Welcome

Welcome to the seventh edition of Edinburgh by Numbers. Produced by the City of Edinburgh Council, the publication provides an annual statistical overview of Edinburgh and its comparative economic performance.

While the macro environment in Scotland and the UK has been subdued in 2012, Edinburgh continues to perform better than other areas. The City was voted 'Best Large European City of the Future' and 'Best Large European City: Foreign Direct Investment Strategy' by the Financial Times fDi Magazine. The City was also chosen by the UK Government as the location of the headquarters of the world's first Green Investment Bank; with the Council, Edinburgh Chamber of Commerce and other partners contributing to the business case. Residents' satisfaction with Edinburgh as a place to live is exceptionally high at 97%, as shown in the results of the Edinburgh People's Survey.

The importance of jobs to residents and the need to cultivate the economy are central to Edinburgh's Economic Strategy for 2012-2017; A Strategy for Jobs. The Strategy, developed with the support of public and private partners, will shape the direction of the Council's Economic Development Service over the coming years. The focus will be on delivering three clear targets by 2017:

- Creating or safeguarding 20,000 new jobs;
- Attracting £1.3 billion of new development; and
- Assisting 10,000 people facing significant barriers to the labour market into work or learning.

Great progress on the Strategy has already been made for example through



the Edinburgh Guarantee. Employers throughout the city have shown fantastic support for the initiative. In the last year, the Edinburgh Guarantee team has engaged with approximately 80 partners to identify over 400 opportunities for Edinburgh School Leavers, with over 170 young people already supported into employment or training.

2012 also saw the City of Edinburgh Business Gateway team move into the Council. A fully integrated service to support new and growing businesses is now available, which in turn will create jobs and further strengthen Edinburgh's economy.



Age structure 2011







Figure 3 Projected population by age band (2010 based) 2010-35





Overseas workers registering in Edinburgh*, by country of origin 2011







Resident well-being ratings in major UK cities 2011–12




Residents' satisfaction with Edinburgh as a place to live 2012



Recorded crime in Scotland 2002/03-2011/12




Average rainfall in Edinburgh and Scotland 1981-2010


Carbon dioxide emissions in Edinburgh 2006-2010

Air pollution levels in major UK cities 2011-12









Business births and deaths 2005–2011





Foreign direct investments in major UK cities 2012





Average room rate and revenue per available room 2011-2012



Overseas visitors to Edinburgh by country of residence 2011












Jobseeker's Allowance claimant rate December 2012



Total labour costs per employee by sector 2010





Economic activity of the working age population of Edinburgh 2005-2011









Transport used by residents of Edinburgh 2012







Passenger numbers at Edinburgh Airport 2003–2012






Average broadband connection speed in major UK cities 2012


How residents of Edinburgh access the internet from home 2012


Percentage of homes receiving less than 2 Mbit/s in major UK cities 2012

Superfast broadband availability in major UK cities 2012




Housing tenure of households in Edinburgh 2011

Average residential property selling prices in major UK cities 2011




Average prime city centre retail rents in major UK cities 2011


Average prime city centre office rents in major UK cities 2011


Vacant shop units in Edinburgh City Centre 2005-12


Residential building land values in major UK cities 2011
