The Director General of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) presents his compliments to the Minister for Foreign Affairs and has the honor to communicate to him, at the request of the Government of Ireland, a reproduction of State emblems of Ireland, which the Government of that country wishes to have protected under Article 6^{ter} of the Paris Convention for the Protection of Industrial Property as revised at The Hague on November 5, 1925, at London on June 2, 1934, at Lisbon on October 31, 1958, and at Stockholm on July 14, 1967.

It is recalled that the protection of armorial bearings, flags and other State emblems of countries of the Paris Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, and of official signs and hallmarks indicating control and warranty adopted by those countries, is provided for in Article 6^{ter} of the Paris Convention as revised at The Hague, London, Lisbon and Stockholm and that, consequently, the communication of the State emblems of Ireland, mentioned above concerns all countries of the Paris Union, whether party to the Stockholm, the Lisbon, the London or the Hague Act.
