OTHER STUFF

The two U.S. new station applications above are actually listed as feet above average terrain but I believe that's a typo. These are also the first new station applications in quite some time. KXIV=>KJZZ is a correction; I had it as KJZZ last month.

A HDTV standard has been set. The "Grand Alliance" of HDTV system developers has agreed on a 1080-line interlaced picture, and an alternative progressively scanned picture at 720 lines. Audio is to use the 6-channel Dolby AC-3 system. And the entire data stream is to use the MPEG-2 compression system to save bandwidth. A RF transmission standard has not yet been set. A final proposal should be ready for the FCC late next year.

Fifth and sixth TV networks are imminent. Warner Brothers is teaming with Tribune and Gaylord to form one network, including:

Just to show how bad you really have to be to get in serious trouble with the FCC... KARW-AM Longview, Texas faces a \$250,000 fine and a license renewal hearing over three violations. #1: the station filed a renewal application on behalf of someone who'd been dead for three months. #2: the person who signed the application had no authority to do so. #3: the current operators of KARW won't tell the FCC who controls the station or how they got control!

Arbitron announced in late October that they're getting out of the TV ratings business. The move leaves Nielsen the only firm doing TV ratings. What this will do to several FCC regulations dependant on Arbitron figures- or to the Arbitron numbers published in the *Television Factbook* is unknown.

ValueVision Inc., which operates a home-shopping network and a number of LPTVs carrying it, has purchased three UHF TV stations. The stations acquired are WTWS-26 New London, CT; WTKK-66 Manassas, VA (Washington, DC); and KRTW-57 Baytown, TX. (Houston)

The retransmission-consent war in Corpus Christi is still unresolved. None of the "big 3" network affiliates there is on the TCI cable system. Wireless-cable firm Omnivision, which pays cash for retransmission consent, says it's had a 35% increase in subscribership since the deadline. See Neil Griffin's item for information on retransmission-consent problems in Kirksville, MO.

Roy H. Park has died at age 83. Park, who lived in Ithaca, NY, owned a long list of radio and TV stations, mostly in the South. He was the first person to purchase the (at the time) legal limit of 7 each AM, FM, and TV stations in 1977.

Boston University has purchased WCVX-58 Vineyard Haven, Mass. Presumably the station will become a satellite of WQTV-68, also recently purchased by the University. Also sold was the construction permit for WYDC-48 Corning, NY. This station had been owned by religious group owner Cornerstone Television; the new owner has no other TV stations.

In Canada, the owners of CHSJ-4 and its rebroadcasters have proposed, pending CRTC approval, to sell to the CBC. New Brunswick had been the only province in which the CBC owned no TV stations, though CHSJ had been a CBC affiliate. Also sold in Canada was the MITV network in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia (indeed, this network was also offered to the CBC, which couldn't afford it), to CanWest Global. This new owner now has independent TV stations in every major English-speaking Canadian market except Calgary and Edmonton.

Also in Canada, MITV's request to take over CHMT-7 (currently a CBC affiliate) and replace it with UHF stations at Moncton and Buctouche has been denied. The CRTC doesn't want CBC coverage in New Brunswick to be reduced by the UHF move. CHMT-7 is one of CHSJ-4's rebroadcasters, so it will also be becoming a CBC owned station.

FORUM

Steven West, Glen Mills PA:

First, from the Oct. 14 Baltimore *Sun* Scripps-Howard, the owners of WMAR-2 there, are trying to block the sale of WNUV-54 to Glencairn Ltd. Glencairn, while theoretically controlled by Eddie Edwards Sr. (also owner of WPTT-22 Pittsburgh), is 70% owned by Mrs. Carolyn C. Smith. That's where the problem comes in- Mrs. Smith's four sons own the Sinclair Broadcast Group, which in turn owns WBFF-45, also in Baltimore. Currently, the FCC doesn't permit one entity to own more than one commercial TV station in the same city.

Mr. Edwards told the *Sun* that Scripps-Howard has complained only because the Smith brothers have filed a challenge to WMAR's license. The challenge, alleging that the Smith brothers would better serve Baltimore, was scheduled for hearing in November. (In practice, it's extremely unlikely WMAR's license would be lost, especially since no allegations of serious violations have been made)

Another item comes from the Oct. 10 Philadelphia *Inquirer* and relates to non-commercial WLVT-39 Allentown. WLVT is known as one of the nation's most successful non-commercial TV stations, with more assets than any other such station in Pennsylvania, and volunteer involvement by many of the city's more influential people.

However, there are now allegations of "shilling" in the fund-raising auctions that, as in most other places, provide so much of WLVT's finances. "Shilling" means placing fake bids on unpopular items, either to raise the final selling price or to prevent embarrassment for the donor.

While WLVT president Sheldon Siegel freely admitted he

promoted shilling, apparently word never reached the station's board of directors. When the board heard of the policy (which had ended a year previously), four members resigned in protest. Which, in turn, got the attention of the Pennsylvania Attorney General's office, the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (which may withhold some part- maybe all of- WLVT's 1994 grant of some \$680,000), and the FCC. (which frowns on misleading broadcasts & has fined stations thousands of dollars for similar actions)

In a separate card, Steve mentions "Another LPTV on the air. Ch. 42 from the Vineland, NJ area with W08CC programs." W08CC is licensed to Hammonton & transmits from Waterford Works; its programming includes Home Net, All-News Channel, Movie Greats Network, and other assorted stuff. Hmmm. My records only list one LPTV 42 in New Jersey, a construction permit for Cherry Hill. This is apparently something else- Fred?

John Combs, Orlando FL:

"Oh, goody...another local (grrrr...)" From the Oct. 21 Orlando *Sentinel* it appears WRBW-65's signon may be imminent. Tom Meek, operations manager at WOFL-35, told the *Sentinel* "My understanding is that they have broken ground" at the tower site. The paper was unable to reach either WRBW owners Rainbow Broadcasting or the lawyer who represented them during the nearly decade-long fight for the license. As an educated guess, I'd expect it to take roughly a year to complete construction, assuming they're still installing the 465m tower shown in my most recent listing.

In 1990, when the U.S. Supreme Court upheld FCC policy of granting preferences to minority applicants (Rainbow's head is a Cuban immigrant & thus eligible for such a preference), Rainbow said the station would be a regular independent station, possibly carrying Spanish-language news.

Jeff Kruszka, Baton Rouge LA:

Jeff went on a DXpedition to Monroe & Shreveport & found some new LPTVs, listed in LPTV Watch. He also mentions that W52BF Mobile, AL is now on with Home Shopping Spree, leaving W31AQ with only Home Shopping Club. "This is the first city I've seen with both HSS and HSC. What exactly is the difference, anyway?"

Best I can tell.. Home Shopping Club is the service carried on their owned-and-operated UHF stations, the ones with "HS" in the callsigns. (as well as a number of affiliated stations) This program sells general merchandise. The phone number is 1-800-284-3200, and the little HSC house in the lower right corner of the screen is blue.

Home Shopping Spree is carried on affiliated stations. Most of the products sold are clothing or jewelry. And the phone number is 1-800-284-3400.

Just for good measure, a third home shopping service, ValueVision, is now buying full-power TV stations & signing full-power affiliates. I don't get ValueVision here, so I can't tell you how to ID their affiliates.

Bill Nienajadly, Clifton NJ:

From the October 4 Herald-News, an item of history- they noted that 50 years ago that day, TV station W2XWV, operated by DuMont Laboratories of Passaic, broadcast photographs of seven missing people. They estimated that 8,000 TVs saw the pictures. They do not say whether any of the missing people were found! W2XWV later became WABD-5, then WNEW-TV; today it's WNYW, the Fox affiliate for New York City.

And from the October 1 New York *Post* problems with the David Letterman show in Sioux City, Iowa.. Local CBS affiliate KMEG-14 doesn't

Falls, SD- but provisions in the Cable Act prevent cable systems from carrying only part of a TV stations' schedule after October 5.

The TV writer for the Sioux City *Journal* organized a rally October 6 at the abandoned former City Hall. Letterman fans were to sign petitions asking CBS to intercede & ask KMEG to carry the show. But rally organizer Bruce Miller says he's actually received more letters & calls in support of KMEG's current late-night schedule than those demanding Letterman!

Neil Griffin, Kirksville MO:

KTVO-3 is another victim of the retransmission wars. Neil wrote on October 21: "KTVO and Cablecom did not come to an agreement, so channel 3 has been replaced by the Sci-Fi Channel. Cablecom offered non-cash compensation to KTVO in the form of a second channel. However, in market 205, a second channel is not very practical. (yes, second channels really can push the budget even in top-50 markets - DS) KTVO did reach compensation agreements with several smaller systems, and granted extensions to TCI systems in the area."

"If you're looking for an antenna, don't look here. The local Radio Shack dealer is out of rabbit ears and rooftop antennas. Other dealers are doing well with fringe antennas for those who want KHQA and WGEM." (KHQA-7 Hannibal, MO and WGEM-10 Quincy, IL)

Matt Sittel, Tallahassee FL:

Matt went on a roadtrip & provided a number of LPTV notes, which appear in LPTV Watch. Otherwise: "Yes, I did see Florence (AL) 26, calls are now WYLE according to TV Guide. They were not real strong even as I checked right near the bridge going into Florence."]

He confirms my observation, on a visit to Meridian, MS, that WTZH-24 is off- "WTZH-24 has NOT been in the

TV Guide for a couple of years..." a couple of years..." Somehow I missed that one! He also confirms my observation that WHLT-22 (the CBS station on Meridian cable with WTZH off) has no local news, running WJTV-12's news from Jackson instead. Both stations have similar, distinctive, logos, with the channel numbers in a red, slanted parallelogram, like this:

John Johnson, Billings MT:

John is a new member (welcome!), and works for frequent Es target KTVQ-2. John first wrote to correct my call change for KXIV-14 Salt Lake City; my reference had the new calls two different ways and I decided KJJZ was right- not a good move!

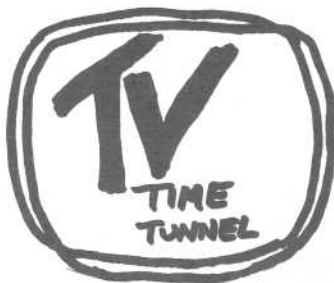
"Billings is served by one LPTV, channel 14. Trinity Broadcasting programming with a local church backing the operation. I have never seen an ID on this operation. (K14AQ according to my records) Also, channel 25 translator (K25BP) still operates here re-broadcasting KSVI channel 6. This started out being an easy way for KOUS channel 4 to get a signal into some parts of Billings. Channel 4 operated from a 650' tower 18 miles east of Billings. There are a lot of deep valleys here, 4 didn't make it into Billings too well."

"The move to 6 was a long process for them. (KOUS-4 => KSVI-6) That '6' was originally assigned to Miles City as educational." Usually the FCC won't allow moving an educational channel unless another channel can be found to replace it- looking at the allocations table, it appears KSVI's owners found a way to get channel 10 to replace 6 at Miles City.

IDAHO'S FIRST TV STATION

Who was first? In virtually all facets of North American broadcasting, that's subject to great debate. As to who was first in Idaho television, very few know the correct answer; including broadcasters!

Most believe KTVB (KIDO-tv) to have been first, and each year on their anniversary they [KTVB] promote themselves as Idaho's oldest tv station and at times have stated incorrectly that they were the first.

In reality the first television operation in the state was an experimental operation that Idaho State University ran from September to December 1941 on 144 MHz with 15 to 20 watts. The first tv station in the post-freeze era was the short-lived KFXD, channel 6, in Nampa.

When the 'freeze' was lifted in 1952, Idaho broadcasters scrambled for construction permits and equipment; and wound up in a contest to be 'first'. In December of 1952 KIDO was granted the first cp for channel 7 in Boise. Right on their heels, KGEM Boise got channel 9, KDSH in Meridian nabbed channel 2 (transferred to Boise in 1955), and KFXD picked up 6 in Nampa. KID in Idaho Falls was also granted a cp (1953) and went on the air as the states' 4th station in December of that year.

Getting back to the 'who's on first' aspect of this report, we return to the spring of 1953 when KGEM announced they would not be able to get on the air until early 1954 (the station never went on due to financial problems and was deleted in 1954). KDSH also reported they would not be able to be on until fall; and began regular operation on Thanksgiving Day 1953. This left the race between KIDO and KFXD.

Newspaper accounts from the spring and early summer of 1953 implied that KIDO was leading the pack. In fact they were heavily promoting a July startup for channel 7. But...from seemingly out of nowhere...an announcement from KFXD on June 14 or 15 caught everyone by surprise. KFXD-tv would begin operation on June 18!

According to a short article in the 6/19/53 IDAHO STATESMAN, the first KFXD-tv transmission started at 1:10 PM June 18, consisting of two different test patterns for about five hours. Reception was reported to be good in Boise and Nampa and even as far away as Weiser. After 10 days of running test patterns, KFXD began regular programming on June 29.

Meanwhile, KIDO stated that they were planning to stay on schedule; and that they would not sign on until they could provide a full service operation. They followed through on that promise on July 13; offering local origination along with selected programming from the NBC, CBS, ABC and DuMont networks. Oddly enough, KFXD was unable to secure ANY network contracts...a likely factor in its untimely demise.

While most of KIDO-tv's equipment was commercially manufactured; the gear at KFXD was a hodgepodge including a prototype Gates transmitter and a significant amount of equipment designed and built by their engineering department.

"TV TIME TUNNEL" - Idaho's First TV Station - continued...

Frank's initial research on this topic began about 20 years ago at which time he interviewed officials from KTVB and KBOI-tv. There was a consensus that the early KFXD-tv equipment was mostly home-brew, including the transmitting antenna consisting of two dipoles made of chicken wire! Their transmitter power was around 500 watts and the site was near Deer Point where the present TV/FM antenna farm is located. The channel 6 transmitter was taken up to the 'mountain' in a trailer; and power was supplied by a generator. Connection to the studio site at KFXD radio (south of Meridian) was made by phone line. Contrary to printed reports the old-timers recalled that KFXD transmissions were received poorly in Boise (16 miles SW of the xtr) and barely at all in Nampa.

The conflicting information as to signal strength is significant to the extent that the article in the IDAHO STATESMAN placed the transmitter on Schaeffer Butte (7500 Ft.) as opposed to 7100 ft. at the Deer Point location suggested by the KBOI and KTVB officials. Frank notes that the Schaeffer Butte location makes more sense as phone and power lines would have been more accessible. There is also reason to believe that KFXD's actual power might have been more than 500 watts. The newspaper article noted that tv watchers in 'the valley' had received KFXD-tv transmissions but were disappointed at seeing only a test pattern instead of regular programming.

The channel 6 program schedule was typical of many early non-network operations. 1-5 PM, test pattern; 5-6 PM, off the air; 6-6:01 PM, sign on; 6:01 PM, "Skyway to Mexico"; 6:20 PM, "San Diego Zoo"; 6:30 PM "Twelve Million Brothers"; 6:50 PM, "Operation Bootstrap"; 7 PM, "Williamsburg Restored"; 7:30 PM, "How To Drive In The City" (they need to revive that here in Nashville..hi..tjb); 7:45 PM, "The Christophers" (religious); 8 PM, test pattern; 9 PM, sign off.

The preceding paragraph tells us quite a bit about why KFXD didn't survive. Even if one overlooked KFXD's terrible program lineup, KIDO had a big edge in technical muscle. Their transmitter was situated on a rim just above the city (Boise) [moved to the Deer Point antenna farm in 1956]; and with 55,000 watts they literally blew channel 6 off the dial!

Although there was little publicity about the startup of KFXD-tv, the media (at least the IDAHO STATESMAN) blew out the stops to herald the arrival of KIDO-tv. A feature article on the new channel 7 facility looked more like an advertisement...consisting of several pages of photos and text.

It was this combination of adverse factors that led to an August 12, 1953 announcement from KFXD-tv manager Edward Hurt stating that the station was leaving the air...less than 2 months after its inauguration. No explanation was given, however Hurt added that the station would not return to the air...at least for several months.

In early 1954 it was reported that channel 6 had been sold and would be rebuilt with new equipment. The report also stated that new call letters had been assigned and that the station would return to the air as KTVI. Those statements proved to be erroneous as the operation did not come back as promised...and the construction permit was dropped in October 1954. According to BROADCASTING YEARBOOK, the channel was not re-activated until 20 years later when it finally returned as KIVI...a full-power ABC affiliate...in 1974.

Frank concludes by saying, "It is unfortunate that there is so little known about KFXD-tv. As far as I have found, none of the principal people with KFXD at the time are alive today. I checked several years ago (with the WTFDA) to see if any of the early DXers had seen the station by skip, and the result was nil. As for what the KFXD-tv ID slides and test patterns looked like...we may never know. I will continue to do more research on the station."

- Note # 3 - That strange LPTV is at it again! Toward St. Louis/St. Charles, randomly on and off with TBN, presumably WWTO-35. What is this? Not a "phantom", but why would anybody down there have anything to relay from channel 35?
- Note # 4 - OK, what's this? I couldn't determine which French service they were carrying (satellite dish is acting up), but audio was between 59z and 59+. 0444 reception proved that Chatham is still English TVO. Chatham picks theirs off channel 18, which picks theirs off channel 19, right? I'm not aware of French on channels 18 or 19 capable of breaking signal threshold, so I assume a different station?
- Note # 5 - TBN listed 23 stations that are "under construction." I had no facility for taping, so I could only mark down cities within 600 miles: Cleveland, Meadville PA, Sault Ste. Marie, Sioux Falls (isn't this K51EE already on? (Definitely! fm)), and Wichita Falls TX. Many in the far south and along the coasts. Too bad they didn't specify which channels!
- Note # 6 - With these two TBNs both licensed to Toledo (I assume opposite ends of town? (16 miles apart. fm)), and nearby WGGN-52 also on, this gives new meaning to the phrase "Holy Toledo!". Hi.

A couple small news items of note from the Twin Cities' newspapers: KXLI-41/KXLT-47 may try their TV Heaven programming format for the third time early next year. Their current HSN format will be moving to KVBM-45 which apparently is finally under construction. General Manager Ron Eikens expects the cable must carry provisions to really help them out this time around.

ValueVision has filed with the SEC for permission to issue a stock offering. They plan to use most of the proceeds to acquire full power TV stations. With Paramount and Time-Warner each planning new broadcast TV networks, I wonder if there will even be any independents left for ValueVision to buy. Only the largest markets will have any left and most of those cater to niche markets such as Spanish language or religious programming.

After 36 days of straight high pressure, forecasters October 1 predicted an end to the good weather with a strong cold front advancing from the Gulf of Alaska headed southward. I immediately adjusted my vacation plans to return to the Long Beach area for some serious DX! I first noticed tropo in a big way as I approached Port Alberni while listening to the African music show on CFRO 102.7 and KYTE started taking over the frequency! I was astounded that signals would penetrate the deep valleys on the highway out to the coast. 400 miles tropo may be ho-hum to eastern and southern DXers, but here in tropo-mediocre British Columbia this is serious stuff!! Radar Hill is the highest spot on the flat Long Beach coastline and has a straight over-the-water shot at the entire coastline of Washington, and most of the Oregon coast as well. Previous trips have netted Portland and Aberdeen-Hoquiam as the furthest tropo. Also back in June 1980 I received double-hop Es from Japan using a Sony 76-108 Mhz receiver and Radio Shack 10 element FM beam. I may try to get permission to do a ham VHF contest from Radar Hill (which is part of Pacific Rim National Park). I'm curious whether conditions would allow California tropo DX to come in during exceptional conditions, in spite of the fact that the coastline curves southeast (no longer a straight over the water path). Tropo from Hawaii has been experience on the Calif. coast. I wonder if this could be possible from Long Beach? I will probably try to get out to Long Beach at least once a year during the fall. Now I know what you guys mean when you say "the tropo was so thick it was like e-skip"!!! I hope everyone got lotsa tropo this fall. 78\$, Mike

I sent away for the booklet "Digital Radio, The Sound of the Future" (the Canadian Vision), put out by the task force on the introduction of digital radio. This task force is a government-industry alliance which includes many heavyweights from the CBC, Dept. of Communications, Canadian Association of Broadcasters, Campus and Community Radio, and the CRTC. I found the booklet most disturbing from a DXers standpoint and the future of AM/FM DX but also I am concerned about the future of small community local radio stations. The Canadian vision has chosen the L-band portion of the broadcasting spectrum to move all Canadian AM and FM stations to this L-band. At present, the U.S. domestic L-band is not available for use by digital radio. Many American broadcasters have no desire to see this allocation altered, because they perceive L-band digital radio as a potential threat to existing radio stations. The establishment of L-band digital radio stations would result in the creation of a third radio band (in addition to AM and FM) a new band whose better sounding stations would attract revenue away from conventional AM and FM broadcasters which are already having problems generating sufficient profits in the crowded U.S. radio market. The U.S. effort is trying to develop a form of digital radio that will work within the existing bandwidths allocated to the AM and FM stations without resorting to L-band. This in-band on-channel (I.B.O.C.) solution would not be practical for future satellite use and also AM stations during nighttime hours would be subject to severe interference from distant stations which would seriously degrade digital radio performance in this band. The task force current timetable on the introduction of digital radio on the L-band includes the adoption of technical regulations by 1994, first commercial terrestrial broadcasts of digital radio begin by 1995 & first commercial digital radio receivers come on the market for consumers. By 2003-2005 direct satellite service to begin. 2010 and beyond, eventually all AM and FM transmitters in Canada are shut down after the move to the L-band is complete and the public has accepted digital radio. My big concern is what will happen to my and your DX hobby with the digital radio introduction. The purchase of new and expensive equipment will be required by both consumers and broadcasters. I'm also concerned that this technology will be the death of small local broadcasters who could not compete with the big city broadcasters. The Canadian vision seems to be marching to a different tune than the U.S. effort on digital radio. I envision the future of two different systems in use, both not compatible to each other. This reminds me of Beta vs. VHS and the Canadian metric system vs U.S. system of measurement. My concerns are deep and I would welcome hearing any comments about the Canadian vision. Be they positive or negative as I feel the Canadian public will be bombarded only with the positives of moving all AM and FM to the L-band from only a CD quality, interference-free sound perspective. (Bruce, I doubt propagation conditions would be as favorable for DXing on the L-band, certainly not for skip!-gc) How 'bout them Blue Jays!!!! 7-threepat-dB

NOTE 1 (17 Sept 0838/0909): It never fails to surprise me how, during a good Tr opening, a station will often come in, "if it wants to", even with formidable obstacles. After cursing new local KDMG-IA (40), I could've never expected to log 2 Gulf state Tr's through it without phasing, only a half hour apart, neither state ever heard via Tr on a Class A freq. before! But only LA is a true Class A, I don't count MS as one because it's high power. Ahhh. it doesn't get much better than this.

NOTE 2 (19 Sept 0805): I guess I made the right decision on July 27, to devote my chasing to WKXO 106.7, and not this because notw I have both WKXO AND my 24th Tr state. Rather than fuss with finding it heck-knows-where on the July 27 tape, I'll just log it now and keep July 27 as an unresolved tentative.

NOTE 3 (19 Sept 2354): This is my 25th Tr on 106.7, and I now have 11,122 Tr miles on that freq. (a record?) I'm in no hurry for Sullivan, IL to vacate 106.3 for this, but by the time they do, I may have no 106.7 Tr's left, hi.

NOTE 4 (7 Oct 0358): I make an effort to tape all my ID's, intially feeding the audio and external video into the VCR. I didn't get the tape running in time to catch this 900 watter, darn, they interrupted satellite stuff early for the ID, and at 0400 (when I had the tape going) they only had dead air. An obvious solution is to have the tape running all the time, but I haven't transferred any ID's since June (to audio cassettes), and I would probably have 25 or 30 video tapes stacked up by now if I did it that way.

NOTE 5 (07 Oct 0600): I guess that, even if KDMG hadn't been here, this freq. was "in for it" anyway. A quick check (not guaranteed accurate) seems to show me with 24 Tr loggings here, so watch out, 106.7! I expect to get Jackson TN here someday, as there is sort of a KDMG null to the south.

Not a peep yet from Keokuk 105.9. I hope it stays that way! Tropo this year nearly reminds me of 1980. At least, for the first time I moved to Macomb, I've been having a season where much of the UHF Tr also affected FM! During 1991, for instance, I had almost no FM Tr of any type whatsoever, despite TV openings

...to Texas, etc. Anugust/September continued my saga of "cleaning up Indiana Class A's", and some very welcome OH stuff came in on several occasions, from a deceptively hard-to-hear state. A good example of the dearth of FM Tr most of my time in Macomb was that it originally took me 4 or 5 years to hear anything from Louisville KY at only 303 miles. September 16-19 was probably my best Tr opening of all time, perhaps only because I had a mediocre and inconvenient FM setup on Thanksgiving 1986. It was my second best TV Tropo ever (surpassing anything ever seen in Ohio when also considering its huge swath), only behind that same 1986 opening. Getting Texans at noon was stunning...I'd sure enjoy another one of these! Local WIUS 88.3, W.I.U.'s student station with a mix of alternative rock, rap, and metal, signs on early (0700 I think) and runs past midnight. WZLZ-103.9 IL has indeed been off the air. Were they flooded out, will they be back, does anybody know? Their absence helped me clean up on 103.9 this summer. I hope all readers had great DX! 7 ♂

Thanks go out this month to these people for contributions to Station News: Matt Sittel, Doug Smith, Mike Cherry, Jerry Monroe, Jim Renfrew, John Ebeling, Dan Oetting, Ralph Strobel, Mike Hawk, Bill Dulmage, Frank Merrill, Dave Nieman, Paul Mount, Tim Noonan, and Paul Swearingen. Thanks also to Paul S. for sending an article regarding KJTY 88.1 Topeka and the controversial resignation of their general manager over differences with the station's parent company. Nine staff members walked out in support of the former general manager...

CANADA:

CJOJ 95.5 Belleville, Ontario is on testing now that CIBC1 has vacated that frequency for 94.3. They are in stereo, playing rock tracks, and promising the first day of programming will be December 1st. I have heard a slogan of 'OJ 95.5' given. CFMX 103.1 and CFMX1 96.3 are now using the slogan 'Classical 96 & 103'. Call letters are no longer used, I don't think. In British Columbia, several new relay stations are noted on the air: CIWC 102.7 Tofino, BC, in MONO, relaying CJJR 93.7 Vancouver, country music 'JR Country'. Also in Tofino: CFMI-7, 104.7, mono translator of album rock CFMI 101.1 New Westminster/Vancouver. An CJWC 107.3 Ucluelet, BC is on, in stereo, as another translator of CJJR. Both these communities are on the Pacific Coast of Vancouver Island.

NORTHEAST US:

In New York, 106.1 Coming changed calls to WNKI, to go along with its new 'Wink-FM' slogan. They

have been heard giving fake calls of 'WINK-FM'. They are upbeat adult contemporary. In Avon-Rochester, on 93.3, the news/talk format parallel to AM 1030 was short lived. The call letters are now WEZO, the old 101.3 Rochester calls, and a soft adult contemporary/easy listening format. 100.9 North Syracuse is back on the air after a short silence, as WKRL, with album rock, "K-Rock", simulcasting WKLL 94.9 Frankfurt-Utica-Rome. WTKW 99.5 Bridgeport-Syracuse goes classic rock from country. Maybe they will pick up the WKFM calls, which have vacated 104.7 and 104.3! I noted WYQS 95.9 Liberty as now country, with a "Mountain Country" slogan. WAAL 99.1 Binghamton is supposedly to be going in more of a classic rock direction. In Pennsylvania, WWBV 106.1 Beaver Springs and WUNS 96.3 Lewisburg are simulcasting, with a "V-Rock" slogan. WUNS's calls have not changed as far as I know.

SOUTHEAST:

News from Georgia...there has been question recently as to the calls of 106.1 Sylvester: well they are WKMK. WOKF 92.5 Folkston is country, with a 'K92' slogan, IDing with Kings Bay and Jacksonville (FL). Two items from the Carolinas this month: longtime Myrtle Beach top 40 station WBPR 97.7 Georgetown goes to hot a/c as WEMX, 'Mix 97.7'. In addition, WNCK 99.7 Port Royal, which just changed recently from top 40 WHTK to country, has now been heard with adult standards, simulcasting WLOW 106.9 Bluffton. In Virginia, specifically the Norfolk area, WMYA 96.1 Cape Charles has gone modern rock, with the slogan '96X' - MORE STATION NEWS TO COME

STATION NEWS (Southeast):

Listen for WKHS 90.5 Worton, Maryland to be simulcasting WXPB 88.5 Philadelphia at times. From Florida... "Disney Radio" (KA2XXZ 107.9) is now broadcasting in stereo! Another station in the Sunshine State that has embraced stereophony is WGWD 93.3 Gretna. WNFQ 100.5 Newberry is using the slogan "Foxy Hot 100 One-Double-Oh-Five". A big change in Tallahassee this month: 101.5 Quincy is WFHT no more: now they are WXSX, "Star 101.5", and adult top 40: "Superstars of the 80s and 90s". And WPFM 107.9 Panama City, now "Kiss FM" is moving back more towards the mainstream top 40 direction again. News from Alabama...two new translators have been noted in the Huntsville area, one for WKDF 103.3 Nashville on 105.7 (that really gets out!), and one for WAYM 88.7 Columbia, TN on 88.1. WMCZ 97.1 Millbrook-Montgomery has gone to an urban format as "Magic 97.1, Montgomery's Adult Favorites". In the Birmingham area, WWBR 105.9 Trussville is on the air as "The Bear" with an eclectic album rock format. From Linden, AL, WINL 98.5 is country "Young Country Win 98.5", and WNPT 102.9 is urban "T103". WJEC 106.5 Vernon is on with satellite A/C and "106". WXFL 96.1 Florence is also sat. a/c, "96X The Hit Mix". WZMJ Demopolis is not yet on 106.5, they are still on 106.3, with a/c-oldies. WAZK 92.5 Trinity is classic rock with a "92.5 Rock" slogan. Alabama gains another 105.9, as WKXM Winfield is on the air now. In Tennessee, WNWS 101.5 Jackson is supposedly on the air now, with local and syndicated talk. These are the same calls as an FM station in the Memphis area, so there is the possibility there is a simulcast going on. Also WAYM 88.7 Columbia adds another translator-W258AZ, on 95.7, in Fayetteville.

MIDWEST:

In Indiana, note that the calls on 'Q101' South Whitley are WLZQ, not WQBX as has been reported in some places. There must have been a call change sometime. In Wisconsin, WLDY 93.1 Ladysmith changes calls to WJBL and goes to an oldies format. In Illinois, WMMC 105.9 Marshall is back on the air with a soft. a/c format. In Minnesota, KARP 96.1 Glencoe is on the air, with a slogan 'Carp Radio'. Some changes in Missouri...KBXR 106.1 Ashland-Columbia has reportedly come on the air with alternative rock. 106.9 Jefferson City's life as KKFA are short lived as they return to their old calls of KTXV, with a rock format, but 'without the hard rock'. Reported on the air is KWND 88.3 Springfield, with a slogan of 'The Wind'. KMZA 92.1 Seneca, Kansas, is "Kansaland Radio" and sometimes simulcasts KNZA 103.9 Hiawatha. Two items of note from Iowa: KIOV Forest City has moved from 102.3 to 107.3. Also 106.1 Clarinda is now 'B106', KKBZ. KDAB 94.9 Prairie Grove, Arkansas is on the air with religion, parallel to AM 1580 KFDF Van Buren, which I am told

..is widely heard by AMDXers in the Midwest. Plenty of news from Texas this month! KAMZ 93.1 El Paso has gone to classic rock, and has added Howard Stern I believe. Big change in Dallas: 97.9 KLRX goes to a 60s & 70s rock oldies format, with an "Arrow" slogan, which stands for "Adult Rock and Roll". 93.1 in Los Angeles recently adopted a similar format and slogan. KCDQ 102.1 Mohanans has the slogan "Texas 102", with a 'rockin' country' type format, a mix of classic rock and country. Adopting that same format is KCWS 102.7 Merkel-Abilene, now with the slogan "Rockin' Country West 102". KKLK 101.9 San Angelo is still silent, and KFJX 92.5 Abilene has not yet signed on the air. KVMX 96.7 Eastland is soft AC, except Saturdays from 2-4p.m. when they run a top 40 all request show, with lots of hard rock and rap! KROO 93.5 Breckenridge uses the slogan "Power Country K-R-Double-O". KYXL 104.1 Brownwood is country "Kicks 104". KORQ 100.7 Abilene has gone top 40, as "Hit Radio Q-100". And supposedly 107.5 in San Antonio will soon revert to its old KBUC calls and country format.

WEST:

KBOB 98.3 West Covina-Los Angeles has signed on the air with Spanish programming. Also in the Golden State, KWIN 97.7 Lodi has supposedly switched from top 40 to religious programming. KQKS 104.3 in the Denver metro is moving away from its dance format to more of a straight top 40 approach. KPOI 97.5 Honolulu, Hawaii goes modern rock. In New Mexico, KASY 103.3 Albuquerque is hit country, with a "Y103" slogan. KKBR 97.1 Billings, Montana has gone to an oldies format, with a "K-Bear" slogan. Some news from the Northwest, KACS 90.5 Chehalis-Centralia, WA is on the air now with religious oriented easy listening format. KSHL 97.5 Gleneden Beach, Oregon is on with country. KRBZ 99.5 Reedsport, OR is new to the air, also with country music. KMUZ 94.7 Camas (WA)-Portland (OR) takes the air with a beautiful music format and the slogan "K-Music".

Wayne IN is also on the 'network'. That would also explain the 'listened to in more places' remark made by the station, and it matches your PTA. Hope you can figure it out!

Time now for a 'CCI Helper', here's Doug Smith...

"It may not be common knowledge among DXers lucky enough not to have them for locals but...there's more than one flavor of Home Shopping Network. Knowing which is which may be the difference between a positive logging and another unID. The 'Home Shopping Club' is a general-merchandise service. You can tell it by the phone number (1-800-284-3200) and the color of the little house in the corner-- it's blue on HSC. HSN's owned-and-operated stations (the ones with 'HS' in the callsigns) carry this service. The other service is the 'Home Shopping Spree'. It sells mostly clothing and jewelry, and can be distinguished by a red house, and the phone number 1-800-284-3400. In cities with more than one Home Shopping station (Chicago, for example), the second station usually carries this program. By the way, several religious stations in the South (notably, WHTN-39 and WLCN-19) have been observed carrying HSC on Saturday and Sunday afternoons."

Thanks, Doug! I have noticed WFGX-35 Fort Walton Beach FL runs shopping in the early AM before religious programming. WPAN-53 runs ValueVision 24-hours a day (back on the air, I'm sure Mike Hollis isn't happy about that one...) over there too, wow, it is almost a 'shopping city' on the UHF dial there! Doug also mentions Fernando's unID ch35 with an ID of 'CBS-6' is "almost-certainly WMLB-35 Miami." (7/93 VUD, logged 4/16/93, 2157 LT). Doug also says Dave Nieman's logging of a ch64 HSC (5/12/93, 1424 EDT) not // ch61 Cleveland could be W64BG Columbus OH or W64BM Toledo. Neither has ever been reported to the VUD... (until the 10/93 VUD! Greg Coniglio got W64BM, and I was there to help!) In addition Doug Allen's 106.5 WLSN logging is Greenville OH, says Doug. Thanks Doug for your help! I am very happy to see such help with others' unIDs! In some cases 2 or even 3 people wrote in with an ID; thanks to all of you. Remember to send your unIDs here.
