# RECORD NUMBER OF CABLE NETWORKS WIN NAMIC VISION AWARDS

Los Angeles, CA – April 19, 2006 – A record number of cable networks were victorious at the 12<sup>th</sup> Annual NAMIC Vision Awards, held Tuesday, April 18, 2006. Presented by NAMIC (National Association for Multi-ethnicity in Communications) and NAMIC – Southern California, the black-tie gala was staged at the Regent Beverly Wilshire in Beverly Hills, California. Hosted by comedian D.L. Hughley, the evening was highlighted by the impressive roster of stars in attendance, such as Louis Gossett, Jr., Jimmy Smits, Wendy Raquel Robinson, Paul Rodriguez, Robert Townsend, Cesar Milan, Sheryl Underwood, Kym Whitley, the cast of Disney Channel's "That's So Raven," winner for Best Children's program and more.

Eleven networks garnered single wins in 11 programming categories for their achievements in multi-ethnic, original programming. Comedy Central, the only network garnering multiple honors, received a dual win for "Mind of Mencia" and "Weekends at the DL," which tied for Best Comedy. Hughley and comedian Carlos Mencia, accepted the awards, while feting the audience of over 500 attendees with their comedic genius. Comedian Steve Harvey, host of BET's "2005 Comedy Awards" took top honors for Best Comedy Performance.

HBO's original movie, "Lackawanna Blues" written by actor-writer-producer, Ruben Santiago-Hudson won for Best Drama. Best Dramatic Performance honors were awarded to Irene Bedard for her role in the TNT epic, "Into The West."

Among the evening's many memorable moments, was the presentation of NAMIC's most coveted honors, the **North Star**, **Legacy** and **Quasar Awards**. Smits presented the North Star Award to Santiago-Hudson, recognized for his long-term commitment to advancing the cause of diversity. Motivational speaker, author and media personality, **Yyanla Vanzant** presented the Legacy Award to writer-producer, **Kyle Bowser**, co-founder of the NAMIC Vision Awards. The Legacy Award pays homage to a trailblazing individual or body of work that has made and indelible impact on the diversity landscape. **Mark Lazarus**, president of Turner Entertainment Group accepted the Quasar Award on behalf of **Turner Broadcasting System**, **Inc.**, honored for its achievements in promoting the cause of diversity in the past year.
