Since winning the national competition at year 7 in the Millennium Stadium, this year group continue to excel as being the top team in Wales.

Celtic Crusaders' Neale Wyatt was on hand to present the trophies for the first two finals and he said: "I really enjoyed the matches. It was easy to see that they these games were finals as they were played at a very high standard. The games were competitive and also played in good spirit.
