Field Dates: June 4-5, 2014 Completed Surveys: 600 Margin of Error: +/- 4.0%

- Likely voter sample included only those who voted in the 2010 general election and who indicated likeliness to vote in 2014 or who have registered to vote since 2010 and indicated likeliness to vote in 2014
- Survey includes both landlines (80%) and cell phones (20%).
- ➤ The survey was conducted using live operator interviews through a contracted professional call center.
- ➤ In addition, the survey was balanced using historical voting patterns for partisanship, as well as demographic variables such as age, gender and geography.
