TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER

Each party is restrained and enjoined from voluntarily canceling, modifying, terminating, assigning or allowing to lapse for non-payment of premiums any insurance policy of a party or in which a party or child of the parties has an interest without permission of the Court or by consent order.
4. Each party is restrained and enjoined from harassing, threatening, assaulting or abusing the other party and from making disparaging remarks about the other party to or in the presence of any children of the parties or to an employer of a party.
<ol> <li>Each party is restrained and enjoined from hiding, destroying or spoiling, in whole or in part, any evidence electronically stored or on computer hard drives or other memory storage devices</li> </ol>
6. Each party is restrained and enjoined from relocating any children of the parties outside the State of Tennessee or for more than 100 miles from the marital residence without permission of the Court or by consent order, except in the case of a removal based upon a well-founded fear of physical abuse against either the fleeing parent or the child. In such latter case, upon the request of the non-relocating parent, the Court will conduct an expedited hearing to determine the reasonableness of the relocation and to make such other orders as appropriate.  Nothing herein shall preclude the Court from revising, modifying or expanding the terms of this order pursuant to T.R.C.P. 65.07.  Entered this
