

Proclamation

City of Tarpon Springs, Florida

Whereas, His Eminence Archbishop Demetrios of America, and His Eminence Metropolitan Alexios of Atlanta, will be celebrating the Feast Day of Epiphany; and

Whereas, The City of Tarpon Springs has been identified by history and tradition as the City in the United States with the longest consecutive celebration of the Feast Day of Epiphany and home to the oldest and largest celebration in the United States; and

Whereas, The City of Tarpon Springs has been internationally known and officially designated as *Epiphany City*; and

Whereas, The City of Tarpon Springs is home to St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Cathedral (Patron Saint to spongers, shrimping and fishing seaman); and

Whereas, The Feast Day of Epiphany is steadfast and true to the belief and customs-rich in tradition and cultural of the Orthodox Christian Faith; and

Whereas, His Eminence Archbishop Demetrios, and His Eminence Metropolitan Alexios have bestowed special honor on the City of Tarpon Springs and the St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Cathedral for their participation on this special occasion of the Feast Day of Epiphany.

Now, Therefore, I David O. Archie, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Tarpon Springs, do hereby proclaim January 6, 2012 as

The Feast Day of Epiphany
