



A new class of restaurants and cafes has emerged in Downtown Oshawa - embracing creative foods, architectural details, diet accommodations and variety. Bringing together celebration, education and comfort, these foodie hotspots are building community one dish at a time.



The restaurant market is forever changing and at a rapid pace. This scene in Downtown Oshawa has grown from 38 establishments in 2009 to 58 today. With this growth has come increased quality, creativity and variety.

The following pages will give you a special glance at a few of Downtown Oshawa's emerging establishments, including The Table, Buster Rhino's, Felicio's, Spicy Affairs, Berry Hill, Tutto, Viva Burritos, and Cocoa & Joe. The Table (cover photo & above) has led the recent emergence of foodies, with hyper local foods, daily fresh soups and a 75% vegetarian and gluten-free menu. Creating a sense of community is a guiding principle at the Table, as evidenced with their Euro-styled harvest-table patron area, community garden and a healthy-eating after school program. "I didn't want to call myself a restaurant," says owner Carol, "because it's not. It is a place. It is a place to dwell, it's a place to be."

Even the most cautious eater can enjoy a Grilled Trio of Cheese sour dough sandwich with homemade ketchup, while the more discerning may prefer a Roasted Root Vegetable and Garlic Salad with a Spinach Paneer Soup.

MAHARAJA INDIAN CUISINE

Indeed, visit Spicy Affairs as featured above, but if food from south-central Asia appeals to your palatte - don't neglect to visit Maharaja as well at 74 Simcoe St N. We recommend that you begin with a Mango Lassi, which is a bit like a mango smoothie and will serve to protect your stomach from hot spices. Consider some appetizers such as Fish Pakora (very approachable fried fish pieces) and Chicken Kebab. After that, the sky is the limit.



Berry Hill delivers up life's simple pleasures: pastries baked fresh daily, summer's first strawberry, food made from scratch. Sarah, a returning Oshawa native and her partner Jorge, from Uruguay, make the perfect team with equal parts passion and customer service.

Sarah prepares the meal in front of you, all the while endeavoring to have a conversation about food with honest enthusiasm. She is creating institutions: unique forms of eggs benedict for Saturday brunch (pictured here), Friday is homemade pot pie days (bring home dinner at less cost than delivery pizza), and winter brings lamb shanks, short ribs and other specials. On occasions, food demonstrations bring education to vegan desserts and European chocolate making.

Jorge is a natural conversationalist and entertainer; it is not uncommon to see him holding court with a captive audience at the coffee bar. But, he brings sustenance as well: the best coffee roasted in Durham Region - it's a coffee-nut's paradise. Get a half dozen people together and Jorge will stage a personalized coffee demonstration with the roaster (photo below).



In our first trip to Tutto we quickly learned that you don't report directly to the register to order lunch - the puzzled look at the cash told us, politely: "you missed it already, mister."


We quickly started over back at the front door. The navigation of Tutto is important - this is how we did it the second time:

As soon as you walk in, look left at Tutto-to-Go. Here you will find fresh fruits, salads, and sandwiches ready for consumption back at the office desk. A few steps further on is the drink cooler - S. Pellegrino anyone?

Stop by Tutto @ Home if you need supper for tonight, otherwise from here you need to travel contrary to the flow: O check out the sweets in the dessert window (wow, those cannoli look fresh), then () examine the artisan sandwiches in the second window. and finally before standing in line, look at the hot food in the final window: vegetarian lasagne as big as your head, manicotti or a veal sandwich?

This is important: order your food as you pass the window of desired edibles, these will be delivered to the cash for you.

() Pay, grab your food, sit down. The second lesson we learned about Tutto - go off peak (11:45am), if you can!




Chart Notes

- 1) VEGETARIAN FRIENDLINESS is difficult to rate, so we studied menus and interviewed vegetarians to arrive at the following scale:
- = a few choices = should be pleased = vegan too!
- 2) OPEN HOURS there are 3 columns: Monday-Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Each has 3 circles: morning, lunch & evening open hours. A white dot means "not open", a yellow dot means "open", while a grey dot means "sometimes open".

Cocoa & Joe 44 Simcoe North

Sharon is celebrating 4 years in business at 44 Simcoe North as the sole proprietor of Cocoa & Joe. She has had a passion for nutrition for over 40 years.

Cocoa & Joe's first mission is to provide a unique and popular selection of gluten-free and vegan baked goods, but Sharon has also ventured into offering freshly made organic juices and smoothies, such as a wild blueberries, beet root, and ginger root juice.

Patrons additionally enjoy lattés, coffees and teas. The space has been transformed to accommodate live music nights and showcases a rotation of works by local artists.

The combination of a liquor license, smoothies, live music and art sometimes leads to an ecclectic gathering in a small space; nevertheless, Sharon greets everyone with the same charm.



The music scene in Downtown Oshawa is a story of ebb and flow, with one of the highest tides spawning bands like Cuff the Duke. Local music has been welcomed at supportive restaurants like the Thirsty Monk, The Atria and Murphy's, while all ages bands are at home in supportive cafes - Isabella's, Berry Hill and Cocoa & Joe.

Dedicated "live music clubs" have recently emerged. At The Hub, The Moustache Club and Wasted Space, food has become secondary to the priority of great music. These establishments are off-beat, creative, and offer a physical space for local and travelling talent.
