Subject: San Diego Mayoral Race a Tossup

Date: January 18th, 2014

A new Public Policy Polling survey of the San Diego Mayoral race finds that the race is a tossup, with David Alvarez holding a slight lead over Kevin Faulconer at 46/45. 9% of voters remain undecided with a little bit over three weeks to go until the election.

Key findings from the poll include:

Both candidates are popular with the electorate, and they have almost identical favorability ratings. 55% of voters see Alvarez favorably to 27% with an unfavorable opinion. Similarly 54% have a positive opinion of Faulconer to 28% with a negative view.

• Alvarez's slim advantage is based on his strong support from Latinos and younger voters. He is up more than 2:1 with Latinos, getting 63% to just 28% for Faulconer. Comparably, with voters under the age of 45 he has a 61% support level, with Faulconer getting only 27%.

The bottom line on this race is that it could not be much more competitive. It's very unusual for us to find a contest where the candidates are so evenly matched both in terms of their overall support and their favorability numbers. This is one contest where it's not cliché to say – it really will come down to turnout and which side does a better job of getting its people to the polls.

PPP interviewed 526 likely voters on January 13th and 14th on behalf of the California Democratic Party. The margin of the error for the survey is +/-4.3%
