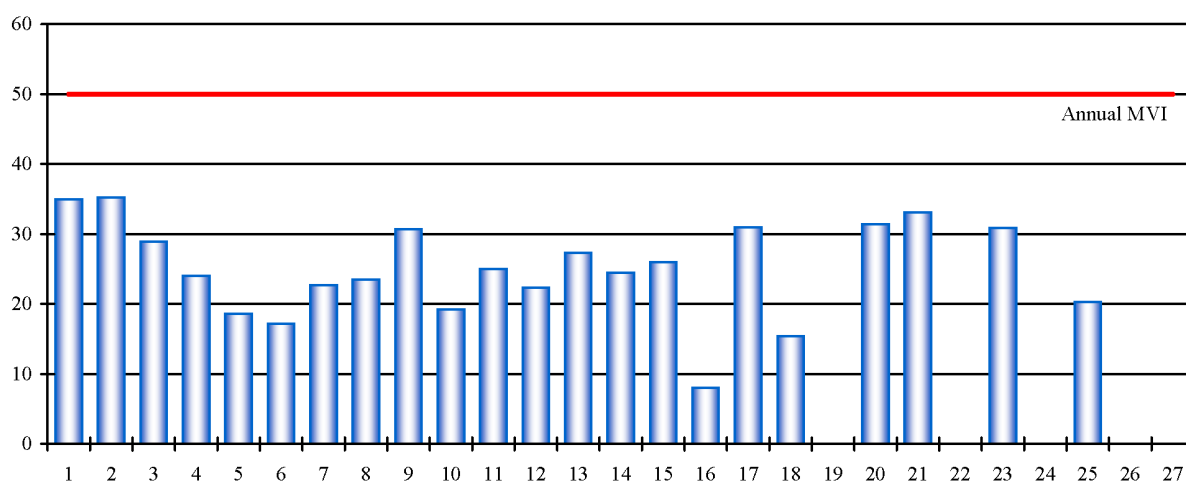

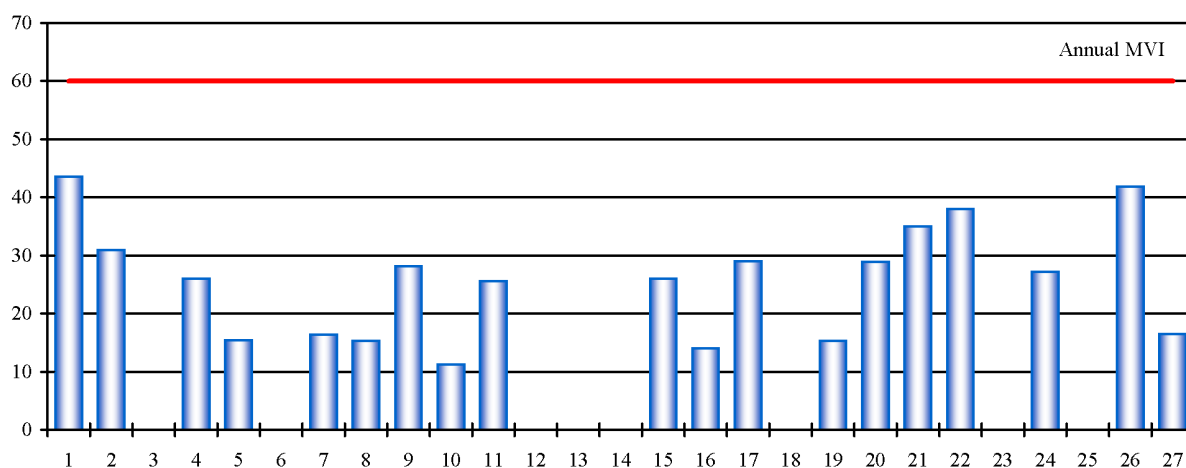

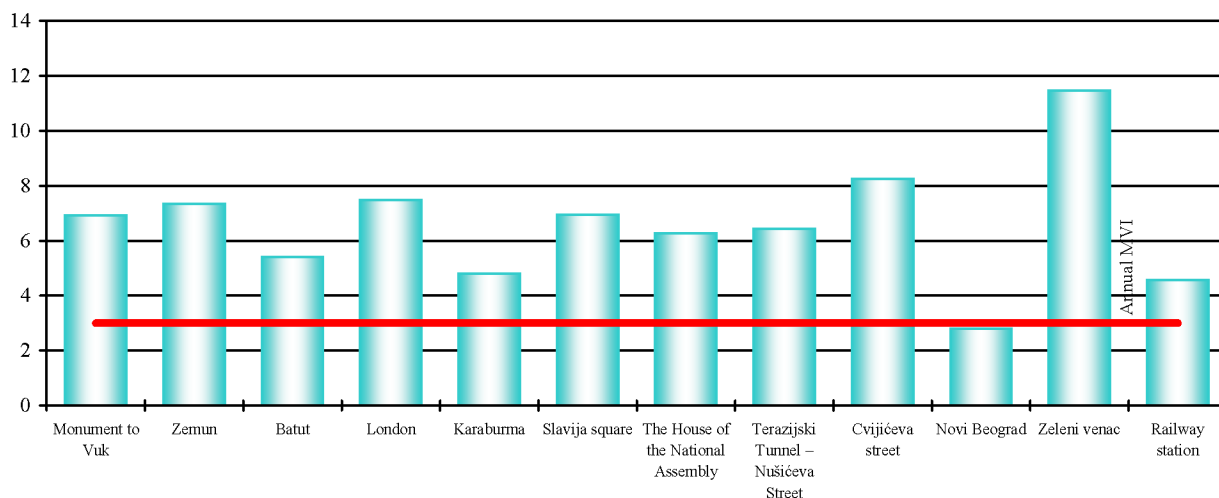

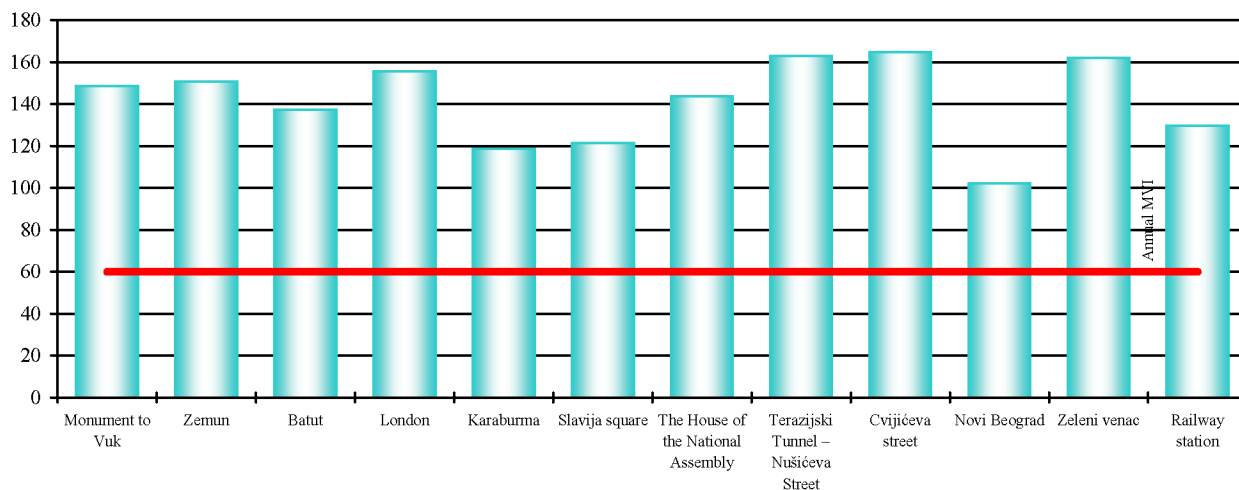

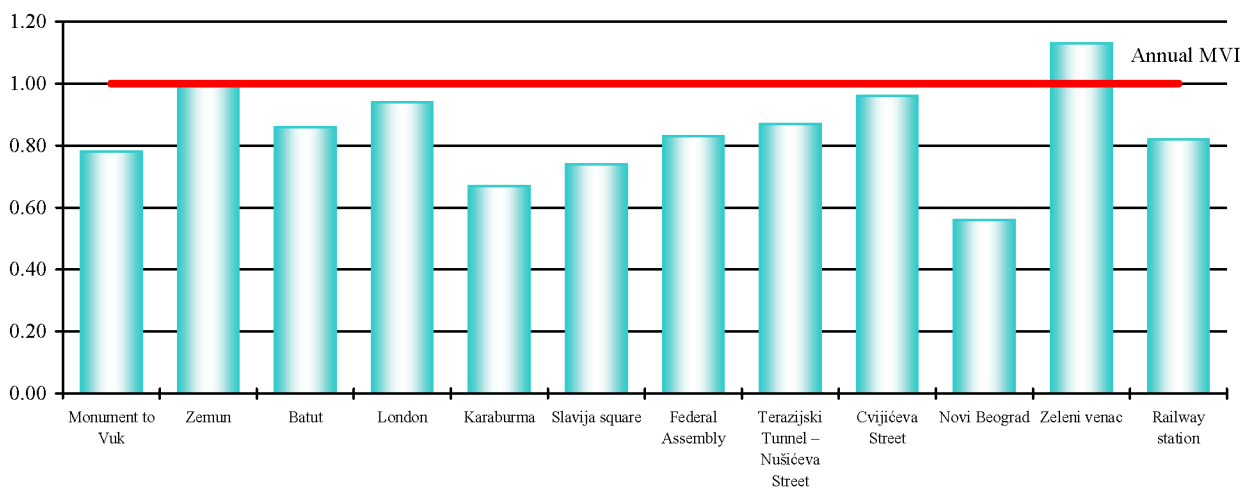
Graph. 1.9. MEAN CONCENTRATION OF CARBON MONOXIDE FROM MOTOR VEHICLES, 2009 – mg/m³



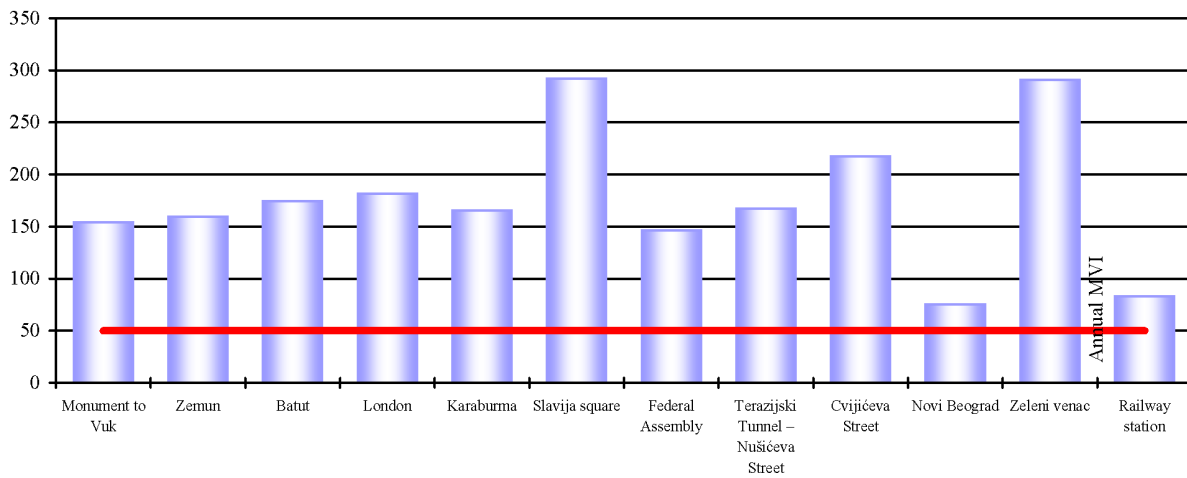
Graph. 1.10. MEAN CONCENTRATION OF NITROGEN OXIDES FROM MOTOR VEHICLES, 2009 – µg/m³



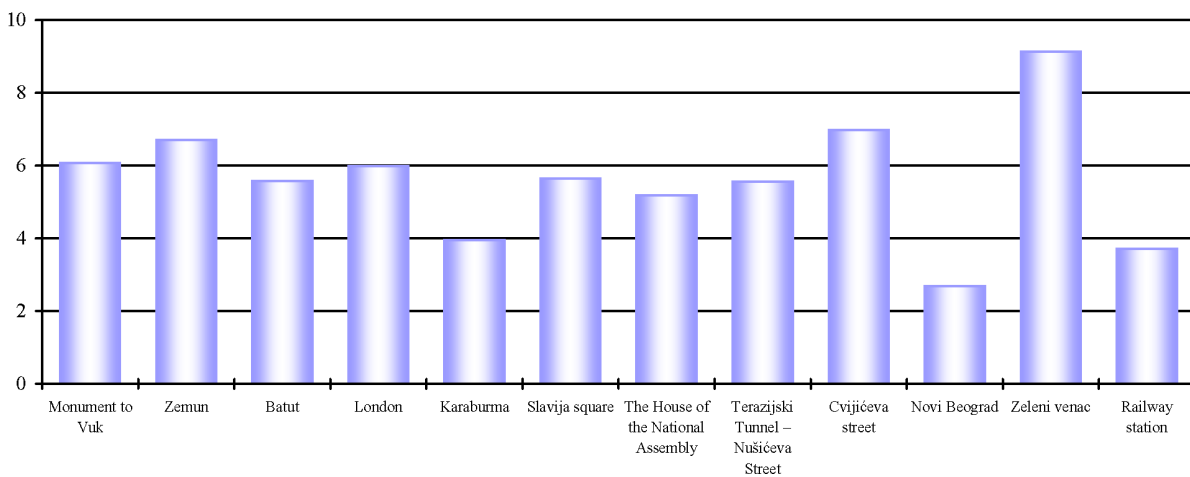
Graph. 1.11. MEAN CONCENTRATION OF LEAD FROM MOTOR VEHICLES, 2009 – µg/m³



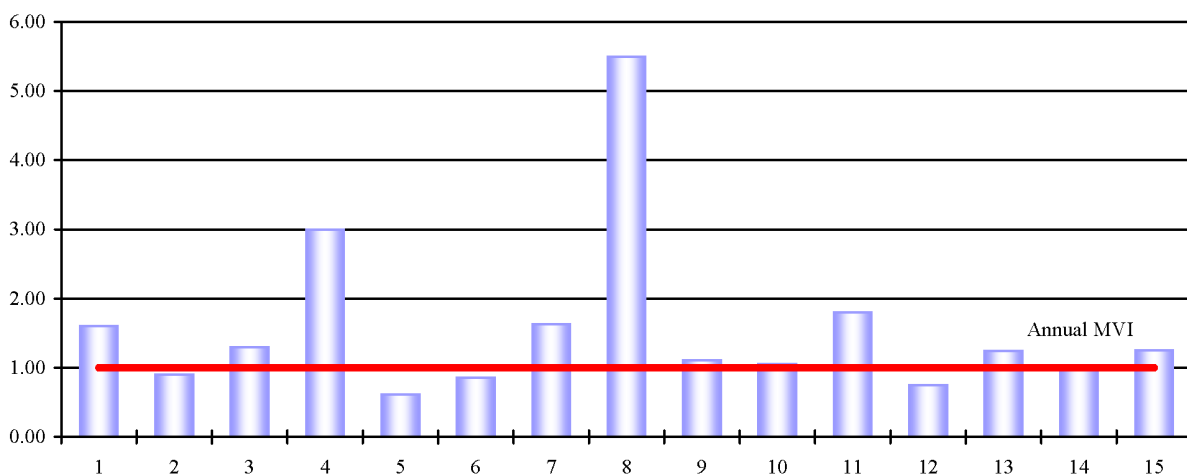

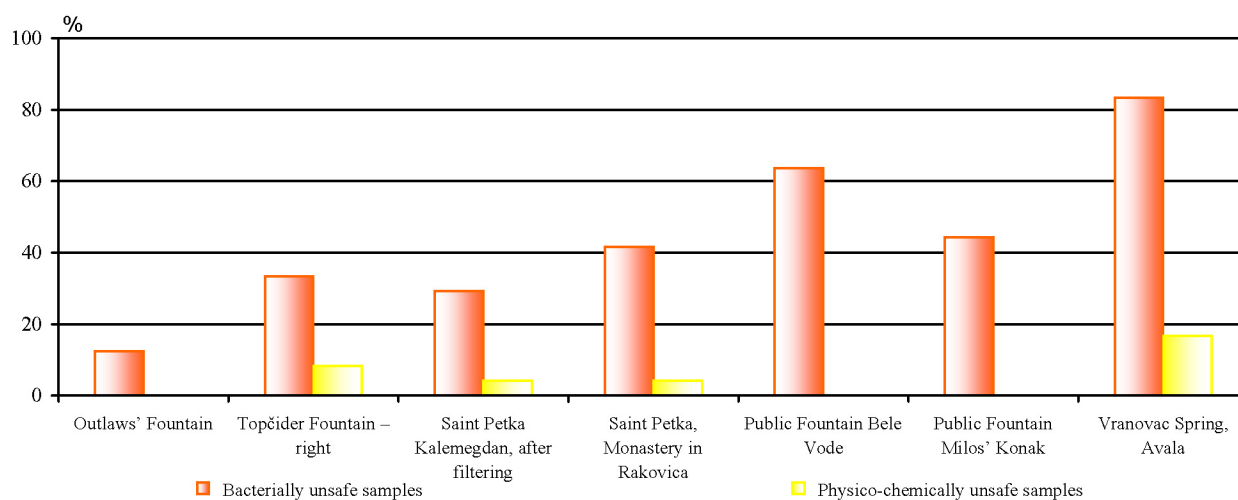
Graph. 1.15. QUALITY OF DRINKING WATER, 2009

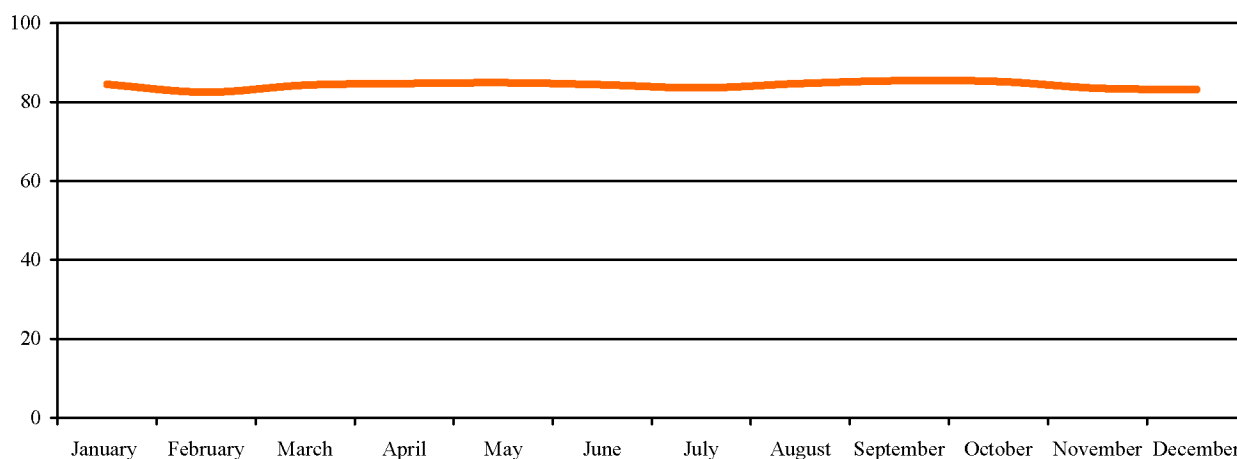

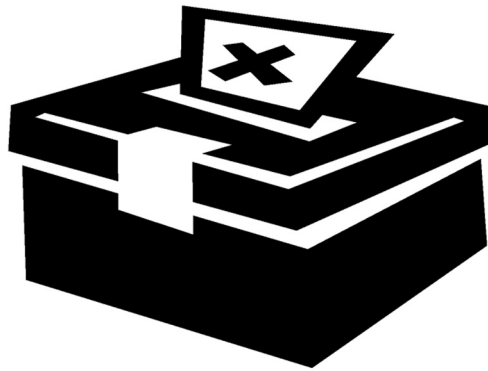

2. LOCAL ELECTIONS 2008

Sources and methods of data collection

According to the Law on Local Elections („Official Journal of Serbia”, no. 129/2007) the competent electoral commissions released the data on the elections' results concerning the election of councillors of Belgrade City Council, the councillors of municipalities' assemblies.

Coverage

Statistical surveys related to the election and structure of councils/assemblies covered the Belgrade City Council, as well as the assemblies of municipalities within the territory of the city of Belgrade.

In accordance with the decision to launch elections for councillors within municipalities' assemblies, City Councils and Belgrade City Council, („Official Journal of Serbia”, no. 130/2007) which was taken by the Speaker of Parliament of the Republic of Serbia, the time set for election started from March 20, 2008 and the elections were held on May 11, 2008.

According to the Law on Local Elections, the proportionate electoral system for appointing councillors was applied.

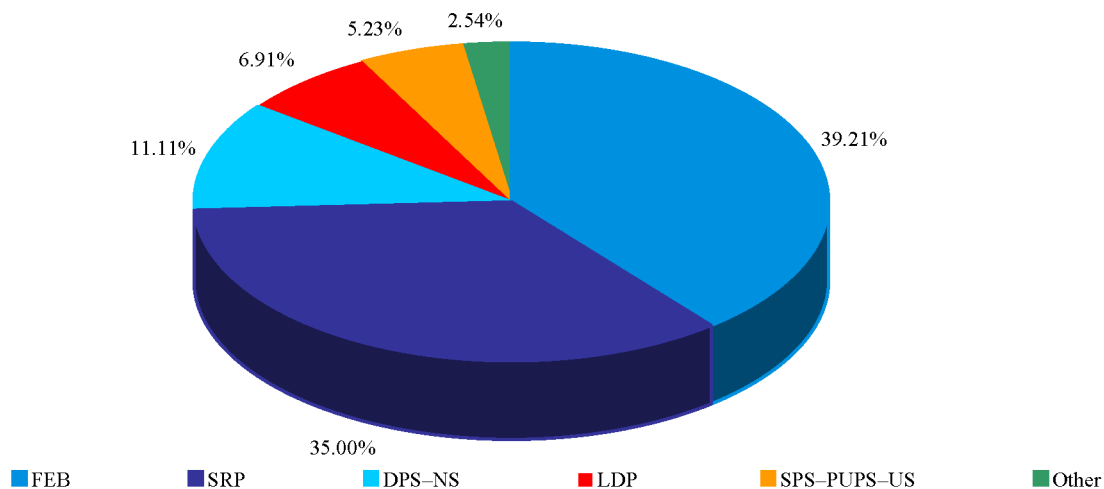

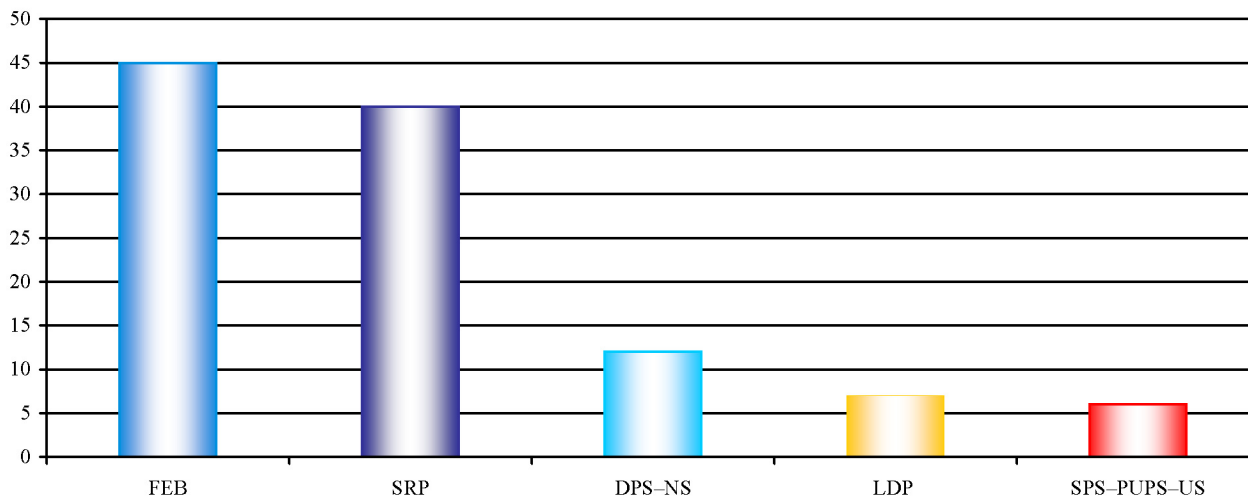

– VOTES GAINED BY NOMINATORS**

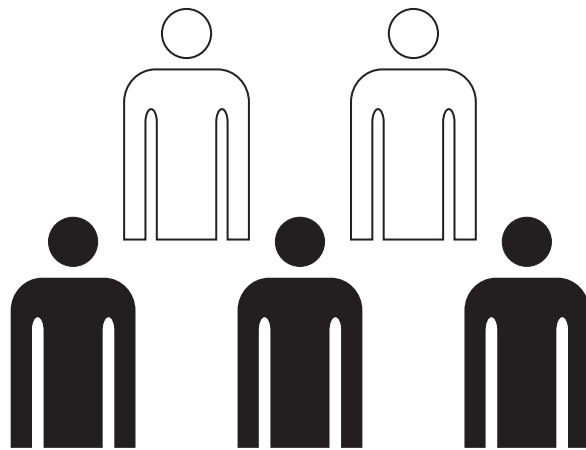


**Graph. 2.2. ELECTIONS FOR MEMBERS OF CITY ASSEMBLY OF BELGRADE 2008 –

3. POPULATION

Sources and methods of data collection

The data on population and households for 1948, 1953, 1961, 1971, 1981, 1991 and 2002 were gathered through the censuses carried out in respective years.

The data on births, deaths and marriages have been collected and submitted by registrars, and data on divorces by courts of justice.

Coverage

The data from censuses 1948, 1953, 1961 and 1971 had been previously processed according to the territory of the City of Belgrade in these years. Subsequently to territory changes the data were recalculated so that correspond to the present territory. The data for 1981, 1991 and 2002 were done for the present territory of the City of Belgrade.

The annual estimations of population (as of 31.12) are obtained on the base of data from censuses and data on natural and migrational increase of population. In cases of relevant deviations, the estimations are harmonized with results of censuses.

The data for the City proper (the locality of Belgrade), in relevant periods, relate to territory of:

- 1921–1940, the localities Belgrade and Zemun
- 1948–1971, the City proper with the prior separate localities Bežanija, Kneževac and Kijevo
- since 1972, the City proper with the prior localities Jajinci, Village Rakovica, Kumodraž, Mali Mokri Lug, Mirijevo, Batajnica, Krnjača, Višnjica, Žarkovo, Železnik and Resnik.

The natality statistics includes live births and stillbirths. The mortality statistics includes all death occurrences. The marriage statistics includes all legally contracted marriages, i.e. marriages entered into the register of marriages. The divorce statistics includes marriages dissolved by a competent court.

According to the regulations on keeping registers, all births, deaths and contracted marriages are recorded in registers of a territory on which they have occurred, regardless of whether respective persons are residents or not of that territory. The data are reclassified in the course of processing, so that the results are shown according to the place of permanent residence (of the newborn child's mother, of the deceased, of the bridegroom, and in the case of dissolved marriages according to the last joint place of residence), what corresponds to the concept of the so-called resident population applied in population censuses.

Since the year 2005, all cases of birth, death, marriage and divorce of the population that is on a temporary work and stay abroad longer than one year are excluded.

Definitions

Population. In all seven post war censuses the population was enumerated and the results shown by the principle of resident population. It means that every inhabitant had to be enumerated in the place of permanent residence, even when at the time of the Census he/she was absent from that place due to any reason (travel, education or field work, temporary work abroad, compulsory service in the Army, medical treatment, penal servitude imprisonment, etc.). Data on these persons were furnished by their households. Accordingly, data on every person were included in the census results for the locality the person was domiciled, regardless of whether this person was in that or some other locality at the time of Census.

According to international recommendations, in census 2002, beside population in country, permanent population comprise our citizens working-dwelling abroad less than one year. Accordingly, included are foreigners and members of their families residing in our country longer than one year.

Taken as a household is every family or other collectivity of persons, whose members live together and pool their resources and share their expenses (housing, food etc.).

In censuses and in demographic statistics the population is grouped by age according to the age on last birthday.

The data on ethnic nationality are the result of freely expressed ethnic nationality of population, respectively of parents (guardians) in the case of children under 15, in the situation where nobody is obliged to declare its national belonging (according to the article 45, Constitution of the FR Yugoslavia).

Educational attainment is understood as the highest school completed regardless of whether education was attained through completing a regular school, passing an exam or in other ways through which, according to existing regulations, a corresponding education is acquired. Data are presented only for population aged 15 and over, i.e. over the age for compulsory school attending.

POPULATION

Data on literacy of population relate only to population aged 10 years and over. Literate population covers every person who can read and write a text dealing with everyday life regardless of the language. All other persons, including also those who can only read, are considered as illiterate.

Migrational movements designate population displaced from hometown or previous place of residence in a determined place of immigration-residence. Those migrations are called final (permanent) displacements.

Considered as live born is a child who showed any sign of life after birth (such as: breathing and beating of the heart) even if during the briefest period of time, regardless of duration of mother's pregnancy.

Considered as stillborn is a child born or removed from mother's body showing no signs of life, provided that pregnancy lasted at least 28 weeks.

The causes of death have been classified according to the International Classification of Diseases, revised 1997. edition.

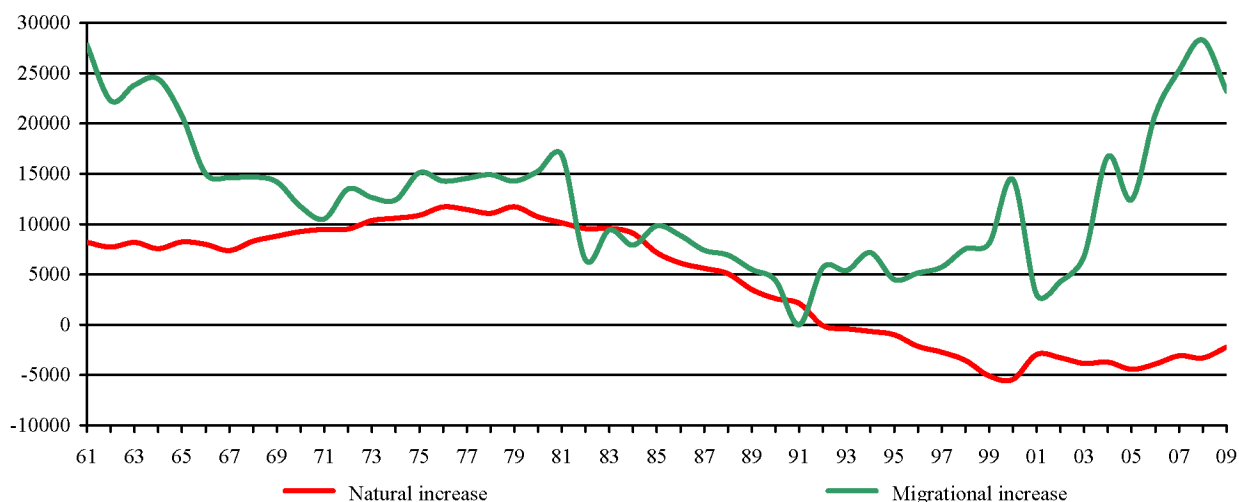

EMPLOYMENT

Sources and methods of data collection

Data on employees in legal entities (enterprises, institutions and other organizations) are collected by:

- the regular Semi-annual Report on Employees and Salaries (wages);
- the Sample Survey for Complement of the Semi-annual Report which provides evaluations of employees in legal entities with less than 50 employees not covered by the regular Semi-annual Report.

Data on private entrepreneurs, physical persons who independently perform profit-making activities and their workers, were taken from the Republic Health Insurance Institute.

Data on employment and unemployment are obtained from the National Employment Service and are the results of monthly and annual reports.

Coverage

Since 1997 the number of employees in the Tables 1 and 3 contains the evaluation of employees in small-sized enterprises and other organizations. The other tables on employees are based on the regular semi-annual report, (without the evaluation), so that can be used for observing general structures and distribution of employees by economic activities and territory. The data from the semi-annual report are comparable with the data on employees published by the Statistical Office of the Republic of Serbia.

The semi-annual report on employees does not cover ministries of national defense and of the interior as well as domestic branch offices abroad.

The organizational and territorial principle were used for the realization of the survey on employees, where a commune is taken to be the basic territorial unit. In this way, employees are, in principle, shown according to main activity of an enterprise, that is, organization. Only separated parts – business and other units of organizations, that is, enterprises at the territory of another commune – were considered as separate reporting units and were observed within the branch of economic activity they actually practice.

Semi-annual report on employees within the individual entrepreneurship – shops – covers the employees registered with the Republic Health Insurance Institute.

The data on employment and unemployment cover only persons registered with the National Employment Service.

Definitions

Employees are taken to mean:

1. a person who is employed in an enterprise, that is, in organization.
2. a person performing an activity by personal labour and with means owned by citizens, a person performing independently a professional activity as an occupation, and employed with these persons.

As unemployed persons are taken those aged 15–65, able and willing to work instantly, registered as unemployed and actively looking for job.

The rate of registered unemployment is taken to mean the number of unemployed in relation to the sum of employees and unemployed in the reporting period.

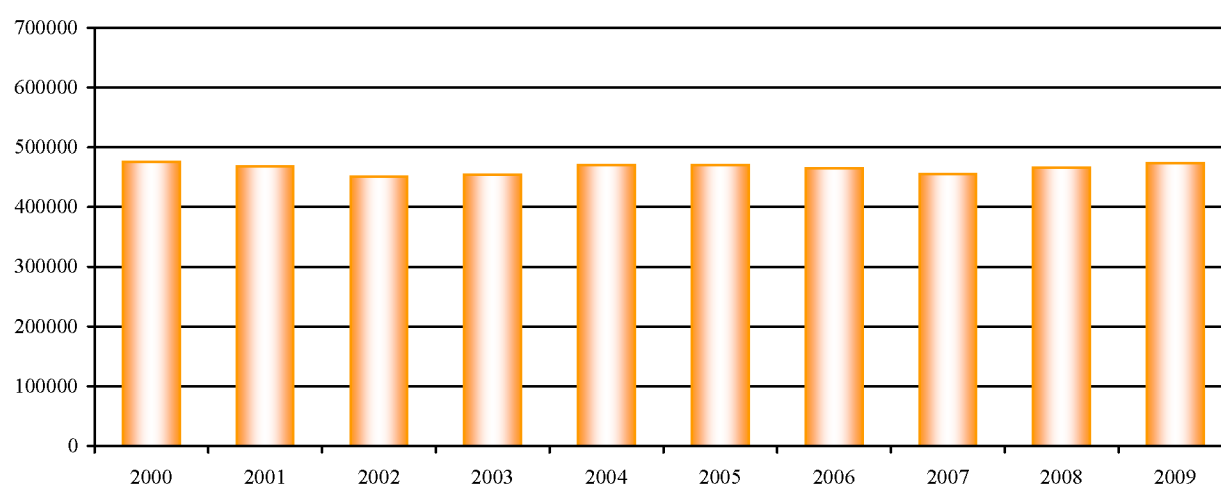

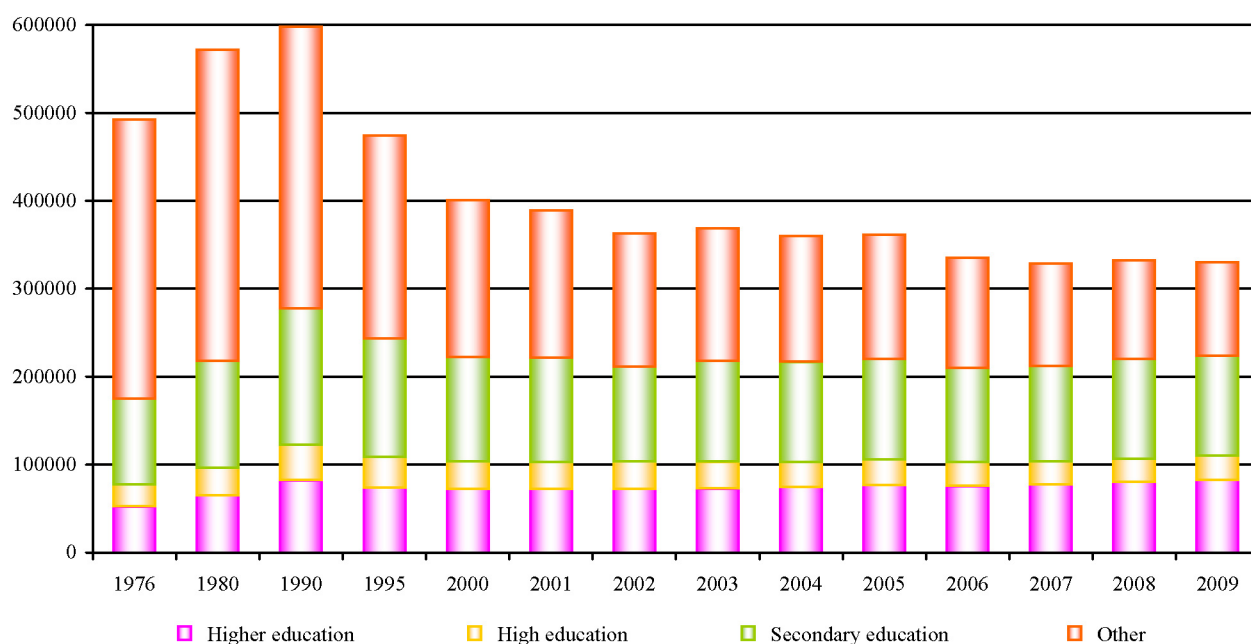

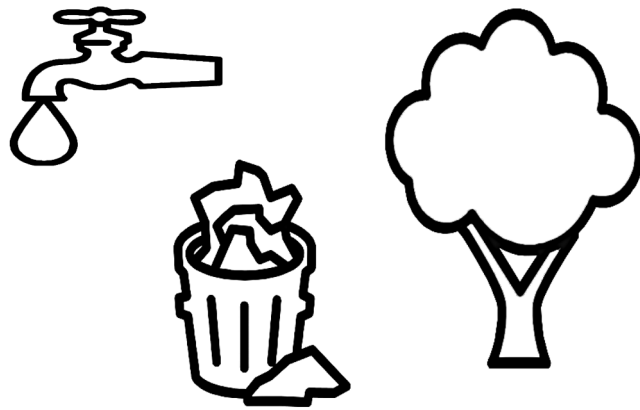

5. PUBLIC UTILITIES

HOUSING STOCK

Sources and methods of data collection

Data on housing stock of 31st march 1971, 1981, 1991 and 2002 were obtained through respective population and housing censuses.

Coverage

Housing stock covers occupied and vacant dwellings intended for habitation all the year round. Housing stock excludes dwellings used occasionally for holiday and recreation, during seasonal works in agriculture, occupied business premises, premises occupied in the case of need, collective dwellings and workers' barracks of temporary character.

Definitions

A dwelling is considered any structurally connected compound intended for habitation, consisting of or more rooms with corresponding accessories (kitchen, pantry, lobby, bathroom, toilet, etc.) or without accessories and with one or more separate entries. A dwelling, which at the time of census was shared by two or more households, and was not not constructionally converted into two or more separate dwellings, was counted as one dwelling.

Area of useful floor space of a dwelling covers the entire useful floor space of all rooms, kitchen, bathroom, toilet, corridor and all other accessories, as well as floor space of all covered terraces and verandas. Included is area under placards and partly area of balconies. Thickness of outer and partition walls is excluded.

BUSINESS SPACE

Sources of data

Data for commercial space, starting from 01.01.2008. Institute for Informatics and Statistics takes over from the Directorate of Public Revenues of the city of Belgrade and JKP Infostan, authorities responsible for establishing and charging fees for use of construction land for business space, and displays them in bulk for the 11 urban municipalities of the city of Belgrade. The data JKP Infostan there was an increase in area office space for the category „empty space” due to lack of data on activities.

Coverage

Data comprise business space on the territory of the City communes: Voždovac, Vračar, Zemun, Zvezdara, Novi Beograd, Palilula, Rakovica, Savski Venac, Stari Grad, Surčin and Čukarica. Data on business space on the public areas in general usage (military objects, agricultural objects, forest complexes, recreation areas and parks, religious communities etc.) are not included.

Definitions

A construction plot stands for the plot on which objects are constructed, the plot serving for usage of the objects, and the ground proscribed by law for construction and use of objects. The area of construction plot is determined by the communes, that is, the City of Belgrade, and represents the functional and urban entity according to low and urban plots.

Business space is defined as useful space consisting of the room for business activity and open space used for business purposes. As business space is also considered flat or part of the flat adapted to make separate constructional entity used for business activity, and garage space used for business purposes.

Data are presented by communes, fields of activities and zones according to the Regulation on the Fee for the Use of Construction plot.

PUBLIC SERVICES

Sources and methods of collecting data

Data on public services are collected by the questionnaires used for regular statistical surveys and particular reports collected from public enterprises responsible for maintenance and development of the City, as well as from other appropriate institutions.

Coverage

Data refer to urban localities, which are determined as urban by regulations of the communes' assemblies. Data on this locality are taken over from the Systematic List of Localities edited in 1991 by the Federal Statistic Office.

Methodological papers

Methodological explanations relating to public services are published in Methodological papers of the Federal Statistic Office.

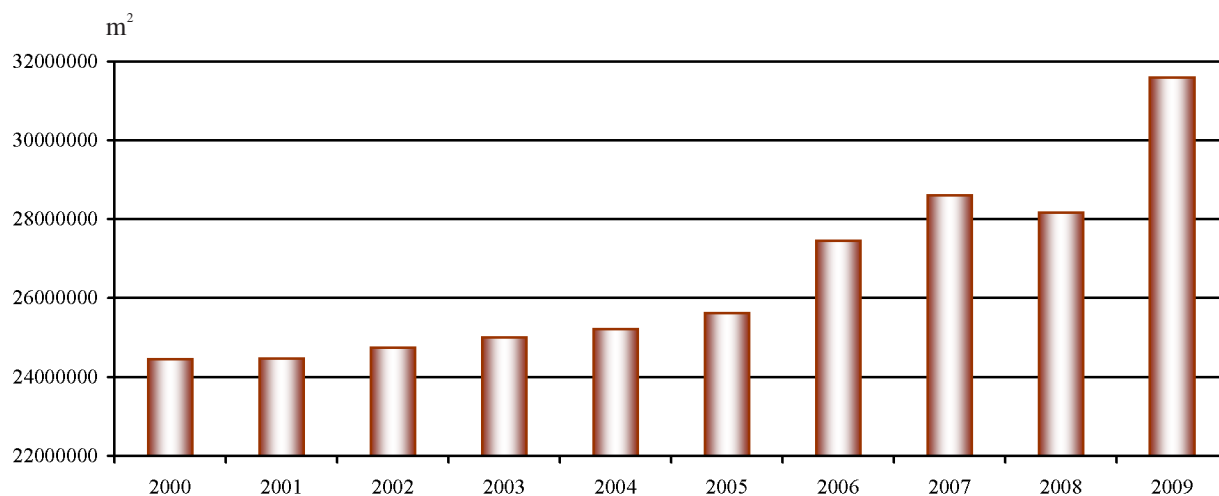

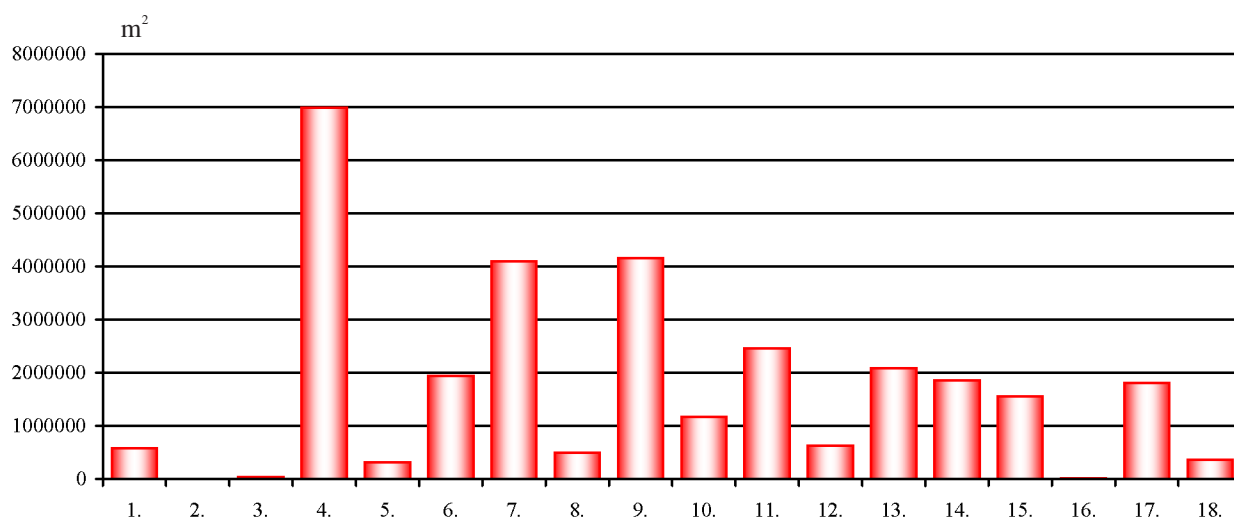

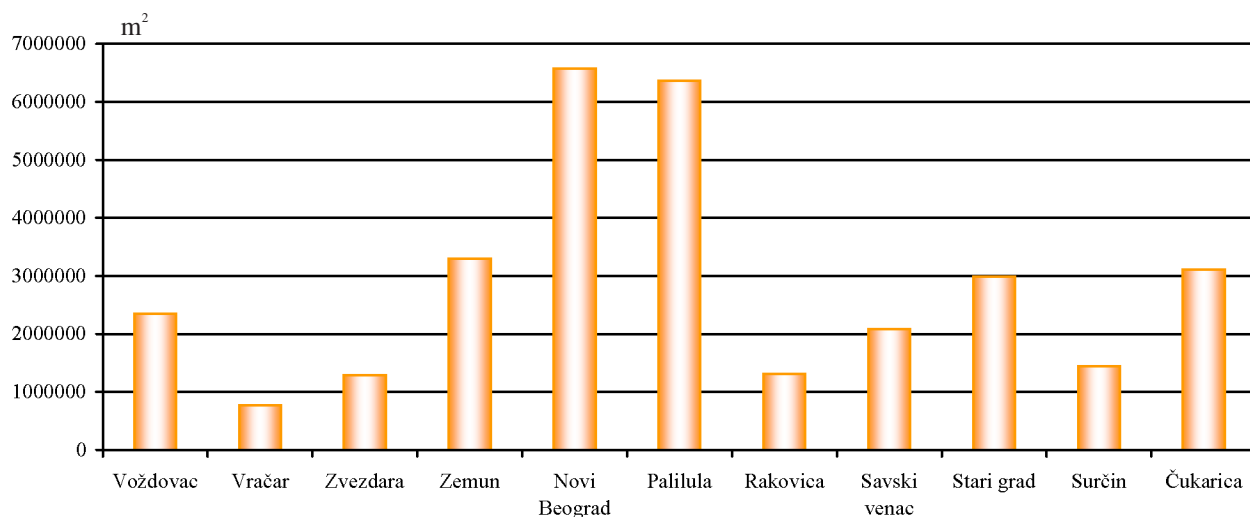
Graph 5.1. BUSINESS SPACE AREA, 2000–2009

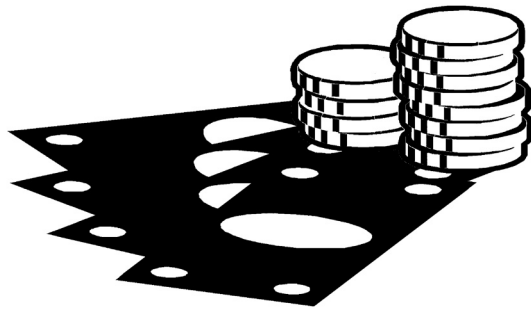

6. SOCIAL ACTIVITIES AND PUBLIC CONSUMPTION

Sources and methods of data collection

Data on employees, realized revenues and expenditures of budgetary resources' users have been obtained by a regular statistical survey „Complex annual report of budgetary resources for budgetary resources' users” (KGI-03), that have been filled in on the basis of final accounts and other disposable accountancy documentation.

Data have been collected and expressed according to a head office and prevalent activity of a reporting unit „Organizational principle”.

Coverage

The survey „Complex annual report of budgetary resources for budgetary resources' users” covers direct and indirect budgetary resources' users (organizations that make final accounts for budgetary resources' users). Direct budgetary resources' users are bodies and organizations of the Republic respectively local authorities. Indirect budgetary resources' users are judicial bodies, local communities, public enterprises, directorates and funds established by local authorities, financed from public revenues whose purpose is established by a special act, institutions established by the Republic, respectively local authorities over which an establisher, over direct budgetary resources' users, exerts rights established by law regarding management and financing, as well as budgetary funds. These are organizations from the field of: financial intermediation, real estate activities (renting of real estates, computer and related activities, research and development, other business activities); public administration (except jobs of defense, fire units), education, health and social work (except veterinary activity), activity of membership organizations (business, working and professional organizations) and cultural and related activities (motion pictures activities, artistic creation, artistic institutions activities, other entertainment activities, libraries, museums).

According to the Classification of activities, reporting units from the field of Agriculture are also included (crop farming), Industry (publishing activity), as well as shops (pharmacies) that have been using budgetary resources in their operations.

Public revenues include revenues from taxes, contributions, fees and other taxation and similar forms, regulated by law and serving for financing of public expenditures respectively financing of school system, health and social care, disability-pension insurance, all functions of state and its bodies.

Definitions

Number of employees is expressed as an annual average calculated on the basis of the state at the end of each month during the year.

Total revenues and expenditures include resources formed and directly spent for social activities' current operations-of budgetary resources' users.

At public administration and organizations from the subgroup of other social work in institutions without accommodation social activities' current operations have been given, that means without expenditures on the basis of social care help from the budget as transfer resources (social payments to households in cash or in kind, on the basis of illness, disablement, maternity leave, unemployment).

Revenues

Budgetary revenues are revenues obtained by a budgetary resources' user directly from budgetary resources.

Transfers (transfer resources) include: transfers among organizations of the compulsory social insurance, transfers among budgetary resources' user at the same level and current transfers of other authority levels.

Transfers among organizations of the compulsory social insurance are revenues obtained by a budgetary resources' user through organizations of the compulsory social insurance (Republic Fund of Pension and Disability Insurance, Republic Institute for Health Insurance, National Employment Service).

Transfers among budgetary resources' user at the same level present resources switched from the budget by transfer to the end user.

Current transfers from the other authority levels present irrevocable resources obtained by budgetary resources' users from the other authority levels for financing of certain purposes and regular activity.

Revenues from sale of goods and services are all revenues realized by renting of goods in state ownership, revenues realized by performing of activities and sale of goods and services.

Current donations present irrevocable resources obtained by budgetary resources' users as help from foreign governments and international organizations, used for financing of certain purposes and regular activity.

Other revenues (other revenues) include property revenues (financial and non- financial), fines and deprived property benefits, voluntary transfers from physical and private entities and mixed and undefined revenues.

Expenditure

Expenditures for employees present costs on the basis of calculated earnings' costs, earnings' indemnifications and other personal expenditures. These expenditures are expressed in gross amount.

Tax expenditures include obligations on the basis of different kinds of taxes (property taxes, customs duties, excise duties).

Business expenditures include regular costs of operations (materials costs, costs of current repairs and maintenance) and compulsory Republic, district, municipal and court fees.

Fines include fines paid on different basis.

Current subsidies present irrevocable transfer of resources carried out for the purpose of stimulating of production and rendering of services.

Current donations, grants and transfers present resources irrevocably given by reporting unit to foreign governments or international organizations as a help in case of extraordinary events, resources transferred to other authority levels and compulsory social insurance organizations as well as other unclassified current donations, grants and transfers.

Grants to non-government organizations present transfer of resources (in money or in kind) to different non-profit institutions (Red Cross, sports and young people's organizations, religious communities, citizens' communities and similar).

Interests' expenditures include expenditures on the basis of interests on domestic and foreign credits and interests on the basis of activated guarantees as well as accompanying expenditures of debt accumulations.

Depreciation presents calculated value of spent fixed assets as results of operations and their obsolescence during the calculation period.

The rest presents a difference between totally expressed revenues and expenditures. This is an arithmetically derived data that can be positive or negative and that has to coincide with result of operations expressed in final account.

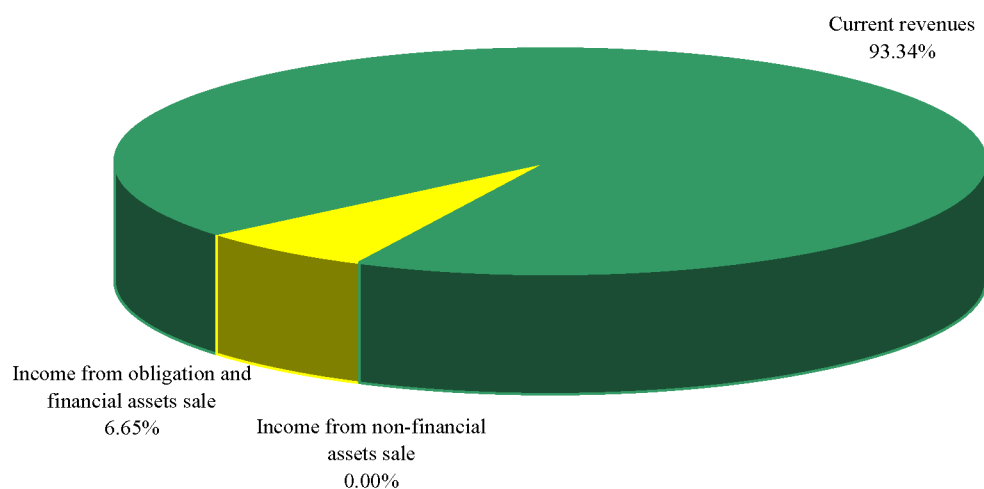

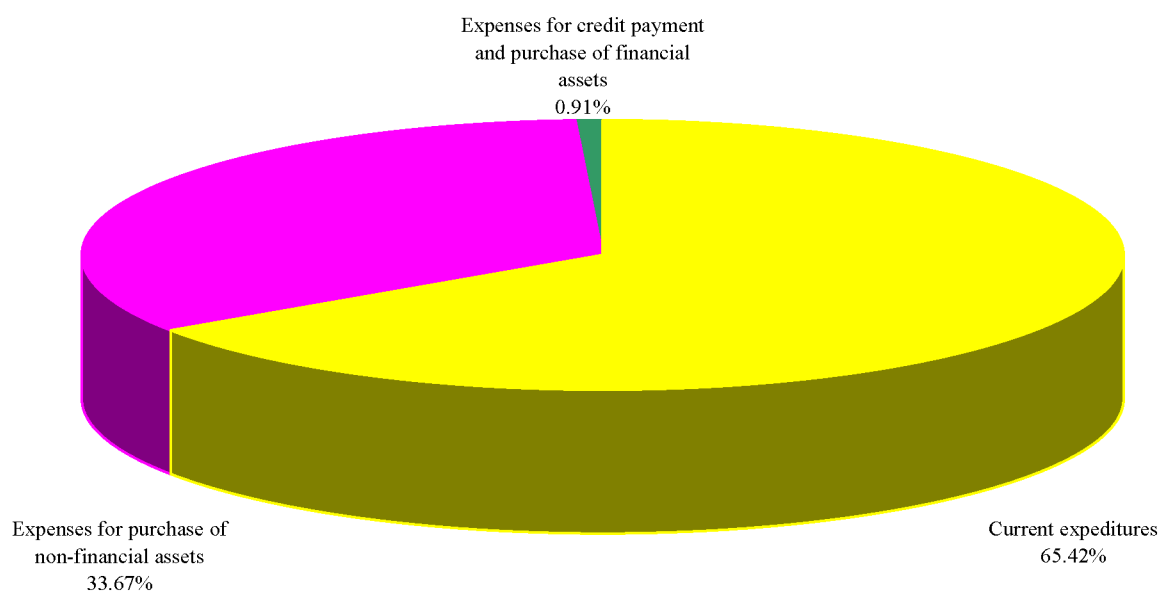

7. INVESTMENTS

Sources and methods of data collection

Investments into fixed assets at current prices are computed according to the methodology that is partially harmonized with international standards and methodologies, that will say with the European system of Accounts 1995 (ESA 1995) and the System of National Accounts 1993 (SNA 1993).

Data on investment at current prices have been obtained by means of the Annual Report on Investment into Fixed Assets (form INV-01) from all enterprises and other organizations.

Data are shown by establishment principle and according to the Classification of Activities

Computation is based on elements of the technical structure (construction infrastructure, equipment with assembly and other), for each industry within economic and non-economic activities.

Coverage

Annual Report on Investment into Fixed Assets (form INV-01) at current prices covers all enterprises, organizations and communities engaged in economic and non-economic activities if they are direct investors regardless of whether they are in regular or in trial work, under construction or in the process of liquidation.

Distribution of data on effected payments for investments has been done by prevailing activity and head office of an investor, so called „organizational principle”. Data of collected fixed assets are only related to new fixed assets which are classified on purpose and location of investment, so called „establishment principle”.

Definitions and explanations on methodology

Investments into fixed assets are purchases aiming at getting new assets, increasing the value, or replacing existing fixed assets. Acquired investment goods can be new or already used, purchased or received with no compensation from third persons in the country and abroad, or produced on own account. Included are all investments in new facilities, as well as for extensions, building onto and modernization of the existing or replacement of obsolete, worn out or accidentally destroyed facilities. Investment does not cover investment expenditure and resources for regular maintenance of existing infrastructure.

Payments for investment are investments in cash in the course of a year in which payments were actually effected regardless of the time of their construction or purchase.

Payments from own resources include dinar and foreign currency resources of a direct investor: depreciation, operative funds, pooled and other resources (budget, public funds, and other) which were transferred to the investor's account. This includes also foreign funds obtained on the basis of contract on joint venture.

Payments from pooled resources include dinars and foreign currency of national and foreign co-investors, as well as physical persons, associated with funds of the direct investor, but on the basis of joint venture.

Payments from credits include bank credits, financial credits, as well as financial credits directly settled with foreign organization.

Realized investment in the course of a reference year represents the value of actually performed construction, building or purchase of infrastructure, outfit and other, regardless whether they are completed or not and whether payment for them has been effected (without revaluation of realized investment).

Construction of new facilities includes investment for founding new enterprises and organizations, and new units in composition of existing enterprises and organizations on new or old location, regardless the activity to be performed. These facilities are: the whole building as an economical-technical complex (construction part, equipment installations, assembly and other) planned by the investment program; construction of a part of the infrastructure as a separate economical-technical complex (construction is performed in phases, according to the investment program) which is, after completion, activated as a production unit; construction of buildings or equipping formerly suspended investment; investment in long-standing plants, basic herds, construction and purchase of ships, airplanes; investment in public infrastructure and new lines of communications.

Reconstruction, modernization, building onto and extension include investment for altering or expanding the existing infrastructure, equipment and facilities so to expand the size, adjust to market requirements, change types, find technical and technological solutions of products or services.

Maintenance of existing facilities are investments for the replacement of obsolete, worn out or destroyed fixed assets of existing organizations or business units in their composition. These investments might have an influence on the intensi-

fication of operation process, but without extension of available facilities and essential changes in the existing kind of products, services and operation technology.

8. EARNINGS

Sources and methods of data collection

Data on average salaries (wages) were obtained from the regular monthly report on employees and employees' salaries (wages), and based on the data of the Ministry of Finance (Tax Office).

Coverage

Data on earnings refer to employees in companies, enterprises, institutions and other organizations (legal entities) in all forms of property, as well as the earnings of entrepreneurs (natural entities) taken from the records of the Tax Office.

Data on average salaries (wages) in enterprises and other organizations covered by the average net salaries (wage) of employees for an unlimited and limited period of time. Income of outside collaborators are not included.

Definitions

Average salaries (wages) comprise income from regular employment. Gross salaries (wages) include net salaries (wages) and taxes and contributions paid out of salaries (wages).

Net salaries (wages) include net income from regular employment. They also cover: remunerations for holiday, sick-leave up to 30 days, waiting time and stoppage not caused by an employee, national holidays, days spent in performance of civic duties, in case if they are debiting net salaries (wages) fund, paid leaves, etc., rewards, premiums, income on the basis of results of management and economic use of social resources.

Indices of nominal and real average salaries (wages) were obtained based on data from regular monthly report on employment and salaries (wages) of employees and the cost of living index. Index of real average salaries (wages) is the ratio between average nominal salaries (wages) and cost of living index.

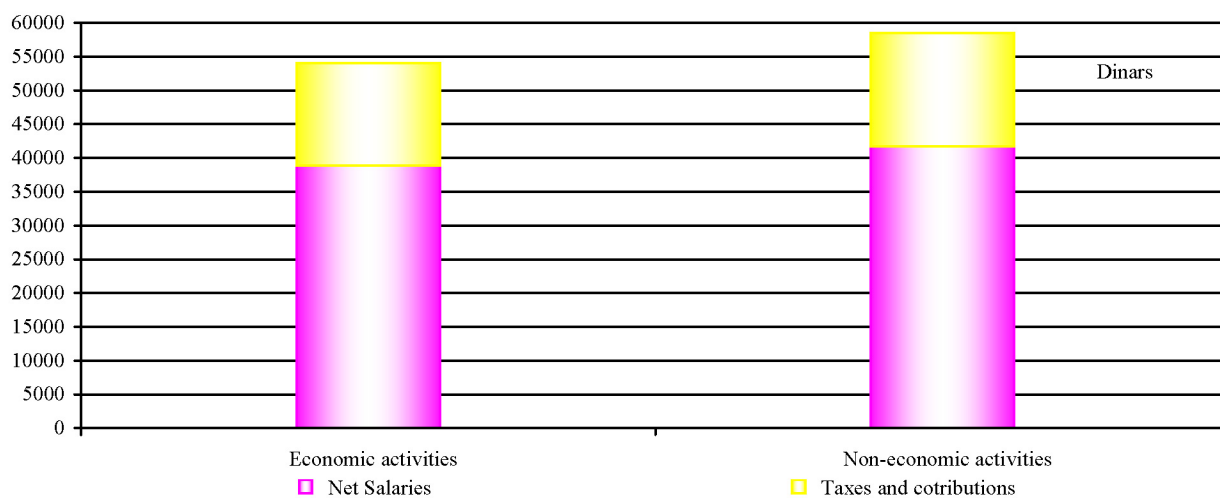

9. RETAIL AND CONSUMER PRICES

Sources and methods of data collection

Retail prices of manufactured and agricultural products and prices of services are recorded by the statistics, which is also in charge of selecting products and services. The local statistician selects points of sales (shops and markets, trade shops, shops of service industries and market places) taking into account the turnover, that is, he selects the shop (market) with the biggest turnover.

Prices of manufactured products are recorded once a month, as a rule, in 3–5 trade enterprises-shops and in as many shops of the private sector with the biggest turnover. Prices of agricultural product are recorded twice a month, as a rule, in 3–5 trade shops and at several market places. Prices of services are recorded once a month. Prices of handcrafts services are recorded monthly in 8 shops.

The average price for the city is computed for every product and service as a simple arithmetical mean, on the basis of several prices recorded in different places of the city. As for agricultural products, the average price is obtained from data of the third week (over the period 15th–21th of a month).

Average annual prices of manufactured products and services are computed as simple arithmetical mean of monthly prices.

Prices of catering services (food, beverages and overnight accommodations) are recorded monthly in selected catering establishments by price statistician.

Average annual prices are computed as simple arithmetical mean.

Coverage

Retail prices are recorded for 118 food products, 211 manufactured non-food products and 76 kinds of services.

Prices of catering services are recorded in 40 establishments. The list of catering services covers 67 services distributed into four groups: food, alcoholic drinks, beverages and overnight accommodation.

Price Indices

The whole methodology of price statistics is harmonized with the need of measuring price fluctuation, that is, with the computing of price indices.

Indices of prices in retail trade are computed by weights representing the structure of turnover value in retail trade and on green market, increased by the value of services from data of corresponding services (arts and crafts, public utilities, cultural, transport and PTT services).

Indices of catering trades are computed by weights which represent the structure of turnover value of enterprises and other organizations dealing with catering trades.

Consumer price index is based on: a) a special list containing articles and services for personal consumption, b) average retail prices of goods and services, that is, their individual price indices. The list and weights are built on data from the survey on consumption households.

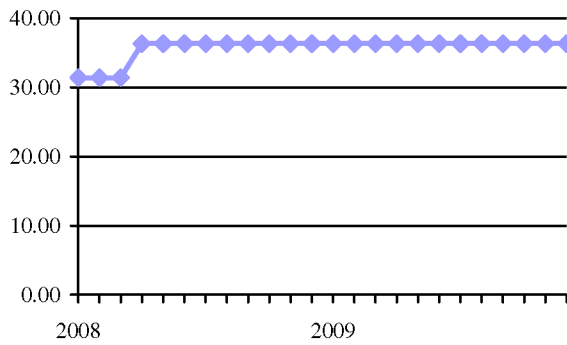

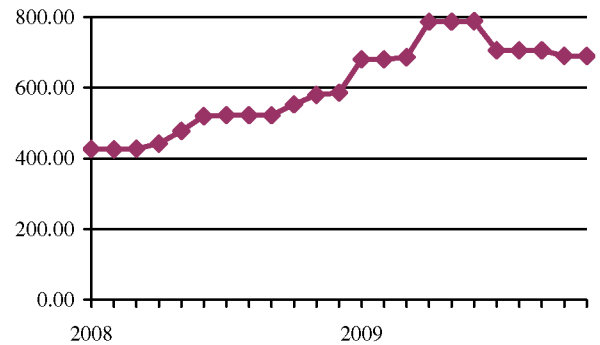

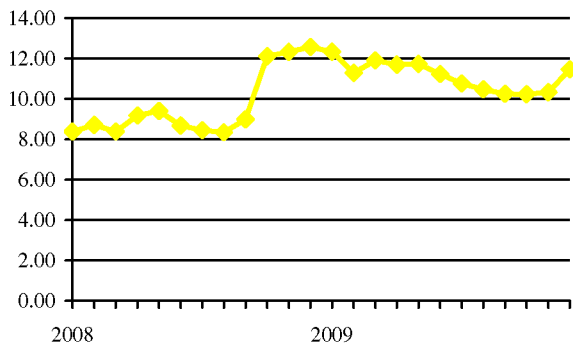
Graph. 9.1. RETAIL PRICES OF BREAD, dinars



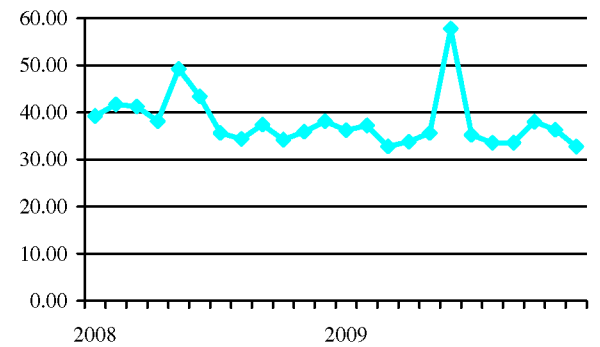
Graph. 9.2. RETAIL PRICE OF BEEF, dinars



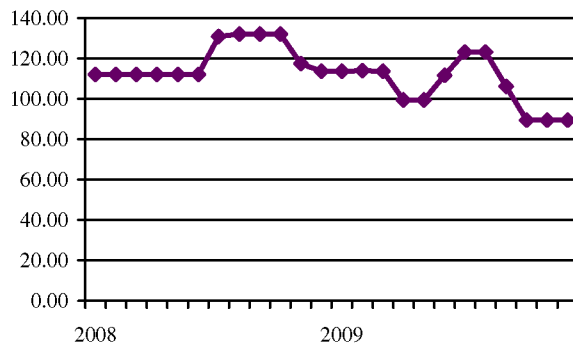
Graph. 9.3. RETAIL PRICES OF EGGS, dinars



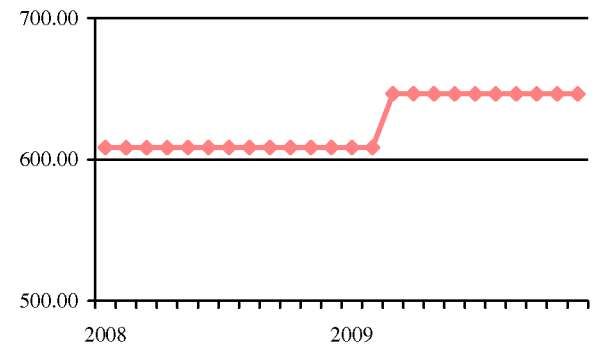
Graph. 9.4. RETAIL PRICE OF POTATO, dinars



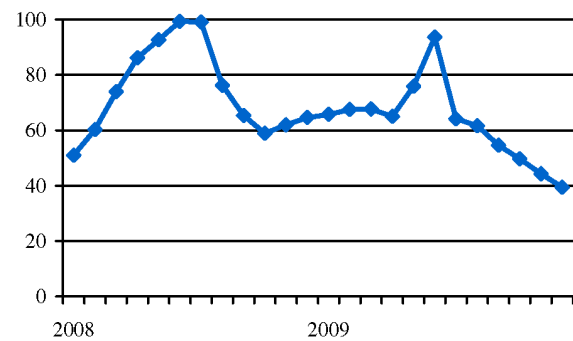
Graph. 9.5. RETAIL PRICES OF OIL, dinars



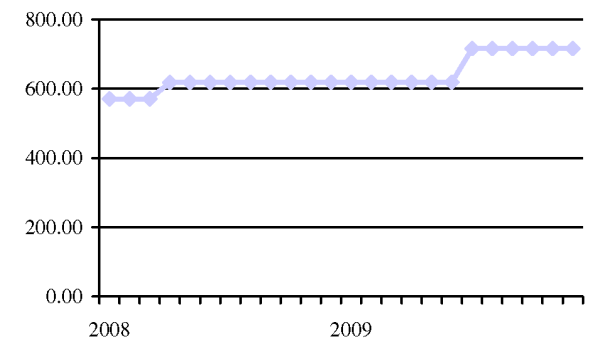
Graph. 9.6. RETAIL PRICES OF BUTTER, dinars

10. LEGAL ENTITIES AND SHOPS

ENTERPRISES, INSTITUTIONS AND OTHER ORGANIZATIONS

Sources and methods of data collection

The data on enterprises, institutions and other organizations, as well as on their units in composition are obtained from the Uniform Register of Enterprises and Institutions, being kept in statistics since 1976 and also from Business Registers Agency (BRA) since 2005.

Information on institutions, state, and judicial organs of local self-governments, political organizations, social organizations (in addition to social and trade union organizations and trade unions at the employer) associations of citizens and other organizations (funds, foundations, foreign non-governmental organizations and others.) Update and maintain with daily changes in the state Institute for Informatics and Statistics. Information about the companies, and commercial companies are downloaded from the Registry APR once a month. Also, from the Register APR are downloaded, and since 2008 displayed in the special sections: foreign representative offices and branches of foreign legal entities.

Enterprises which have not been harmonized according to new regulation till June 15th 2006 are terminated from BRA while the data on entrepreneurs are still processed. Some enterprises were not harmonized according to the Law of Classification of Economic Activities and are in specific status in BRA and therefore are shown separate in tables.

The purpose of the register is to provide connecting of data obtained by means of statistical survey, as well as with data collected by other bodies. Simultaneously with keeping up the register and in accordance with the Law on Uniform Classification of Economic Activities, organizations were classified by economic activities in order to provide a uniform classification of enterprises and institutions by activities for the purposes of statistics and other records of country-wide interest.

Enterprises, entrepreneurs, institutions or other organizations which are founded, ceased and changed their status, activity or any other characteristic, fill in a registration form for themselves, and deliver it to the authorized registering body (BRA, economic court, ministry, community body, or any other body, or directly to the statistical body).

Coverage

The Uniform Register includes all organizational forms, provided by the law regulations, such as:

- all types of enterprises, established by the Law on Enterprises;
- organizations of social activities;
- cooperative form of organizing;
- financial organizations: banks, insurance companies and other financial organizations;
- common and special associations: economic chambers, communities resulted from the compulsory association and other;
- government bodies, communes and local communities;
- social organizations, trade unions, political organizations and associations of citizens;
- organizations going into liquidation and bankruptcy.

Register includes units in composition of enterprises, institutions and other organizations.

The uniform register excludes: national diplomatic and other missions abroad; foreign diplomatic and other missions in the country; and institutions of the Army of Serbia.

Definitions and classifications

An enterprise is defined by the Law on Enterprises, as a traditional form of economic organization, recognized in the word and adaptable to market relations and management conditions.

An enterprise is a legal entity performing an activity for profit.

Organizationally, enterprises are set as economic companies, social enterprises, until the ending process of transformation and public enterprises.

An economic company is established as an association of persons or capital. An association of persons is established as a partnership or limited partnership. An association of capital is established as a sharing company or a limited joint company.

A partnership is a company established by contract between two or more natural persons binding to perform an activity under the same firm, provided own unlimited united responsibility for obligations of the company. Legal relations between the members of the company are arranged by contract on company foundation. The deposit in the company can be: cash, materials, work or services.

A company with limited partnership is a company established between two or more persons for performing an activity under the same firm, of whom at least one person has an unlimited united responsibility for obligations of the company (active partner), and the risk of at least one person is limited to the amount of the contracted deposit (dormant partner). The active partner can only be a physical person, and the limited partner both a legal and physical person.

A sharing company is established by legal, that is, natural persons for performing an activity, whose main capital is distributed in shares of a determined nominal value. The sum of nominal values of all shares makes up the capital of the sharing company.

A limited joint company is a company for performing an activity established by legal or physical persons, not being responsible for obligations of the society, but bearing the risk of the business up to the amount of their deposit. Portions cannot be expressed in terms of shares. Each member of the company can have only one portion, and one portion can have several votes.

A social enterprise is an enterprise doing business with social capital. The social capital of the social enterprise is distributed into shares or portions of a nominal value.

A public enterprise is an enterprise performing an activity of general interest, and is established by the State, that is, the unit of the local self-management.

A bank is established as a sharing company by contract on foundation and providing assets in fixed capital of the bank. The other financial organization, except for the saving-credit cooperative, is established as a sharing company.

Insurance organizations are established as sharing companies or companies for mutual insurance. Services in insurance can be performed by agencies for rendering insurance services. Agencies are set as sharing companies or limited joint companies.

Institutions are forms of organizing established for performing activities in the field of: education, science, culture, physical culture, pupils' and students' standard, medical care, social welfare, social care and social welfare of children, health, care of animals. Institutions can be founded by: republic, province, town, commune and other legal and physical entities. They are founded and operate with resources of different forms of ownership.

A cooperative is a volunteer organization of cooperators which realize economic interest by joint venture, that is, improve their socioeconomic position and independently decide on their joint issues.

An incorporated unit is a part of an enterprise, institution and other organization representing a business or productive entity in which an activity is performed, usually different from the activity in which the enterprises, institutions and other organizations are classified according to the predominancy. Parts located outside the headquarters of enterprises, institutions and other organizations represent special units in composition, even when they do not represent a business entity and when they perform the same activity as the enterprises, institutions and other organizations. If located in the same place, then sections of organizations are not considered as special incorporated units.

The Classification of economic activities is a general standard used for grouping and resenting data of interest for directing economic and social activities. The main goal of the classification of activities is to meet the needs of grouping data from a variety of statistical surveys and records of country-wide interest on a uniform comparable basis.

Classification of Activities is based on the Classification of Activities of the European Union. This Classification of Activities is comparable to the International Classification of Activities of UN. By application of Classification of Activities the standard is obtained, which is harmonized with the international documents enabling easy comparison of the data on economic activities.

Classification of the Register units is also performed by origin of capital. Origin of capital can be: domestic, foreign, mixed and not stated. The units with not stated origin of capital include public administration bodies, political organizations, social organizations and citizens' associations and other.

INDIVIDUAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP – SHOPS

Sources and methods of data collection

The data on shops are obtained from the Uniform Register of Shops, being kept in the statistics since 1995 and also from Business Registers Agency (BRA) since 2006. Since January 2006 the data on shops are collected by BRA monthly.

Coverage

BRA data on shops comprises all the organizational forms provided by the law regulations, such as: one-owner and partnership. Individual shops in form of the additional activity as organizational form are not monitored by BRA. As well, the data for 2007 in BRA are not completed due to new registration process and therefore shown partly with no activity mentioned.

Definitions

Shop is a organizational form for performing an activity for profit founded by a physical person, that is, a private entrepreneur.

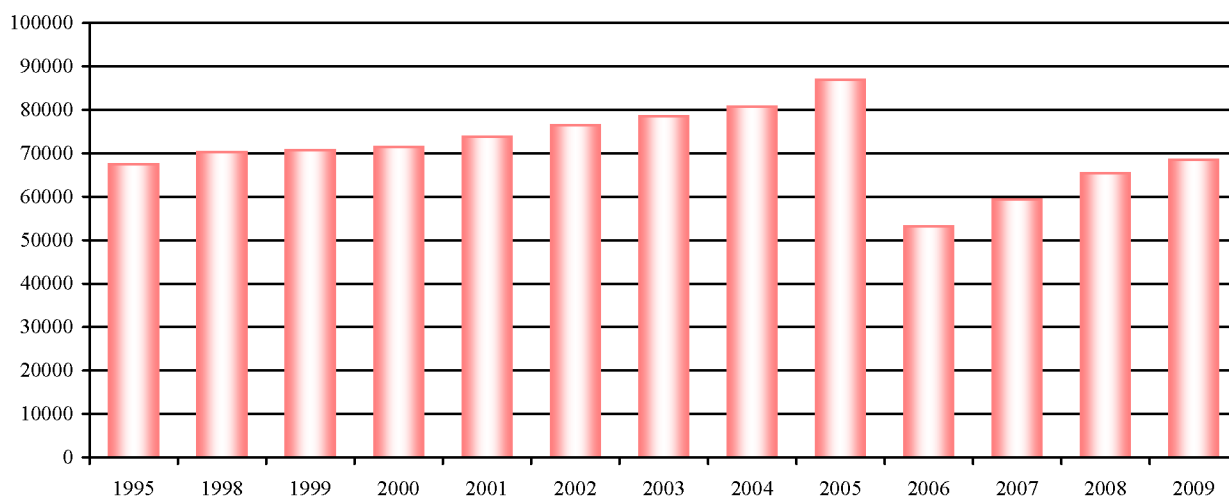

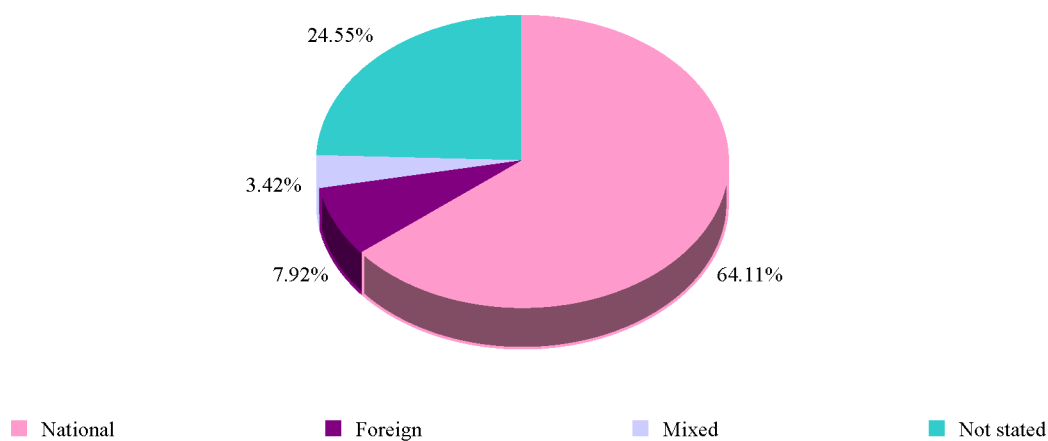

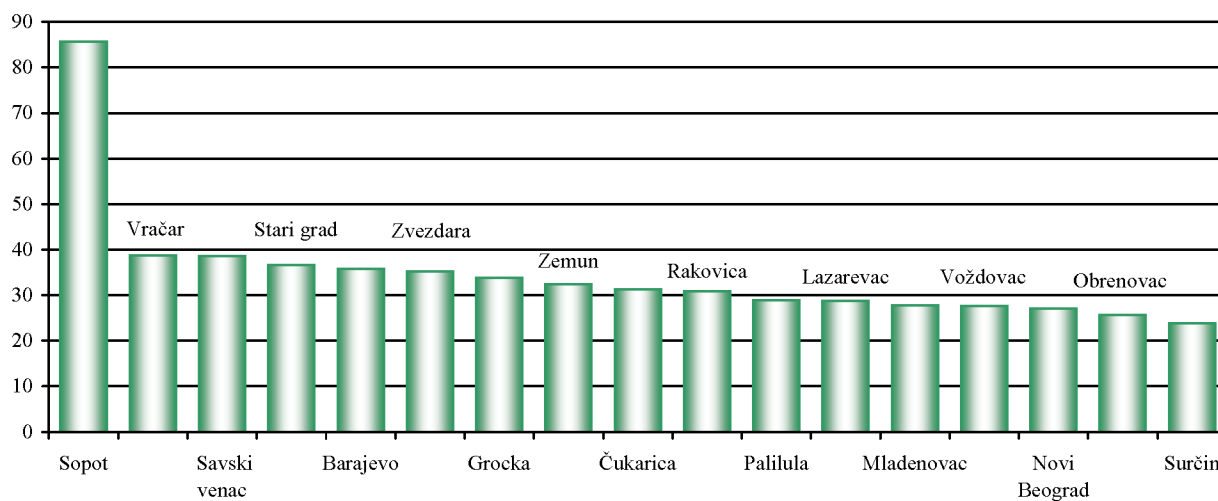
Graph. 10.1. LEGAL ENTITIES, 1995–2009



Graph. 10.2. LEGAL ENTITIES BY ORIGIN OF CAPITAL, 2009

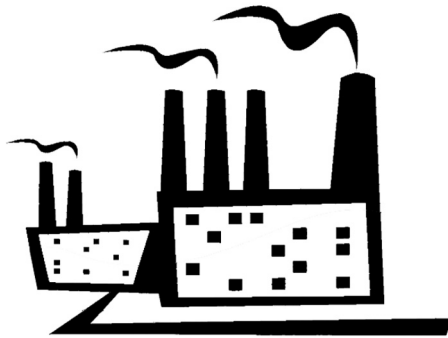


Graph. 10.3. SHOPS PER THOUSAND INHABITANTS BY COMMUNES, 31.12.2009

11. INDUSTRY AND MINING

Sources and methods of data collection

Data of industry statistics are extracted entirely from evidences of enterprises and units in their composition which fall within industry according to the Classification of Economic Activities. These data are collected by means of monthly and annual reports.

Data shown in physical terms on production are collected by monthly reports of industry. The data of these reports are used for the computation of indices of production.

Coverage

According to the Classification of Economic Activities industry comprises sectors: C (Mining and quarrying), D (Manufacturing) and E (Electricity, gas and water supply).

Reports on industrial enterprises cover all type of ownership enterprises as well as parts of nonindustrial enterprises performing industrial activity, while a great number of small private enterprises is not covered as well as special-purpose production.

Definitions

Industry is the activity of production of various products and processing of raw materials of mineral, floral, faunal or artificial origin. Main characteristic of industry is production of great quantities of products, of equal quality, mainly using machinery for work.

An industrial enterprise is an entity with the industrial production, as the prevailing industry.

Manufactured goods are defined as total production of finished products listed in the nomenclature as a permanent base for presentation of industrial production.

Index of physical volume of industrial production represents changes in volume of total industrial production.

Computation is based on monthly and annual data on final production, shown in physical terms according to Nomenclature of Products for monthly report and criteria of weighting system.

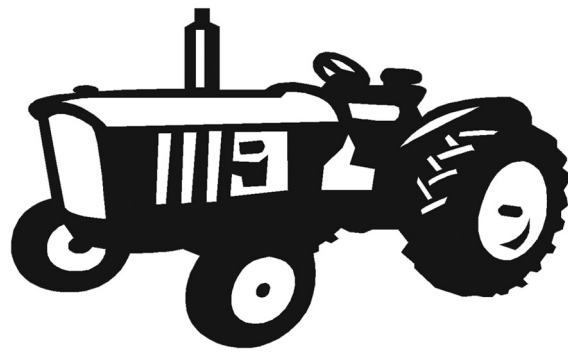

12. AGRICULTURE AND FORESTRY

CROP PRODUCTION

Sources and methods of data collection

Data for agriculture are collected by regular reports covering all agricultural organizations (enterprises and co-operative farms). Data have been derived from accounting and other records. In the individual holdings of agriculture, data on areas are estimates based on data taken from comprehensive cadastral records. A network of about 50 statistical estimators has been set up for work on estimates, who provide data for 165 estimate areas being, as a rule, one or more cadastral communes. Agricultural experts or advanced agricultural producers, well acquainted with local conditions and trained for that task are engaged as statistical estimators. They are in constant touch with statistical bodies and rely in their work on the latest data of cadastral, estimates from preceding years, data of census of private agricultural holdings, information obtained from agricultural producers and experts, their own observations and other sources.

Data on crop production were checked and corrected on the basis of data on purchase and industrial processing of agricultural products, objective measuring and various surveys.

The data on agricultural machinery and implements have been obtained through annual reports of agricultural organizations, and for private agricultural holdings data is provided by communes.

Coverage

As the statistical data on land areas and yields, are based on all-inclusive cadastral records, they cover total funds and production on agricultural holdings and outside agricultural holdings (households of non-agriculturists, gardens in towns and similar).

Definitions

Cultivable area covers land areas on which: farm crops and vegetable crops, permanent planting and grasses are grown; the following works are performed: cultivation, mowing and other; the yields are gathered every year. Cultivable area includes: arable land and gardens, orchards, vineyards and meadows.

Agricultural areas are land areas utilized for agricultural production. Agricultural area covers: cultivable areas, pastures, fish-ponds, reedtracts and pools.

Arable land (fields) are land areas generally under temporary crops. These areas are sown in rotation with the following crops: cereals, industrial crops, vegetable crops and fodder crops. Arable area includes also areas „for rest” remained uncultivated: green fallow or black fallow, neglected land. Arable lands are also areas under vine and fruit tree nurseries and areas under clover and lucerne.

Productive trees and grape-vines are trees and grape-vines capable of bearing fruit under standard conditions, regardless of whether or not they beared fruits during relevant year.

Wine is a product obtained by alcoholic fermentation of unfermented grape juice of crushed grapes of cultivated vines or hybrids.

Yield of crops is shown as the granary yield of standard humidity after reduction of all losses during harvest (gathering), transportation and threshing.

Yield per unit of area (per hectare) is computed on the basis of harvested area.

Yield per fruit tree-grape-vine is computed for productive fruit or grape-vines.

LIVESTOCK BREEDING

Sources and methods of data collection

Data on number of livestock have been obtained by means of regular annual reports of agricultural organizations (enterprises and agricultural cooperatives) and annual surveys for private agricultural holdings and households.

Samples, in addition to data on number and turnover of livestock, comprised also data on production of milk, eggs, honey and wool on private agricultural holdings and households.

FORESTRY

Sources and methods of data collection

Data on forestry are collected by means of regular statistical reports based on technical and other documentation of report units. The reports are submitted by enterprises entrusted with management and exploitation of forests. Data on production of forest assortments are collected monthly.

Definitions

A forest is every area over 5 ares covered with forest trees with an economic or protective function or a special purpose. Treelike paths, parks in inhabited places, forest tree nurseries and a group of forest trees on an area under 5 ares are not considered a forest.

Volume of cut timber (gross volume) covers total cut timber – produced forest assortments and residue – so that represents the total volume of wood measured on stamp.

Technical wood is wood which is owing to physical and chemical properties intended for technical and industrial use.

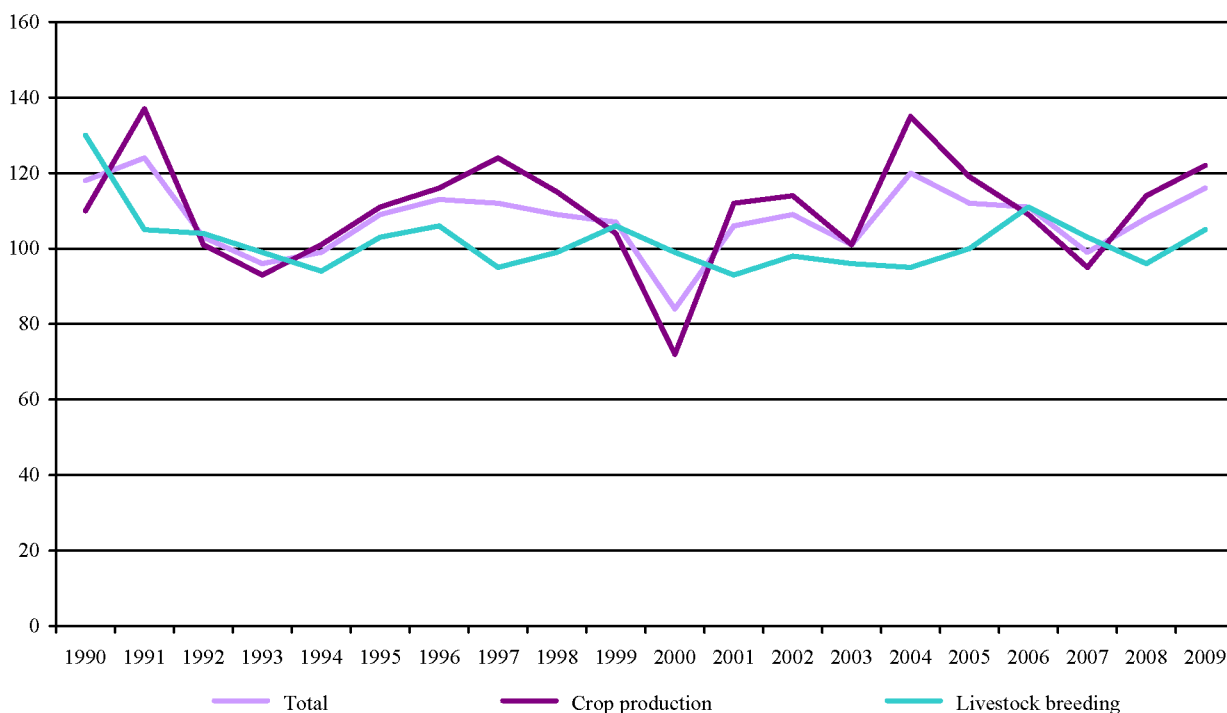

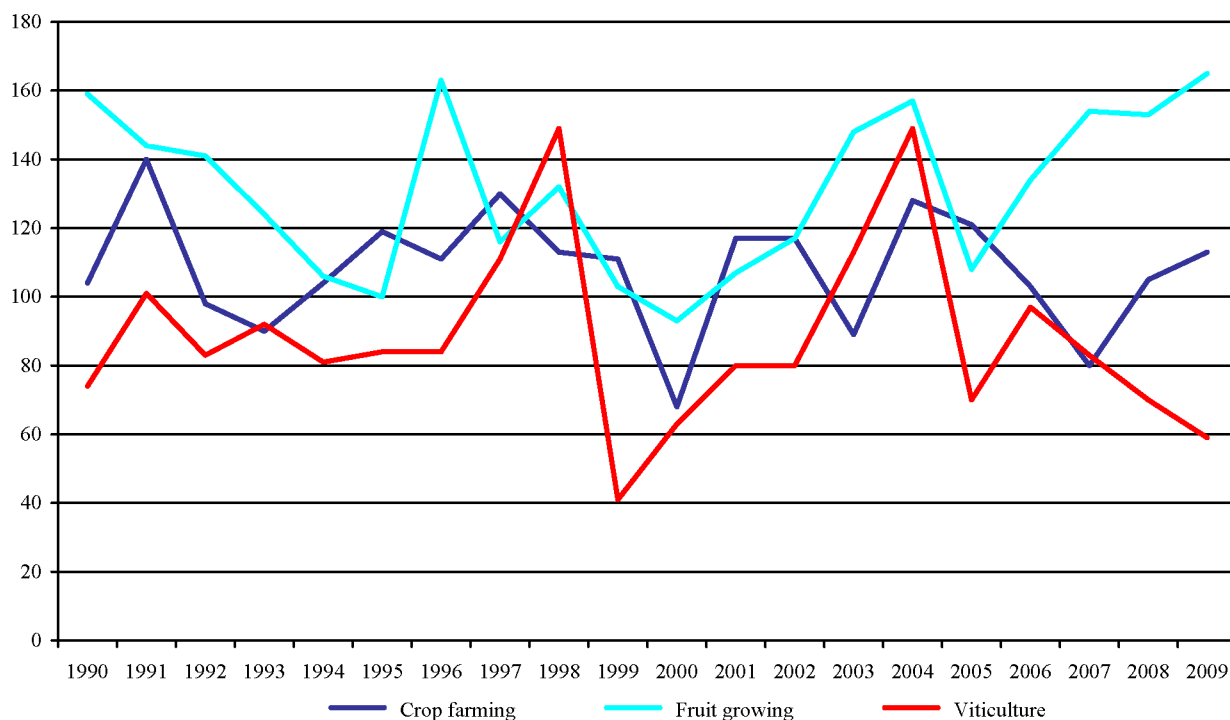

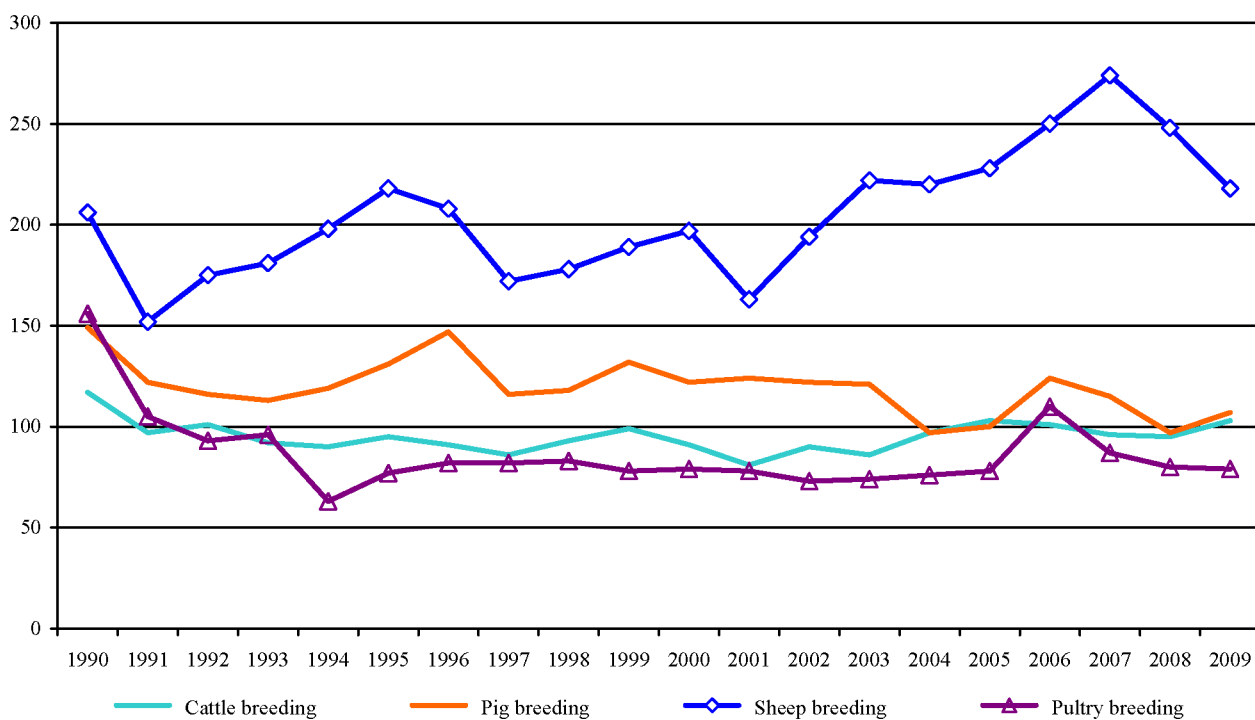
Graph. 12.1. INDICES OF AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION, indices, Ø1985–1990 =100



Graph. 12.2. INDICES OF CROP PRODUCTION, indices, Ø1985–1990 =100

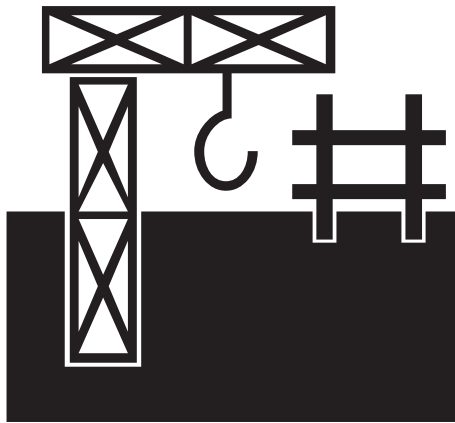


Graph. 12.3. INDICES OF LIVESTOCK BREEDING, indices, Ø1985–1990 =100

13. CONSTRUCTION

Sources and methods of data collection

Data on construction industry are collected by following surveys: Annual report on construction structure (Građ-11 and Građ-11a), Semi-annual report on new dwellings prices (Građ-41), Quarterly report on done constructional works (Građ-31).

Coverage

Annual report on construction structure covers all constructions on which constructional works were performed by constructional enterprises, management groups or physical persons during the reference year. Value of constructional works covers all built in constructional materials and labour involved. Data on value of works done relate to works performed during reference year on completed and non-completed constructions. Value of works performed by contractors-physical persons is given on the basis of annual computation statements, whilst value of works performed by physical persons is given on the basis of documentation or is estimated. Works performed on constructions have been shown according to the territory where a structure under construction is located, regardless of the seat of the work contractor.

Definitions

Statistical system of European union has made Classification of types of Construction based on temporary Central Product Classification published in 1991 by Statistical system of United Nations. Central Product Classification in section 52 „Constructions” defines two major areas of constructions, „Buildings” and „Other constructions”.

A **construction** comprise constructions connected with the ground, any underground and over ground construction, as well as hydrotechnical structure (water-works), for which constructional works are performed, made of constructional material, building-in finished products and parts.

New constructions stand for works on a completely new structure erected entirely, or horizontally or vertically added to an existing one.

Restoration covers the works on changing the function of a structure or premises thereof, with bigger or smaller changes in layout or in structural system.

Reconstruction covers works altering layout or structural system and thus, enlarging its capacity or improving conditions for use without affecting purpose to be served by a structure or by its premises.

Modernization covers works on an existing structure aiming at quality improvement and in case of roads and railway tracks – at increasing the traffic capacity, speed and transport security.

Major repairs are works designed to renew dilapidated parts of a structure without altering layout, structural system and purpose to be served by a given structure.

Regular maintenance works are constructional works of a minor extent periodically performed to secure normal use of a construction structure.

A **dwelling** is any structurally connected compound intended for habitation, consisting of one or more rooms with necessary accessories (such as: kitchen, bathroom, lobby, pantry, toilet, etc.) or without accessories and with one or more separate entries.

Type of dwelling has been determined according to the number of rooms. A room is a space intended for habitation and enclosed by walls having direct daylight and with area of floor space of at least 6 square meters.

A **separate room** is a dwelling consisting of only one room without kitchen and bathroom, but possibly with a lobby, toilet or pantry provided that the total area of floor space of these accessories is less than 6 square meters.

A **bachelor flat** is one-room dwelling with a bathroom and lobby with a small „kitchenette” (with a floor space under 4 square meters) or without it.

One-room dwelling may consist of one room with kitchen and other accessories or one room without kitchen, but with other accessories, where total area of floor space should be at least 6 square meters. Two, three, four and more rooms dwelling consists of two, three or more rooms with accessories or without it. Such a dwelling need not have a kitchen.

Area of useful floor space of a dwelling covers the entire useful floor space of all rooms, kitchen, bathroom, toilet, corridor and all other accessories, as well as floor space of all covered terraces and verandahs. Included are area under placards and partly the area of balconies. Thickness of outer and partition walls is excluded.

The **value of construction works done** includes all building materials and labour involved irrespective of whether such labour and materials have been paid or not.

CONSTRUCTION

Classifications of the types of constructions, as well as measure units that express construction values, are done according to the Classification of types of Construction (CC, final version, Eurostat, 1997), by taking over the structure and content of all the levels of that classification, but some lowest levels (categories) have been additionally divided into joints because it was necessary for our statistical research and in order to adjust them to the Nomenclature of building structures and works, which has been used up till now.

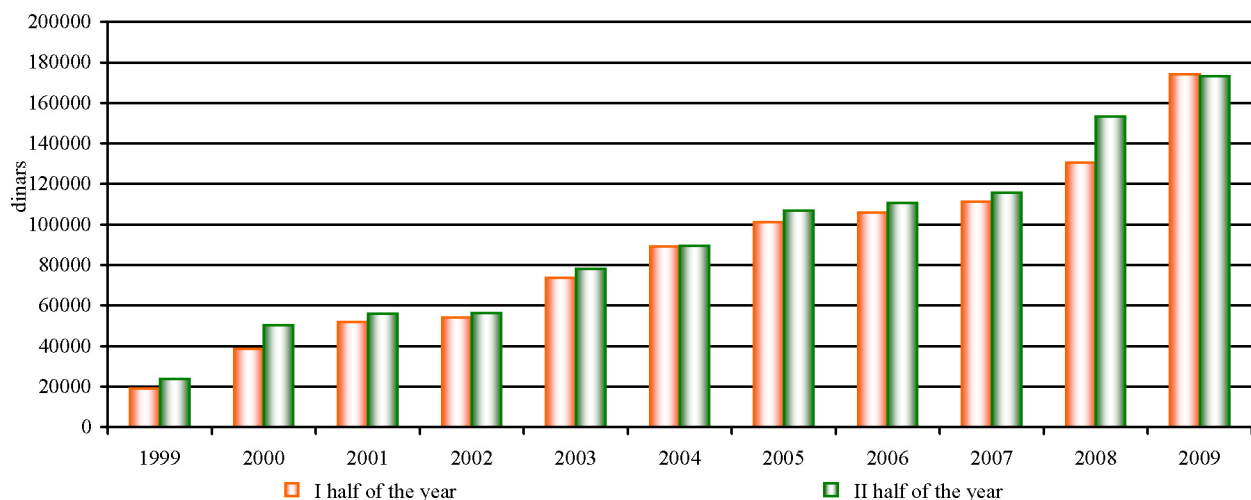

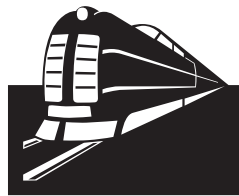

14. TRANSPORT AND COMMUNICATIONS

Sources and methods of data collection

Compilation of basic data for 2005 was based on regular monthly and annual statistical reports of transport organizations.

Coverage

Data on postal-telegraph-telephone traffic relate only to organizations of national post, telegraphs and telephones, as well as communications. Data on urban transport cover operations of transport organizations or their sections and refer to the transport performed with the mobile equipment operating completely or partly in the transportation of passengers in both, urban and suburban transport. Data on activity of private carries in urban transport until 2005 were not available.

Basic definitions

Considered as transport is the carriage of passengers or goods from place of loading/embarkment to place of unloading/disembarkment. The unit of measure in passengers transport is 1 pkm, representing the transportation of one passenger over a distance of one kilometer. The unit of measure in goods transport is 1 tkm, representing the transportation of one ton of goods over a distance of one kilometer.

Considered as national transport of passengers is the transportation between a place of embarkment and a place of disembarkment providing that both are located within the country boundaries.

Considered as international transport of passengers is the transportation between a place of embarkment and a place of disembarkment providing that at least one or both are located outside the country boundaries.

Considered as national transport of goods is the transportation between a place of loading and a place of unloading providing that both are located within the country boundaries.

Considered as international transport of goods is the transportation between a place of loading and a place of unloading providing that at least one or both are located outside the country boundaries.

International transport of goods consists of exports, imports, transit and transport between foreign countries.

Exports refer to the international transport where the place of loading is within, and the place of unloading outside the country boundaries.

Imports refer to the international transport where the place of loading is outside, and the place of unloading is within the country boundaries.

Transit refers to the international transport where the place of loading/embarkment and the place of unloading/disembarkment are located outside the country boundaries and providing that the transit is partly carried out through our country, without transshipment.

Traffic volume refers to quantity of goods from national traffic, unloading, exports and imports.

Considered as traffic is the loading/embarkment and unloading/disembarkment of passengers or goods at stations, river-ports, airports and other places of loading/embarkment or unloading/disembarkment. Stations, river-ports and airports are specially built-up areas organized for the loading/embarkment or unloading/disembarkment of passengers or goods over the network of transport, concerning each mode of transport.

Letter mail in inland and in international traffic relates to mail both sent and received. Data cover regular or registered letters, printed matter, business papers, mail for the blind, small parcels, value letters.

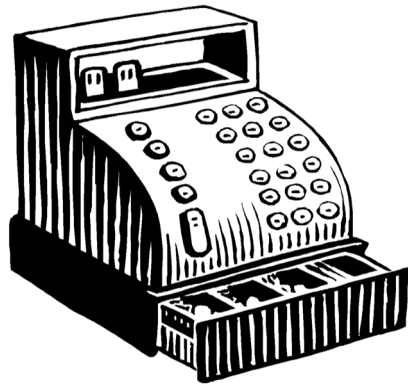

DOMESTIC TRADE

Sources and methods of data collection

Data on domestic trade originate from accounting and other documentation in possession of organizations engaged in retail and wholesale trade. Statistics collects those data by regular, quarterly and annual reports.

Data on market surpluses of agricultural products at the stage of sale have been compiled by monthly reports of agricultural and other organizations which sell agricultural products from their own production, by monthly reports of organizations dealing with the authorized purchase of agricultural products from private producers, and by monthly reports on turnover of agricultural products on markets of organizations rendering services of utilization of market places.

Coverage

Statistics of domestic trade covers and shows the goods turnover which is realized through trade activity (retail and wholesale trade). The part of goods turnover being directly realized between producers and between producers and consumers, is not covered.

In addition, this section presents realization of markets surpluses of agricultural products being classified and shown as: a) authorized purchase of agricultural products from private producers, b) sale (realization) of products of agricultural organizations and c) sale of agricultural products on organized markets.

Statistical surveys on trade cover trade enterprises (social, mixed, cooperative and private), trade units of non-trade organizations.

Definitions

Turnover of goods in retail comprises the quantity and value of goods delivered to consumers by organizations dealing with retail trade.

Sale of agricultural products at market places is taken to mean sale of agricultural products by private agricultural producers directly to final consumers on organized market places (so-called green markets, and shopping centres for retail trade).

FOREIGN TRADE

Data source for external trade statistic is the Uniform Customs Document on exports and imports of goods submitted by forwarding organizations to the customs on behalf of authorized export and import organizations when declaring the goods.

External trade based on principle of special trade, includes, as regards exports, all goods originating from domestic production, respectively from domestic trade, as well as the so called nationalized goods, that is goods imported and on which customs duty was charged, and in unchanged condition, exported abroad as goods of domestic origin. Imports cover all goods imported, on which customs duty was charged, and retained in domestic trade for reproduction, investment or consumption purposes. Beside regular (commercial) imports, data include deliveries of miscellaneous charity organizations and private gift-parcels.

Value of goods in external trade statistics has been shown on the basis of prices realized by organizations and enterprises when stipulating prices. All values have been computed on the basis of parity free country border, i.e. F.O.B. prices as regards exports and CIF prices as regards imports, (invoice value of goods augmented by costs of transportation, insurance, and sim. to the country border). Statistical value of goods being exported is the invoice value of goods. Statistical value of goods being imported is the value representing customs base.

Data on export and import for purposes of processing where included in the results on foreign exchange (in tables marked as processing).

Registration of data of external trade by countries is carried out according to the principle of country of destination as regards exports and country of origin as regards imports. It means that in case of exports registered is the country in which goods are consumed or further processed, and in case of imports the country where goods have been produced in the state in which they have been imported.

Detailed explanations could be found in the Uniform Methodology of Statistical Survey on Foreign Commodity Exchange.

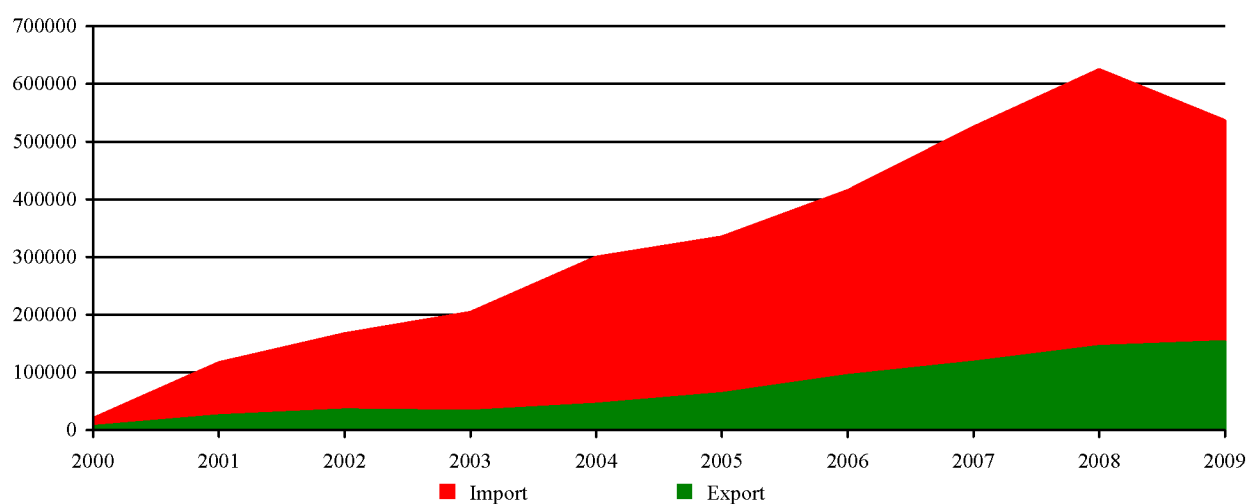

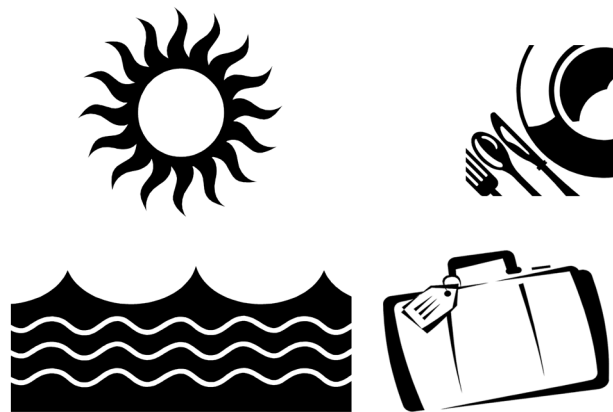

16. CATERING TRADES AND TOURISM

CATERING

Sources and methods of data collection

Data on network and turnover in catering trades are collected by means of quarterly and annual reports of organizations engaged in catering trades. Researches are conducted on a sample basis.

Definitions

A catering business unit is a catering establishment of an organization (enterprise) which, regarding its business, constructional and functional aspect, makes up a whole or which, within a broader constructional whole, has a separate space and necessary business functionality for performance of catering activity. Catering shops in private ownership are also shown as business units. Depending on the kind of prevailing catering services, technical possibilities and the rendering mode, catering business units are classified into hotels, motels, restaurants, cafes, buffets, etc. The number of business units is shown as of 31 August.

Turnover in catering trades is, in terms of bookkeeping, a computed value of rendered catering services (accommodation, food and drinks) as well as of other services usually rendered in catering trades (transport of passengers and luggage, service craft industries, sale of tobacco, souvenirs, newspapers, etc.) The value of rendered services also includes the tax.

TOURISM

Sources and methods of data collection

Data are based on monthly statistical reports of catering and other organizations providing accommodation to guest.

Definitions

A tourist is any visitor who stays at least one night in an accommodation establishment in the place visited.

Number of nights realized by guests in an accommodation establishment.

Country of origin has been determined on the basis of guest's citizenship.

Tourist agencies

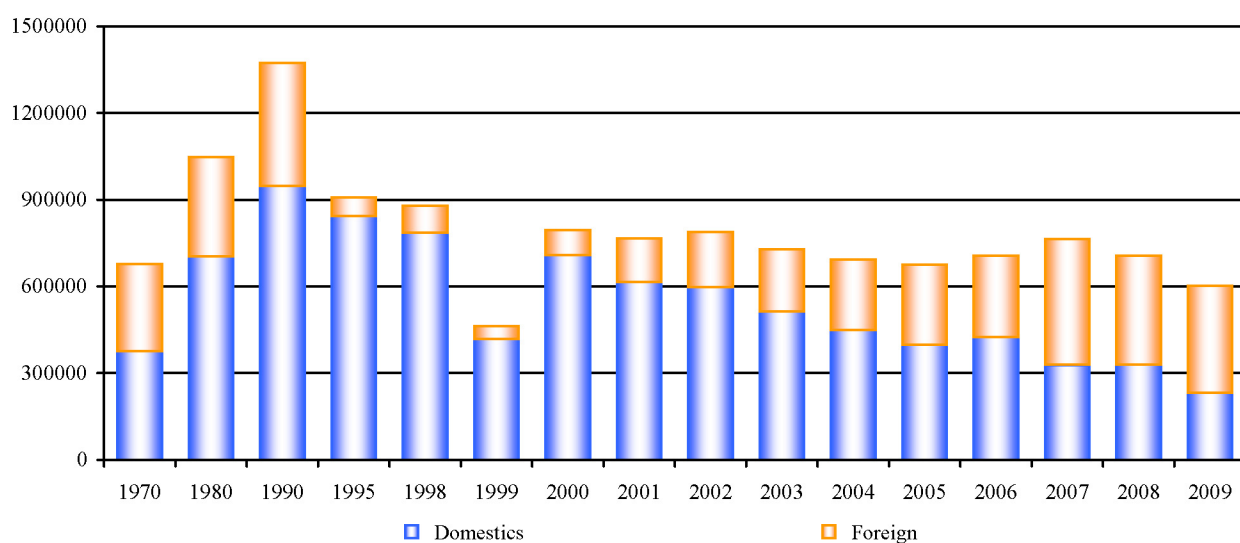
Data are collected semi-annual reports of the Belgrade tourist agency (Tables 16.6 and 16.7).

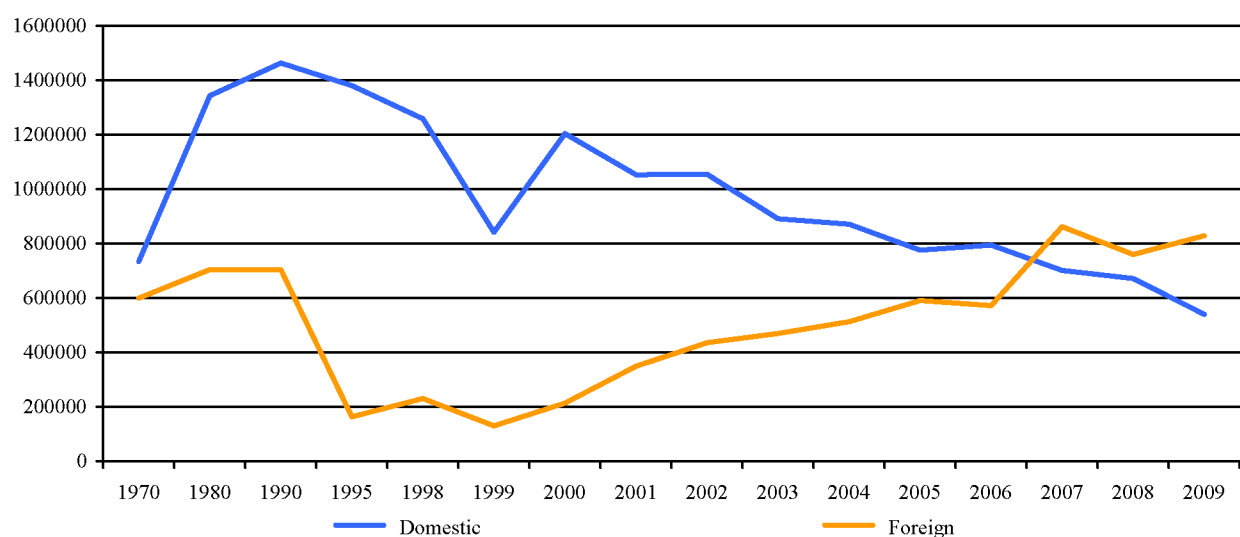

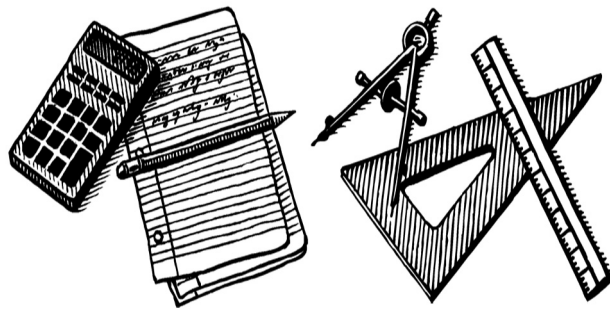

17. EDUCATION

Sources and methods of data collection

Data on primary, secondary, high and higher education are collected by means of regular annual reports.

Coverage

Annual reports of statistics of education cover primary, secondary, high and higher education from the field 80 of The Classification of Activities: „Education”. Data for primary and secondary schools relate to the end and beginning of school year, whereas data on enrolled students and teaching staff for high schools, faculties and academies refer to winter semester during which students were enrolled. Data on graduated students, refer to end of calendar year.

Definitions

School, in education statistics, is an educational institution or educational unit where educational activity is performed by releasing the curriculum. Under this concept shown is every school unit regardless of whether it is an autonomous school or regional department. Schools comprising both primary and secondary education are shown as two schools (primary and secondary).

Regular primary education

Primary schools comprise four-year (incomplete) and eight-year (complete) primary schools.

Regular secondary education

Secondary school can be established as high school, art school and vocational school.

Starting from the 1987/88 academic year, in secondary schools, pupils have been instructed from the first grade for a certain branch of vocation or occupation and since the 1990/91 academic year, secondary education has been accomplished by fields of work and educational profiles (occupations).

Special education (primary and secondary)

Special education is the education of children and mentally and physically handicapped youth. Pupils are regularly enrolled at the age of compulsory enrollment to school but also beyond that age. The curriculum of these schools is in accordance with the curriculum of a corresponding regular school, adapted to the level of handicap of pupils.

In addition to the number of special primary and secondary schools, presented is the number of regular schools in which the special classes are organized. The number of these schools is shown in brackets.

Adult education

Schools for adults' education enable persons over 15 years of age (adults), who do not regularly attend school, to acquire elementary education.

In contrast to previous years, adults acquire secondary education as part/time pupils in secondary schools.

Additional education

Additional education includes primary music and ballet schools.

Higher education

Higher education includes higher schools, faculties and art academies.

By rendering the Law on Higher Education (end of 2006) where decisions of Bologna Convention were applied and conducted, the Statistical Office of the Republic of Serbia adapted monitoring both of enrolled and graduated students to these modifications. Since 2007/2008 school year both enrolled and graduated students are being monitored by type of studying (academic and professional) and by degree of studying (first, second and third degree), respectively basic academic, basic professional, master studies specialist and Ph.D. studies. Data processing and publishing is being carried out according to the Classification of Educational Fields instead of previous departments and majors.

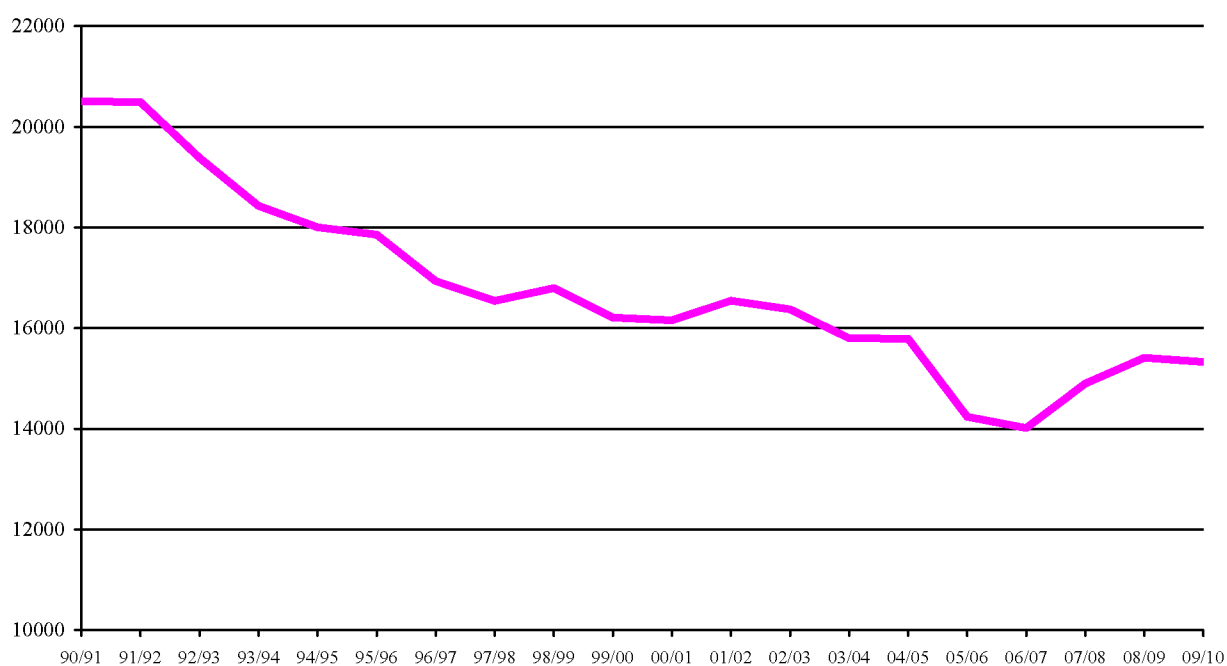

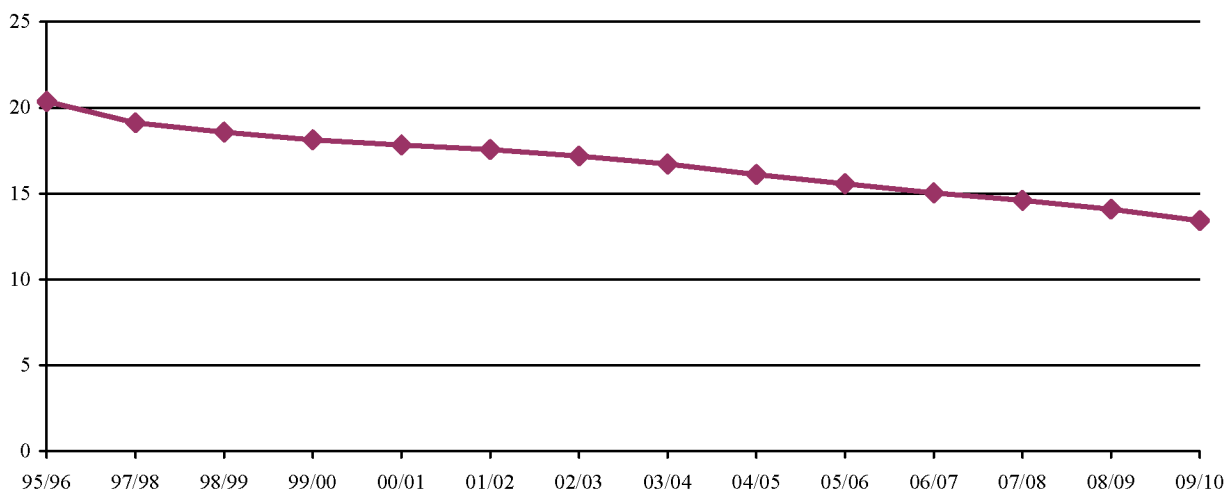

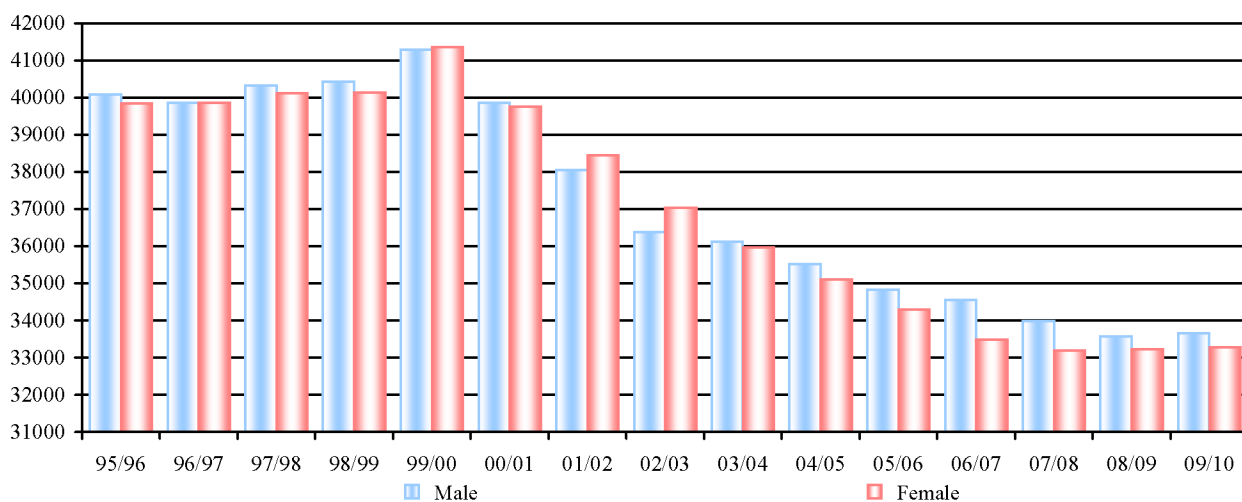

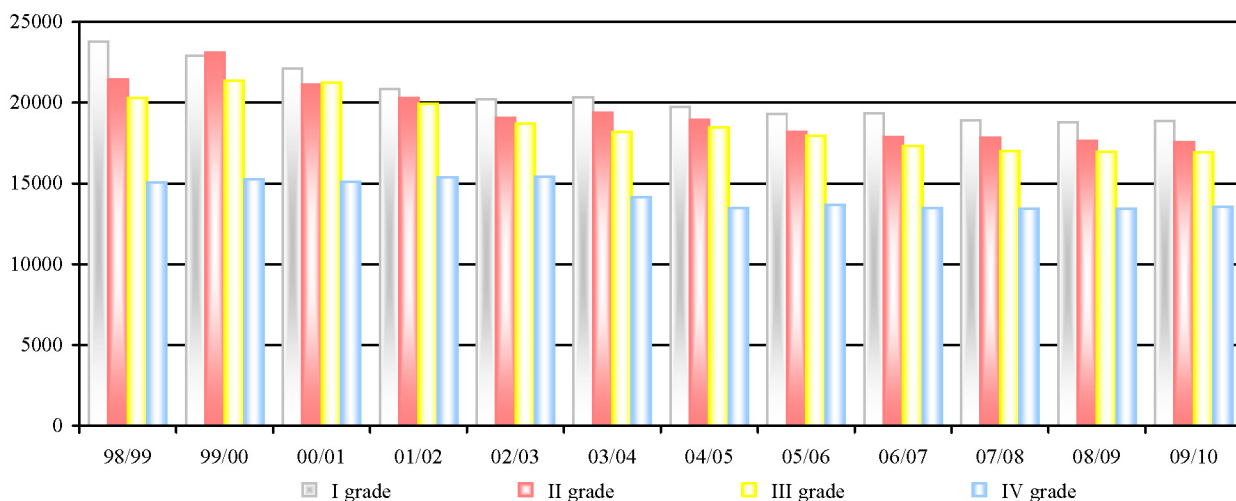

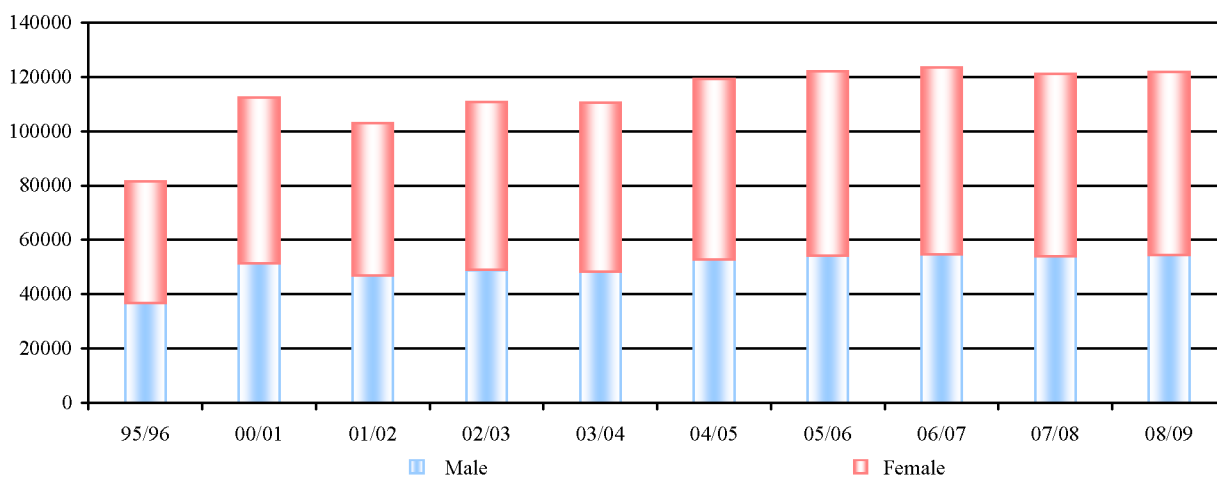

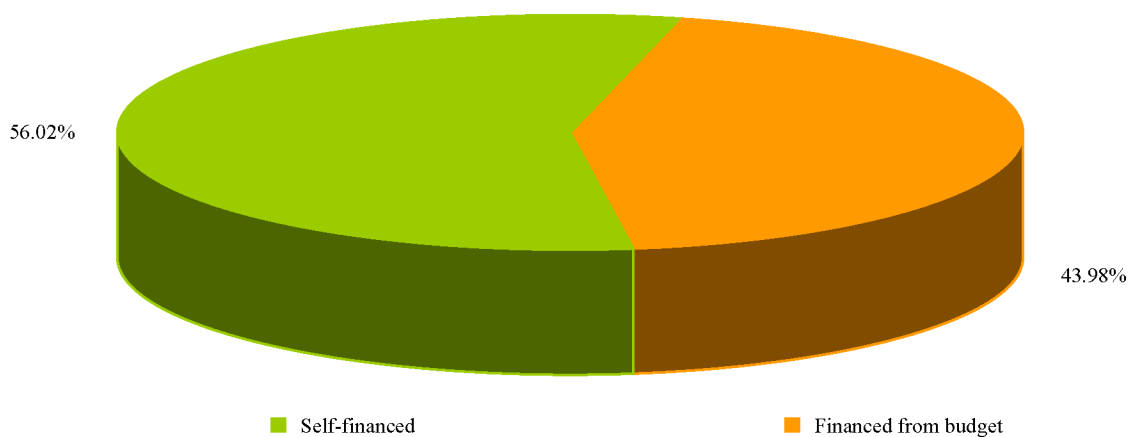

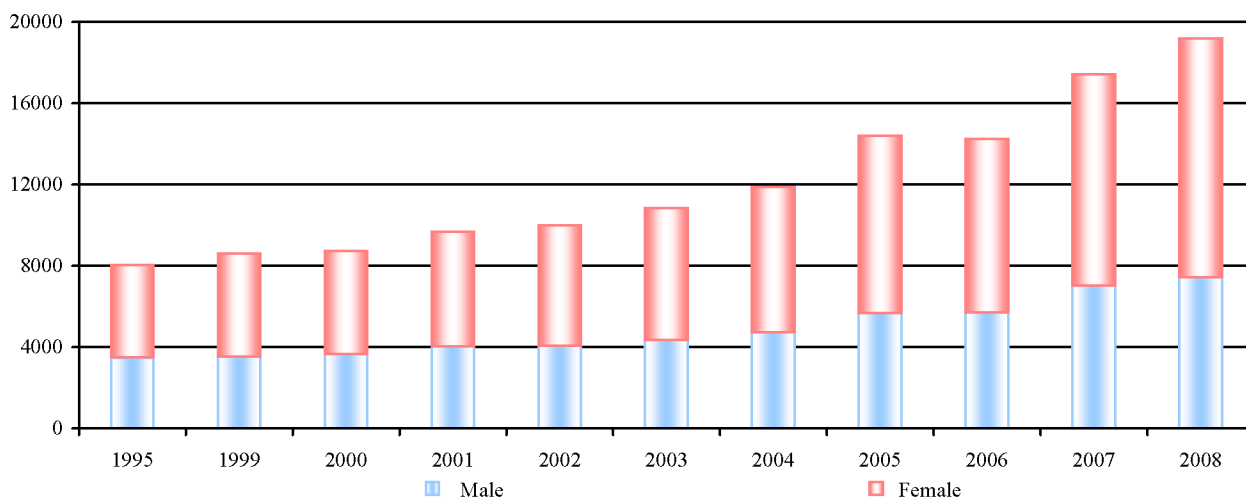
Graph. 17.5. STUDENTS BY SEX



Graph. 17.6. STUDENTS BY WAY OF FINANCING, 2008/2009

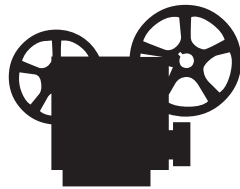


Graph. 17.7. GRADUATED STUDENTS

18. CULTURE AND ART

Sources and methods of data collection

Data on institutions and enterprises in the domain of culture and art have been collected by means of regular annual and perennial statistical reports.

Coverage

The annual reports cover cinemas and theatres, three-year reports cover museums and art galleries.

Definitions

A museum is an institution, which systematically collects, scientifically processes, keeps and exhibits articles originating from nature, spiritual and material culture. Art galleries are treated as art museums.

A professional theatre is an autonomous cultural-artistic institution with a permanent company of professional actors. Each stage within a professional theatre with regular performances has been considered a unit of observation since 1972-73. Experimental theatre is considered professional theatre if it has a separate administration.

Employees in theatres with two or more stages are shown as employed with the main stage.

An amateur theatre is a social-cultural institution made up mainly of amateur actors. Organizationally, it is either autonomous or within a cultural-artistic society, cultural centre or another institution-enterprise.

A children's theatre is a cultural-artistic institution which regularly gives performances for children.

A cinema is a hall or an open space having own equipment for public projection of films. Organizationally, a cinema may be an autonomous enterprise or unit incorporated in an enterprises for film projection, cultural centres, and other institutions and enterprises. Kinds of cinemas: operating all year round (indoor), outdoor cinemas and mobile cinemas (traveling).

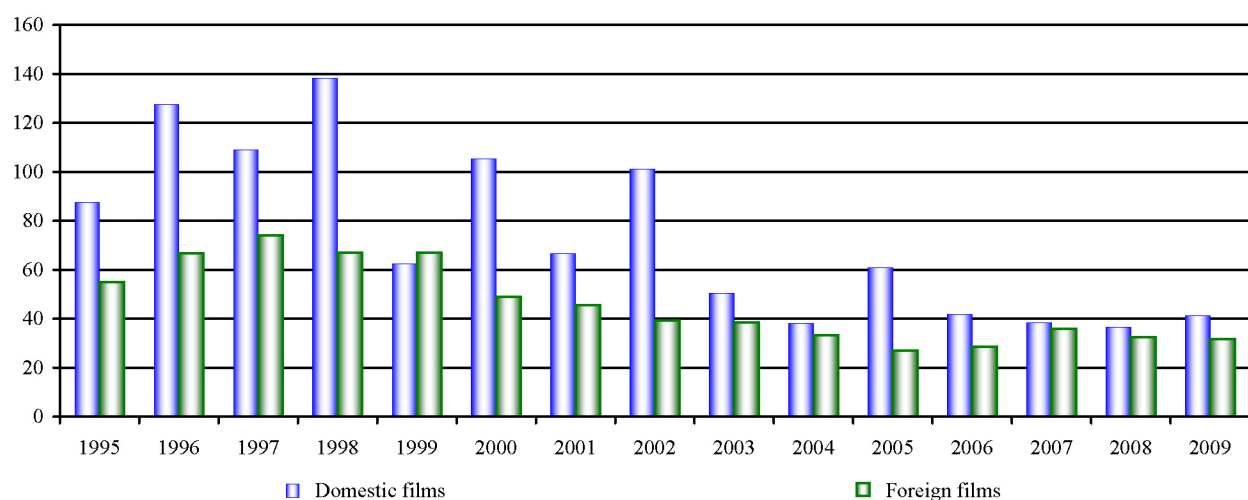

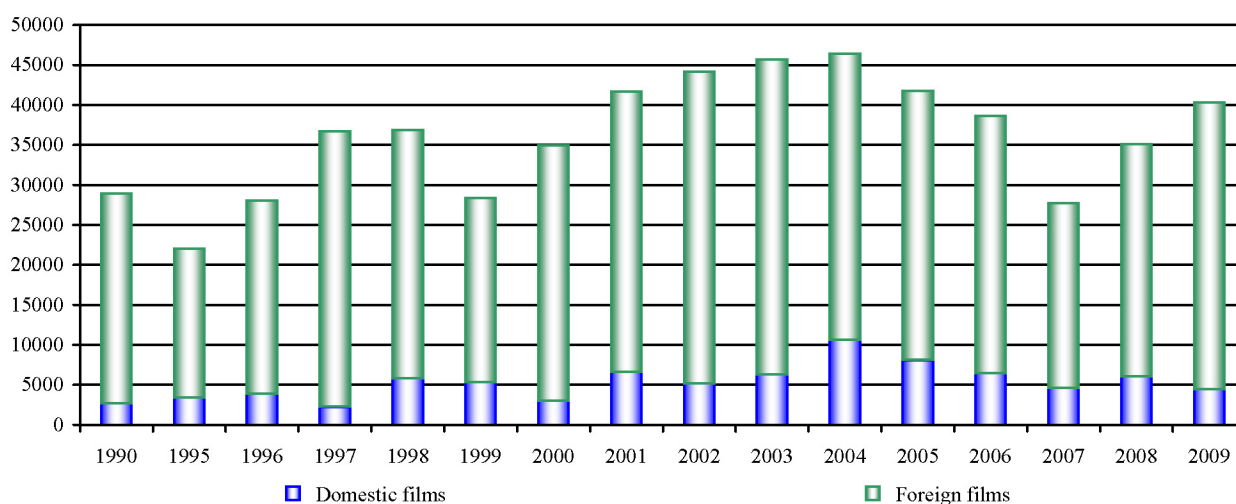
Graph. 18.1. AVERAGE ATTENDANCE BY FILM PERFORMANCE

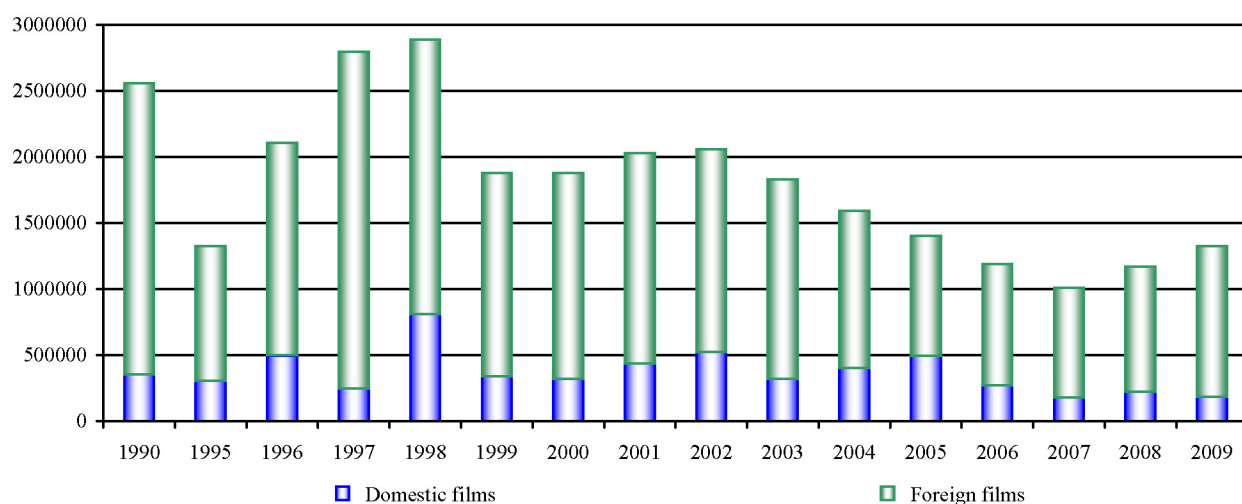

Graph. 18.2. CINEMA PERFORMANCES

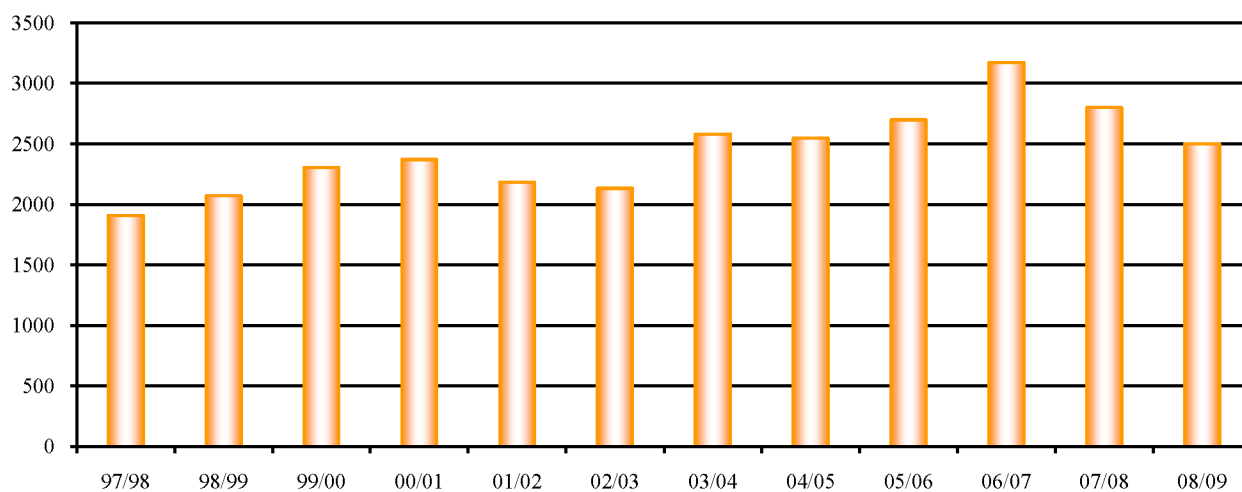

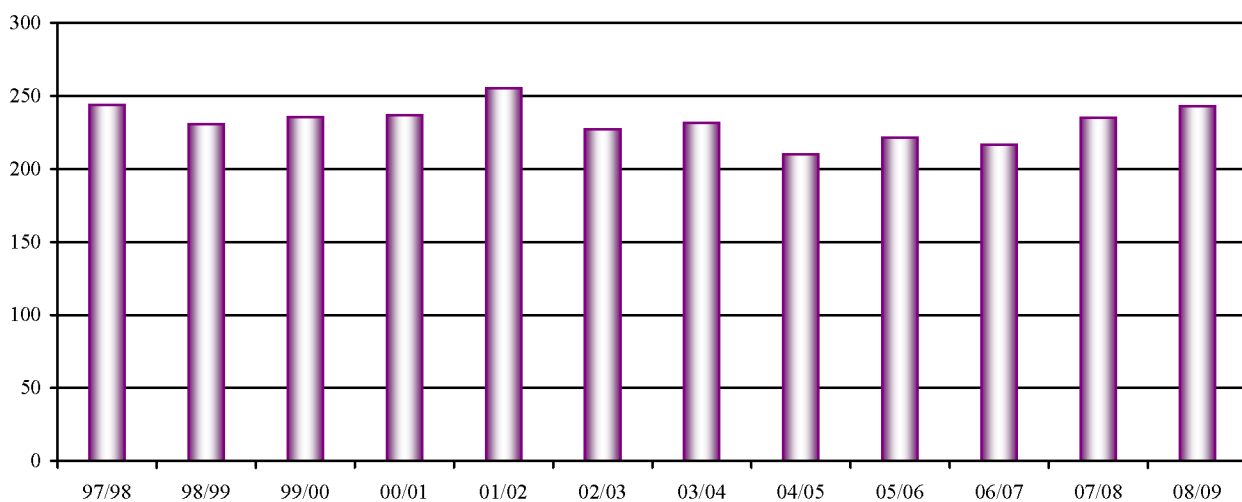
Graph. 18.3. ATTENDANCE AT CINEMAS

19. PUBLIC HEALTH

Sources and methods of data collection

Data on health organizations or organizational units, employees and activities have been collected by annual reports for certain types of health services, which they submit in conformity with pertaining instructions. The data on the number of notifications of infectious diseases have been obtained every seven days and annually on the basis of prescribed notifications of sick and deceased persons.

Diagnoses made by general practitioners and specialists have been given according to a specially established list of diagnoses based on the International Classification of Diseases, Revision X.

Coverage

Figures on activity and morbidity relate to the whole calendar year, and staff is shown as of 31 December.

Data on personnel in public health are complete regarding that all public health organizations are covered.

Data on established diseases, illness conditions and injuries in out of hospital health institutions, are also complete.

Infectious diseases have been monitored according to the Law on Control and Prevention of Infectious Diseases (Federal and Republic laws).

Data on activity – visits, examinations, diagnostics, are not complete because they do not cover activities of all services in public health institutions.

Definitions

Service is a public health institution or a part of health institution providing health care to given groups of population (women, children, employees) or providing health care against some diseases (tuberculosis, diabetes, etc.).

A service provides both curative and preventive care and it incorporates more than one working unit, such as: outpatient clinic, consultation centre, nursing, etc. As a rule, a service has at least one specialist who is in charge of the service.

A service providing in-patient treatment is a public health institution or a part thereof providing medical examination and treatment of persons in in-patient public health organizations. This service can be: general hospital (autonomous or within a medical centre), clinic, clinical hospital and clinical centre, special hospital, natural cure and inpatient department outside hospital.

Service for in-patient treatment in general hospitals provide treatment for all kinds of diseases. Organizationally, they are composed of specialist wards (internal, infectious, surgical, etc.).

Service for in-patient treatment in special hospitals provides treatment for a specific disease (pulmonary tuberculosis, diseases of bones, children diseases, mental diseases, etc.).

Hospitalization days are days a person stayed in inpatient public health institution, for treatment or medical examinations. Included are days actually spent in a given inpatient organization as well as the day of discharge, but excluding day of admission.

A visit is every contact of an individual with a physician or another medical worker in a public health organization, at home or elsewhere for health care purposes.

A visit to a physician due to disease, condition or injury is a contact, which a person has with a physician regarding a disease, condition or an injury. This visit may be a new case or an old one.

A new case is a contact a person makes for the first time with a physician due to a disease, condition or an injury.

Old cases are all other visits concerning a given disease, condition or injury, until the final outcome.

The first visit to a consultation centre is a visit made for the first time to a consultation centre in one calendar year.

The first visit of a pregnant woman to a consultation centre is a visit, which a pregnant woman makes to a consultation centre for the first time during one pregnancy.

The first visit of infant to a consultation centre is the first visit to a consultation centre in the first year of life.

Systematic examination is an examination of organs or a system of organs of groups of individuals (children of pre-school and school age, employees, etc.) for health condition to be established.

Control examination is a repeated examination of groups of population and individuals which has been carried out after systematic and periodic examinations in order to establish the results of measures applied after systematic or periodic health examinations.

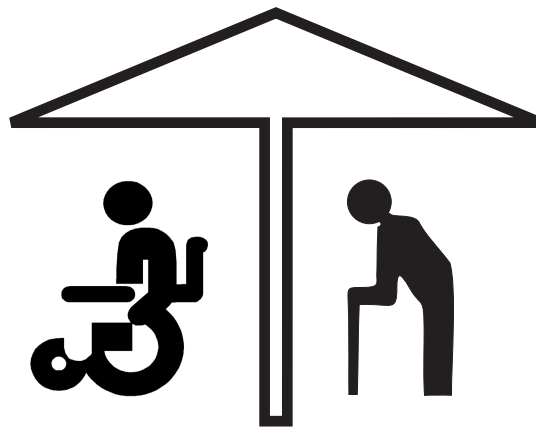

20. SOCIAL WELFARE

Sources and methods of data collection

Data on social welfare of children, youth and adults are based on regular statistical surveys. Data on institutions for accommodation of children, youth and adults and social work centres are collected biannually.

Data on minor and adult beneficiaries, forms, measures and services of social welfare are collected annually.

Coverage

Statistical reports on social welfare cover field 85, group 853 of Classification of Activities.

Definitions

Institutions for children and youth provide temporary or permanent care, meals, health care, education, upbringing and professional training of children and youth who need this kind of help.

Institutions for accommodation of children deprived of parental care homes for infants and small children and children's comprise.

These institutions also provide education and upbringing of children and youth until conditions are met for their return to their family, accommodation in foster family or another institution, as well as preparation for independent life.

Institutions for accommodation and care of physically and mentally handicapped children and youth (institutions for mentally handicapped children, institutions for physically handicapped children) provide (depending on the kind and degree of handicap) temporary or permanent accommodation, care, upbringing and education, and training for work under special conditions.

Institutions for work with socially and emotionally maladjusted children and youth (shelter stations, institutes-homes) provide shelter and temporary accommodation for socially and emotionally maladjusted children and youth with the aim to return them, as soon as possible, to parents or guardians or to a competent body if they have been found wandering, or begging. They also provide upbringing, education and professional training.

Institutions for adults (shelters, old-people homes and homes for pensioners, homes for adult disabled persons, combined homes) provide temporary or permanent accommodation, meals, care and health care to adults and the aged without means of subsistence and family care and who are physically and mentally handicapped, thus being unfit for independent life and without conditions to receive care and assistance in their family.

Enterprises for professional rehabilitation (protective workshops, institutes-centres and enterprises) provide professional qualification and employment to persons with reduced working capabilities.

Beneficiary of social welfare is any person who, during a reference year, used once or several times any of forms, measures or services of social welfare. Classification of beneficiaries has been done according to basic category representing the predominant disturbance of an individual i.e. his basic situation for social welfare. Social welfare beneficiaries are classified into minor and adult beneficiaries.

The concept form, measure or service of social welfare comprises each of realized social welfare by a social welfare centre or social welfare service in line with decision passed on the basis of law and regulations form this domain.

Data on forms, measures and services of social welfare relate to the number of cases of individual forms, measures and services carried out in course of the reference period and not to the number of persons.

SOCIAL CARE OF CHILDREN AND YOUTH

Sources and methods of data collection

Data on social care of children and youth have been obtained by regular annual reports.

Data on pre-school institutions refer to the situation in September.

Data on pupils' and students' hostels refer to the period from 01.04. to 31.12. of the reference year and from 01.01. do 31.03. of the next year.

Coverage

The annual reports in the field of social care of children and youth cover pre-school educational institutions pupils' and students' hostels and children's allowance.

Definitions

Pre-school educational institutions provide day nursery, upbringing and education, preventive medical care and social services through the organization of various forms of work with children up to their school age. The work may be organized on the following basis: daily, half-day five-day, shortened, periodical, etc.

Pupils' hostels provide accommodation, meals and upbringing to pupils of primary and secondary schools during schooling outside their parent-earner domicile, as well as to pupils needing accommodation for some other reasons.

Students' hostels provide accommodation to students of high schools, faculties and art academies during their studies. Besides accommodation the students may also have meals in these hostels.

Children's allowance is a special form of social care of children – a monthly cash benefit to families with lower income for creating more favorable conditions for upbringing and education of children.

SOCIAL INSURANCE

Sources and methods of data collection

Data on social insurance have been collected by regular statistical reports from health insurance offices, that is, health funds and funds of pension and disability insurance.

Definitions

Active insurants are all employees and other persons having an obligation of compulsory health insurance contribution by regulations of the republics.

Persons entitled to rights by pension and disablement insurance schemes cover persons entitled to pension (old-age, disablement, survivors', as well as those entitled to appropriate pension on the basis of years of service in another county with which a convention on social insurance has been signed), persons entitled to benefit for physical injury, assistance and nursing and persons entitled to rights on disablement insurance.

Temporary incapacity for work of insurants covers cases and days of incapacity due to sickness, professional injuries, professional disease – nursing a family member and isolation for which an insurant is entitled to compensation instead of salaries (wages).

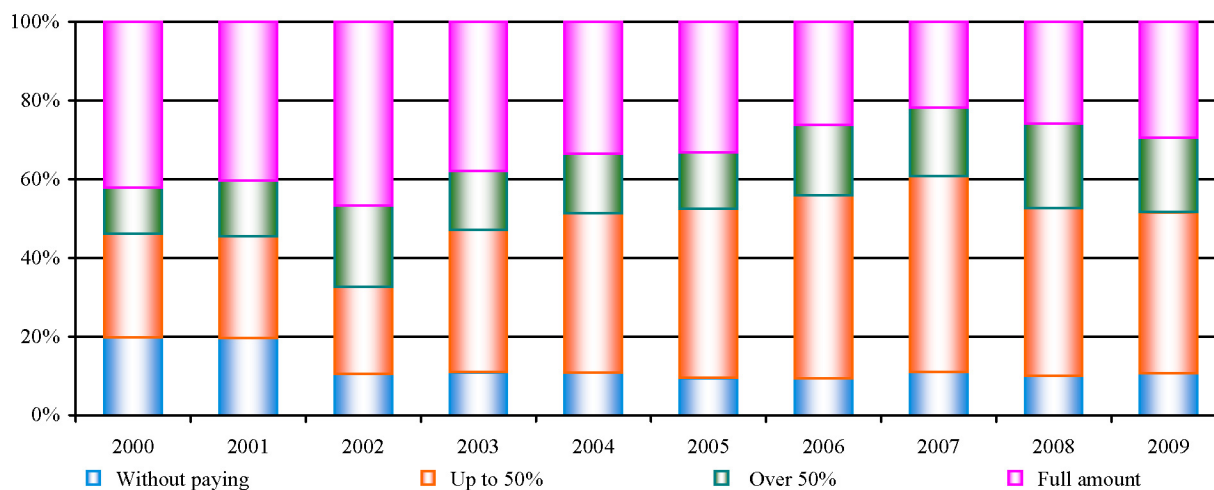

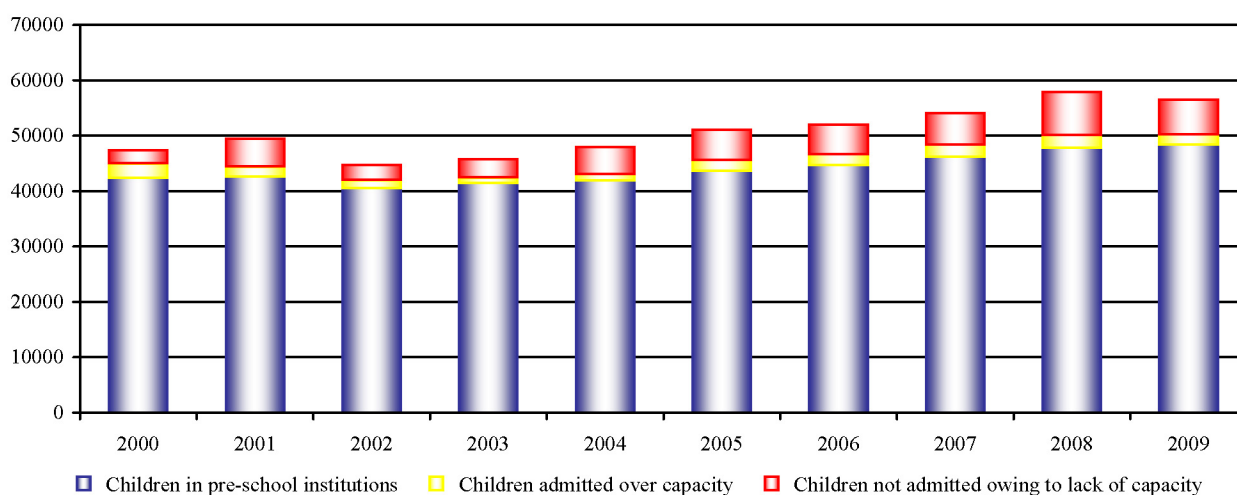

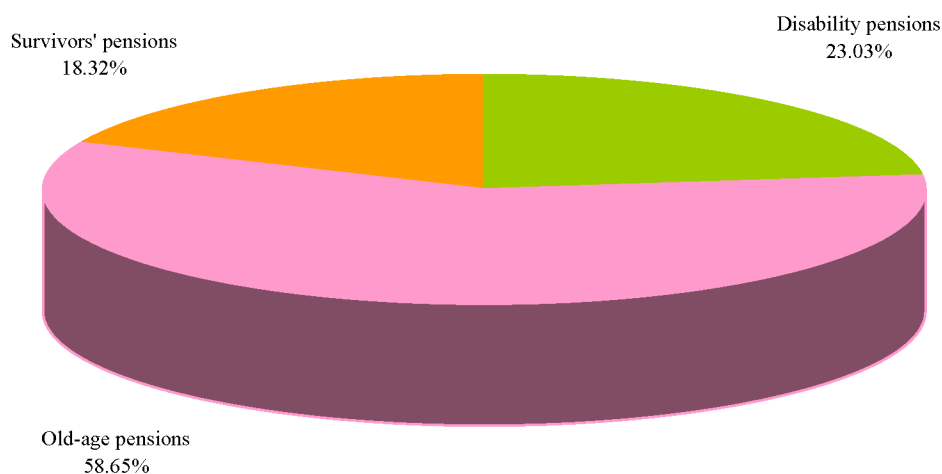

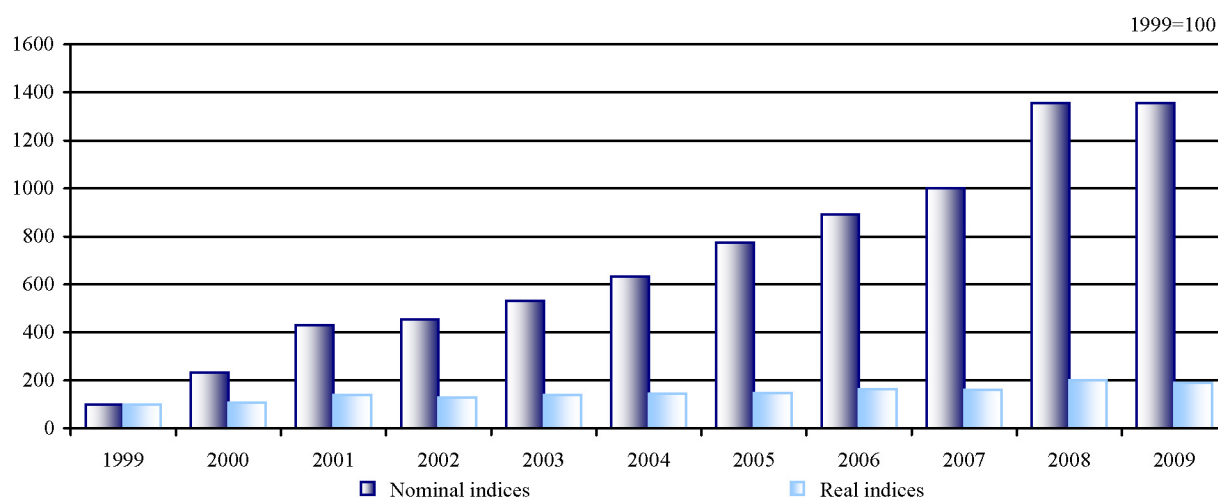

21. ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE

Sources and methods of data collection

Data on minor and adult perpetrators of criminal offences, responsible and legal persons perpetrators of economic violations have been derived from current statistical survey „Uniform Criminality Observation System in FRY”, which has been conducted by statistical agencies since 1st January 1973.

Data on persons punished for violations, courts and judges, public prosecutors' offices and public prosecutors, administrative litigation and civil suits, have been obtained from the Ministry of Justice of Serbia.

Coverage

Coverage of criminal, offences, as socially negative events, is full as statistical surveys comprise all adult and minor perpetrators of criminal offences (including also criminal offences of unknown perpetrators) and responsible and legal entities – perpetrators of economic violations against whom a crime report is submitted to a competent public prosecutor's office and criminal proceedings were conducted and terminated legally in competent public prosecutor's office or courts. Furthermore, all legal and physical entities punished for violations, decided economic and administrative suits, civil suits instituted, as well as courts, judges and public prosecutor's offices are also covered.

Definitions

Adult perpetrators of criminal offences are persons who were 18 years old and over at the moment of criminal offence committal against whom the proceedings by crime report and preliminary proceedings terminated, accused persons against whom the criminal proceedings terminated by finally binding court decision and sentenced persons.

A reported person – known perpetrator is an adult perpetrator of criminal offence against whom proceedings by crime report and preliminary proceeding terminated by a decision by which: a charge has been rejected, investigation suspended, investigation discontinued or charge sheet submitted.

A reported person – an unknown perpetrator is an unknown person against whom the crime report has been submitted to a public prosecutor's office and who was not detected one year after the moment of crime report submittal.

An accused person is an adult against whom an indictment, charge sheet, summary charge of a private suit has been submitted to a court, against whom criminal proceedings terminated by a finally-binding court decision by which, a private charge has been rejected by Article 445, pp. 4 of the Code on Criminal Procedure (CCP), proceedings have been discontinued or charge dismissed, perpetrator acquitted of the charge, charge rejected, security measure passed without stating sentence or a perpetrator has been pronounced guilty.

An adult who has been pronounced guilty and upon whom criminal law sanctions have been imposed: punishment, conditional sentence, judicial-admonition, security measures, and educational-corrective measures, as well as a person found guilty but discharged, is considered a sentenced person.

Minor perpetrators of criminal offences are persons, who at the time of criminal offence committal, were 14 and not yet 18 years old, against whom proceedings on the grounds of crime report have not been instituted (crime report dismissed) or preparatory proceedings discontinued, against whom the charge motion for pronouncing sentence-measure has been submitted to the juvenile court, criminal proceedings before the juvenile court discontinued and upon whom law sanctions have been imposed.

A minor who turned 14 at the time of criminal offence committal but not reached the age of 16 years, who may not be punished except by educational measures is considered a junior minor. A minor who at the time of criminal offence committal turned 16 years but not yet reached the age of 18 years who may be punished to juvenile imprisonment is considered a senior minor.

A reported person is a minor against whom criminal proceedings on the grounds of a crime report have not been instituted, (crime report dismissed) against whom preparatory proceedings are discontinued or the charge motion is submitted to a juvenile court for pronouncing sentence or educational measures.

An accused person is a minor against whom a charge motion has been submitted to a juvenile court for pronouncing sentence-measure, so the proceedings terminated by a finally binding judgement in a juvenile court, security measure without imposing criminal law sanctions or juvenile imprisonment or educational-corrective measure have been pronounced.

A minor perpetrator of a criminal offence against whom a criminal law sanction – juvenile imprisonment or educational measure has been passed, is considered a convicted person.

Responsible persons-perpetrators of economic violations are responsible persons for certain number of assignments in economic and financial operations, in a legal entity agency or a local community, another government agency or a local community, who have violated the rules on economic and financial operations, against whom the crime report on economic violation has been dismissed, charge submitted, and proceeding terminated by legally binding court decision by which: proceedings have been suspended or discontinued, charge sheet dismissed or denied, perpetrator acquitted of the charge, pronounced responsible but discharged, or pronounced responsible with law sanction passed.

Legal entities who have violated the rules on economic and financial operations, against whom proceedings have been terminated for economic violations in the above stated manner are considered legal entities perpetrators of economic violations.

Persons convicted for violations are: legal entities fined and physical persons – responsible persons, adults and minors fined, sentenced to imprisonment or to whom educational measure has been pronounced.

Criminal offences are shown by groups of criminal offences on the basis of the Uniform Classification of Criminal Offences prescribed by the Statistical Office of the Republic of Serbia.

Economic violations are shown by kinds of violations on the basis of Uniform Classification of Economic Violations prescribed by the Statistical Office of the Republic of Serbia.

Types of violations are shown according to the Uniform Classification of Violations.

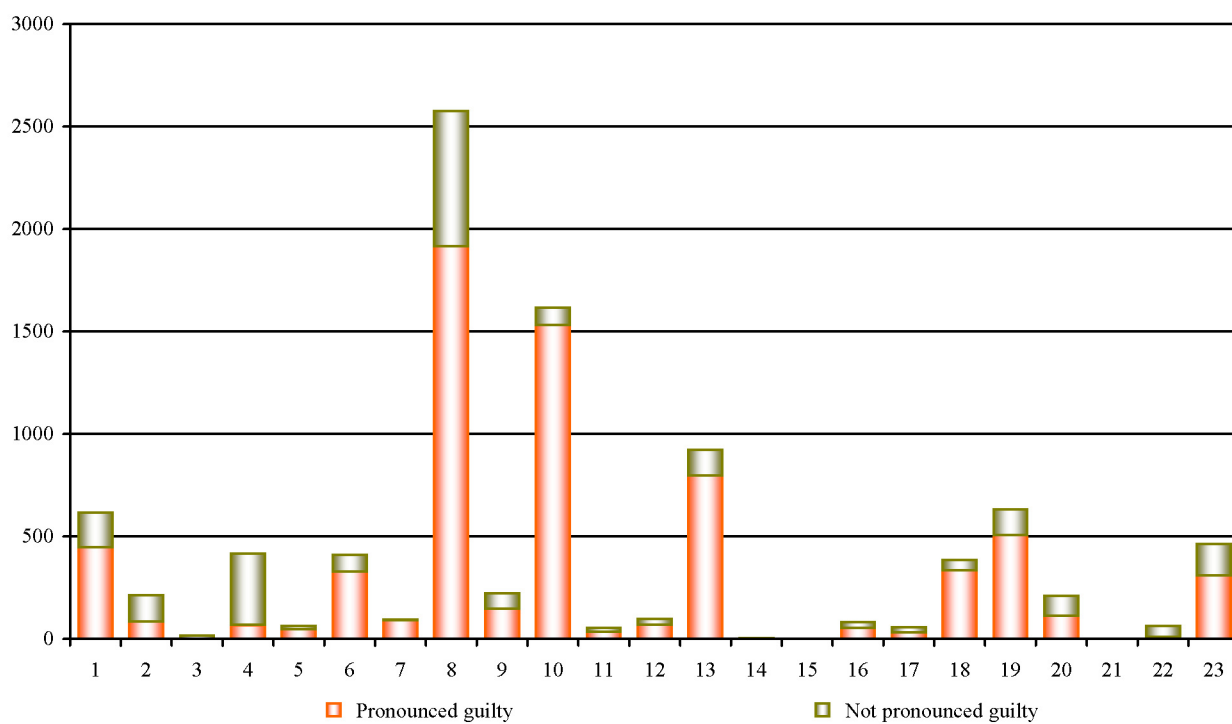
