HEAD COACH GREGG TROY



The summer of 2012 brought major accomplishments to an already stellar resume for University of Florida Head Coach Gregg Troy. Troy served as the 2012 USA Men's Olympic Swim Team head coach in London, England, as the U.S. men won 16 medals during the games. To go along with his success with the University of Florida swimming and diving team as well as his international coaching success, Troy was inducted into the American Swimming Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 2012.

Troy has brought the University of Florida swimming and diving program back to the national spotlight after winning the women's program's second NCAA Title in 2010, the first since the Gators won the inaugural NCAA Championship in 1982 in Gainesville. As a result of his latest success during the 2010 season, Troy was named the 2010 USA Swimming Coach of the Year, 2011 and 2010 ASCA Coach of the Year, 2010 NCAA Women's Swimming Coach of the Year and 2010 SEC Men's Swimming Coach of the Year. A top-10 NCAA contender in his 14 years at the helm of the University of Florida men's and women's swimming program, Troy has created an atmosphere of consistency and excellence around both the men's and women's Gator swimming and diving programs. The result has been the elevation of one of the most storied collegiate programs to even higher levels of success.

SEC team titles, All-Americans, and Coach of the Year honors are just some of the accomplishments Troy has accumulated during his tenure at Florida. Entering his 16th seasons with the women's squad and 15th with the men's team, Troy has guided the Gators to 29 national titles, 132 SEC event titles, more than 300 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections and more than 775 All-America honors.

And that's just at Florida. With his first National Championship as the Gator head coach, Troy elevated to an elite status, having won a team national championship at the high school, club and collegiate levels. In his career, he's tutored over 75 Olympians, over 240 All-America swimmers and

has coached athletes to more than 155 U.S. and international records.

The 2012-13 season brought even more highlights to Troy's already illustrious resume. Both the Gator men and women finished sixth at the 2013 NCAA Championships, extending their top-10 streaks to 14 and 13, respectively.

UF's sixth place finish on the men's side capped off a strong season for the Gators. The group tallied 41 All-America honors at the national meet, the most since the 2007 season. For the second time in three years, Florida's men claimed victory in the 800 free relay. The group of Pawel Werner, Sebastien Rousseau, Marcin Cieslak and Dan Wallace blistered the field with a school record time of 6:13.27, winning by two seconds over eventual NCAA Champion Michigan. Cieslak led the team with seven All-America honors after finishing second in all three individual events (200 IM, 100 fly and 200 fly) and swam on four relays.

The biggest highlight of the season came at the 2013 SEC Championships, where Troy guided the Gator men to the conference title for the first time since 1993. The Gators broke Auburn's streak of 16-consecutive conference championships, and gave the program its 34th SEC title. Cieslak won two individual event titles, while Matt Elliott and Pawel Werner each won their first SEC titles. Troy was named the SEC Male Swimming Coach of the Year.

UF's women also finished sixth at the 2013 NCAA Championships, collecting 35 All-America honors, and third at the SEC Championships. Elizabeth Beisel won the NCAA title in the 400 IM, giving her two NCAA championships in her career. Out of the pool, Beisel became just the 11th student-athlete in Florida history to be named Capital One Academic All-America of the Year, earning the distinction for the women's At-Large team.

In the 2011-12 season, the Gators continued their streak of consecutive top-10 finishes at the NCAA Championships. With their 12th consecutive top-10 finish, the Gator women took tenth at the 2012 NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships. They also brought home 27 All-America honors. Senior Teresa Crippen led the team with six All-American honors and finished eighth among the high point swimmers. Beisel won her first individual national championship when she finished first in the 200 backstroke with a time of 1:50.58.

The UF men also extended their streak of top-10 finishes to 13, as they placed eighth at the NCAA Championships. The orange and blue collected 27 more All-America titles, with Marcin Cieslak earning six to lead the men's team. Cieslak finished second in the 200 IM and third in the 100

and 200 butterfly. The Gators were one of only two SEC teams in the top-10.

At the 2011-12 SEC Championships the Gators collected eight SEC Championships, including a sweep of the 200 and 400 IM events. Beisel and Cieslak each won three individual events and Brad deBorde and Eduardo Solaache-Gomez won one title a piece. Beisel and Cieslak were named SEC Female and Male Swimmers of the Year. It was the first year since 2010 that a Gator has received the Female Swimmer of the Year and the third year in a row that a UF swimmer has won the Male Swimmer of the Year.

The 2010-11 season was another successful year for Troy, as the men's team finished fifth and the women's team placed seventh at the 2011 NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships. The UF men's top-five finish was the highest of any Southeastern Conference school at the meet, Florida's fifth top-five finish in the last six years and UF's eighth under head coach Gregg Troy. For the 12th consecutive season, the Orange and Blue finished in the top 10 nationally. Individually, 15 UF swimmers combined to bring back 19 All-America honors and two national championships (200-yard freestyle, 800-yard freestyle relay) to Gainesville.

For the 11th consecutive season, the Gator women placed in the top-10 at the NCAA Championships with 11 swimmers and one diver combining to earn 38 All-American honors, led by junior Shara Stafford's seven All-American honors. This year's SEC Female Freshman of the Year, Elizabeth Beisel, brought home five All-America honors, including top-three finishes in the 400-yard IM and 400-yard backstroke.

At the 2011 SEC Swimming and Diving Championships, Troy coached 19 Gators to 56 All-SEC honors, including 13 SEC Championships, more than any other school in the conference. As a result of Troy's guidance, UF took home the Male Swimmer of the Year Award and both Male and Freshman Swimmer of the Year Awards.

2010 was one for the record books as the Florida women brought in the school's first National Championship in 28 years, led by five school records and national championship performances in the 200-yard free relay and 100-yard back by senior Gemma Spofforth. Like the Gators did on March 18-20, 1982, the 2010 squad pulled out a close victory over second-place finisher Stanford. Florida scored 382 points, edging out the Cardinal (379.5) in the second-closest NCAA competition ever. A total of 12 All-Americans tallied 36 All-America performances on the Purdue campus at the Boilermaker Aquatic center.

HEAD COACH GREGG TROY

While the women's team swam and dove its most complete Championship meet in recent history, the 2010 men's swimming team rallied for its seventh top-five NCAA finish in Troy's tenure at Florida, scoring the most points in Florida history to finish fifth at the NCAA meet on the Ohio State campus after tallying 364 points with leverage from three national titles and five top-eight relay finishes. Junior Conor Dwyer was named the men's Division I National Men's Swimmer of the Year after winning the 200 and 500 freestyle events, the first NCAA swimmer to do so since 2001. Additionally, senior Shaune Fraser recorded one first and two second-place finishes, earning seven All-America honors to rack up an all-time Florida mark of 27 All-America honors, the most for a single men's swimmer or diver in school history. Ten other Gators collaborated with Fraser to collectively put on 38 All-America performances to highlight the 2010 campaign.

Both the 2010 Gator squads finished second at the 2010 SEC Championship meet, Florida's tenth straight top-three finish on both the men's and women's side. The Gators tallied numerous accolades at the league championships in Athens, Ga., under Troy, including SEC Men's Swimming Coach of the Year, SEC Women's Swimmer of the Year in Spofforth, SEC Men's Swimmer of the Year in Dwyer, high point awards for Spofforth, Dwyer and S. Fraser, while the Gator divers cleaned up with SEC Women's Diving Coach of the Year for Donnie Craine and SEC Women's Diver of the Year for senior Kara Salamone.

In summer 2009, Spofforth captured the spotlight of the world when she shattered the World Record in the women's 100-meter backstroke (58.12), winning her first World Championship for Great Britain at the 2009 FINA World Championships in Rome, Italy. But Spofforth's World Title is just the tip of the iceberg. Under Troy, Spofforth defended her 100 & 200-yard backstroke races in 2009, becoming just the fourth NCAA swimmer to win the 200 back three consecutive years. Under Troy's watch, Spofforth, the 2009 SEC Swimmer of the Year, shattered the NCAA record in the 200 back at the 2009 SEC meet, becoming only the second swimmer to ever break the 1:50.00 mark in the event when she swam to a 1:48.34. Spofforth also carried British Commonwealth Records in the 50, 100 and 200-meter backstroke races, as well as the 100-meter back European Record. The Gators stamped their 17th SEC Championship team title in 2009 in Auburn, Ala., with the help of Spofforth, a tribute to Troy's talent and expectations of excellence at the head of the Gator program.

Additionally, Troy tutored 2009 NCAA Champions Bradley Ally and Shaune Fraser, who collectively won three individual national titles, the most since 2006 when

Gator great Ryan Lochte picked up three, bringing Florida's all-time national championship count to 35 titles. Collectively the men's and women's squads brought back 71 All-America honors home to Gainesville after the 2009 season.

Troy's success is thriving at Florida, but it's no different than the mark he made his first season. Troy came to Florida in 1998 as the women's head coach and promptly led the Gators to an eighth-place finish at the NCAA Championships – an improvement of seven spots from the previous season. A year later, he became the third coach in UF history to take the reins of both teams when he was named the head coach of the men's squad.

In his inaugural season as men's head coach, the Sarasota, Fla., native guided the Gators to a ninth-place showing at NCAAs and a runner-up finish at the SEC Championships. For his efforts, Troy was named the 2000 SEC Men's Coach of the Year.

Both teams made remarkable strides the following season, as the women jumped 11 places from 19th at NCAAs in 2000 to an eighth-place spot in 2001. The men also showed improvement, from ninth place the year before to eighth that season, at NCAAs.

The case was the same in 2001-02 as both teams made progress at the conference and national levels. The women's team captured the SEC Championship and finished seventh at NCAAs. The men placed second at SECs for the second-straight season, and, like the women, showed improvement at NCAAs with a fourth-place finish – the highest for the Gators since a third-place showing in 1991. In addition to taking home the high finishes, Troy captured the 2002 NCAA Men's Coach of the Year and SEC Men's Coach of the Year awards. He also received the Knoxville Sentinel's 2002 SEC Men's and Women's Coach of the Year awards.

In 2002-03, both squads continued to make progress under the tutelage of Troy and his staff. The women improved yet again at the national level by placing fifth at NCAAs after a runner-up finish at the SEC Championships. The men took home second at the SEC meet for the third-consecutive season and followed that up with a sixth-place showing at NCAAs.

In 2003-04, Troy led the women's team to a fourth-place finish at NCAAs, the best finish during his tenure. The women's team finished third at SECs, marking the fifth-consecutive year UF had placed in the top three at the league championships, and the Florida women did not drop out of the top five of the College Swimming Coaches Association (CSCAA) national poll for the second-consecutive year. On the

men's side, the Gators finished second at the SEC Championships, the fifth-straight top-three finish at SECs, and placed sixth at the NCAA Championships. One of the highlights of the season was Lochte winning the 26th NCAA title in UF history when he broke the U.S. Open, American and NCAA record in the 400-meter IM. At the end of the season, Troy was rewarded for the Gators' success with his second NCAA Men's Coach of the Year Award.

In 2004-05, Troy led both teams to top-five finishes at the NCAAs, as the women placed fourth and the men secured the fifth spot. For the women it was the 22nd time in Florida history that they finished in the top-five. Both teams also had success outside of the pool, claiming a combined 30 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections during the season.

Troy piloted the Gator men to a fifth-place finish for a second-consecutive season in 2005-06, while Lochte, one of Troy's finest protégés, became the all-time Florida leader in individual NCAA Championships with seven titles. The women finished in the top-10 for a sixth-consecutive season under Troy's direction.

The 2006-07 season was another banner campaign for both Troy and the Gators, as both squads finished in the top-10 at the NCAA Championships. The UF men earned 45 All-America honors en route to a fourth-place finish – their highest in five years – at the NCAA meet. Three Gator men's swimmers also combined to win six individual SEC titles and Florida won the 800 FR at the conference meet for the sixth year in a row, garnering Troy SEC Men's Coach of the Year honors.

Florida's women were not left out of the title chase in 2006-07, as Troy guided freshman Gemma Spofforth to NCAA crown in the 200 back and Caroline Burckle to the conference championship in the 100 breast. Spofforth's performance marked the first individual national championship for a member of the UF women's team since 1995, and the squad's first backstroke victory in 17 years.

Spofforth returned a year later and under Troy's direction, became the first Gator woman since the 1993-94 season to win both the 100 and 200 backstroke events at the SEC and NCAA Championships in the same year. Burckle added to the trophy haul at the NCAA Championships, winning both the 200 and 500 freestyle events. Burckle also set a new NCAA record in the 500 free, eclipsing Janet Evans' 20-year record.

Named the 2008 SEC Women's Swimming Coach of the Year, Troy oversaw the development of Burckle, who came away from her four year career with five school

records. For her accomplishments in the water she was named the 2008 NCAA Swimmer of the year and collected the Honda Sports Award for Swimming and Diving. Burckle additionally rallied at the 2008 Olympic Trials in Omaha, swimming a lifetime best 200-meter free time to make her first-ever Olympic Games. In Beijing and under Troy's watch, she swam one of the four 200-meter free legs in the women's 800-meter free relay that claimed a bronze medal.

The Gator men countered in 2008 with five SEC titles of their own. Clark Burckle collected two of the five, winning the 400 IM and 200 breast while also setting the school record in the 100 breast. Shaune Fraser picked up his second straight SEC Championship in the 200 free, defending his title in pool record time. Bradley Ally picked up the win in the 200 IM in pool record time while Omar Pinzon led a Gator sweep in the 200 back with the fifth fastest time in school history. The men would go on to finish eighth at the NCAA Championships, picking up a total of 38 All-American honors.

Troy has also found success in international competition as the head coach of several teams, including his honor as an assistant coach of the men's United States Olympic Team in Beijing. Troy additionally served as head coach of the Thailand Olympic team in the 1992 games in Barcelona, as well as the men's United States 2010 Pan Pacific Swim Team. Active Gator Olympians that are presently under Troy's tutelage include Sarah Bateman, Elizabeth Beisel, Melani Costa-Schmid, Evan Lehtonen, Jemma Lowe, Anna-Liisa Pold, Rodion Davelaar, Brett Fraser, Shaune Fraser, Balazs Gercsak, Sebastien Rousseau and Gemma Spofforth.

Under Troy's watchful eye, Lochte has quickly developed into one of the top swimmers in the world. At the 2010 Pan Pacific Championships, Troy coached Lochte to a meet-high six gold medals, giving Lochte Male Swimmer of the Meet honors at the year's biggest international meet. At the 2008 Olympics in Beijing, China, Lochte won two gold medals and two bronze medals. He broke fellow American Aaron Peirsol's two-year winning streak in the 200-meter back with a world-record performance at the 2007 World Championships in Melbourne, Australia, winning his first individual world title in a long-course meters setting. He won five medals (three gold, one silver and one bronze) and set four world records at the 2006 FINA Short Course Championships in Beijing, China, just 10 days after competing at the NCAA Championships. In 2004, Lochte captured a gold medal at the Summer Olympic Games in Athens, Greece, in the 800 FR with an American-record time of 7:07.33, and won a silver medal in the 200-meter

IM in a University of Florida-record time of 1:58.78, which ranks third-fastest all-time in the history of the event.

Troy was on deck in Melbourne as an assistant coach with the U.S. Men's World Championships Team when Lochte claimed his world record. He has also served as the head coach for the U.S. Team at the World Championships in 2001; head coach of the U.S. Team for the Pan American Games in 1999; assistant coach for the 2004 U.S. Women's FINA World Short Course Championships; assistant coach for the U.S. Women's Team at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta and the head coach for the U.S. Pan American Team in 1995. His accomplishments on the international level led him to being named the 1997 U.S. Olympic & United States Swimming Development Coach of the Year. The award is one of several that Troy has received from the U.S. Swimming Coaches' Achievement program.

Before Troy racked up success at the collegiate and international levels, he enjoyed a scintillating career at the prep level for The Bolles School in Jacksonville, Fla. For 20 years, he led the school's program and its affiliated club program.

During his tenure, Bolles claimed several national high school team championships. At the state level, his teams won 15 boys' Florida State Championships (including 10 consecutive) and 11 girls' state titles (including nine consecutive).

Troy earned his bachelor's degree in history/government from Texas Christian University in 1972. In 1987, he earned his master's in history education from Jacksonville University. Troy and his wife, Kathleen, have three sons: Patrick (27), a former UF Cross Country and Track & Field athlete who earned his undergraduate degree in English from Florida in 2009; Geoffrey (26), a four-year football player at the Merchant Marine Academy and now a United States Marine Lt. Helicopter Pilot; and Ryan (24), a decathlete on the 2009-11 Gator Track & Field team and a graduate of Idaho State University in Outdoor education.

ASSISTANT COACHES

ANTHONY NESTY ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH



One of the most decorated swimmers in Florida history, Anthony Nesty enters his eighth season as associate head coach and 16th as a member of the Gators' coaching staff.

"Anthony is one of the most revered coaches in college swimming, and one of the few

who is considered both a great athlete and a great coach," Florida head coach Gregg Troy says. "He's got a great work ethic and a tremendous ability to get results. His experience at the Olympics as an athlete is instrumental in his ability to relate to our current athletes, and his reputation for getting the most out of them speaks for itself."

Nesty brings experience at the highest levels of international swimming to the Florida staff. At the 1988 Seoul Olympic Games, he won the first-ever Olympic medal for his native country of Suriname when he edged seven-time medalist Matt Biondi of the United States by .01 to bring home the gold in the 100-meter fly. Nesty also won the gold medal in the 100 fly at the 1990 Goodwill Games and captured the world championship in the same event in 1991.

He concluded his swimming career at the 1992 Barcelona Olympics, where he earned the bronze in the 100 fly. Not yet finished on the international scene, however, Nesty served as an assistant coach for Suriname at the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens, Greece, and continued his Olympic tradition as the head coach for Suriname at the 2008 Summer Olympic Games in Beijing, China as well as the 2012 London Olympics. On the 20th anniversary of Nesty's Olympic gold medal in the 100-meter fly, not only was Nesty honored as head coach of his country's team, he was recognized as the Suriname flag bearer at the opening ceremonies of the 2008 Summer Games.

Nesty returned to the international coaching realms during the summer of 2009, as he traveled to Rome, Italy, as a coach for the 2009 Cayman National Team to the 2009 FINA World Championships, where he tutored Gators Brett and Shaune Fraser. In the summer of 2010, Nesty coached the Cayman National Team at the 2010 Mutual of Omaha Pan Pacific Championships, the largest international meet of the year. In 2011, Nesty served on deck as an assistant coach for the U.S. men's team at the World University Games, his first time coaching for the United States.

Nesty also found success on the national level during his collegiate career at UF, capturing three consecutive NCAA crowns in the 100 fly from 1990-92. He also won the 1990 NCAA title in the 200 fly and was a member of Florida's 1991 NCAA champion 400 MR team. He held the school record for NCAA titles until 2006 when former Gator Ryan Lochte finished his illustrious career with seven such honors. For his accomplishments as a Gator, Nesty was inducted into the Athletic Hall of Fame in April 2002.

Nesty made his return to Gainesville on June 1, 1998, to assume duties on the pool deck. Prior to that, he served as a club level coach for three years with Swim Florida in Sarasota.

Making the coaching stop at Florida has not only allowed Nesty to reach a career goal, but his post on the Gators' deck has allowed him to be reunited with a close friend in

Gator swimming head coach Gregg Troy, for whom Nesty swam in high school. After Nesty's college career was finished, he served as one of Troy's assistant coaches at The Bolles School in Jacksonville, Fla., while also holding the head coaching position at Jacksonville's Nease High School.

Over the last 13 seasons, Nesty has shown the ability to transfer his penchant for fast times in the water to the Gator swimmers he has coached. In 2006-07, he helped Gator Shaune Fraser, a 2004, 2008 and 2012 Olympian from the Cayman Islands, develop into a top-five finisher in the 200 fly at the NCAA Championships in his first collegiate season. His work with the Gators' middle-distance and distance freestylers during that campaign also came to fruition at the NCAA meet, where Grant Johnson and Tobias Work combined to earn five All-America honors and record four career-best times.

Fraser returned to the NCAA Championships in 2008 to collect seven All-American honors and finally reached the helm of success under Nesty's watch in 2009 when he brought home his first two individual national championships in the 200 free and 200 fly, setting an NCAA record in the 200 fly. Additionally in 2009, Bradley Ally won his first NCAA title, swimming an NCAA-record performance in the 200-yard IM. Fraser became the first Gator to win the 200-yard fly since Nesty did so during his college tenure in 1990. With Nesty's leadership, Fraser wrapped up his career in 2010 with seven All-America honors, giving him 27 All-America honors, the most for a single men's swimmer or diver in school history. In all, Nesty guided 11 total Gators to 38 All-America performances to highlight the 2010 campaign.

During the 2011 season, Nesty coached Brett Fraser to Florida's third-straight NCAA title in the 200 free, while also leading the men's 800 free relay squad to a national title. Under Nesty, Florida finished fifth at the NCAA meet, marking the sixth time in the last seven years UF has finished in the top five, and the 12th-straight year UF has placed in the top 10 at the NAAs.

Additionally, Nesty was on deck at the SEC Championships where protégé's Conor Dwyer and Marcin Cieslak were named SEC Male Swimmer of the Year and SEC Male Freshman Swimmer of the Year, respectively. Behind Nesty's coaching, the UF men won eight SEC titles and broke four SEC records.

Nesty's success as a coach continued to be evident in the 2012-13, as the Gators brought home their first SEC Championship in 20 years and placed sixth at the NCAA Championships, extending the streak of consecutive top-10 national finishes to 13 seasons. The group tallied 41 All-America honors at the national meet, the most since the 2007 season. For the second time in three years, Florida's men claimed victory in the 800 free relay. The group of Pawel Werner, Sebastien Rousseau, Marcin Cieslak and Dan Wallace blistered the field with a school record time of 6:13.27, winning by two seconds over eventual NCAA Champion Michigan. Cieslak led the team with seven All-America honors after finishing second in all three individual events (200 IM, 100 fly and 200 fly) and swam on four relays.

In the 2011-12 season, Marcin Cieslak earned three third place finishes at the NCAA Championships as well as winning the SEC Championships and being named SEC Male Swimmer of the Year. The UF men won five SEC titles at

the 2012 SEC Championships and Cieslak was named the SEC Male Swimmer of the Year, third year in a row a Florida swimmer has earned the honor under Nesty's tutelage.

At the 2000 NCAA Championships, Nesty saw his pupil, Duncan Sherrard, break his 10-year old school record, which he set at the 1990 SEC Championships, in the 200 fly. In 2006, he was on the pool deck when Ryan Lochte set the school records in the 100 and 200 fly at the SEC Championships.

Another Nesty protégé, Ricardo Monasterio, collected four All-America honors and swam in the 1996, 2000, 2004 & 2008 Olympic Games for his home country of Venezuela.

Nesty also played an integral role in the development of Sarasota, Fla., native Eric Donnelly into a nine-time All-American from 1999-02. Donnelly, who swam for Nesty on the Swim Florida club team, also won individual SEC titles in the 200 and 400 IM and was awarded an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship in 2002.

MARTYN WILBY

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH



Gator sixth-year associate head coach Martyn Wilby has served as a leading figure for the University of Florida swimming and diving program since 1998. Wilby was promoted to associate head coach in spring of 2006 following eight seasons as an assistant coach with the Gators.

"Martyn is an internationally-known coach whose success on the deck speaks for itself. Europe has a vast swimming community, and he has one of the strongest reputations in that area of the world," Florida head coach Gregg Troy says. "His move to associate head coach has been a tremendous asset because of the increased level of contact that he has had with our student-athletes. His work ethic and passion for swimming are contagious both on and off the deck."

The Darlington, England, native completed a stellar four-year collegiate swimming career at the University of Kentucky, where he lettered from 1982-86. While swimming for the Wildcats, he was also a member of the British National Team.

Wilby's arrival at Florida in 1998 marked a reunion with head coach Gregg Troy, after having previously coached under him for seven years at The Bolles School.

This past season, UF's women finished sixth at the 2013 NCAA Championships, collecting 35 All-America honors, and took third at the SEC Championships. Elizabeth Beisel won the NCAA title in the 400 IM, giving her two NCAA championships in her career. Out of the pool, Beisel became just the 11th student-athlete in Florida history to be named Capital One Academic All-America of the Year, earning the distinction for the women's At-Large team. The women's team tallied 34 All-America honors. Natalie Hinds was named the SEC Female Freshman of the Year after her phenomenal performance at the conference meet.

In the 2011-12 campaign, the Gators finished third at the 2012 SEC Championships and 10th at the NCAA Championships under the leadership of Wilby. Elizabeth Beisel won her first individual national title when she took first in the 200 backstroke. Beisel also collected three SEC titles in the 200 back, 200 IM and 400 IM, she was named SEC Female Swimmer of the Year and won the Commissioner's Trophy under the coaching of Wilby.

In the 2010-11 season, Wilby helped lead the women to four SEC titles, four school records, 38 All-America honors and 17 All-SEC selections. Under his tutelage, Elizabeth Beisel became the first Gator since Caroline Burckle in 2005 to win SEC Female Freshman Swimmer of the Year. The Gator women finished in the top 10 at the NCAA Championships for the 11th consecutive season.

Wilby played an instrumental part in the Florida women's 2010 National Championship, the school's first in 28 years. Wilby coached the women to two national championship performances and five school records. Under Wilby's direction, the 2009-10 squad pulled out a close victory over second-place finisher Stanford on March 20. Florida scored 382 points, edging out the Cardinal (279.5) in the second-closest NCAA competition ever. A total of 12 All-Americans

coached by Wilby tallied 36 All-America performances on the Purdue campus at the Boilermaker Aquatic Center. Wilby also helped coach the women's team to its first-ever 200-yard freestyle relay national title, as well as its most SEC titles (8) since 1995. The Gators have won at least eight dual meets every single season Wilby has coached in Gainesville.

His dedication to Florida and his athletes paid off once again in both 2008 and 2009 as he watched the lady Gators win their 17th SEC Championship crown in school history in 2009. Recently graduated Gemma Spofforth also defended her NCAA 200 back title and also won the individual championship in the 100 back both years. In summer 2009, Spofforth captured the spotlight of the world when she shattered the World Record in the women's 100-meter backstroke (58.12), winning her first World Championship for Great Britain at the 2009 FINA World Championships in Rome, Italy. Wilby was on deck at the international swim meet, serving as a support and coaching system that helped Spofforth to her first World title. Traveling to the 2009 European Championships, Wilby was on hand again to support Spofforth as she won two more gold medals as well as silver. The SEC Swimmer of the Year the last two years under Wilby's tutelage, Spofforth finished her career at Florida a seven-time NCAA champion and 25-time All-American.

Wilby's British background and European experience have proven to aid the Gators in international recruiting, proven by Spofforth and 2008-09 newcomer Jemma Lowe, who swept the 100 & 200-yard butterfly events at the SEC meet. Lowe set a new SEC record in the 200-yard fly and took down 25-year-old Florida records in both fly events.

Additionally, the women recorded a seventh-place finish at the 2007 NCAA Championships, mentoring Gemma Spofforth to an NCAA title and school record in the 200 back. The national crown was the first individual title for a UF woman since 1996 and the first backstroke championship for a member of the Florida women's team in 17 years.

Wilby made the transition from swimming to coaching when he accepted a position as a swimming developer with the Stockton Council in England. In 1990, he returned to the United States and was named head coach at the Lakeside Hawks Swim Club in Louisville, Ky. Two years later, Wilby joined the coaching staff at the Bolles School in Jacksonville, Fla., and was honored as the Florida Age Group Coach of the Year in 1994.

In addition to coaching at UF, Wilby has also had numerous successes while coaching internationally. In 1997, he coached the Malaysian National Team to its best-ever finish in the Southeast Asian Games. Wilby also served as head coach for Barbados' swim team at the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Australia. In Sydney, he coached former Gator and current assistant swim coach Leah Martindale Stancil to a 23rd-place finish in the 100-meter freestyle preliminary heats and a 25th-place tie in the 50-meter freestyle preliminary events.

"Donnie Craine's reputation speaks for itself. He has shown the ability to craft top-level divers, and to maintain that success through hard work and discipline," Florida head coach Gregg Troy says. "Coach Craine is, without question, one of the elite diving coaches in the country."

After a better than expected rebuilding year that witnessed five divers score at the SEC Championships, Craine has hopes of sending student-athletes from his 2013-14 squad to the NCAA Championships.

In 2012, Craine coached Mike Lewark to the NCAA Championships, making him the first male diver to compete in six years. Lewark also finished third at the SEC Championships on the platform event under Craine's guidance.

Prior to that, Craine was named SEC Women's Diving Coach of the Year after coaching 2011 SEC Female Diver of the Year Monica Dodson and leading Kara Salamone to the 2010 SEC Female Diver of the Year Award in 2010. Dodson broke the SEC and school records on the three-meter board and on platform in 2011, while it was Salamone's performance at NAAs in 2010, along with Monica Dodson on the platform, that helped Craine and the UF women's swimming and diving team bring home its first national championship since 1982.

Craine molded two 2009 All-American divers in Kara Salamone and Dodson, both of whom have emerged as two of the best divers in recent Florida history.

For the second time in Craine's storied career, UF had two female divers compete at the NCAA Championships in the same year in 2009, the first being 2007-08 season when Gator Jeana Bartell joined Dodson on the boards at NAAs.

Salamone garnered two All-American honors at the 2009 NCAA Championship meet, her first as a Gator after transferring from the University of Texas, placing seventh on the platform and 14th on the one-meter diving board. Additionally, Salamone shattered a UF record with her 346.75 three-meter performance at the 2009 SEC Championship meet, good for fourth overall.

Dodson has been one of Florida's most consistent performers in her first three seasons, earning trips to the NCAA championships all three years. Dodson earned All-American honors in 2008 after finishing eighth in the platform competition, while earning 16th at the 2009 meet and bringing home an All-American Honorable Mention accolade.

Without a doubt, Craine is one of the most experienced diving coaches, and his international experience has served as a base for his ability to mold diving talent. Craine most recently served as the United States diving judge at the 2009 FINA World Championships in Rome, Italy, after also serving as the U.S. judge at the 2008 Junior World Diving Championships that took place in Aachen, Germany, last September.

Craine, now in his second stint with the Gators, first served under former UF head coach Randy Reese from 1976-81.

During his hiatus from Florida, Craine coached at the Schroeder YMCA in Brown Deer, Wis. for two years, at the University of Arkansas from 1983-85 and at LSU from 1985-89.

He returned to Florida in 1989 to revive an ailing Florida diving program. During the 1988 season, the Florida men's diving team didn't have a diving entrant at the SEC Championships. In the following four seasons, Craine's divers produced 37, 67, 62 and 70 points, respectively, to help the Gators win four-straight conference crowns. Craine led Florida's women divers to the top diving team score and was the runner-up for SEC Women's Diving Coach of the Year honors in 1990. He also coached Florida's first SEC champion in platform diving, guiding Jeff Nichols to the title in 1996.

Craine also coached SEC Champions Heather Lawrence (one-meter in 1998) and Robyn Grimes (one-meter in 1999 and three-meter in 2000). He added another SEC champion to his lengthy list when Zach Wilcox won the SEC title on the one-meter in 2003.

In 1985, while at Arkansas, Craine was named the NCAA Diving Coach of the Year and during his career at Louisiana State (1987-89), he was named SEC Women's Diving Coach of the Year in 1987, 1988 and 1989, as well as the 1988 SEC Men's Diving Coach of the Year.

Craine has coached five NCAA champions, including Chris Snode, Florida's first individual national champion, who won the 3-meter in 1978, and Alison (Maisch) Brothers, the 1989 1-meter winner. While at Arkansas, Craine coached two divers to three NCAA titles in 1985. Ronnie Meyer won both the men's 1-meter and 3-meter events, while Robin (Ford) Ballint claimed the women's 3-meter title.

Craine's divers have earned an impressive 60 All America honors. The most recent came in 2006, when UF freshman Jonathan Wilcox claimed All-America status in the 1M dive at the NCAA Championships.

He served as head coach of the U.S. Diving Team at the 22nd Annual Dive Canada in the summer of 1995. Craine also coached at the 1993 World University Games and the 1991 Pan American Games. At the 1991 Pan Ams, Craine coached 1989 NCAA women's one-meter champion, Alison Maisch, to two silver medals.

As a competitor at Michigan under coaching legend Dick Kimball, Craine earned third place finishes on both the one and three meter boards in the 1975 and 1976 NCAA Championships. He was also a 13-time finalist at the U.S. Nationals.

Craine was born in Ann Arbor, Mich., and raised in Fort Lauderdale, Fla. He graduated from the University of Michigan with a B.S. in physical education in 1976. Craine and his wife, the former Mindy Sawyer of Indialantic, Fla., have been married 36 years. They are the proud parents of Keith (31), Christopher (30) and Stephanie (26). Keith, married to the former Jesse Hayes (Rome, Ga.), serves as a major in the U.S. Air Force and flies search and rescue helicopters. Craine and his wife are proud grandparents of Emma Isabelle (4) and Lily Ann (2), daughters of Christopher, a 2006 graduate of the University of Florida, and his wife, the former Andrea Guy (Gainesville, Fla.). A 2008 graduate of the University of Central Florida, Stephanie is engaged and will marry Jan. 4.

Assistant coach Steve Jungbluth enters his fourth season with the Orange and Blue after helping lead UF's sprinters to several notable marks, including Sarah Bateman's school-record 21.89 in the women's 50-yard freestyle. Additionally, Jungbluth was instrumental in helping Brett Fraser capture the 2011 NCAA

title in the 200 free, while coaching Conor Dwyer to coming within .01 of the American record in the same event at the 2011 SEC Championships.

During the 2011-12 season, Jungbluth guided Brad deBorde to his first individual SEC title in the 50 freestyle where he also set a then school record of 19.25 in the event. Sarah Bateman, another sprint freestyler, bested her old school record time at the NCAA Championships in the 50 free when she finished in a time of 21.89. Under Jungbluth's coaching, Hilda Luthersdottir also broke the UF record in the 100 breaststroke at NCAA Championships when she finished 13th in a time of 1:00.05.

The success continued into the 2012-13 campaign, as Jungbluth's sprinter group dropped impressive times during the championship season. Freshman Natalie Hinds picked up seven All-American honors and was named SEC Female Freshman of the Year for her impressive conference meet performance, which included a championship in the 100 butterfly (51.70). Hinds set her best times in the 50 free (22.12) and 100 free (47.73) at NCAA's. Junior Ellese Zalewski swam UF's second fastest all-time 50 free of 22.04 and capped off her season with six NCAA All-American honors. On the men's side, Brad deBorde picked up the silver in the 50 free with a Gator record swim of 19.12 and capped his year off with a fifth place swim in the same event at NCAA's. Freshman Pawel Werner touched first in the 200 free (1:33.23) at the SEC Championships and picked up four NCAA All-America honors at the national meet.

Before his time in Gainesville, Jungbluth spent seven seasons directing Colgate to the top of the Patriot League. His women's squads won the league title in two of his last three seasons in Hamilton, N.Y., while every swimmer he recruited into the program achieved at least one personal-best time during the course of their careers. Jungbluth will work primarily with the sprint crew and breaststrokers, but will coach other areas as well.

Under Jungbluth's tutelage in 2009-10, five Colgate women's swimmers and divers were named to All-Patriot League first team, while two Colgate men's swimmers garnered conference honors as well. In the 2008-09 season, his women's team cruised to its second consecutive conference crown and the second-highest point total ever generated in the three-day event. At that meet, Colgate captured titles in 14 of 18 swimming events; set 18 team records and 14 league and meet records. On the men's side, the Raiders gained ground on the Patriot League's top four and only finished four points out of fourth place. Four

freshmen combined to shatter eight freshmen records. In the 2007-08 campaign, the Colgate women's team won the first Patriot League championship in program history. The Raiders placed a team-record 11 on the all-league teams, and six swimmers took home at least one gold medal as Colgate won five individual events and both medley relays.

During the 2005-06 season, Jungbluth led Colgate's women's team to sweep through its dual-meet schedule without a blemish against conference opponents, including beating Navy for the first time in school history, and upsetting four-time defending league champion Bucknell for the first time in 21 years. At the conference meet, the Raiders finished second to the Bison by the slimmest margin in league history. At the 2006 conference meet, the Raider women became the first team in the league to sweep all five relay events since Navy achieved the feat in 1995. Nine members of the women's team earned all-Patriot League honors after Colgate captured a meet-high 12 gold medals en route to its second runner-up finish in three years.

By the end of that season, the Raider women had broken all but four of Colgate's varsity swimming records. In his first season at Colgate, Jungbluth earned Patriot League Coach of the Year honors after leading the women's team to a second-place finish at the league championship and placing five athletes on the all-Patriot League team. It was the highest finish at a conference meet in the history of the Raider women's swimming and diving program.

That same year, the men's squad finished with a 9-5 record, the most wins in 20 seasons. The two teams combined for 180 lifetime-best performances over the course of the season.

Prior to taking over the Colgate program, Jungbluth served as assistant coach for three seasons at the Naval Academy. There, he produced nine Patriot League champions, six Patriot League record-setting performances, two Patriot League Championship Swimmers of the Meet and one team championship.

Before heading to Navy, Jungbluth served as an assistant coach and later interim head coach at Amherst (Mass.) College. As an assistant, he helped coach seven New England champions, 10 All-Americans and 13 honorable-mention All-Americans. In addition, the Jeffs broke 41 varsity and/or pool records, and the men's team posted a perfect 10-0 record during the 1995-96 season.

Jungbluth earned a bachelor's degree in exercise science from the University of Massachusetts, Amherst in 1994 and a master's degree in exercise science, also from UMass, in 1997. He was a four-year letterwinner for the Minutemen, serving as co-captain during his senior season.

Leah Martindale Stancil, a former Gator swimmer and UF grad, enters her sixth year as an assistant coach with the men's and women's swimming and diving programs after returning to her alma mater prior to the 2008 season.

A 12-time NCAA All-American at Florida, two-time Olympian and a four-time national record holder for her native country, Barbados, Stancil's impact has already been felt in both the men's and women's teams since her first season with the Gators. Stancil contributed to a coaching staff that led the 2008-09 Lady Gators to their 17th SEC Championship crown, while helping tutor 2009 NCAA Champions Bradley Ally, Gemma Spofforth and Shaune Fraser. In 2010, Stancil helped elevate the program to new heights, coaching the women's team to their first NCAA Championship since 1982.

In the 2012-13 campaign, Stancil assisted in guiding the men's and women's team to a pair of sixth place finishes at the NCAA Championships. This extended the University of Florida's streak of consecutive NCAA top-10 finishes to 13 for the men and 12 for the women. In addition, the Gator men's team captured the SEC Championship for the first time in 20 years, while the women's team placed third at the conference meet.

In the 2011-12 season Stancil helped the Gators to one individual NCAA title, eight SEC titles and three school records in the pool. During the 2010-11 season, Stancil aided the Gator swimmers to eight school records, top-10 finishes at the NCAA meet and a league-high 13 SEC titles.

In addition to her coaching duties, Stancil serves as the Gator Swim Camp Director, while also coordinating all team travel.

"Leah has a tremendous background in international competition, a big background in sports psychology and she's also a Gator," head coach Gregg Troy said of Stancil.

Previous to her return to Gainesville, Stancil served as an assistant coach at SEC foe South Carolina. Before joining the Gamecock coaching staff, the Bridgetown, Barbados, native served one year as an assistant coach at the Savannah College of Art and Design where she coached the women's team to a second-place finish and the men's team to a third-place finish at the NAIA National Championship. Before taking the position at SCAD, she was a graduate assistant at Florida for two years, while also serving as an instructor at Swim America in Gainesville, Fla.

A member of the 2002 Florida Gators SEC Championship team, Stancil is additionally the Barbados national record holder, both long course and short course, in the 50 and 100 free events, in addition to being the 50 and 100 butterfly record holder. She set her records for the 50 and 100 free events at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta and her butterfly records at the Commonwealth Games in 2002. She was additionally named the Barbados Female Sportsperson of the Year from 1995-97.

Stancil graduated from Florida in 2002 with a B.S. in Psychology. In August 2006, she completed her Master's of Science from UF. Stancil and her husband Michael have two children, Noah (5) and Emma (2).

- The Gators finished sixth with 285.5 points at the 2013 NCAA championships, giving the program its highest finish since 2011
- The Gators ended the 2013 NCAA Championships as the highest scoring SEC team, with Auburn placing eighth and Georgia 10th
- UF's top-10 finish marked the 14th consecutive top-10 finish for the program, all of which came under Head Coach Gregg Troy

SEC CHAMPIONSHIPS

Florida Swimming & Diving in the Southeastern Conference

Both the Florida men and women's swimming and diving programs have dominated the Southeastern Conference since league competition began, dating back to 1937 for the men and 1981 for the women. The men's team has claimed 34 SEC Championships, 16 more than its closest competitor, Auburn (18). In 2013 the men brought the SEC Championship back to UF, ending a 20 year dry spell and broke Auburn's streak of 16 straight. The women have claimed 17 out of 33 possible league crowns, including 11 consecutive from 1986 through 1997, and their most recent title in 2009. Both teams boast numerous SEC honors, as the men's history includes 21 SEC Male Swimmer of the Year awards and four SEC Male Diver of the Year selections. The SEC Female Swimmer of the Year has been a Gator 19 times, while the SEC Female Diver of the Year has been a Gator five times. Florida coaches have also earned 22 SEC Swimming Coach of the Year accolades and eight SEC Diving Coach of the Year awards, including seven by current diving coach Donnie Craine.

Combined, the two teams have won 678 SEC-event titles and received 510 SEC Academic Honor Roll accolades.
