Her Majesty Queen Rania Al Abdullah is announcing her role as 'Honorary Chair of Global Action Week' for the Global Campaign for Education on Her visit to South Africa. Renowned for Her philanthropic work on education and women's rights, Queen Rania will address the need for Education for All before reading her story alongside South Africa's popular women leaders to a group of children from Soweto and Thembisa.

South Africa's popular poet and storyteller Gcina Mhlope, world famous jazz artist Simphiwe Dana and business and fashion leader Basetsane Kumalo will sit with Her Majesty in telling their stories and asking that everyone be given the chance to learn from a good education. Amongst the children are dancers from the gumboots foundation who will be performing for Her Majesty as she arrives.

With 774 million illiterate adults and 75 million children out of school the Global Campaign for Education puts pressure on all governments to deliver 'Education for All'.

The Big Read is a compilation of many stories from global figures including **Nelson Mandela, Desmond Tutu, Alice Walker and Paulo Coelho.** The book will be read by **millions of people around the world,** who will then write their name at the back of the book – in demand of everyone being given the right to be able to learn. Big Read events are taking place during Action Week – 20th - 26th April.

In South Africa the Public Participation in Education Network are organising the Big Read campaign that will take place from the 20th April until the 16th June. The list of names added to the Big Read in South Africa will be delivered to the new President and Minister of Education n the 16th June with demands to provide everyone with a good quality education.
