CSG-free feds

Nats candidate joins MP Elliot in opposing north coast CSG

Both federal candidates for the upcoming September election have now gone renegade against their own parties over coal-seam gas (CSG).

National's hopeful for the seat of Richmond and Hungry Jack's operator Matthew Fraser told *The Echo* he agrees with sitting Labor MP Justine Elliot that CSG should not be mined in the northern rivers region.

Meanwhile, Ms Elliot and fellow MP Janelle Saffin (Page) stepped up the campaign by launching a petition, which, if 10,000 signatures are reached, will be tabled in state parliament. The petition, found at <http://bit.ly/XFdoGB>, requires it be printed out for signing.

And although the decision to frack and mine NSW lies with the state government, *The Echo* understands that the federal government could intervene by amending the Corporations Act. But so far, both candidates have not given any indication that this is an avenue they would pursue.

CSG free petition

Mr Fraser told *The Echo*, 'I do not believe that it is possible for CSG operations in Richmond to meet [The Nationals] criteria and I will not be supporting any such proposal.'

According to Mr Fraser, the federal National's criteria includes that no CSG 'development should occur unless it is proven safe for the environment' and that prime agricultural land 'must be protected from activities that destroy its capacity to deliver food security.'

Additionally, CSG, 'must not occur close to existing residential areas.'

But Ms Elliot condemned Mr Fraser's stance, claiming that, 'he can support CSG operations when it meets his guidelines.' She says that unlike Mr Fraser, she doesn't support CSG mining in our community, 'no ifs, no buts, no conditions.'

Additionally, a position on CSG by a Tony Abbott-led federal government, aligned with the Nationals, remains unclear. Little exists of CSG policy on the Liberals' website. One press release, dated April 4, 2012, blasted a Greens inquiry into coal-seam gas as 'politically motivated and counterproductive.' And an address to the *West Australian* Leadership Matters breakfast in late 2012, Mr Abbott was critical of the red tape holding up a CSG project in central QLD.

Capitalise the outrage

When asked what is the difference between both candidates, Mr Fraser said, 'The only difference is I have never change my position and I'm not using the CSG agenda to hoodwink voters.'

'I think it is obvious to most people: the election is called then she's taking a stand against CSG. Where was she on this issue for the past two years?'

'At the same time her Labor party has stated they wish to reduce obstacles and impediments to fast-track CSG operations.'

While both candidates scramble to capitalise on public outrage, it remains unclear as to what influence Ms Elliott has, and potentially Mr Fraser would have, in stopping it. Their respective parties at both state and federal level are planning to expand CSG and general mining. Federal Labor environment MP Tony Burke gave conditional approval for 110 CSG wells at Gloucester last week, while the state Nat/Lib government failed in a bid to push CSG on suburban areas of southwestern Sydney in early February. QLD federal independent Bob Katter put forward legislation to stop CSG but it failed last week. 'It's his second attempt to stop the practice,' reports www.news.com.au, 'after his previous bid was voted down by the major parties last year.'

State and feds refuse CCTV funding

Funding to install CCTV for Byron's CBD has not only been refused by the state, but now by the federal government.

Despite in-principle support from Council and with urging from police and the business community, it appears the only option left is for CCTV to be installed and run privately.

President of Byron's chamber of commerce (Byron United), Paul Waters, said that after the state government refused to assist, local MP Don Page approached the federal attorney general's office who delegated the request to the federal minister for home affairs, Jason Clare.

That request was declined last week.

When *The Echo* asked Richmond Labor MP Justine Elliot if she was able to make representations, she said she

had also spoken to the home affairs minister about the need for CCTV, but again was not given any commitment.

'It takes a suite of measures to address the complex issue of alcohol related crime,' she said. 'Police numbers are vitally important to this. Community education and resources are also important. CCTV can also play a role.'

She also blamed the current state government for lack of police presence. 'I know there are many great community groups working with the police to try to address these problems. While the police do a great job in difficult circumstances, the fact is, if there aren't enough resources, the whole community suffers.'

'As Don Page has been unable to deliver a CCTV grant for the area I would urge him as minister for the north coast to get his government to deliver more police and resources

to areas like Byron to help curb the alcohol-related violence.

'We constantly see his government giving more police resources to Sydney, while our police numbers are cut on the north coast.'

Meanwhile Mr Waters has says he has taken on loan 'portable high-tech mobile CCTV units,' which he will trial in the next month. 'We'll look at sponsorship if the government doesn't end up contributing,' he says.

Man found safe

29-year-old Charl Viviers, who was declared missing by police following the January floods, has turned up alive and well in Byron Bay.

Washed-out road partially reopen and supplies flown in

Thankfully Wanganui Road reopened on Friday afternoon but only to authorised vehicles under 3.5 tonnes. The road had been closed since a landslide over the Australia Day long weekend.

He says the shire's 'significant number of landslips' are being assessed by geotechnical consulting engineers and reported to the Natural Disaster Assistance Scheme to gain access to funding for repair works.

Meanwhile, Upper Coopers Creek Road remains closed and continues to affect about 40 properties.

SES helicopters have been resupplying residents with essential items, which occurs on Monday and Thursday, say Council.

In late-breaking news, the Local Emergency Management

Committee local operations controller (LEOCON), Superintendent Stuart Wilkins, says an emergency access route has been identified for the beleaguered road.

'This route will only be used by emergency service providers should a life threatening incident occur and the Westpac Rescue Helicopter service can not attend. The development of an interim access road will take some time and is dependent on weather, approval from private landowners and access.'

The Upper Coopers Creek Road landslide occurred on the Australia Day long weekend and the road was closed to motor vehicles and pedestrian access on Wednesday February 6 due to the risk of immediate collapse of the road.

Actions awarded that helped save mum and bub

Local man Tomas Leszczynski was one of 40 award recipients at a ceremony in Tweed Heads last week.

Tomas, along with another man Robert Jazwinski, were awarded the Tweed Byron Local Area Command Certificates of Merit for service to the community.

On February 23, 2012, a serious motor vehicle accident occurred at Ferndale near Murwillumbah and both men, without regard for their personal safety, provided invaluable assistance to police to remove two seriously injured persons who were trapped in the vehicle.

Mr Leszczynski climbed into the wreckage to free a little girl who was trapped in the back by the driver's seat and then stabilised the mother's neck and made sure she continued breathing, as she was uncon-

scious. He made sure the driver of the van was okay and then called 000 for help.

Despite the incident happening during a severe storm, both Tomas and Robert made the unconscious driver comfortable and re-assured a trapped baby. They then assisted to pry open the car window and to

remove the badly injured baby. 'The men the helped to slow traffic down during the downpour to prevent any further collisions and showed great control prior to the arrival of emergency services', said Sergeant Mal Kentwell during the ceremony.

'Throughout the ordeal, they

showed total motivation and concern to assist the trapped, injured persons, and without their assistance the outcome of the vehicle accident could have been more severe.'

Tomas said he was surprised when he got news of the award.

'I just did my best to keep a mother and her toddler alive until medical help arrived', he said. 'Unfortunately, there had been an earlier accident on the other side of town, which meant I was stuck in the car for about 25 minutes before any other help arrived. I then stayed with the mum while the SES cut into the car to get the little girl out. After that I got out of their way while they cut the mother out.'

Tomas added the incident was of course very traumatic, one that took a long time to recover from. Thankfully the mother and child survived thanks to the pair's clear and present thinking.

Bruns foreshore cabins 'must go'

Brunswick Heads residents have welcomed Byron Shire Council's move to regain public access along the riverbank at the Terrace Caravan Park, which had been encroached on by dwellings and other structures for years by the state government.

The decision means around 16 permanent residents have to be relocated off their prime foreshore sites within three years, with cabins and other infrastructure set back ten metres from the top of the riverbank (Simpsons Creek).

The administrator of the town's three Crown-reserve holiday parks, the North Coast Accommodation Trust (NCAT), now has to ensure the setback, plus a three-metre foreshore buffer zone, is implemented in that time. The foreshore area of the park includes unauthorised construction of carports, garden sheds, verandahs, patios, rock walls, hard paving, staircases, exotic gardens and boat moorings, which Council says exacerbates erosion.

Huge turnout for CSG-free picnic concert

A stellar cast of performers, including Xavier Rudd and Ash Grunwald, performed to around 600 people on paddocks next to the Doubtful Creek coal-seam gas (CSG) test-drilling site on Saturday.

'Don's Party' was hosted by Don Knight, local of more than 50 years, as a response to the direct threat from CSG mining to his and surrounding properties.

Despite the music and fun, the serious issue was highlighted by Mr Knight, who has already been affected by the lighting and noise from the site.

He says he has genuine concerns about water, soil and air pollution. 'I am very disappointed. Already we have bright

lights shining at us at night and the noise from the site comes straight across. That noise goes 24/7, Don told *The Echo*.

A lagoon on his property, which provides the only water for his stock, is fed from a creek that runs through the test site.

'We have had no consultation from Metgasco or my neighbour,' he says, 'only a glossy leaflet in the mailbox.'

'When your assets get threatened you have to fight. There are others sitting around with their heads in a bucket of sand; they will end up losing their properties if they don't fight.'

After the event more than 200 people walked to the rig site and were able to gain access.

Xavier Rudd told the audience, 'Our government is hopeless, ruthless and toxic in terms of protecting our land.'

'So much land has been ruined in 200 years; so much culture has been devastated.'

Protesters are now camping nearby after the state forest was closed to public access.

Welcome back Council

It was new GM Ken Gainger's first day at last Thursday's Council meeting, and as to be expected he sat in as an observer, soaking in the finer nuances of Byron's local government decision factory.

The following are just a few areas covered:

The Sun Bistro proposal in Sunrise looks set to re-use an existing building after Council approved a change to its DA.

Debate again was divided the benefits, or not, of a pub close to residential areas. Cr Ibrahim made a passionate speech in favour of the 'family bistro', as it was outside of Byron's CBD and is opportunity for local residents to stay in the neighbourhood. 'I know people who bought in Sunrise 20 years ago who are waiting for a bistro.'

Staff announced the breaking news that Mayor Simon Richardson's park-and-ride proposal was rejected by the state government.

Increased Council powers to tow away vehicles are to be explored after council voted to ask the state government's permission. The motion requests, 'that Council be granted powers usually afforded to the Police... That these powers

be those comparable to those already granted to the City of Sydney and, in particular, during major entertainment and holiday periods.' Deputy mayor Di Woods, who put forward the motion, says illegal camping in vehicles happens every weekend, and all over the shire, including Brunswick Heads and Tyagarah nature reserve. It was noted that signage doesn't work, and staff say people move to other areas.

Rural landowners affected by sweeping changes to Council's new LEP (Local Environment Plan) will be sent letters after council voted to advise them of the changes. Cr Woods, who penned the motion, said she was still dissatisfied with the LEP document. 'Our maps are flawed and we've based our LEP on it,' she said. A foreshadowed motion will advise the Minister Brad Hazzard that it believes that consultants, Parsons Brinckerhoff, have a conflict of interest as independent assessors of Byron Shire's proposed E2, E3 and E4 Zonings as they were Council's paid consultant who developed Byron Shire's Local Environment Study?

And a petition to re-seal Mullumbimby's Pine Avenue was referred to the Community Infrastructure Advisory Committee.

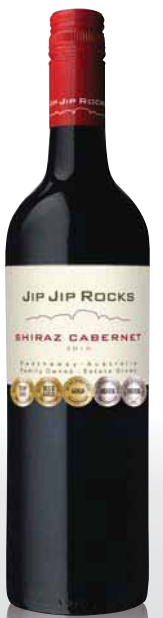

A peek inside the lives of Indian women

A gripping eye-opening documentary exploring the lives of a handful of women living in India will launch The Byron Bay International Film Festival on Friday March 1.

Moving between two extremes, *The World Before Her* documents the polar opposites of Indian life for women. On one hand, the intimate drama of the Miss India pageant's rigorous beauty 'bootcamp' is explored, while the intense regime of a militant Hindu fundamentalist camp for young girls is presented on the other.

It's a provocative portrait of India and its current cultural conflicts during a key transitional era in the country's modern history.

The film's formulation is one that is a personal one for Indian-born filmmaker Nisha Pahuja: Nisha. Her family left

India for Toronto when she was just three for economic opportunity, yet Nisha still has India in her heart – the content of her documentaries are fixated on her homeland.

Nisha also had a fairly traditional Indian upbringing. 'My father was extremely conserva-

tive in most respects but he demanded that all his children be educated and have careers. Though I was supposed to be a doctor, my mother was much more forward-looking and understood the cultural conflict my brothers and I were constantly negotiating.'

But Nisha still has India in her heart – the content of her documentaries is fixated on her homeland.

Pahuja says that she has not exhausted her interest in the women of the fundamentalist movement, but feels she has had her say in this particular polarity. 'I think the complexity of emotions I felt shooting the stories and the desire to do that justice comes through. I think what also comes through is just how much this film was a labour of love on the part of everyone involved in it – both the crew and the subjects.'

The Byron Bay International Film Festival is celebrating its seventh year with the screening of more than 200 films from over 30 countries.

The festival program presents feature films, documentaries, animation and short films that support and celebrate local and international cinema.

Police assoc pressures OLGR to act over rising crime

The NSW police association has urged The Office of Liquor, Gaming and Racing (OLGR) to take immediate action over the rise in alcohol-related assaults in Byron Bay.

The call comes despite the recent visit by OLGR, who met with liquor accord, police, council and community groups.

Police Association president Scott Weber said alcohol-related assaults in the town have risen 20 per cent since 2009/10 and assaults on police have jumped 25 per cent – well above the state average.

As part of The Last Drinks coalition, which represents NSW emergency service workers, Mr Weber said, 'Our doctors, nurses, paramedics and police see the cost of alcohol-related violence first hand every single

day. When a suite of simple, moderate measures to reduce alcohol-related violence were introduced in Newcastle the number of after dark assaults dropped by 37 per cent and emergency department admissions dropped by 26 per cent. It's clear the measures work.'

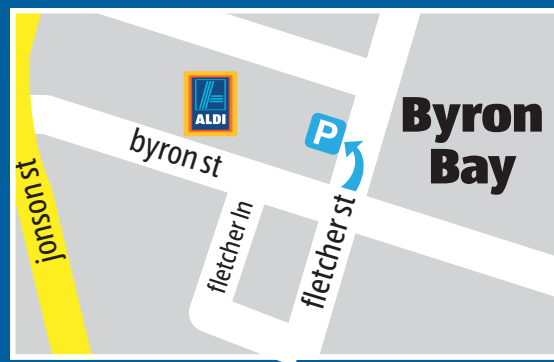

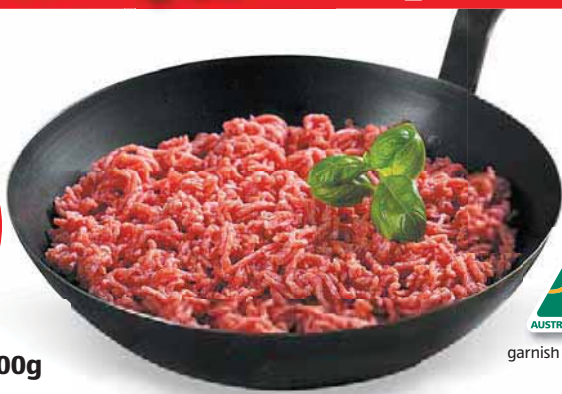

An examination of global corporate power

Helena Norberg-Hodge explains the impetus behind the upcoming Economics of Happiness conference

For most of human history, our survival has depended on intimate and enduring bonds of interdependence with one another and with Earth. We evolved in tight-knit communities with a deep connection to the plants, the animals – the living world – around us. But today we seem to have lost our way: we're isolated from one another, and the natural environment has ended up little more than a source of distant resources to sustain consumer lifestyles.

In order to shift direction from the destructive path we're on, it's essential that we look closely at the root cause of our social and environmental problems: an economic system that separates us further and further from one another and from nature.

Like most westerners, I grew up under the impression that economic growth meant progress, and that the environmental costs of growth were unfortunate but necessary. After World War II, the government of my native country, Sweden – as well as almost every other industrialised nation – dismantled smaller-scale, diversified food production in favour of large-scale agriculture, and weakened community life in favour of rapid urbanisation.

The tale of Ladakh

I might not have seen the links between the economy, community and the environment had I not had the privilege, as a young woman, of living in relatively intact local economies in rural Spain, Bhutan, and Ladakh (or Little Tibet).

I arrived in Ladakh in 1975 when the Ladakhis still lived in large, extended families. I witnessed how they nurtured children in ways that led them to feel appreciated, seen and heard; this, in turn, led to a positive, relaxed sense of self.

Intergenerational care and exchange was part of daily life, and there was much less fear of growing old than in the modern western world. Ladakh was no paradise, but because of the

intricate webs of mutual support there was also less strain on individual relationships; there was more peace and collaboration, less strife and conflict.

People were not only linked to one another, but to the rest of the living world around them. Their food, clothing and shelter were produced and traded within the region. Most necessities were met within walking distance, providing a sense of empowerment at the local level. Overall, the Ladakhis were the most peaceful and contented people I had ever encountered – they sparkled with humour and vitality.

In the 35 years since I first arrived in Ladakh, I have seen how the outside global economy undermined their economy, culture and inner wellbeing. The changes I witnessed led me to recognise the connections between our economic system and overpopulation, overconsumption and a decline in human and ecological health. I saw how advertising and the media affected young children with the message: if you want to have the respect of your peer group, you've got to have the latest blue jeans, the latest iPhone, you've got to join the consumer culture, or else you're no-one.

At the same time as I witnessed the tragic psychological effects of a corporate-led economy, I also saw the effects on the environment and employment. Products from the other side of

the Himalayas sold for half the price of local products, destroying the market for local farmers, builders and shop owners, and this of course destroyed local jobs while all the transport and packaging polluted the pristine environment.

A global story

Having had my eyes opened, I studied this process around the world, finding that the giant tobacco company Philip Morris was the largest food corporation in Sweden. And among other insanities, potatoes were being shipped by road to Italy to be washed, put in plastic bags and shipped back again to Sweden. I've discovered in the meanwhile that these are not isolated examples but part of a global process whereby local economies are being destroyed.

Our tax monies have been used to industrialise and corporatise production in ways that have concentrated profits in the hands of giant corporations like Coca-Cola and Monsanto, and big banks like Morgan Stanley and Goldman Sachs. To increase global trade, transport and energy infrastructures were built up to serve mega-cities and sprawling metropolises, while neglecting smaller cities, towns and rural areas. At the same time, governments from both the right and left signed on to trade treaties that opened their economies to outside investment, while scrapping laws

and regulations designed to protect national and local businesses, jobs, and resources.

In the process, national sovereignty has been relinquished to giant transnational corporations and undemocratic supranational bodies like the World Trade Organisation (WTO) and the Bank of International Settlements (BIS).

In the name of growth through increased trade and comparative advantage, governments have blindly hollowed out their own economies.

The problem is not international trade per se, but the scale and power of global corporations. Whether it's gas fracking, CO₂ emissions, plastic islands in the Pacific, extinction of species, clear-cutting of rainforests, or the growth of poverty and social breakdown, the roots of our problems lie in the destruction of more diversified, and productive, local and national economies.

The realisation is growing that we need fundamental change. The political left tends to favour big government and strong regulations while being suspicious of big business, while the right favours big business and rejects big government. At the grassroots, however, both are being rejected, creating a vacuum and uncertainty. By strengthening the economy at the community level, the growing localisation movement is beginning to provide some answers.

At Byron's Community Centre, from March 15 to 17, my organisation has the privilege of hosting visionary leaders from six continents to discuss the multiple benefits of localisation and highlight inspiring movements and initiatives from around the world. Promising the world in 52-pages

I didn't know the federal Liberal Party had any policies until stumbling upon the 'Real Solutions for all Australians', released only a few weeks ago on January 27, 2013.

It's a glossy 52-page brochure that includes ubiquitous images of boardrooms, hard-hats, baby-kissing, open-cut mining and veggie gardens. And its 15,750 word count has plenty of gushing rhetoric and motherhood statements, along with openly fascist phrases such as, 'We need to address Australia's growing workplace militancy.'

It's basically an uncoded promise of a utopian life, free of pesky unions, lower taxes and wait for it – no carbon tax (it's mentioned 26 times).

A slightly weird 'Costed Fully Budgeted' watermark stamp also appears throughout, obviously as an attempt to correct the seven billion dollar black-hole impression which is yet to be corrected.

It's light on substance, bereft of big ideas and an all encompassing vision that reflects who we really are. But such is the state of current Australian politics. Anyway, the Mad Monk Abbott team also reckon the nation's top priorities are more efficient government, building modern infrastructure and improving health and education services. Improving border security, manufacturing innovation, agriculture exports, world-class education and research are also featured as desirable outcomes for Abbott's vision. But of course not a word on culture and arts.

To pay for it all, they unsurprisingly plan to boost mining exports to the rapidly growing Asian middle-class. Apparently it's a golden opportunity to send them as much fossil fuels as they can choke on.

'...estimates suggest that Asian demand could almost double our net energy exports over the next 20 years.'

And the answer to address our obscenely high carbon emissions and climate change complicity is to 'establish a 15,000-strong Green Army to clean-up the environment'. Presumably that means dole-bludging moochers will be asked to plant trees or something. What corporate suck-hole stupid fuckwits.

Achieving such ambitious prosperity goals, according to them, is to all but give up on curbing emissions. Their goal of five per cent by 2020 is far behind most other western countries, such as Spain, who in the last three months saw windfarms produce more electricity than any other source for the first time. The UK's *Guardian* reports that the country remains on track to meet its goal of generating around 40 per cent of its electricity from renewables by 2020. So okay, Spain is an economic basket case. But if they can achieve that, the Liberals/Nationals obviously just don't give a shit about future generations or don't understand CO₂.

Julia's art of mining negotiations

Julia Gillard is frequently blamed for things which are not entirely her fault. But not in the case of the mining tax.

The Minerals Resource Rent Tax is as much her personal burden as the words she used to announce it on July 1, 2010: 'The breakthrough agreement keeps faith with our central goal from day one: to deliver a better return for the Australian people for the resources they own and which can only be dug up once.' True, but much the same could be said of the tax itself, and Gillard comprehensively muffed it with the initial exhumation.

When Gillard had greatness thrust upon her, she announced that her first priority was to end the controversy over Kevin Rudd's version of the tax – or, more precisely, to put an end to the fundamentally dishonest but devastatingly effective advertising campaign the mining industry had mounted against it. The big three miners – BHP-Billiton, Rio Tinto and X Strata – were called in, to be confronted by Gillard, treasurer Wayne Swan and resources and energy minister Martin Ferguson, but not by the treasury boffins who actually understood the nuts and bolts of what was a fairly complex proposal.

And in her eagerness to put the issue to bed, Gillard gave the miners everything they demanded and in fact considerably more: a drafting error meant that the Commonwealth's offer to cover state royalties extended not just to present rates, but to all future ones as well. Naturally the states immediately raised the ante, resulting in the Commonwealth paying the miners to pay the states, not quite the outcome intended.

In addition, Gillard and her ministers agreed to allow the miners to offset their write-downs against what was left of

their tax. At the time this did not look too bad, but it proved a picnic for the armies of accountants and lawyers (themselves a tax deduction) on the miners' payrolls. Treasury's first estimate of Canberra's take for 2012 was \$3.7 billion.

As time went on this was reduced to \$3 billion, then to \$2 billion. The final result was a derisory \$126 million.

The problem was, as should

demand that the loopholes be plugged and the miners made to contribute, if not their fair share, then at least a bit more than the handful of loose change they had tossed in to date.

But the miners threatened swift and savage retribution if one word of the tax was changed: as far as they were concerned a deal was a deal. And Gillard, beset on so many other fronts, was not inclined to

cheer squad to portray her as a puppet and a liar, weak and untrustworthy, incapable and unworthy of her office. In practice the carbon tax had proved to be not such a bad idea after all, especially if considered in the context of the first step towards a comprehensive emissions trading scheme, but putting it in place had been the albatross around her neck for most of her first term and had meant that her government started from well behind scratch in 2013.

And it was all so unnecessary; the Greens were unlikely to support any coalition government at any time, and were never, ever, going to throw their weight behind one led by Tony Abbott.

To save face, they were always going to make demands on Gillard, and started with what amounted to an ambit claim; but they would have settled for far less than she was prepared to surrender. So Milne knew, first hand: Gillard was indeed more interested in appeasement at any cost than in holding out for the best terms she could get.

She should have taken a lead from her colleague Martin Ferguson, the man who succeeded Bob Hawke as president of the ACTU.

When asked whether he could hope to match the record of his predecessor, the great conciliator, in settling industrial disputes, Ferguson replied: 'I don't try to settle disputes. I try to win them.' But that has never been Gillard's style.

She can be persistent, stubborn, even pig-headed when she considers that there is no alternative. But if there is a deal there to be taken, she is always inclined to take it – whether it is in the national interest or not.

have been clear from day one, was that Gillard had been intent not on driving a hard bargain but on securing a quick fix. It was all about the politics. This was what Rudd was implying last week when he commented: 'No government should ever take a backward step in pursuit of the national interest.' Gillard had not only taken the backward step; she had effectively fallen flat on her back, pleading with the miners: 'Take me!'

At the time, of course, it worked: the advertisements stopped and the miners went back to profiteering, leaving Gillard to deal with her other intractable problems: climate change and asylum seekers. But it only ever going to be a stopgap solution; the failure of the Mineral Resources Rent Tax (MRRT) to provide any worthwhile returns and the government's urgent need to find more funds – Swan had already spent the non-existent returns predicted by Treasury – provoked an outcry from the Greens and many of Labor's own backbenchers. They

resist their ultimatum. Greens leader, Christine Milne, was not impressed. 'The prime minister is always cited as a great negotiator but I have pointed out that it's not about whether you get an agreement, it's about whether the agreement you get actually delivers,' Senator Milne chided.

She was referring to the Mineral Resources Rent Tax, but there was another example of Gillard being a soft touch which Milne was perhaps too tactful to mention, and that was the agreement with the Greens-Gillard negotiated after the 2010 election. This was totally one-sided and incredibly generous; it effectively gave the then Greens leader Bob Brown de facto cabinet status with unprecedented access to government ministers and the public service.

And it accepted, indeed embraced, the implementation of the carbon tax Gillard had specifically ruled out in her pre-election platform. This latter proved all but fatal to Gillard and her government, allowing Tony Abbott and his media

Recently I received a speeding ticket for apparently driving over the 60km limit at St

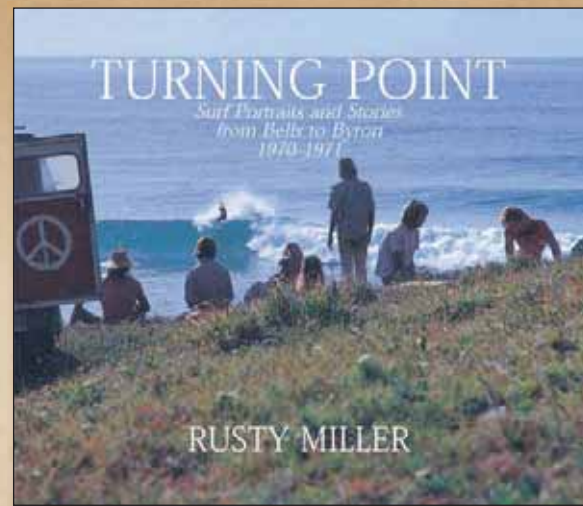



Subsidising the beach

Council's meeting on February 14 saw a shift in our approach to the 'Byron Bay Embayment' – and whether to armour the dunes with rocks before the Coastal Management Plan is completed. That plan will determine our long-term approach. Meantime, temporary short-term protection works can be undertaken. None of the current armoring in the Embayment is deemed up to the standard of long-term protection. Chinks in the existing armour are clearly visible – walk the beaches (at low tide).

To date, Council has built temporary short-term protection using 'geo-bags', the giant sandbags you see these days on Belongil Beach. Private landholders have built rock walls in the past. Under current rules, they are also allowed to build temporary short-term works after applying to the state government for permission.

A report on February 14 asked Council to note 1) continuance of the approach set in 2011 by the previous Council; 2) that hardware options are being considered; and 3) that landowners at Belongil have recently lobbied Council to buy cheap rocks from Boulderstone, who are excavating for the current Pacific Highway upgrade including its tunnel. Those three elements were passed by Council along with two further parts: that Council buy the rocks and that it prepare applications for placing the rocks at Belongil.

The motion was successful, five votes to four.

The new Council appears to be planning a retreat from 'Planned Retreat', which has been Council's position on coastal management since the 1980s. Under planned retreat, landholders had clarity that there would be little or no government help. They simply had to move on if the sea came too close to their buildings. Protecting such land would be positive from an owner's perspective but government agreeing to protect a coast permanently includes the cost of repairs to such hardware for the rest of eternity. On a retreating coast that cost grows with time so that future generations foot the bill for what may eventually become an island, like Venice. It's clearly unsustainable. Worse than that, rocks on a retreating coast mean you lose the beach (and isn't that why we live here).

Anyway, if you have an opinion, 2013 is the year to speak up.

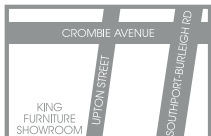

Ten things you need to know about coal-seam gas

In February and March, local volunteers will doorknock the 6,924 residents of Byron Bay, Bangalow and Ocean Shores asking 'Do you want to see your land/road gasfield free?'

Before you answer, consider these ten points:

- 1. In Australia, as in the UK** (but unlike USA), the Crown owns mineral rights under land you own. The NSW state government sells the exploration and mining rights to companies. The law requires landowners to provide access, drilling and other facilities. Some compensation is offered by the mining company.
- 2. The NSW state government** licensed much of New South Wales, including Byron Shire, for coal-seam gas exploration. In our shire, the mining company holding the licence is Dart Energy, taking over from Arrow Energy. Dart has international offices in eight countries. While Arrow was owned by Shell and PetroChina, Dart's main shareholders are a bunch of mining companies, banks, investment funds, and wealthy individuals who invest in oil and gas. Dart will decide where to sink test wells but has made no announcement yet about drilling in Byron.
- 3. Fracking is one of several**

methods of getting underground methane gas to the surface. All methods produce enormous volumes of water mixed with polluting chemicals flowing from deeply drilled holes. Gas and polluted air may be released in large quantities both at the wellhead until sufficient densities are reached for the gas to be profitably tapped, and in other unexpected areas through geological cracks. Another byproduct is undrinkable salty water often with toxic, radioactive compounds and heavy metals. From a few thousand litres to several hundreds of thousand litres are produced each day, a waste which must be handled in storage ponds or treated.

4. CSG mining in USA results in a network of pads an acre in size, containing several drilling rigs, holding tanks, well heads to pipelines, etc. These pads are set every half to four kilometres apart in every direction. Most of the gas is bled off in the first five years or so. At that point the site can be redrilled/refracked, sold off to much smaller companies or closed. New buyers may run lean operations for some years and then go belly-up, abandoning the sites and infrastructure.

5. Residents of Tara near Dalby, Queensland, living close to CSG sites, report headaches, rashes, nausea and vomiting, nose bleeds, eye and throat

irritation. Air and water sampling by Australia's National Toxics Network found volatile organic compounds, known and suspected carcinogens, at a wellhead 24 hours after being hydraulically fractured. This included benzene and bromodichloromethane.

6. Farmers on very rich soils, like those in the northern rivers region, are typically adamantly opposed to CSG mining. Desperately impoverished farmers in places with very poor soil like Tara may be glad to get \$5,000 per well, until other problems arise. They are required to sign confidentiality agreements, which often leave them unable to compare their compensation and experiences with others.

7. Concerned citizens throughout Australia are surveying their communities according to a 'street strategy' developed by Annie Kia, from The Channon. Some of Ballina and Byron Shires have been surveyed, while most of Lismore is complete. To date, responses from communities have been from 85 per cent to high 90 per cent in favour of remaining gasfield free. Residents present these results to local councils as the reason they will refuse to allow drilling rigs on to their land. In NSW, this democratic action contrasts sharply with the results of the last state election, when Barry O'Farrell's pro-

mining government received 51.5 per cent of the vote.

8. Local police are seen to hold the same attitudes as other residents. To defend their unpopular actions, the O'Farrell government has bussed in the Public Order Squad in expensive confrontations with residents who block drilling rigs.

9. All local, state and federal politicians and candidates, across party lines, oppose CSG mining in the northern rivers. The exceptions are three local sitting National state members. The Aboriginal Land Council applied for prospecting licences, but the Arakwal (Byron Bay) and Githabul (Kyogle) both oppose CSG mining. France leads a variety of nations and states in banning CSG mining altogether.

10. Other CSG issues not discussed here: impact on property prices, tourism, health of stock and wildlife, aquifers, longterm farming yields, costs of land restoration and decommissioning wells, compulsory mining damage bonds.

The path to healthy breathing and restful sleep

Physiotherapist and breathing educator Tess Graham (right) is the author of *Relief from Snoring and Sleep Apnoea*, recently published by Penguin Australia. After her successful visit to Byron Bay in November, 2011, she is holding more workshops for clients and health professionals next month. Peter Thompson spoke to her about her work.

Peter Thompson: The basic point seems to be that breathing is not properly understood.

Tess Graham: Yes, it sounds ridiculous at first because we take breathing for granted. And we don't necessarily associate disease with dysfunctional breathing. But I would go so far as to say that many common chronic disorders have their origin in incorrect breathing. Unfortunately, there's a belief that the 'deeper' you breathe, that is, the more air you breathe, the better. But it does more harm than good.

Your initial training was as a physiotherapist. When did you first become aware that there might be more to learn?

In hospitals, physiotherapists traditionally use exercises that involve deep breathing and coughing techniques. We don't focus on normalising the patient's whole pattern of breathing. My thinking changed when my young children developed asthma and I realised that their everyday breathing was wrong, compared to normal textbook definitions. That was the light bulb moment. They were breathing too fast, and too heavily. In fact, too deeply – too much air! And when they breathed even more deeply when they were running around, even laughing, it could tip them into an asthma attack.

As you say, we take breathing for granted so the idea that we might actually have to learn

to breathe correctly seems counter-intuitive. What do you mean by 'correct breathing'?

Correct breathing is breathing at the correct rhythm, rate and volume and with the correct use of the breathing muscles. Correct breathing is silent and very gentle. There are myriad symptoms that are directly connected to dysfunctional breathing. You can go from doctor to doctor getting pills and treatments for this and that, but if you don't fix the underlying problem, you can never be truly healthy. No ifs, no buts, no exceptions.

The Buteyko Breathing Method was introduced to Australia in 1990 and you were one of the first people to study it here.

How did that come about?
For seven years, I had been searching for a way to relieve my children's asthma, and I read about Buteyko in a health magazine. That was an end to their asthma and the beginning of a new career for me. I studied the work of the Russian scientist Dr Konstantin Buteyko and others who have shown conclusively that asthmatics characteristically over-breathe and that over-breathing or hyperventilation causes inflammation and constriction in the lungs.

I know from personal experience that breathing retraining can be highly effective. What has your experience been?

Well first of all, it saved my children from a lifetime of asthma and asthma medications. It also rescued my father from severe breathing distress with emphysema and a heart condition and it gave him nine extra years of life. And, despite my training as a physiotherapist, I started for the first time to seriously observe how people breathe! For example, I started counting respiration rates and found that typically they were double the desirable rate. I listened to breathing – audible breathing



is another sure sign of over-breathing.

I could see there was a great need for breathing retraining and not only for asthmatics. Snorers, people with panic attacks, fatigue or poor exercise capacity also needed it. So I studied and apprenticed myself to a skilled breathing educator and then established, in Canberra, Australia's first dedicated breathing retraining centre. Over a period of 20 years I have trained more than 5,000 people with consistently good results.

Does anyone just naturally breathe correctly? And what's

wrong with bad breathing, anyway? Is it such a big deal?

Healthy babies born to healthy mothers breathe correctly. And that's about it. Lots of children and 90 per cent of adults breathe incorrectly, ranging from mild to extreme dysfunction.

Why is that?

Illness, poor posture, emotional stress, feeling overwhelmed by your circumstances, can all trigger bad breathing. There's also chemical stress because our environment and our foods are typically loaded with additives and toxins that have an inflammatory effect on the body and raise your breathing rate, without you knowing or doing anything to keep it in check. Keep up the over-breathing and you can end up with swollen tonsils and adenoids, snoring, sleep apnoea, asthma, anxiety, panic attacks and brain fog. Yes, it is a big deal! So many people are running below par because the most fundamental of all bodily

processes, their breathing, is dysfunctional. Snoring and sleep apnoea increase your risk of developing high blood pressure, heart disease, diabetes, cancer, and depression. Even sexual dysfunction.

But surely doctors know what correct breathing is?

Checking a patient's baseline breathing pattern is not part of standard medical diagnosis. It would be great if it was as common as checking their blood pressure or heart rate or blood sugar level. Until you recognise and address a habit of chronic over-breathing that is a major factor in the dehydration, inflammation and constriction seen in the nose, sinuses, throat and lungs, you're never going to truly get on top of problems like asthma, snoring and sleep apnoea. You will continue to need drugs, surgical procedures or appliances like CPAP machines to relieve the symptoms.

you advocate just another alternative health idea? Is there any solid science behind it?

Breathing retraining should not be considered an alternative therapy but part of primary healthcare management for breathing disorders. It is totally science-based, grounded in well-known principles of physiology, physics and biochemistry.

Why did you write your book Relief from Snoring and Sleep Apnoea?

I wanted people to know the facts – and get relief. We do not have to just put up with snoring and sleep apnoea and the uncomfortable and intrusive treatments that go with them. We can simply change the way we breathe.

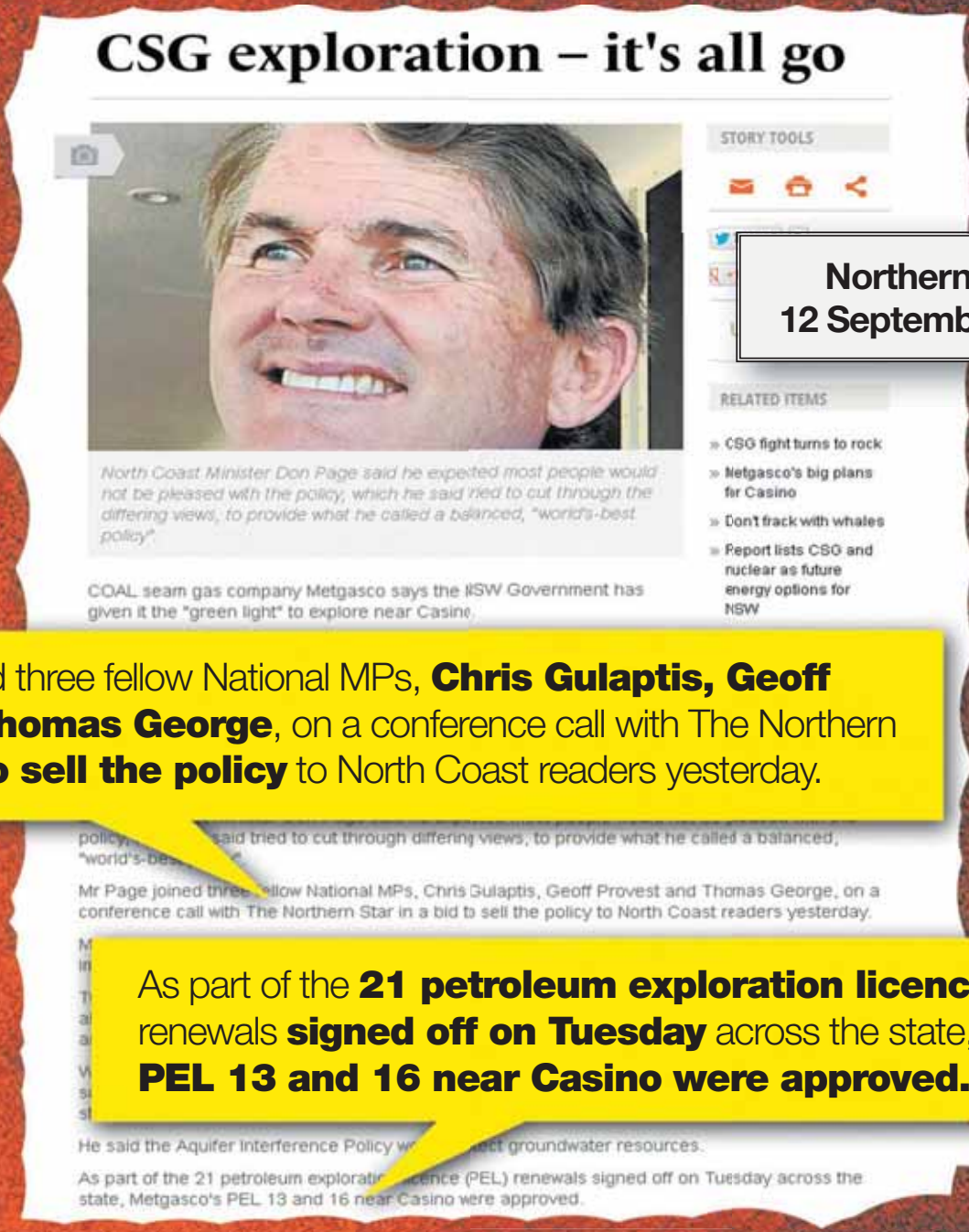

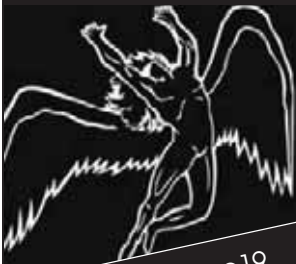

It is one of the reactions that produces the flavour of toasted bread, roasted coffee, chocolate and caramel. It's all about the sizzling fat. Which makes me think that if a hot flame were applied to my ample arse then I might taste pretty good too. So from this day forth until I'm part of God's big bain marie in the sky, I am going to keep on bringing home the bacon. Man, I'm shaken my bacon right now.

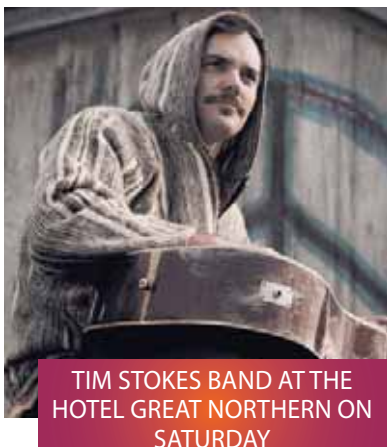

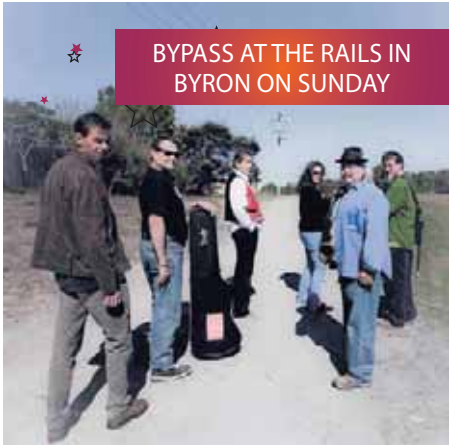

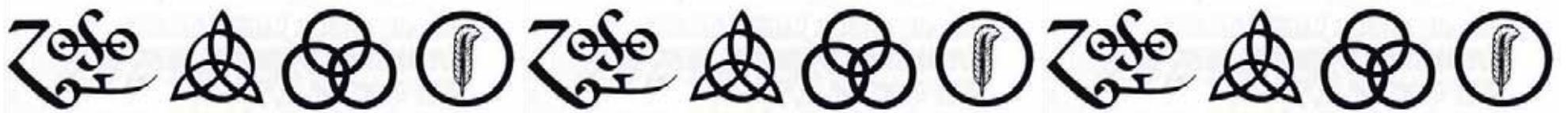

WHO IS LISA HUNT?



LISA HUNT is an American-born, Byron Bay-based soul sensation! Her show 'Forever Soul' (a retrospective of Motown, soul, funk and disco) has been wowing audiences here in Australia for a decade. She is not only the darling of the glamorous party circuit (recent shows include Collingwood Football, Linfox, Gold Coast Titans, Magic Millions, Spotlight and Westpac), but she also pulls big crowds in the public arena. Her current residency venues include great hotels such as The Beach Hotel - Byron, Brunswick Heads; QWB - Newcastle; Banora Tavern and The Coolangatta Hotel. She does great business on ticketed shows at The Dee Why RSL; Wests Leagues - Tamworth; Star Court Theatre - Lismore; and The Panthers - Port Macquarie. Her casino gigs include Conrad Jupiters (four consecutive NYEs as headliner), The Treasury Brisbane (5-year residency), The Reef Casino Cairns (seven years), and many events at the Crown Casino Melbourne and Skycity Darwin. Lisa has signed to headline NYE 2013 at Twin Towns. Festival appearances include Byron Bay Bluesfest; Groove and Grape - Brisbane; Jazz and Shiraz - Logan; Caloundra Surf and Soul; Jazz in the Vines - Hunter Valley; Adelaide Cabaret (handpicked by David Campbell); and a full decade at Tamworth Country Music!

Lisa has performed, recorded and toured with Jimmy Barnes, Diesel, Tina Arena, Darren Percival, Jon Steven and Midnight Oil. Her credits include Luciano Pavarotti, Ray Charles, Eric Clapton, James Brown, Ronan Keating, Macy Gray, Dionne Warwick, Joe Cocker, Miles Davis and Andrea Bocelli. Incredible, some would say, for someone you may have never heard of.

Lisa was the winner of *Australian Idol's* 'My Mum Rocks' contest for NSW. Kyle Sandilands called her 'A Knockout!' Paulini replied 'They call us the young divas, but you are a True Diva!' Marcia Hines called her performance 'Very Soulful!'

'Awesome Voice' - Michael Bolton; 'Great Voice' - Peter Gabriel; 'A true force of nature' - Fausto Piritto (Russia)

So what about the show? This review says it best...

'If you missed American soul sensation, Lisa Hunt and her band Forever Soul, at the Beach Hotel in Byron Bay last week, then you missed an absolutely fantastic night! One of my best friends Roma is a real fan of Lisa's and raves about her all the time. So I thought I would see what all the fuss was about and went along to hear this talented "diva".'

'Well, Roma, were you right! This lady is simply sensational! She has one of the best voices I have ever heard and her performance was one of the best I have ever been to. A huge crowd danced for two hours (including myself) nonstop and it was great to see so many locals enjoying themselves. Lisa Hunt has a fantastic repertoire of songs, including lots of old favourites by Wilson Pickett, Aretha Franklin, Otis Redding and The Supremes.'

'She has a great knack of really involving the audience in her performance and she has a voice that is simply awesome. So if you get a chance to see Lisa Hunt and her band, then make sure you do! It will be a night you will not forget.'

For well over a decade Lisa Hunt has been knocking the socks of punters around the country with her retrospective *Forever Soul*.

'It's like probably the soundtrack of my life,' she says. 'I love the music because it makes people happy.'

'I can still remember being five years old and lying in bed and hearing *Dock of the Bay* and feeling that I was totally overwhelmed.'

So this was how soul music found Lisa Hunt, its power rendering her motionless. 'There were a few Stevie Wonder songs; when I heard them I couldn't move, I would be so emotionally captured.'

Of course now Ms Hunt has regained mobility, but the intensity of the impact of the songs are still the same.

'I have no choice; I have to go there. I don't

care what is happening during the day, when I get on stage I just go there; its like opening Pandora's box. It's something I am happy I can go to even when I get tired of music sometimes. If I just get there and start then there is nothing else.'

Lots of people can sing. And even some of them can sing particularly well. So what is it that separates a singer from the herd?

'I was thinking about that this morning,' says Lisa. 'I was thinking about Pavarotti a lot (with whom Ms Hunt has sung!), and I was trying to isolate what that thing is that makes one person transcend - soul or performance or magic, I don't know what it is, you just have it or you don't - you can't learn it or buy it. Aretha opens her mouth and she goes up and down your arms and I love it when people tell me that I have that effect on them.'

Like most things, Lisa took performing with the world's best tenor in her stride.

It was on the streets of New York where Lisa first found her mojo with the public. She's had it ever since.

'I would go in to Grand Central Station at 9am and sing my heart out. That was the only way you were going to stop people - you had to give everything. For half an hour I would give it everything I had. I would make \$200 and go have breakfast!'

A few years back Lisa made it through to the finals of *My Mom Rocks*.

'It was an interesting experience, although I understand the business and I understood they did not want a big black American woman being Australia's Mum!'

That may have been the producer's call, but audiences certainly felt differently.

While Lisa hasn't found 'stardom' in the industry, she admits she has something just as good.

'You know what I have found, which is great, is that I have the same gigs as celebrities; every weekend we are with Australian celebrities somewhere. We have been gigging for 12 years - word of mouth is the strongest promotion you can have!'

So would Lisa Hunt consider doing a Darren Percival and giving something like *The Voice* a shot?

'I would consider doing *The Voice*. I would have to lose weight first; they don't like fat people - that's right - the people who sit there and listen to you and they love it - then it's like, whoa big black mama! The marketing people are like how do we market this?'

What marketing people don't know is you don't have to. The enigma of Lisa Hunt and the power of her shows just market themselves. Catch the shire's own American Soul Sister with her band at the **Bangalow Bowlo on Friday 1 March**. Tickets are at the club and are available now.

A LOAD OF MOLONEY

Lyll Moloney has been playing music for as long as he can remember.

At 21 he's a musical shapeshifter with a backlog of genre-busting projects that belies his age. The constant here is his eclectic musical taste: somewhere bounded by hip-hop, dub and folk is the field he plays in.

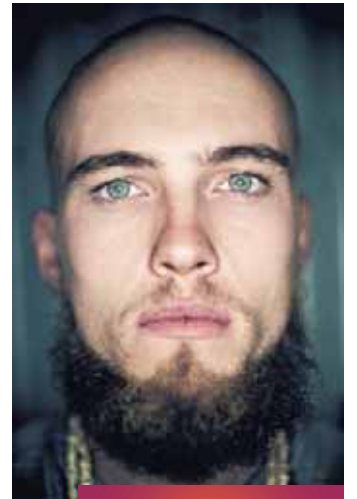

SKIPPING TO THE BLUES

SKIPPING GIRL VINEGAR ARE A MELBOURNE-BASED INDIE ROCK BAND COMPRISING SIBLINGS MARK AND SARE LANG AND THEIR RESPECTIVE CHILDHOOD FRIENDS CHRIS HELM AND AMANTHI LYNCH. THEY HAD A CHAT WITH SEVEN IN THE LEAD-UP TO THEIR SHOW AT THE BYRON BLUES FESTIVAL.

What brought SGV together? Mark and Sare are siblings and we've all been friends since childhood, playing in various bands since high school. Skipping Girl Vinegar formed over a mutual love of music (and night swimming) and started as a weekly songwriting collective – writing together what would later materialise into our debut album *Sift The Noise*.

What do you think keeps you together – how do you keep your life trajectories in the same direction... eight years on? We all love playing shows, meeting people, travelling and songwriting. As each year unravels we find ourselves challenged and engaged with new opportunities. Our recent trip to the US was amazing and brought a new focus with the success of our recent album charting in the US and signing to US management.

Your first album *Sift the Noise* really captured that living-room sound – is that something you set out to do in your recordings? To stay away from over-production? Definitely. Sonic textures and soundscapes are as important to us as the songs themselves. We worked hard to capture the feel of the spaces that we created our albums in. If you listen carefully to our first ever

single *One Chance*, you can hear the fridge rattling in the background as we stomp the floor. On the song *Here She Comes* (off our latest record *Keep Calm, Carry The Monkey*) we had birds singing in the background during the tracking of the song. We always feel that surrounding sounds and creaks in the room bring a distinctive character and sense of place and feeling to the record.

What do you think it is about SGV that resonates most with audiences? People tell us that they love the stories, and that they connect with the songs and the feelgood nature of our live performances.

How do you approach your songwriting or storytelling? Songs can sometimes come from the strangest of places. The trick is to always be ready to grab them when they pass you by.

You had a lot of critical acclaim with your first album, so what did you set out to achieve with *Keep Calm Carry the Monkey*? We had already begun working on the new album and had decided not to make *Sift the Noise* version two. We pushed ourselves – questioning our known processes, breaking down everything we did, trying to find new pathways in our writing and recording. This makes you feel extremely uncomfortable and can leave you feeling like you are floating in nowhere land. The temptation to return to what we knew was strong but we pushed ahead into the unknown.

What song or songs are you proudest of? Depends on the weather. They're all our children – we can't pick a favourite.

Which are the songs that you really look forward to playing in your live shows – you

must have a few favourites? We love crowd interaction and participation. Our favourite thing is seeing the audience reacting to our songs. One person once told us that he felt like laughing, crying and cuddling a stranger next to him while listening to our songs, and that he had never suffered the full spectrum of emotions in one hour.

What should we expect for your Bluesfest performance? Expect to be uplifted, overwhelmed with joy and bedazzled by Amanthi's amazing baking. We're also champing at the bit to play our latest single *Making Our Way* at Bluesfest. We'll see you there!

What song or songs are you proudest of? One of our favourite songwriters, Ron Sexsmith, joined us in the studios in Nashville singing harmonies on the album version of *Heart Does Ache*, written by Mark about the passing of his grandmother.

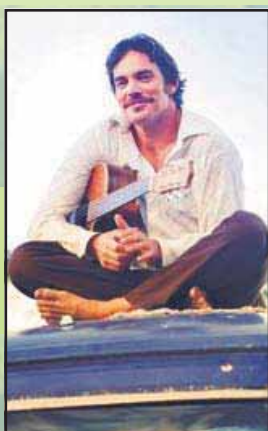

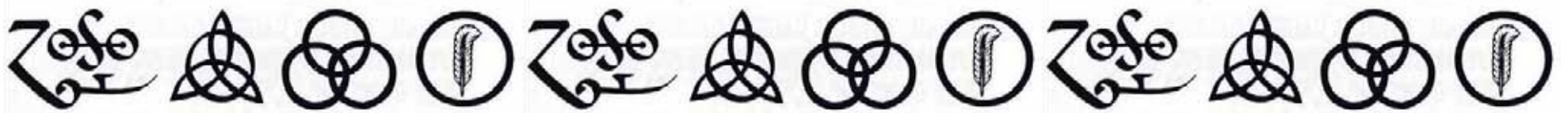

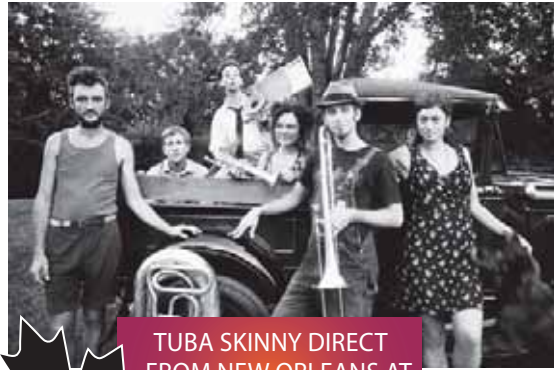


INTERNATIONAL UKE COMES TO MULLUMBIMBY

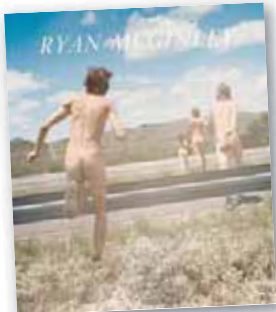


Ryan McGinley: Whistle for the Wind

Oh to be young and free... and wild. Ryan McGinley came into my life only recently but I feel like his photographs were always kind of there, in the background somehow. This New York photographer made it big, very quickly. In 2002, his handmade books sampling his work, *The Kids Are Alright*, found their way to the curator of photography at the Whitney Museum of American Art in New York; she gave him a solo show a year later. He's the youngest artist to have a one-person exhibition at the museum, and burst onto the scene with an eye for capturing the essence of wild, free-spirited youth, the kind of 'I just don't give a damn' kids that define his generation. And mine I guess. Perhaps that's why his images resonate with me so much, because he vividly captures a time and a feeling that I have lived. I'm older now, life is moving on, but he celebrates the immortality of wild inhabiting the world and the body. The potential of a moment, the fragile bubble before it bursts, expectation that strikes the air like a match.



We can all relate. Even it was only one party, one holiday, the day you quit a job you loathed, or packed a car and just drove away into the unknown. A swim in rough seas that nearly swept you away, a kiss that flew you to the stars, or one moment when you felt invincible, filled up with so much energy

you could inspire the whole world; a love that exploded like fireworks in the night sky. Your memories may not involve the intoxicating rawness of McGinley's work - bare-breasted, scratched-skin, jumping figures, falling through the sky - but I hope you've all had a moment of wildness you remember. I hope you've felt bigger than a system, larger than your fears, more powerful than your doubts, and certain you could do anything and be anyone.

This is what McGinley captures: the light in the eyes of his subjects, their aloofness that says they don't play by old rules because they are creating their own. And yet there is simultaneously a touch of something vulnerable and soft-skinned that makes McGinley's art inspired rather than brattish. If the images confront, it's because they may remind one of what has been lost. Of the ways life has tied us down. Of how we yearn for moments on the edge of existence, outside of our conformity and self-imposed monotony that feels safe but renders us un-wild. These photographs speak of free-spiritedness

and adventure. The play of unexpected colour and shadow on beaches, in forests and womb-like caverns aches of the power of the natural landscapes to consume and re-birth us: Spirit-beings communing. There are others too - Sienna Miller, siren-like nudes amid a flock of coloured parrots, some ventures into lust, desire, heady expectation and laughter

Ryan McGinley's work is big, unique and beautiful. Take this book home and love it. It will love you back. It may even whisper to you that life still CAN BE.

The Secret Keeper

How else could a Kate Morton book begin, without a dramatic, unexplainable mystery? It was a summer day in the English countryside, the birthday of little

Gerry to be exact; everyone was at the river celebrating. Laurel had escaped her family and was resting up high in the treehouse. Within minutes there was her mother, a stranger, a knife, a ribbon... A sheet, over a body.

50 years later Laurel is a successful actress, living in London, isolated from the rest of her family. It is her mother Dorothy's ninetieth birthday. The

whole family is gathering at Greenacres, the family home, but this house only brings back old memories. She searches for the answers, which can only be found in Dorothy's past.

Dorothy Smitham was a beautiful girl living in the English countryside who only wanted to run away to the big city with Jimmy, her childhood boyfriend. At only 18 years she had enough of her boring father and tame mother and fled for the big smoke. Working for an old Lady Gwendolyn, Dorothy enters a world of riches and



fame. In this world she meets Vivien, during The Blitz in WWII England; what can seem like a long friendship to some can seem like a work acquaintance to others.

Laurel easily discovers the link between her mother and the stranger in her garden; however, what she cannot understand is why. Why would her mother commit such a crime?

When she tries to talk to her mother, she only states that a second chance is one of the most beautiful things in the world, but only if you can't avoid losing your first.

One of the most engaging characteristics for me was how Kate Morton managed to find a story - of deceit, longing and passion - which mirrored the times in which they were set.



The secret Garden

By Frances Hodgson Burnett

If you didn't read and cherish this classic as a child, now's the time to do so. Reading it as an adult is still a marvellous and joyful experience.

If you're not familiar with the story of Mary Lennox, a sour-faced 10-year-old who arrives at her uncles estate after being orphaned by an outbreak of cholera in India where she lived with her selfish wealthy British parents. Her uncle is a stranger to her and the huge country house in Yorkshire, England, holds many secrets including a garden that has been tucked away for 10 years and a cousin living in a hidden bedroom.

It's easy to love this book. The language is simple, the plot is uncomplicated, and Burnett writes in such a way that it captures the sense of secrecy that hides much more than a garden and the inner workings of a child's mind. It's a beautiful book that has been around more than a century and it is easy to understand why it's considered to be a classic of English children's literature.

Crazy Kirsan's latest plan

The strategies of the two major parties for the September federal election have been thrown into disarray by news that World Chess Federation (FIDE) President Kirsan Iljumzhinov is setting up a Chess Party and will run candidates in elections around the world.

The head of world chess for the last 18 years, Iljumzhinov plans to run Chess Party candidates in elections for all levels of governments in FIDE member countries and to organise a match between Palestine and Israel, as well as North and South Korea, to promote the new political powerhouse.

Iljumzhinov plans to push for chess to be part of the education system, presumably as a science subject since Iljumzhinov claims that chess was likely brought to earth by aliens, possibly the same ones who (he says) captured him and returned him to earth after

an exchange of ideas via brainwaves.

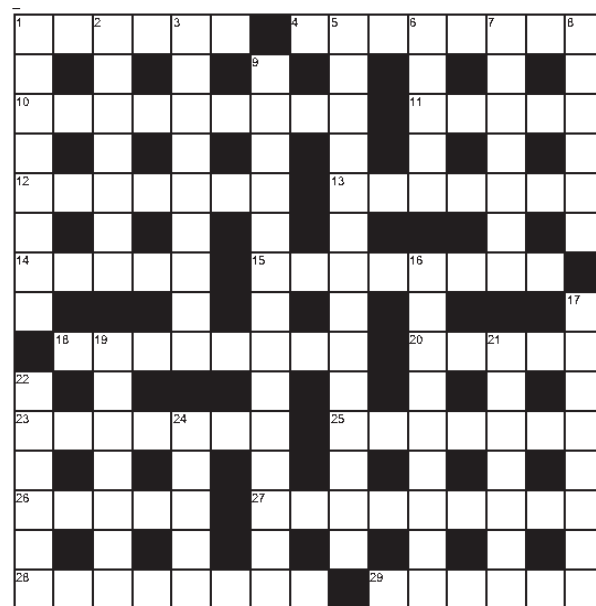
Iljumzhinov is no stranger to politics, having ruled the Russian Republic of Kalmykia for 17 years, although whether he can keep his membership of Vladimir Putin's United Russia Party while starting a new party is unclear.

As well as securing the alien vote at the Australian elections, Iljumzhinov's past visits to meet, and praise, Saddam Hussein, Muammar Gaddafi and Bashar Assad will no doubt endear the Chess Party to electorates with voters of Middle-Eastern origin.

The Australian Chess Federation, no doubt fondly remembering FIDE's attempt to have various expenses for Iljumzhinov and his delegation's visit to the 2000 Sydney Olympics put on the ACF credit card, are expected to rally around Iljumzhinov's new political party.

The best part of Iljumzhinov's plan is that it comprehensively explodes the myth which has held back chess in Australia: the theory that you need to be intelligent to play chess.

SURFING TO FIND FREEDOM

One of the most talked about films out of South Africa recently, *Otelo Burning* combines sport, racism, politics, family and friendship with gentle but awesome power.

Based on a true story, it is set in South Africa in 1989 and takes us inside a society on the brink of radical social change at the ending of apartheid, where we follow one boy's inner search for personal freedom amid the chaos of racial prejudice and violence.

For when 16-year-old Otelo Buthelezi takes to the water for the first time, it's clear that he was born to surf. Generally considered a white man's sport, surfing confronts him with racial prejudice and his own cultural fears, and then rewards



him with the joy of 'flying on water'. But then tragedy strikes. On the day that Mandela is released from prison, Otelo is forced to choose between surfing success and justice.

Directed by Sara Blecher (*Surfing Soweto*), *Otelo Burning* opened the Durban International Film Festival last year, and since then it has since screened at over 50 festivals around the world.

CINEMA REVIEWS

Anna Karenina

Adapting a revered work of an earlier period, in this case nineteenth-century Russia, from the page to the screen inescapably involves matching – or contrasting to enhance – style with content. Joe Wright has called on one of Britain's pre-eminent playwrights, Tom Stoppard, to do the screenplay of Leo Tolstoy's novel and the result is, not unexpectedly, stagey in the extreme. Shot mostly on cut-out, evolving sets, this potentially claustrophobic approach is relieved by occasional sweeping rural vistas, but the overall effect of such lavish art direction within a confined space is akin to eating a king-size box of Godiva chocolates in one sitting. The story, an age-old love

triangle, will be familiar to most, but what surprises, despite its uber-contemporary tarting-up (the style is relentlessly Bazz Luhrmann), is how dated it has become. Though tragic for Anna, who defies the mores of society only to have her heart broken, today's audiences might be less inclined to weep for her plight as shrug their shoulders with a 'so what?' and a desultory 'get over it' – Tolstoy's aim was surely not melodrama. On a personal level, I've always had trouble warming to Keira Knightley and her jutting jaw – she could plough a trough through the Siberian tundra with it – and found myself longing for that fateful steam train to be running on time. Vronsky (Aaron Taylor-Johnson), wickedly handsome if a tad effete, seemed less of the cad than I remembered (it's an age since I read the book), but Jude Law was outstanding as the cuckolded husband and Alicia Vikander drop-dead gorgeous as Kitty. I wearied of it often, but Vronsky and Anna's first dance and the racing scene in which Vronsky's horse falls, among other set pieces, are sensational. The near-gleeful negativity with which the movie has been received by many in the cognoscenti is unwarranted and, though it lacks emotional involvement – it is too arch for that – it succeeds in transforming a rather dreary tale into something more easily embraced by our bangles- and baubles-loving pop culture. ~ John Campbell

Silver Linings Playbook

It just goes to show how little effort a writer needs to put in to a female character for the actress who gets the gig to be nominated for a 'best supporting' Oscar. Jackie Weaver, reliably professional, gets no more than a handful of lines while for the rest of the time she stands around as the frumpy housewife, pulling faces in response to the actions of her self-absorbed son Pat (Bradley Cooper) and testy hubby, Pat Sr (Robert De Niro). For much of this not-very-funny dramedy we are in the company of Pat and his fashionably dysfunctional Philadelphia family. He is recovering from a session in the loony bin after attacking his estranged wife's lover. Likely at any minute to blow up in anger or tumble into manic depression, he meets Tiffany (Jennifer Lawrence), who is also on medication after suffering a similar meltdown. Their troubles might warrant our sympathy, but neither of them is particularly appealing and I'd suggest that the film has won its kudos because it wants to say that people with mental 'issues' can fall in love too. Pat and Tiffany's commitment to entering a 'so you think you can dance' type competition lifts the banal tone, but I was still prepared to write it off as an over-rated dud until a scene in which the pair are alone together, sitting on the floor of her studio before a full-length mirror. The haunting beauty of Bob Dylan and Johnny Cash singing *Girl From The North Country* transforms all that has preceded it and breathes sweet and tender life into the relationship that we'd waited so patiently to see follow its predestined path. The plotting is overly contrived, the climax too predictable (only the drongo of the year would not guess the last judge's score) and the heart-welling denouement so awkwardly drawn out as to make it unnatural. But the chemistry between the two leads works well and the makeover of Lawrence into a sex-kitten is not in the least bit objectionable. ~ John Campbell

The Intouchables

A battle rages in the arts these days. In one corner we have those who still believe that life is worth the effort. Opposing them is the push that insists that it is a joke foisted upon us by the deity of uncaring Irony. Currently, the guys in black are ahead of the despised sentimentalists by a country mile. This wonderful film by Olivier Nakache and Eric Toledano strikes a blow for those of us wearied by chic nastiness. Philippe (François Cluzet) is a quadriplegic with oodles of money. Driss (Omar Sy, giving one of the year's great performances) is a Senegalese no-hoper living with his aunty and her children in the tenements of Paris. Needing to have applied for three jobs to be eligible for his next welfare payment, Driss makes a perfunctory application to be Philippe's new minder. Philippe takes a punt and hires him and the odd couple form a loving bond of mutual dependence. Comparisons with *The Diving Bell And The Butterfly* (2007) are inevitable (the endearing scene in which Driss shaves Philippe is surely a reference to it), but in this the tone is lighter and the emphasis more on the able-bodied assistant. Noticeable too, if only in hindsight, is the orthodoxy of there being no earth-shattering climax. The story is told in an episodic manner and we can see the classical 'character arc' developing as Driss becomes aware of his responsibilities to others, with a comic through-line of his lusting after Philippe's secretary Magalie (Audrey Fleuret). But the contrivances of plot are not allowed to interfere with the exploration of the men's relationship. There is so much to warm the heart – I especially liked it when Driss gave Philippe a joint and they sat up until all hours in the Café Deux Magots; and when Driss, at the opera for the first time, burst out laughing – 'he's a singing tree!' – thus opening Philippe's eyes to the absurdity of the moment. It's a simple truth: we all need somebody to lean on. Unmissable. ~ John Campbell

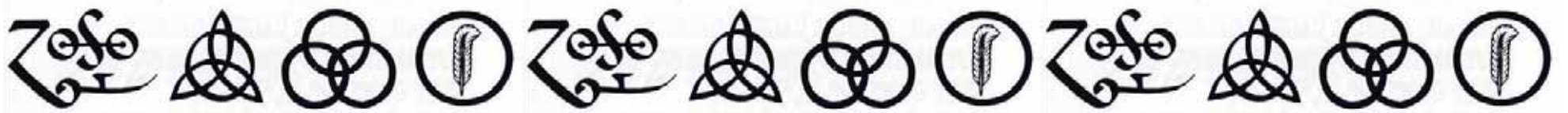

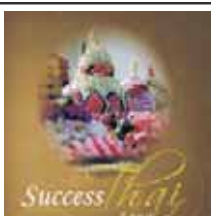

The craze for charcuterie looks set to remain – at least for a while. Moody laneway bars in cities like Sydney and Melbourne and Brisbane have been serving them up for a long time now, often with rustic Euro-peasant decor to match. Small-goods are suspended from on high and spice the very air with that particular yeasty, peppery piquancy. And of course they are a splendid companion to wines, only needing crusty bread and something pickled to provide ideal grazing fodder.

Is it the Iberian influence, part of the current infatuation with tapas and plate-sharing? Is it the economy – the fact that, increasingly, chefs are turning to cheaper cuts of meat and creative ways of expressing them? Is it nostalgia for European adventures, that tiny trattoria we stumbled upon where, instead of a menu, there were family members bearing forth simple homely fare on wooden boards (as ubiquitous as charcuterie)?

It may indeed be a combination of these factors. And yet in a way I am intrigued by a public acceptance of charcuterie as easy as that of pork belly. For all our knowledge, now, about health and nutrition and issues such as obesity, how we have embraced these foods! Pork belly seems unable to leave menus, such is its popularity, even at the level of pub dining – and yet I was horrified to learn recently that a serving of 100 grams – roughly the equivalent of what may be offered as part of an entrée – has 520 calories, eight per cent of protein, and 92 per cent of fat. (The good news for those Atkins-ites is that it is devoid of carbohydrates.)

And all those gorgeous spicy salamis, mortadellas, merguez, lap cheongs, wursts, prosciuttos, rillettes, pepperonis, chipolatas, chorizos and foie gras – all of which constitute charcuterie – they are all monstrously high in cholesterol, sodium and additives, before you even get to the amount of fat and calories. What's more, you usually need at least half a baguette's worth of bread to go with them...

These so-called prepared meats go back as far as Roman times. Originally made from only pork or offal, they were a way of utilising every part of the beast and, in the absence of refrigeration, were preserved in some way – salted, dried, smoked. Salting was and still is a common and successful means of preservation, or 'curing'. (The word *salume* means 'salted meats' and comes from the Latin word for salt, *sal*; *sausage* also derives from *sal*.) It works by incurring osmosis, which assists in destroying harmful pathogens; by dehydration – so less moisture for bacteria to grow; by slowing down fermentation; and finally by denaturing proteins, essentially cooking the meat.

In the age of refrigeration these traditional methods of transforming not only pork but other meats as well as poultry and fish continue to be used because of the wonderful flavours that result. Flavours which – as with pork belly – drown out that inner reprimand, that tiny nagging voice that tells us to be sensible.

CHILLED TOMATO GAZPACHO, PICKLED CUCUMBER & SEARED BUSH PEPPER SPICED PRAWNS

BY BRUNO POUJET, LA TABLE RESTAURANT

(Serves 4 people as an entrée (or light lunch with bread, salad))

Pickle

- ½ cup castor sugar
- ½ tsp mustard seeds
- 1 star anise
- 1 cup white wine vinegar
- 2 tbsps white wine
- ½ continental cucumber, cut into 2cm thick rounds.
- 12 bush tomatoes



Gazpacho

- 1kg ripe tomatoes, roughly chopped.
- 1 long red chilli, deseeded, chopped.
- 3 cloves garlic
- 1 tbsps olive oil
- 1 tbsps cherry vinegar
- ½ continental cucumber, roughly chopped.
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 12 green prawns, peeled
- Bush pepper spice mix
- 2 cloves garlic, finely chopped.
- Salt and white pepper

A few hours in advance....

Put all pickle ingredients into a saucepan and bring to boil. Take off heat. Put cucumbers rounds into pickle liquid with the bush tomatoes. Cool, then place into fridge.

Deseed chopped tomatoes and squeeze excess water out, place into a bowl. Sprinkle salt over tomatoes and place into fridge.

Marinate peeled prawns in garlic, bush pepper spice and olive oil. Place into fridge.

In blender, place tomatoes and all gazpacho ingredients. Blend and season taste. Optional: if you like you can strain for a smoother consistency.

Place frypan on medium heat. Once hot, pan fry marinated prawns on each side.

To serve, divide gazpacho soup into four wide shallow bowls, place a pickled cucumber round in centre of each, then three bush tomatoes each. Then neatly arrange three cooked prawns in each bowl and sprinkle some fresh herbs. *Bon Appetit!*

Sale of local landmark falls through



The sale of luxury resort Rae's on Watego's seemed all set for completion late last year. The property was sold for a reputed \$20 million in October just before it was due to be auctioned.

The vendor, Vincent Rae, headed off to Paris to join his fiancée, well-known French actress and Chanel model Anna Mouglalis.

Now Mr Rae has reluctantly returned to sell his property all over again after the buyer failed to settle the deal.

'We had much genuine interest in Rae's at the auction, and I'm annoyed about this situation, having exchanged a signed contract with guarantees from a reputable international businessman who has not delivered,' said Rae in the *Sydney Morning Herald* on Monday.

The SMH names the buyer who failed to complete as William Morris, a London trader.

Vincent Rae has owned the resort since 1994, turning it from a simple guesthouse into a luxury Byron Bay retreat for the likes of Tom Cruise, Russell Crowe and Keith Richards.

The original guesthouse was built by Ruth Harris as a residence, and later developed into a restaurant called the Argentine Ant. Later it went upmarket and became very popular as La Belle Epoque. Harris sold the beachside property to Rae for \$1.37 million.

When Mr Rae put it on the market in October there was a lot of interest in the property. On auction day a large crowd gathered outside the building to witness

the sale, some of them maybe even intending to bid, but 20 minutes into proceedings the auctioneers announced that contracts had been exchanged and Rae's on Watego's was sold.

The collapse of the sale is particularly inconvenient to Mr Rae, as he and Ms Mouglalis are due to marry in Paris in late March.

The SMH reports that Rae's on Watego's is a freehold property with DA approval for an underground car park with 10 spaces. Offers should be submitted by March 20, through Tony Bargwanna of Ray White Commercial Gold Coast and Andrew Jolliffe of Ray White Hotels Australia.

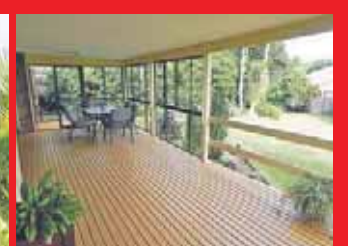

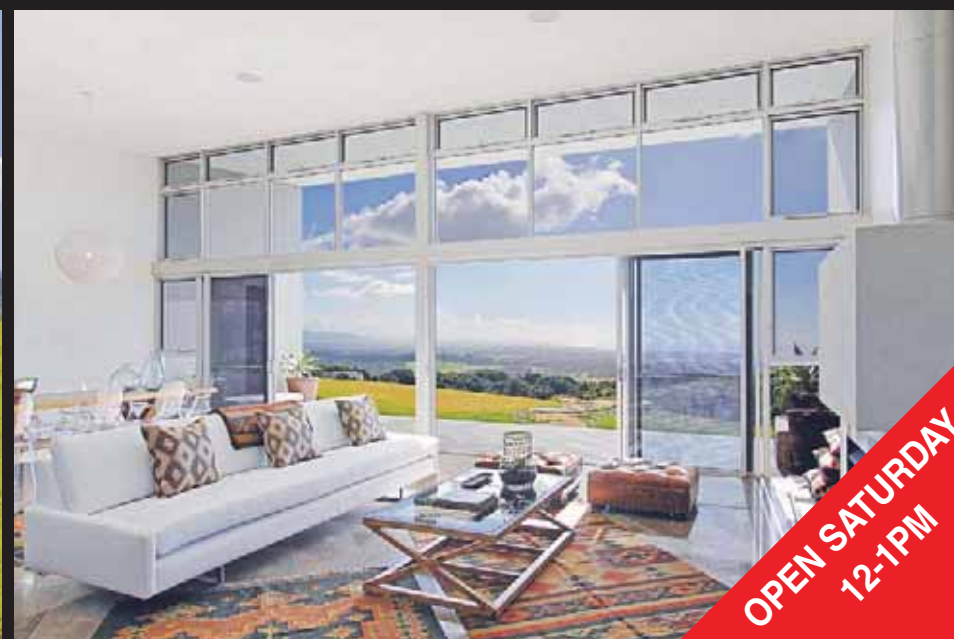

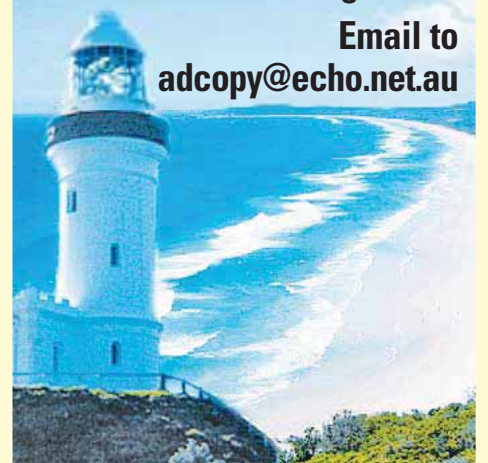

Readers Ed and Wendy Szlezak snapped this pic of the queue outside the Myocum tip on a recent Saturday. The tip was open in the morning from 8.30 to just 11.30, leaving many residents unable to dispose of their green waste after the storms.

Following neatly on our pic last week of Barry O'Farrell and his mates wearing 'Water Not Coal' T-shirts, it turns out his government has just approved an expansion of BHP's Dendrobium mine, located entirely within Sydney's drinking water catchment. NSW Planning Department approved the plans despite warnings from the Office of Environment and Heritage and the Sydney Catchment Authority that swamps on the site, which are listed as threatened ecological communities, could not be effectively rehabilitated once drained. O'Farrell putting the short-term financial benefit of a mining company above the interests of ordinary citizens and the environment? We can hardly believe it.

The public meeting in Ocean Shores to assess residents' feelings about CSG went ahead on Saturday with over 250 attendees, despite signs advertising the meeting being vandalised or removed the previous weekend. Before we start thinking that violence is becoming the signature of CSG proponents,

let's remember that if you put anything up in the Byron Shire it stands a chance of being knocked down, whether it's a sign or just an idea. Anyway, if you want to help with the survey in Ocean Shores contact Vivien Royston on 6680 5756.

And if you want to help with Clean Up Australia Day on Sunday, March 3 you can lend a hand locally at the Old Salad Bowl site in front of Ocean Shores. Local Clean Up Australia coordinator Tina Petroff will be there from 8am till noon with bags, gloves and registration forms for your personal insurance protection. Or bring your own gloves and wear sunscreen, a hat and sturdy shoes. Last year an estimated 591,400 volunteers cleaned up 16,169 tonnes of rubbish at 7,363 sites across Australia, and Tina says we can do even better than that if we try.

With 300 people plus attending the last community meeting on the Bay chaired by Chris Hanley, the mood for engagement and action is upon us. If you

want to be part of a broadly representative group that puts community first, then share in the visioning process at the Byron Community Centre on Thursday at 6pm.

It's tempting to say that Pope Benedict relinquished the throne of Peter not because he shielded priests from the consequences of their crimes, or because he condemned African women to death by AIDS, but simply because he no longer had the strength to do these things. However, Vatican watchers say Benedict's real reason was to prevent Cardinal Bertone of the Curia putting himself in charge during his dotage. A new pope means a new episode in the game of thrones, er, in the endless struggle between the Holy See and the Roman Curia. And for the first time in 600 years there will be two popes alive - wonderful opportunity for a schism...

When former state minister Ian Macdonald has to run the gauntlet outside the ICAC hearings he invariably wears a fixed, shit-eating grin - presumably so there won't be photographs published of him looking worried and guilty. It doesn't work, Macca, you just look guilty and crazy. Greens are pointing out that, in the light of Sir Luncheon's coal licence activities, ICAC should also look at his many forestry agreements. He was responsible for at least 16 of these, most of them based on unsustainable practices that have left NSW with degraded forests and legal issues. Folk with long memories would also like to check out his roughshod treatment of the local community on behalf of motor sport interests, when he rammed special laws through parliament for the benefit of the Repco Rally. Chances are though, with his business partner suffering a 'breakdown' and unable to testify, Macca won't even go to jail...


