Dear Parents,

Perse terms may be shorter than those of the maintained sector, but the longer school day coupled with evening and weekend events and fixtures mean that Perse pupils and their teachers are always ready for the holiday. It is important that children get a good break over the summer to relax and recharge, and I'm hopeful that the northward migration of the Azores High should lead to some good weather for us all to enjoy.

The summer is a time for independent learning and an opportunity for children to try new sports and hobbies. There is also much scope for learning through travel – whether by practising a foreign language, visiting historic sites or appreciating a geographic landscape. Those staying closer to home should not overlook the wealth of educational opportunities in Cambridge ranging from museums to bat safaris, or the joy that comes from reading books of their own choice (rather than those prescribed by teachers or exam boards). Learning is life long and not just limited to school classrooms in term time.

Thank you to everybody who braved the torrential downpours to attend Speech Day. As ever our pupil performers gave a wonderful account of themselves and in doing so exemplified The Perse's values of endeavour, intellectual curiosity and scholarship, breadth and balance, and the importance of supporting one another.

In our final assembly this morning we said thank you and farewell to those pupils and staff who are leaving The Perse. We will miss them and they leave with our best wishes for the future. We also awarded Colours to students across a range of activities. Special mention must go to our boys' First VI tennis team who won all of their fixtures (the First VI have only lost one match in the last two years). We also congratulate both the U15 boys and the U15 girls for winning the Cambridgeshire Championships.

As the students depart today so builders will arrive to complete the final projects in our expansion programme. The old history rooms are being converted to science labs and linked to the existing science faculty by a bridge. The old geography rooms are being refurbished for RS and philosophy, whose current classrooms will be transformed into an art studio and Mac suite. These improvements will mark the end of our building for expansion programme as pupil numbers are now stabilising prior to our steady state being achieved in our 400th year 2015-16. We are keen that existing parents should have the opportunity to see our enhanced campus in September, and as such we will be holding an 'open school' event on the evening of Thursday 11 September. Details are included in this mailing.

This is a particularly busy summer for holiday camps and activities. Indeed there is not a single day of the summer holiday when Perse pupils and staff will not be taking part in a school trip or activity. I wish the 300 pupils who will be participating in the various PES, CCF and sports trips well and thank their teachers for giving up some of their summer to make these excellent opportunities happen.

Sixth form public exam results will be issued electronically on Thursday 14 August, and staff will be in school to provide advice and support. CIE IGCSE results (English, English literature, biology and physics) and FSMQ additional maths results will also be issued electronically on Thursday 14 August. The same pattern will be repeated on Thursday 21 August when the remaining I/GCSE results will be released.

Full term begins again on Wednesday 3 September with Week A. On Tuesday 2 September there will be induction sessions for all Year 7, Year 9 and Lower Sixth pupils.

I end by thanking all Perse parents for their support in 2013-14. Your encouragement whether on the touch line, in the concert hall, or around the kitchen table as pupils complete homework or revise for exams is much appreciated. Special thanks must go to the Perse Parents Association for all the school events they have arranged and supported, the informal coffee mornings they run and the popular second hand uniform shop staffed by PPA volunteers.

Perse Exploration Society trip to Sweden

Straight after the end of Year 11's GCSE exams, the Perse Exploration Society Summit 11 group headed to Sweden for a week of canoeing. Perse student, Caroline Howard shares her experiences on the trip.

"On Sunday evening 48 Summit 11 students returned from the annual trip to Sweden where we successfully completed an eight day canoe hike across the vast Swedish lake of Stora Le. On our journey we stayed on remote and rocky islands with spectacular views and sunsets. Many of the islands were covered in pine forests which meant many of us could spend the night suspended between the trees in hammocks. The wildlife was just as amazing with sightings of osprey, peregrine falcons, a swimming moose and the sound of an evening conversation between a pack of wolves (thankfully on the mainland...).



The weather whilst we were there was much better than in previous years with strong winds at the start of the trip, which allowed for excellent sailing. The wind was followed by a superb week of sunshine such that we could swim in the afternoons. The trip ended with some magnificent thunderstorms.

There were many challenges during the trip. However, thanks to the skills we had learnt in cooking, fishing, foraging, shelter building and fire lighting we were able to overcome them. The most striking achievement was that every group managed to succeed at fire by friction. Several competitions were held including a bake off and a carving competition for which there were some very impressive entries such as a hand crafted squirrel and even a fully-fledged paddle!

The trip gave us the perfect opportunity to relax with all of our friends after our GCSEs as the pace of the expedition was gentle and some of the group had no means of telling the time throughout the trip. Sweden also allowed us to meet and get to know well the members of staff on the expedition, in a way which generally does not occur on a school trip, which therefore made it more interesting and rewarding than others. There could not have been a better way to begin the holidays than to be able to lose ourselves in the beauty of the Swedish Lake District.



Biology Challenge results 2014

Perse students in Year 9 and 10 achieved impressive results in the 2014 Biology Challenge competition. This is a national competition run by the Society of Biology and 32,500 students from across the UK took part this year.

300 Perse students achieved awards with 60 achieving gold awards, 70 silver awards and 83 bronze awards.

In addition one of our students from Year 10, Claudia Tomkys, was one of the top scorers in the competition and attended the awards ceremony at the Royal Society in London to collect her award which was presented by Professor Alice Roberts.

The Perse Primary School Partnership has had a busy end to a year packed with some great work with primary schools in Cambridge and Cambourne. With groups helping primary pupils with maths, French, Latin, computer science and citizenship throughout the year, the end of term has brought with it more opportunities to work with primary pupils in the local community.

As well as the Maths Roadshow, eight Lower Sixth formers went with Dr Macintosh and Dr Nickson to Fulbourn Primary School to help with their one day science festival. In addition, we had visitors at the Upper from Great Abington Primary and Shirley Primary. Great Abington enjoyed some computer programming with Mr Baker and ten pupils, followed by some tennis with Mr Ball and his helpers. Shirley School enjoyed athletics and basketball with the help of Mr Wedderburn, Mr St John, Mr Dann and Mr Mahendra and a team of Lower Sixth sports men and women. Overall, 60 Perse pupils were involved in primary outreach over these two days and their efforts gave the primary pupils a number of fantastic opportunities.
