All applications are subject to approval and may be refused at the discretion of the Shelterbelt Centre. While every effort is made to supply eligible applicants with the species and number of plants requested, certain species are occasionally unavailable. In such cases, the Centre makes the best substitution possible.

You will receive a confirmation statement prior to tree delivery.

Please read over this statement carefully and advise the Centre of any changes.

DEFINITIONS - Planting Purpose

Farmyard - for protection of a yard, residence, or other buildings

Field - for soil erosion control of cultivated fields or for protection of crops

Roadside - primarily for snow control along roads or lanes

Livestock - primarily for protection of livestock or from livestock facilities

Wildlife - for improvement of wildlife habitat, including enhancement of field belts (These species must be planted outside the farmyard.)

Riparian - to buffer between agricultural land and bodies of water, including flood plains and wetlands

Replacements - stock ordered as replacements to seedlings planted in recent years (No substitutions made if species are out of stock.)

RECOMMENDED TREE AND SHRUB SPACING FOR SHELTERBELTS

Deciduous trees - at least 2.5 m (8 ft) apart

Deciduous shrubs - at least 1.0 m (3 ft) apart; caragana at 0.3 m (1 ft) to 1.0 m (3 ft)

Coniferous trees - at least 3.5 m (12 ft) apart; Siberian larch at least 2.5 m (8 ft)

TREE QUANTITY CALCULATOR EXAMPLE

Distance of planting (m/ft) divided by selected specie spacing equals total trees required
