

Immigration notes

All visitors require a passport or Australian Document of Identity that is valid for a period longer than their period of intended stay on Norfolk Island, an onward/return airline ticket out of Norfolk Island and proof of suitable accommodation on-island. Passports not issued by Australia or New Zealand must be valid for a period of at least one month beyond the period of intended stay on Norfolk Island.

All visitors require an Australian visa except for Australian and New Zealand passport holders or persons holding a passport endorsed with a Permanent Resident of Norfolk Island visa label. The required Australian visa must be valid for a period of 30 days beyond the period of intended stay on Norfolk Island. If arrival to Norfolk Island is via Australia, that visa must be a multiple entry visa.

Persons who comply with Norfolk Island entry requirements will usually be deemed to have been granted a visitors permit on arrival allowing a stay on Norfolk Island of up to 30 days. Extensions may be granted by contacting the Norfolk Island Immigration Department after arrival on telephone 22140 ext 2.

Further conditions and travel documentation and permit requirements apply to persons seeking or intending to commence employment on Norfolk Island. Health and police clearances must also be obtained prior to commencing employment. Penalties apply to an employer and employees for breach of these requirements. Further information is available from the Norfolk Island Immigration Department.

Privacy Statement

Information sought on the Norfolk Island Passenger Arrival Card is required to administer Customs, Health, Quarantine, Immigration, Police and Electoral laws. Collection and dissemination of this information is authorised by legislation administered by the Norfolk Island Agencies. These agencies may disclose this information only to those Government bodies authorised to receive it under Norfolk Island law.

At the Airport

- After collecting your baggage you proceed to Passport Control.
- Give your Arrival Card to an official. You may be stopped and questioned about your declaration. Your baggage will also be subjected to further scrutiny including search x-ray or detector dog examination.
- The Arrival Card is a legal document - false declarations can lead to penalties including confiscation of goods, fines, prosecution and imprisonment.
- When leaving the Customs Arrival Hall a representative from the Visitors Information Centre will direct you to your transport.

Biosecurity notes

As Norfolk Island is relatively free from pests and diseases of animals and plants very strict biosecurity procedures are carried out at the airport and ports. You are required to declare to a Customs Officer in Part 6 of the Norfolk Island Passenger Arrival Card all items in your possession that are listed below. **If you are not sure about any items ask a Customs Officer. NOTE: Heavy penalties apply for false declarations.**

Animal and Animal Products

- Live animals, pets, birds, fish, and insects
- Meat and meat products (fresh or cooked)
- Dairy products including cheese, milk, milk powder, butter and ghee
- Egg and egg products including egg powder; and instant meal products
- Fish/shellfish (fresh, dried and frozen)
- Honey, pollen, honeycombs and bees wax
- Feathers, bones, tusks, furs, skins, hunting trophies, stuffed animals and reptiles
- Unprocessed wool and animal hair; including yarns, rugs and apparel
- Coral, turtle and tortoise shells and ivory
- Sea shells
- Biological specimens

Plants and Plant Products

- Fruit and vegetables (fresh, dried, frozen or cooked)
- Nuts unprocessed and raw
- Herbs and spices
- Noodles and rice
- Mushrooms and fungi (fresh or dried)
- Plants live and dried, including plant cuttings and budwood
- Seeds, bulbs, corms, rhizomes and tubers
- Straw and mats in any form
- Cut flowers, dried flowers and leaves
- Pine cones and pot pourri
- Wood carvings and artefacts
- Bamboo, cane, rattan and basketware
- Soil and water

Other items

- Camping/hiking/hunting gear and boots, bicycles and spiked/cleated/studded sporting shoes
- Animal food, remedies supplements, cultures and biologicals
- Riding gear, including clothing, footwear and grooming equipment
- Equipment and clothing used in association with animals

Miscellaneous

You must declare if you have:

- been to a farm, abattoir or meat/dairy packing house
- visited a forest or been hiking/camping/hunting in rural areas or parkland.

You must list all countries you have been in, (including lived in), during the past 30 days.

Failure to make a correct declaration may result in prosecution resulting in a fine or imprisonment.

Customs notes

Prohibited and Restricted Items

Prohibited and restricted goods include:

- Weapons such as firearms, flick knives, sword sticks
- Illicit drugs and drug paraphernalia
- Endangered species of Flora & Fauna, and products derived from these endangered species.
- Firearms (Some firearms are prohibited and some are restricted. Check with the Customs Officer)

Personal Concessions

Your personal concession allows you to bring into Norfolk Island free of duty the following:

- Goods obtained overseas with a total combined value of not more than A\$900 (A\$450 for passengers under 18. Don't count clothing, toiletries and jewellery intended for your own personal use and not for gift, sale or exchange) **and, if you are 18 years of age or over, you are also entitled to;**
- 2.25 litres of alcoholic beverages for each passenger; and,
- 250 cigarettes or 250 grams of tobacco products

Cash Reporting

- If you are carrying A\$10,000, or more in Australian or foreign currency equivalent, you must report this to a Customs officer when you are completing Customs formalities on arrival in Norfolk Island.

Health Notes

If you become ill within the next three weeks with: diarrhoea, skin rash, fever, please see a doctor and say you have recently arrived from overseas. Whilst medical care for sickness is not free to visitors the cost may be covered by your health insurance if you have taken out coverage.

Protection of Norfolk Island's Moveable and Cultural Heritage

There are severe penalties for attempting to export goods that are part of Norfolk Island's moveable cultural heritage without an appropriate certificate or permit.

WARNING

The importation of prohibited goods, smuggling, and using false receipts brings the risk of fines, loss of goods, or even imprisonment. Think, is it worth the risk?
