Crusaders sign three Wales internationals

Celtic Crusaders have signed three Wales under-19 internationals to boost their squad before their opening match of the season at home to Widnes Vikings on Friday February 9th (kick-off 7.30pm).

Tom Burnell joins the Crusaders from last years Welsh Grand Finalists, Cardiff Demons, Owen Lewis comes from Pontypridd-based Valley Cougars, while Chris Vitalini hails from Newport Titans. All three played for the Wales under-19 side against Australia in Blackwood last year.

The club have also announced that Lee Williams, who scored two tries in three appearances for the Crusaders last season, has also been retained for the 2007 season. Lee was captain of both the Wales and Great Britain under-19 squads last year and has also played rugby union for the Wales Sevens side this season.

Crusaders' Operations Manager Gerald McCarthy said: "This week's new signings are further proof that we are looking to develop rugby league in Wales and to develop the local talent. We'll need a lot of strength in depth for these tough matches."

Commenting on Tom Burnell's move, Demons' director Simon Davies said: "This is excellent news for Cardiff Demons, Celtic Crusaders and Tom. We're always delighted when our junior programme produces players of a calibre to move up to the professional ranks."
