HEAD COACH BUDDY ALEXANDER



BUDDY ALEXANDER

HEAD COACH (24TH SEASON AT FLORIDA, 35TH OVERALL) GEORGIA SOUTHERN, 1975

In 32 years of coaching, University of Florida men's golf head coach Buddy Alexander has made significant contributions to enhance not only the Gator program, but college golf as a whole. Alexander's experience and success are the main reason why top recruits throughout the nation come to Gainesville every year to play for Florida. Alexander's accomplishments are so revered that he has already earned a spot in the Golf Coaches' Association of America's Hall of Fame.

A two-time All-American as a collegiate golfer, Alexander graduated from Georgia Southern in 1975 and later collected several amateur titles. Two years after earning his bachelor's degree in recreation, he won the 1977 Eastern Amateur Championship. In 1986, he won the U.S. Amateur Championship and was a member of the World Cup Team. The following year, he represented the U.S. in the Walker Cup. Success continued for Alexander in the 1990s, as he captured medalist honors at the Florida State Amateur.

Alexander has taken his success on the golf course and implemented it in his coaching career. Since arriving in Gainesville in January 1988, he has guided the Gators to seven top-five finishes in NCAA Championships play and eight Southeastern Conference team titles. He has been the architect for two of Florida's four national titles, claiming the first in 1993 and the second in 2001, as well as NCAA runner-up finishes in 1990 and 2006. In his time at the University of Florida, Alexander has also coached an NCAA individual champion, a U.S. Amateur Champion, 30 All-Americans, six SEC individual champions (including four two-time winners) and seen Matt Every become the first Gator to win the prestigious Ben Hogan Award.

For the 10th consecutive season, the Gators earned the privilege to play at the NCAA Championships in 2010 when they finished in third place at the NCAA Central Regional. The trip to Ooltewah, Tenn., marked the 23rd time in Alexander's 24 years at the helm that Florida advanced to the final tournament of the season. The upperclassmen led the way for Florida in 2009-10, as seniors Tyson Alexander (Buddy's son) and Tim McKenney led the Gators in almost every statistical category and were named to the All-SEC first and second teams, respectively. The duo joined redshirt junior Andres Echavarría and junior Bank Vongvanij on the PING Division I All-Region Team. Alexander and Echavarría both earned the first individual tournament wins of their career and the Gators finished first at both of their home tournaments.

The Gators had eight top-five finishes on the season, including two tournament wins in 2009-10. They defended their title at the Gator Invitational for the seventh-straight year and also won the inaugural Golden Ocala Collegiate. Tyson Alexander earned honorable mention All-America accolades and was named a first team All-SEC selection. McKenney earned second-team All-SEC honors and

Phillip Choi was named to the SEC All-Freshman team. In addition, Vongvanij was named the 2010 SEC Scholar Athlete of the Year.

In 2008-09, Florida finished 19th in the NCAA Championships and third at the SEC Championships. The Gators had eight top-five finishes on the season, including three tournament wins. They defended their title at the Gator Invitational for the sixth straight year and won the inaugural Golden Ocala Collegiate. Senior Billy Horschel earned first-team All-America honors for the third time, and joined Gary Koch as the only two Gators to earn first-team All-SEC honors four times. Horschel was also named the SEC Golfer of the Year for the second time after winning the individual medalist honors at the SEC Championship and leading the SEC with a 71.28 stroke average. Tyson Alexander and McKenney were named to the All-Southeast Region team for 2009, and McKenney earned second-team All-SEC honors. The Gators also continued to succeed in the classroom, having eight players named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

During the 2007-08 campaign, Alexander directed the Gators to an 11th-place finish at the NCAA Championships. UF had 10 top-five finishes out of the 14 tournaments it played. For the fifth year in a row, Florida won its home tournament, the SunTrust Gator Invitational, blowing away the field by 12 strokes. Horschel was named a first-team All-SEC performer, while Tyler Brown and Manuel Villegas were named to the All-SEC second-team. Horschel was also named a second-team All-American and Villegas was given honorable mention All-American recognition.

The 2006-07 season saw Alexander lead a young Gator squad to a tie for ninth at the NCAA Championships, earning the 28th top-10 national finish in program history. UF won a pair of tournaments during the year, reaching the top spot in the polls at one point along the way, Horschel and Villegas combined to earn three individual medals under Alexander's guidance. Horschel, who won the PING/Golfweek Preview Invitational and tied for first at the NCAA East Regional, earned Florida's fourth-ever SEC Player of the Year honor — all of which have come with Alexander at the helm. The fact that the Gators played Golfweek's top-ranked schedule in 2006-07 makes Alexander's coaching

during the campaign all the more impressive.

A 2002 inductee into the GCAA Hall of Fame, Alexander directed one of the greatest seasons in Gator golf history in 2005-06. The St. Petersburg, Fla., native led a Florida team that finished first or second in 10 of 13 tournaments, including four wins, en route to a second-place showing at the NCAA Championships. The Gators also had four players — seniors Matt Every, Brett Stegmaier and James Vargas and then-freshman Horschel — earn PING All-America honors.

Under Alexander's direction in 2003-04, the Gators were a major force on the national scene once again, winning seven times in 14 tournaments and never finishing outside the top-six in any event during the season. The squad tied a school record by placing in the top-five in 13 straight tournaments to begin the season, and later posted the 26th top-10 finish at the NCAA Championships in school history by tying for sixth. Florida was also ranked No.1 in the nation for almost the entire season in every poll and ranking.

For all of the Gators' success in '03-04, Alexander earned his fourth National Coach of the Year honor from the GCAA. In addition, he was honored as both the SEC Coach of the

Year and as the GCAA Southeast Region Coach of the Year for the second consecutive season.

Overall, Alexander has hauled in 18 Coach of the Year awards in his storied career, including an impressive 16 while at the helm of the Gators. He has received the GCAA Coach of the Year award three times, three NCAA District 3 Coach of the Year Awards, five NCAA District 3 South

Coach of the Year awards and seven SEC Coach of the Year awards.

Alexander has guided golf programs at Georgia Southern, LSU and Florida, producing 15 top-10 NCAA finishes in 29 years. He has totaled 80 tournament victories at LSU and Florida, with his players earning 58 All-America honors and 74 All-SEC selections.

Alexander's coaching career began when he returned to his alma mater, Georgia Southern, in 1977, to accept the position of head men's golf coach. In his four years with the Eagles, he produced four NCAA Championships appearances, highlighted by a seventh-place finish in 1980. In 1979, he was named NCAA District 3 Co-Coach of the Year. While in Statesboro, Alexander coached three future PGA Tour members, including winners Mike Donald and Jodie Mudd. He also found the time to earn his master's degree in educational administration from GSU in 1980.

Alexander left the coaching ranks to compete on the professional tour that year, but returned in 1983 after he accepted the head coaching position at LSU. In only his second year, Alexander led the Tigers to a second-place finish at the SEC Championship and sixth place at the NCAA Championships. For his efforts, Alexander was named the 1984 NCAA District 3 Coach of the Year.

In 1986, he was voted SEC Co-Coach of the Year after the Tigers' first-place finish at the SEC Championships, a title the team successfully defended in 1987. While in Baton Rouge, Alexander coached four All-Americans and 11 future members of the professional tour, including PGA Tour champion David Toms.

Alexander regained his amateur status in 1986 and won the U.S. Amateur Championship, the third-oldest golf title in the world. He is still the only active coach to have won the most esteemed tournament in amateur golf. Following the 1987 season at LSU, Alexander briefly left coaching to work for a Cleveland-based sports management firm before arriving at Florida.

Alexander returned to his home state in January 1988 to accept the position of head men's golf coach at UF. Since then, he has established the Gator golf program as a top contender in both the SEC and the nation. Florida captured the SEC Championship in just his second season, leading to his attaining the 1989 NCAA District 3 South Coach of the Year award. The following year, he led the Gators to runner-up finishes at both the SEC Championships and the NCAA Championships.

From 1991-94, Alexander's Gators dominated the SEC, winning four consecutive conference championships. In 1991, he was named SEC Coach of the Year, and later guided UF to the 1993 NCAA Championship, the program's first crown since 1973. For his efforts, he achieved the double of taking home the SEC and GCAA Coach of the Year. In 2001, Alexander claimed

STEVE BRADLEY ASSISTANT COACH THIRD SEASON

Steve Bradley enters his third season as an assistant coach at Florida. Bradley was a member of the UF golf team from 1997-1999 under Coach Buddy Alexander.

Bradley helped lead the Gators to their 10th-straight NCAA Championships to cap the 2009-10 season. The Gators posted two tournament wins and finished in the top-five in eight of their 13 tournaments. Under Bradleys tutelage, Tyson Alexander and Andres Echavarría both earned their first individual tournament wins of their respective careers. The Gators were also successful in the classroom, as eight UF golfers were named to the Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll, led by Bank Vonvanij, who was named the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year for men's golf.

In his first year as an assistant coach at Florida, Bradley helped lead the Gators to the NCAA Championship for the ninth straight year after claiming the title at the NCAA Southwest Regional. The Gators had eight top-five

finishes on the season, including three tournament wins. They defended their title at the Gator Invitational for the sixth-straight year and won the inaugural Golden Ocala Collegiate.

Bradley, a former captain of the men's golf team at UF, transferred from Florida State in 1997 and spent two seasons with the Gators before graduating in 1999. He had two top-10 finishes during his senior year and helped lead the Gators to the SEC Championship title in 1999. He was named a second-team All-SEC performer during his junior year in 1997-98. His best collegiate finish came as runner-up at the 1998 Morris Williams Intercollegiate.

Before transferring to UF, Bradley led Florida State with five top-20 finishes during his sophomore year. As an amateur, Bradley won the 1996 Florida State Amateur title and qualified for the 1994 U.S. Amateur.

He is originally from Ocala, where he was an All-State se-

lection at Forest High School and led his team to the 1994 Florida State Championship.



GIO VALIANTE VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH NINTH SEASON

Dr. Gio Valiante is entering his ninth season working with the Gator golf team and will help in the area of psychological performance. Dr. Valiante received his Ph.D. from Emory University and currently is a professor of education and sport psychology at Rollins College in Winter Park, Fla.

The focus of his research has been on the relationship between confidence and performance in achievement in varied environments. His special areas of interest have been schooling and golf, where he has come to understand not only the types of experiences that develop confidence, but also strategies to nurture academic and athletic confidence into competitive resilience and achievement.

In the area of golf, Dr. Valiante has worked with golfers at every level, including the American Junior Golf Association, NCAA, ranked amateurs and PGA professionals. He is the mental game consultant to Golf Digest and the Golf Channel and regularly travels with the PGA Tour. His clients

have included Ernie Els, Matt Kuchar, Justin Leonard, Davis Love III, Notah Begay III, Gary Nicklaus, Heath Slocum and former Florida Gators Chris DiMarco and Camilo Villegas.

Dr. Valiante received his bachelor's and master's degree from the University of Florida, where the University Golf Course served as his initial laboratory for exploring the psychological aspects of the game of golf.

The Gators, who carded a final round score of 293 (+5), finished the week with a total team score of 869 (+5). UF failed to advance to the match play portion of the event by placing outside of the top eight.

Redshirt junior Andres Echavarria and freshman Phillip Choi carded identical final round scores of 73 (+1) on Thursday. The duo finished tied for 34th with a total score of even-par 216. Choi tallied four bogeys and three birdies on the day.

Seniors Tyson Alexander and Tim McKenney both capped their impressive collegiate careers on Thursday. Alexander, who was tied for 40th after day two, dropped to a tie for 64th after carding his highest score of the week, a three-over 75. He finished with a final score of 220 (73-73-75, +4). McKenney fell to a tie for 72nd after carding a four-over 76. He scored a five-over 221 (72-73-76) in his final collegiate tournament.

Redshirt-senior Andres Echavarria earned a medalist honor and led the Florida men's golf team to its 15th SEC Championship and first since 2003 on Sunday at the Sea Island Golf Club. The men's golf championship gave the University of Florida its 200th SEC Championship.

Florida has won SEC titles in volleyball, soccer, women's cross country, men's basketball, men's indoor track and field, women's tennis and men's golf, in addition to winning the ALC title in lacrosse.

As a team, the Gators led after every round, but the result was not decided until the last hole. The teams fought through windy conditions, rain and heat as several teams made a run for the title, but Florida held on and sealed the victory when Echavarria made a birdie and sophomore Phillip Choi and senior Bank Vongvanij made even par on hole 18.

They improved their score each day, going from a 285 on the first day, to 282 and 281 for the third round for a total score of 848 and three individual finishes in the top five.

Echavarria's medalist honor marked his third-career win and second this year after winning the Gator Invitational in a playoff on Feb. 13. He played solidly all three rounds, shooting even par for both the first and second rounds. He started the third round off well, shooting even par until making consecutive birdies on the eighth and ninth holes. He continued shooting even par until hole 13, where he made a double bogey to put him one stroke behind leader John Peterson (LSU). On the 18th hole, Echavarria made a birdie to tie with Peterson and force a playoff.

The playoff did not last long, as Peterson missed a putt for bogey as Echavarria shot even par to mark the sixth time in 10 tournaments a Florida individual has won.

Choi made one birdie and one bogey on the day to shoot even par and finish in a tie for third, marking his ninth-consecutive top-10 finish.

Vongvanij made four birdies and three bogeys to shoot a 69 and finish in fifth place. He has now finished in the top five in seven out of Florida's 10 tournaments.

Sophomore Tommy Mou shot a 73 and finished in a tie for 21st, while sophomore Tyler McCumber shot a 75 on the day.

A fourth and final-round score of two-under 69 by Richard Spears highlighted the Gators' upset of Houston for its first team title at the 71st Annual NCAA Championships. The two schools were tied after 54 holes and Houston held a one-stroke advantage after 63, but the 69th hole (a 525-yard, par five with a lake in front of the green) proved to be disastrous for the Cougars.

Two Houston golfers bogeyed the hole while Florida's Spears and Steve Melnyk recorded birdies to give the Gators a commanding lead that carried them to the victory stand.

Overcoming a two-shot deficit with two holes remaining, the Gators captured their third team title by one stroke at the 96th Annual NCAA Championships. UF, which shot a final-round 283 for a total of seven-under par 1,145, played par golf on the two most difficult holes on the course to grab the title. Georgia Tech finished runner-up with a six-under 1,146 and North Carolina placed third at 1,147. The one-stroke victory was the closest margin in the NCAA Championships since 1984.

Individually, junior Guy Hill was the Gators' top finisher, firing a final-round 69 (-3) to finish in a four-way tie for third with a tournament total of one-under par 287. Sophomore Chris Couch, who made a four-foot par putt on the 18th hole in the last round to clinch the team title, finished tied for seventh with an even-par 288. Sophomore Brad Lehmann fired a fourth-round 67, and junior Brian Gay tied for 19th, while senior John Pettit finished in a tie for 49th.

The Gators captured their fourth national title by firing a 13-under final round of 275 at the 2001 NCAA Championships hosted at Duke University Golf Course in Durham, N.C. Four Florida golfers turned in under-par rounds in the final 18 holes, including senior Nick Gilliam, whose final-round 71 gave him a total 186 and the individual medal. Gilliam became only the second Florida golfer to win the title, joining Bob Murphy, who took the crown in 1966.

Florida's school-record total of 1,126 was 18 strokes better than runner-up Clemson, the third-largest margin of victory since the NCAA Championships moved to four-round play in 1968. The win completed an incredible turnaround after the Gators shot an opening-round 296 to put them in a 13th-place tie, 16 shots from the lead. Florida then shot 10-under 278 on the second day to move into second place and finished the third round at 11-under, 277, to pull into a first-place tie with Arizona heading in the final 18 holes.

The Gators also featured one of the two golfers tied for the individual runner-up spot. Junior Camilo Benedetti shot a nine-under to finish at 279 to tie with Jamie Elson from Augusta State.

GATORS ON THE PRO TOUR

When it comes to success after college, the University of Florida golf program demonstrates this as well as any university in the country. More than 50 Gators have gone on to play professionally on the PGA Tour, Nationwide Tour and Champions Tour (formerly Senior PGA Tour). Former UF golfers have amassed over \$135 million in winnings.

Since 1957, when Doug Sanders, Dave Ragan and Pat Schwab entered the ranks, Gator alumni have hoisted the trophies for numerous tournaments, including three of the four majors. Andy North won the U.S. Open twice (1978, 85). Marl Calcavecchia won the British Open in 1989 and Tommy Aaron took home the coveted green jacket from the 1973 Masters tournament.

GATORS' AMATEUR SUCCESS

The U.S. Amateur Championships is the oldest and one of the most prestigious tournaments in the country – one day older than the U.S. Open. The Amateur has been a match-play championship with the exception of an eight year period, from 1965-72, when it was stroke play.

Four Florida players have etched their names on the Havermeyer Cup. Bob Murphy was the first Gator to win the U.S. Amateur when he took the title in 1965. Steve Melnyk followed by claiming the championship four years later. Fred Ridley went on to win the title in 1975, before Bubba Dickerson became the fourth Gator to win the U.S. Amateur in 2001. Current head coach Buddy Alexander is also a past winner, having taken the trophy in 1986. He is the only active college coach to own a U.S. Amateur title.

Gator Billy Horchel was one of the highlights of the 2006 Championship, firing an 18-hole tournament and USGA record 60 in the first round at Chaska Town Course in Chaska, Minn., en route to claiming the individual medal for the stroke-play portion of the tournament. He is the first golfer to bring the medal back to Gainesville since Brian Gay captured the top spot in 1993. Horchel collected two solid match-play wins before dropping a wild third-round match to eventual semifinalist Ryan Yip.

Several current Gators saw success during the summer of 2010 in amateur play. Redshirt senior Andres Echavarria won the Cardinal Amateur golf tournament. Seniors Bank Vongvanij and Echavarria and sophomore Phillip Choi all qualified for the 2010 U.S. Amateur Tournament. Vongvanij and Echavarria went on to finish in the top 10 in stroke play.

GATORS IN THE RYDER CUP

The Ryder Cup, now an international competition between the best golfers from Europe and the United States, has been contested 34 times over 78 years. Founded on pride rather than prize money, the Ryder Cup has featured 10 Gator golfers who have competed on 16 different Ryder Cup teams.

The first Ryder Cup was held in 1927, at the Worcester Country Club, in Worcester, Mass., where the team from the United States defeated the team from Great Britain, 9.5-2.5. Since that first Ryder Cup, there have been only two occasions that have caused the event to be cancelled or postponed. The breakout of World War II caused the cancellation of the 1939-45 matches, while the terrorist attacks on the United States in September of 2001 caused the postponement of the matches until the following year. Ryder Cup matches are now played during every even-numbered year, alternating venues in the United States and Europe.

The current Ryder Cup format was adopted in 1979, when the event expanded from the Great Britain/Ireland team to allow players from all European nations to compete.

MARK BOSTICK GOLF COURSE

With recent renovations on both the clubhouse and the golf course, the University of Florida continues to boast one of the finest overall facilities in collegiate golf. In the summer of 2008, the University Athletic Association spent \$1.8 million for renovations on the interior and exterior of the clubhouse. Just 10 years ago in 2001, the course underwent a \$4 million renovation.

The Gators have called the University of Florida Golf Club (formerly the Gainesville Golf and Country Club) home since 1962. A \$1.1 million clubhouse was completed in the summer of 1998 on the site of the original clubhouse thanks to a donation from former UF student and Gator Booster Guy Bostick.

In 2001-02, Gator golf moved into a new era, playing on a fully-renovated course. Improvements and additions were made over the years, but the full-scale renovation was the first in two decades.

The University of Florida hired Jacksonville-based architect Bobby Weed to head the renovation project, and along with an experienced staff, he constructed a course that poses a challenge to any college golfer. Weed and his team kept UFGC's par at 70, but increased the yardage to 6,701 yards.

In 2008, the University Athletic Association spent \$1.8 million to renovate the clubhouse facilities. The updated clubhouse features renovated locker rooms for both UF teams with wooden lockers and a new team lounge area. New offices were added for the UF golf coaches and the pro shop, snack bar and public locker rooms were renovated and expanded. The new entryway features trophy cases that display UF golf championship trophies and highlight the program's success.

Each year, the Mark Bostick Golf Course plays host to several championship tournaments. Included among the events

are the Gator and Lady Gator Golf Day Pro-Am, which bring alumni and current PGA players back to Gainesville to pledge their time and money to help the winning tradition of the Florida golf program continue. The course has also hosted the Southeastern Conference championship, as well as various state tournaments.

The Gainesville and Black Diamond Country Clubs serve as secondary home courses for the Gators.

TEACHING CENTERS

One of the many amenities of the Gators' home course is the one-of-a-kind training facility adjacent to the 14th hole. The facility is equipped with a computerized video system that analyzes the players' swings from a number of different angles. The Teaching Center also includes two covered outdoor hitting stations to protect the golfers from the elements, a putting area, restroom and storage room. The \$90,000 project covers 680 square feet and was made possible by Steve Melnyk, a 1969 UF graduate and three-time All-American golfer.

The practice facility also incorporates a two-tier practice and hitting area, a \$10,000 square-foot putting green and two generous greenside bunkers.

"The Teaching Center is a huge lift to our program," head coach Buddy Alexander says. "It gives us a state-of-the-art video facility that has greatly enhanced our instruction of the team."
