#### INTRODUCTION

The Annual Statistical Monitor aims to provide relevant, accurate and timely information to assist the continued refinement of transport services to meet the identified needs of the community of Merseyside.

This report covers the period 1 April 2009 to 31 March 2010, and details public transport patronage and provision (including infrastructure and vehicle standards), and tunnels traffic. It also shows trends in fare levels and prepaid ticket prices. Where practicable, data has been included for all years since deregulation for comparison purposes.

The periods compared in this issue measure the successful Capital of Culture Year, 2008, against the onset of the recession in 2009.

For the first time visitor numbers for the Merseytravel attractions, Beatles Story, Spaceport and U-boat Story, are included.

#### **SUMMARY AND OVERVIEW**

#### **ABOUT THIS DOCUMENT**

The summary below lists significant points from each section of the document. These points are illustrated in the main text. Data tables are included in the Additional Data section following page 55.

#### PASSENGER MOVEMENTS

- □ Total bus passenger journeys, at 142.9 million, showed a decrease of 3.9% from 2008/2009 figures. Within this, there has been a drop of 8.8% in cash fare journeys. There has been a decrease of 0.9% in prepaid travel, journeys made using bus operators' own ranges of prepaid tickets increased very slightly (less than 0.5%), while Merseytravel's prepaid ranges saw a drop of 2.7%.
- □ An average bus journey length remains the same at 2.8 miles. Average busloads also remained constant with 9.2 passengers per mile operated.
- Merseyrail passenger journeys increased by 1.3% to 39.6 million. The largest percentage passenger increase, of 7.5%, was on the City line.
- There was a 2% decrease in the number of embarkations on Mersey Ferries, 684 thousand passengers used the service. However, this follows the exceptional Capital of Culture Year and reflects the onset of recession thereafter.
- □ Traffic through the tunnels decreased to 25.3 million vehicles, down by 1.7%.

#### **BUS SERVICE PROVISION**

- □ Scheduled bus mileage on commercial services dropped by 3.7% to 35.6 million miles, and mileage on supported services increased by 1.5%, to 7.5 million miles. Overall, scheduled mileage dropped by 2.8% to 43.2 million miles.
- □ The number of bus operators participating in the concessionary and prepaid travel schemes decreased to 21.
- □ The market share of supported services rose to from 16.4% to 17.4%. However it had remained around 20% for the six years prior to 2007/08.

#### **FARES AND TICKETING**

- On peak time commercial bus services average fares fell by 1.5%, mainly due to the adoption by most major operators of flat fares for journeys within Liverpool. The flat fare across Merseyside on supported bus services remained the same. Peak time rail single fares rose by 3.5%.
- □ Solo ticket sales decreased by 10.0%, with 208 thousand tickets sold and Trio ticket sales decreased by 3.9% since last year, with 147 thousand tickets sold.
- Saveaway ticket sales have increased by 13.7%, to 2.1 million, after the removal of the restriction on use of these tickets during the evening peak hours.

□ Railpass rail only season tickets were introduced in November 2005. 81 thousand of these tickets were sold in 2009/2010, a 15.7% increase on the previous year.

#### **PASSENGER PERCEPTIONS**

- Rail 'Passenger Charter' complaints were down 81.9%, to 32, over the year.
- □ Bus service complaints regarding all services fell by 32.4%, to 2,758, over the year.
- Regarding the tunnels, there were 92 complaints over the year, 14.8% less than the previous year.
- □ The ferry service received 168 complaints, a 10.7% decrease, and 163 compliments or suggestions, a 27.9% decrease, over the year.
- Calls to the Merseytravel Information Line increased by 10.8% to 355 thousand. Merseytravel's website has been operating successfully for 7 years. There were 1.2 million individual visits to Merseytravel's website over the year. Recent additions to the means of providing information are reported on for the first time this year.

#### INFRASTRUCTURE AND VEHICLE STANDARDS

- The average age of a bus on Merseyside is 8.1 years, compared to 8.7 years last year. A total of 230 supported services are operated using vehicles that at minimum meet the DPTAC accessibility criteria, which set out accessibility standards that are less stringent than full low floor step free accessibility. 156 of these services do use fully accessible vehicles.
- Merseytravel is responsible for the 6,126 bus stops on Merseyside, of which 4,260 have shelters. 621 have advertising space. There are 13 bus stations on Merseyside, of which 6 are staffed.
- □ There are 87 supported rail stations on Merseyside, and two train-operating companies, Merseyrail Electrics (2002) Ltd carrying 81.7% of passengers, and Northern carrying 18.3% of passengers.

#### **ATTRACTIONS**

- □ This year for the first time details of visitors to Merseytravel's popular attractions: the Beatles Story, Spaceport, and the U-boat story feature in this document.
- □ The Beatles Story saw visitor numbers increase by 6.1% to 200 thousand over the year.
- Spaceport attendance figures fell by 60% compared to 2008/09, 39 thousand people visited the attraction in 2009/10. However, special exhibitions at Spaceport appear to have significant influence on visitor numbers.
- □ The U-boat story welcomed 43 thousand visitors in 2009/10, its first full year of operation.

#### **OVERVIEW**

- Data produced by the Department for Transport indicates that all the changes outlined above are against a background of increasing levels of car ownership, up to 390 cars per thousand population. The figure remains well below the national average (459 cars per thousand) but it is growing at a much faster rate, 1.0% in the past year, compared to the national rate which fell by 9.7%. This growth has an impact on public transport use, which is likely to remain a challenge in future years as economic activity levels change. This highlights the need to address quality, consistency and reliability in public transport provision.
- □ The most recent mid-year population estimates, for 2009, show that a higher proportion of Merseyside's population, 20.1%, is over retirement age, compared with the national average of 19.5%. This places further demands on the public transport system. It will become even more important to ensure accessibility across all transport modes in the region.

#### 1. MOVEMENTS

#### 1.1. BUS

#### 1.1.1. Standard Services

Compared with last year, passenger journeys have decreased by 3.9% to 142.9 million and passenger mileage has decreased by 3.3%. Scheduled bus mileage has also decreased, by 2.8%.



#### **Total Passenger Mileage**



#### **Total Annual Scheduled Mileage**




Concessionary bus travel has decreased by 2.9% in the last year, and is now 19.9% lower than in 1987/88. All other travel had been showing some resurgence from 1998/99 to 2002/03, but started to decline thereafter and dropped by 4.4% in the last year.

The Concessionary Bus Travel Act 2007 came into force on 1 April 2008. It implemented the 2006 Budget announcement of free off-peak travel on all local buses anywhere in England (rather than just within their local authority area of residence) for residents of England aged 60 and over or who are eligible disabled people.

1.6 million cross-boundary journeys, which the new legislation enabled, were made by concessionary pass holders in 2009/10; this was a rise of 8.1% on last year and represents 3.3% of all concessionary journeys.

#### **Average Busloads**




#### **Average Bus Journey Lengths**




#### 1.1.2. Merseylink

Merseylink is Merseytravel's Dial-a-Ride bus service for people with mobility impairments who cannot use conventional public transport. Merseylink patronage has fallen by 12.0% to 112 thousand passengers since the previous year. This may in part be due to the withdrawal of the Job Link and Dial a Link projects in December 2008, some journeys under these schemes were recorded under Merseylink.

#### 1.2. **RAIL**

The Statistical Monitor provides information on rail journeys within Merseyside on the Northern, Wirral (Merseyrail Electrics) and City Lines (Northern).

The Northern Franchise started operation on 12 December 2004. The majority of City Line services are operated by this franchise.

All historical data has been revised to follow the same methodology used to calculate the figures relating to years since 2003/2004.

A summary of the routes covered is as follows:

Line Services to / from

Northern Line: Southport, Ormskirk, Kirkby, Hunts Cross

Wirral Line: West Kirby, New Brighton, Ellesmere Port, Chester

City Line: Liverpool Lime Street, Garswood, Earlestown,

Newton-le-Willows, Hough Green and intermediate stops.

The Northern services, Southport - Meols Cop and Kirkby - Rainford are not included in the figures, along with all services other than Northern services on the City Line.

The encouraging growth in rail patronage has continued. Passenger journeys have increased by 1.3%, to 39.6 million journeys, and mileage by 2.4%, to 274.8 million miles, since last year.

Liverpool South Parkway station opened on 11th June 2006 and has proved incredibly successful. Over 1.35 million people used the station over the year to 31 March 2010, approximately the same number as in the previous year. More than 450 thousand bus passengers travelled via the interchange in the same period.

Again passenger journeys recorded as cash fares have increased, by 0.4%, this year to 28.1 million. This is largely due to the impact of the Railpass season ticket, which is sold only by the train operating companies, and is recorded as a cash fare. Journeys made using other prepaid tickets have risen by 4.5% over the same period, this may be in part due to the lifting of restrictions on using Saveaway tickets during the evening peak hours. Ticket sales are analysed further in Fares & Ticketing starting on page 29 of this document.

An analysis of rail passenger journeys by time period is shown in Figure 17 on page 11.

Merseyrail continues to be one of the best performing Train Operating Companies in mainland Britain with 96.3% of trains arriving at their destinations within five minutes of their timetabled time, the national average is 91.5% for the year to end March 2010 (source: Train Operating Companies).















#### 1.3. FERRIES

#### 1.3.1. Standard Services

Embarkations decreased by 2.0% on last year, to 684 thousand. However, the figure should be viewed in the context of the increase in patronage in 2008/09 during Capital of Culture year, and the onset of the recession in 2009/10.

The proportion of leisure passengers to commuters increased slightly by 1%, the increase being balanced by a decrease of 1% for morning commuters.

The proportions of passengers using each the Pier Head terminal remained almost exactly the same as last year, while Woodside increased its share at the expense of Seacombe. The figures are illustrated below.




#### 1.3.2. Special Cruises, Charters and Shore Based Events

A total of 27,038 passengers bought tickets for the 84 special cruises (Manchester Ship Canal, Special Themed Cruises, and Christmas Cruises) held throughout the season.

Despite fewer Manchester Ship Canal cruises taking place, the overall number of passengers increased by 6.2% to 21,350.

#### **Manchester Ship Canal and Special Cruises**





As well as these cruises, there were 44 private vessel charters, 28% down from the previous year, with vessels in use for a total of 146 hours – a decrease of 35%.

There were 31,351 visitors to the Play Planet, a 5.4% drop. There were 426 children's parties, 3.1% up on the previous year.

The 'Spaceport' attraction at Seacombe is now reported separately, see page 52.


#### 1.4. TUNNELS

The total traffic flow for 2009/10 dropped by 1.7% on last year, to 25.3 million vehicles.

Note: There was a barrier fault on 25-26/12/2009, which generated 29,800 spurious violations. These have been excluded from the figures illustrated below.








#### 2. BUS SERVICE PROVISION

#### 2.1. OVERVIEW

Supported scheduled mileage is up 1.5%, to 7.5 million miles, compared to last year. Commercial scheduled mileage has fallen by 3.7% to 35.6 million miles. Overall, the total mileage has decreased by 2.8% to 43.2 million miles.




Average Bus Loads v Annual Scheduled Bus Mileage



A total of 236 registrations were received during 2009/10, 20.1% down on 2008/09. All registrations received are assessed in detail, and action is taken where necessary, in terms of supported service provision, to maintain the stability of the bus network. In proportion to the number of registrations, the number requiring Merseytravel action this year remained very low, only one necessitated action.





#### Operator Share of Supported Mileage 1987/88





#### Operator Share of Supported Mileage 2008/09






#### Operator Share of Total Mileage 2009/10

#### 2.4. THE SUPPORTED BUS NETWORK

The figures for 2009/10 contained in this section are as at April and do not include Christmas/New Year provision or take into account inflation.

Net Subsidy

This is the net cost to Merseytravel after all on and off bus revenue is deducted from the gross contract price.

Annual Mileage The mileage that would be operated if the contract ran for a full year. Mileages on contracts put in place prior to 2008 are contract mileages as determined by operators. Since 2008 tenders have been supplied with mileages from the Passenger Transport Information System. Therefore once the new tendering process is fully implemented, all mileages will be based on the Passenger Transport Information System.

Net subsidy divided by annual mileage.



**Net Subsidy** 





#### 3. FARES AND TICKETING

#### **3.1. FARES**

Figure 40 illustrates the trends in fares for all commercial bus and Merseyrail fares compared with the retail price index. Also included is an index of AA motoring costs, for comparison with the cost of private transport. Recent rises in fuel costs have had an obvious impact on both motoring costs.

It should be noted that in the autumn of 2006 fares on bus services supported by Merseytravel were set at a £1.00 flat fare across the county, this has not been altered in the years to 2009/10. Most major commercial operators charge flat fares of £1.60-£1.70 within Liverpool, this has led to a slight fall in the average fare paid.

NB: AA Motoring costs figures refer to total running cost per mile for a petrol fuelled car costing between £12,000 and £16,000 new\*, running on unleaded fuel, travelling 10,000 miles in a year, and are calculated for April each year. The price of unleaded petrol has been estimated to be 121.1 pence per litre as at April 2010.

<sup>\*</sup> The AA no longer classifies vehicles by engine size for cost purposes. This price range has been selected as most closely matching the engine size 1101-1549cc used in previous years.

The calculation of the average fare is based on an average fare scale of major bus operators with a mileage weighting. For all the average journey length calculations, it was assumed that the percentage of passengers making particular lengths of journeys were as contained in Table 3, which is derived from our passenger surveys database.

#### **Average Peak Fares**




# 3.2. PREPAID TICKETS

Sales of Merseytravel's own range of prepaid tickets continue to be affected by the success of the Railpass season ticket, which was introduced in November 2005. Railpass tickets are valid for rail travel only to all stations within Merseyside, and to all stations to Chester, Ellesmere Port and Ormskirk.

The only outlets for Railpass ticket sales are the train operating companies.





The prices of Trio and Solo tickets have risen steadily over the last 8 years. Saveaway prices were subject to a promotional discount in 2000, and were held steady from 2003 to 2005 but rose in the following two years to bring the increase nearer to being in line with inflation. The restriction on the use of Saveaways during the evening peak hours was lifted in January 2008 and in March 2010 Saveaway prices were revised to take account of this change. The chart below illustrates this.

Ticket prices may have had an impact on sales volumes, which are depicted on the following pages, as the effect of the Saveaway discount can be seen in Figure 48, which also shows their increased popularity since the restriction change. However it is also likely that sales of Railpass tickets, introduced in November 2005, (illustrated in Figure 52) have eroded some Trio sales (Figure 50).



### Solo Ticket Revenue





# **Saveaway Ticket Revenue**





### **Trio Ticket Revenue**






# Railpass Ticket Revenue





# **Prepaid Ticket Sales Income by Outlet**


### Trio Ticket Sales by Outlet

The significant rise in the number of passes is due to the introduction of the national concessionary travel scheme. This scheme extends free travel on local bus services across the whole of England to all elderly and disabled people.

# Due to the introduction of the new national scheme it was not possible to determine the split between elderly and disabled passes in April 2008.

Merseyside was the first area of the country to extend concessionary travel to some rail journeys to destinations beyond the county boundary. Rail extensions apply to the same areas as Railpass tickets (Ormskirk, Chester and Ellesmere Port).

### 4. PASSENGER PERCEPTIONS

# 4.1. COMPLAINTS, REQUESTS AND SUGGESTIONS

# 4.1.1. Rail Service Complaints

There has been a 17.3% decrease in general letters, 435 were received, and an 81.9% decrease, to 32, complaints under the Rail Passengers' Charter. The overall decrease in total correspondence is 33.6%.

'Rail Passengers' Charter' complaints are those for which Merseytravel have given a refund due to the service arriving late or failing to operate within the terms of the Charter standards. As stated on page 7, Merseyrail remains one of the best performing Train Operating Companies in mainland Britain.




# **Complaints by District**

# **Complaints by District**








### 4.2. MERSEYTRAVEL INFORMATION LINE

The Traveline Board is a prime example of public/private partnership, between Merseytravel and the bus operators of Merseyside. The bus operators make a financial contribution to the cost of operating Traveline on a pro rata basis relating to their operating mileage. The Board includes 4 members nominated by bus operators and 5 members of Merseytravel. The information line is now the premier Traveline in the UK, as determined by the Department of Transport.


There was a 10.8% increase, to 355 thousand calls, in the number of calls to the Merseytravel line over the year, although data for the 13<sup>th</sup> 4-weekly period was not captured due to installation of a new computer system. During this time calls were dealt with by Traveline centres elsewhere in the UK. Calls answered within 30 seconds total for the year is 79%. This is below target, there was extreme weather in January, resulting in an unprecedented number of calls and target time was impossible to meet. These points are illustrated in Figure 60 below, and Figure 61 overleaf.

Merseytravel's website (www.merseytravel.gov.uk), which gives access to the whole range of local transport information as well as background details about Merseytravel, has been operating successfully for 7 years. New monitoring software was introduced in spring 2009 to give a more accurate measure of website usage, avoiding the inclusion of Merseytravel staff visits to the website during the course of their work. Therefore it is not possible to compare the usage with previous years. 1.2 million visits were made to the site in the year to 31 March 2010, the website also experienced a peak in the January bad weather. This is shown in Figure 62 on the next page.

Information is also available by SMS text message to mobile phone users. The number of enquiries answered by this service is illustrated in Figure 64 on page 43.


A new service for users of mobile data devices, NextBus, was introduced in spring 2010, 1,265 enquiries to this service were answered in the first 2 months of operation.





# 5. INFRASTRUCTURE AND VEHICLE STANDARDS

### 5.1. MERSEYSIDE BUS FLEET


The average age of the Merseyside bus fleet fell to 8.1 years as at April 2010, compared to an average age of 9.3 years at the start of LTP2 in 2005/06, and 7.1 years at the start of LTP1 in 2000/01. Figure 65 and Figure 66 overleaf illustrate this.

The numbers of vehicles satisfying the old DPTAC accessibility standards remained almost constant this year, and the number of vehicles meeting full accessibility standards rose. There are now 74 supported services using vehicles that at minimum satisfy DPTAC criteria. If operators used dedicated vehicles for each service this would amount to 130 vehicles, however operators may use the same vehicle on more than one service, for instance when two services operate at different times of day. 156 supported services use full low floor specification vehicles, which would amount to 280 vehicles if each vehicle were used on only one service. Table 7 and Table 8 on pages 46 and 47 list these services.

N.B. Operators are not all able to provide snapshot details of their fleet age as at the same date, therefore it is not possible to establish the exact size of the Merseyside bus fleet, the best estimate is approximately 1,200 vehicles.





# 6. ATTRACTIONS

Beatles Story attendances continue to grow, as illustrated below.





# CHRONOLOGY OF MAJOR COMMERCIAL BUS SERVICE CHANGES

### 1 APRIL 2009 - 31 MARCH 2010

### April – June 2009

Cumfybus withdrew service EL1 (2 journeys per day).

Fairway Travel introduced the 120 service serving St Helens and Haydock.

Arriva introduced a new commercial direct shuttle service 501 Liverpool South Parkway to John Lennon Airport. This service operates Monday to Saturday with a 20 minute frequency, stopping only at the start and end points of the route.

Arriva withdrew commercial night services 82N and N86 which served the south east of Merseyside towards Speke.

### July - September 2009

Fairway Travel introduced the new commercial service 319 operating Monday to Sundays with a 2 hourly frequency from/to St Helens. Serves Rainford and Ormskirk (including bus station and hospital) en route.

Cumfybus introduced service 16, hourly, linking Southport with the retail area at Kew.

A number of services which would not normally operate on a Bank Holiday were additionally run on 31 August to serve the Matthew Street Festival.

Halton Transport introduced commercial services 44 and 45 on schooldays only serving schools and colleges in the south east of Merseyside.

First withdrew the 38A variant operating between West Kirby and Bebington.

### October - December

Arriva withdrew service 471 west Wirral cross river to Liverpool, service 472 continued covering most of the route.

### January – March

Fairway Travel introduced the new commercial service 39 operating between St Helens and Ormskirk.

Merseypride withdrew route 914 serving Riverside College.

Stageoach withdrew service 319 from St Helens to Southport, Fairway travel subsequently registered a replacement 319 service.

The withdrawal of the 700 service (Liverpool Airport - Manchester) was replaced by the introduction of the X2 service (Liverpool - Manchester via Liverpool John Lennon Airport), operated by Flight Delay Services.

Helms of Eastham introduced a new service (23) operating an hourly service between Heswall Bus Station and Chester Bus Exchange.
