Arrests

All suspects are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

Drug Trafficking: On November 11, 2012, Alica Mitchell, 22, of Elizabeth City was arrested for possession with intent to sell a controlled substance and trafficking in opium or heroin.

Conspiracy to Possess Stolen Property: On November 21, Heather Austin was arrested for Conspiracy to Possess Stolen Property and also charged by Nags Head PD for Larceny by Employee resulting from a investigation of a case involving both jurisdictions.

Rape Suspect Awaiting Extradition: On August 16, 2008 reggae artist Ripton J. Hylton, stage name “Eek-a-mouse,” was arrested for rape and narcotic possession. He fled the country and an arrest warrant with a million dollar bond was issued. On November 21 he was found in Paraguay without a proper visa and deported. As of November 29 he is custody in Florida awaiting extradition to North Carolina. The Kill Devil Hills Police Department wishes to thank the District Attorney’s office, the FBI, and the State Department for their invaluable work in bringing Hylton to justice.

Crimes Under Investigation
