
### Methodology

- The EKOS survey sampled 1,124 Liberal Party of Canada delegates between October 31 and November 2, 2006.
  - A sample of this size produces a statistical margin of error of +/- 2.5 percentage points, 19 times out of 20.
  - The margin of error increases when the results are sub-divided (i.e. error margins for sub-groups).
- All the data were statistically weighted to ensure the sample's region and 1st ballot support composition reflects that of the actual population of voting delegates at the December leadership convention. Regional proportions were adjusted to account for the lack of delegates from British Columbia in the sample frame, due to that province being under review by the LPC at the time of the poll.
- Note: the poll did not include ex-officios delegates (e.g., MPs, riding presidents).


#### Likelihood of Attending the Liberal Leadership Convention

Q: Given your current plans, how likely are you to attend the Liberal leadership convention in Montreal in December? Would you say you are . . .




#### Dion delegates less likely to attend convention

Q: Given your current plans, how likely are you to attend the Liberal leadership convention in Montreal in December? Would you say you are . . .




#### Required First Ballot Support Retention



■ % delegates who indicate that first ballot requirement is also their first choice for leader


#### First Choice for Preferred Winner

Q: Who among the current candidates for the leadership of the Liberal Party would you most like to see win?




#### Second Choice for Preferred Winner

Q: And who would be your second choice?




#### Who do the front-runner delegates pick for second choice?

Q: And who would be your second choice?




#### Who do also-ran delegates pick for second choice?

Q: Who among the current candidates for the leadership of the Liberal Party would you most like to see win? And who would be your second choice?




#### Third Choice for Preferred Winner

#### Growth Potential Index – 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> Choice Combined


Q: Who among the current candidates for the leadership of the Liberal Party would you most like to see win? And who would be your second choice?


#### Preference Between Ignatieff and Rae

Q: Of the two candidates currently leading, Bob Rae and Michael Ignatieff, which would you prefer to see win?




#### Preference by Kennedy and Dion delegates

Q: Of the two candidates currently leading, Bob Rae and Michael Ignatieff, which would you prefer to see win?




#### **Least Favoured Candidate**

Q: Is there any candidate you would definitely NOT like to see win?




#### Candidate Least Favoured by Kennedy and Dion delegates

Q: Is there any candidate you would definitely NOT like to see win?




#### Candidate Best Positioned to Win a Federal Election

Q: Which of the candidates for the Liberal leadership would you say has the best chance of winning the next federal election?




#### Support for LPC Adoption of Quebec as a Nation Policy

Q: Do you think that the Liberal Party of Canada should adopt as policy a commitment to recognizing Quebec officially as a "nation"?




#### Support for Policy Among the LPC Delegates
