Introduction

Sources

I know of only two published discographies of Mel Tormé; the one that I helped to compile for "Jazz Records 1942-62" ("Jepsen") in the 1970s and the one published in 1990 by W. Bruyninckx in his "Vocalists Discography" Volume 4 (Si - Z). In addition, there is a very useful listing of records in Mel Tormé's autobiography, "It Wasn't All Velvet". Further valuable sources of information are the volumes on "The Clef/Verve Labels", "The Atlantic Labels" and "The Decca Label" by Michel Ruppli. Where I show different data from any of these sources, I am certain that my information is more accurate.

I started my own discography in the seventies and circulated it from time to time only to friends. I never felt able to publish it formally as I lacked so much information on the early period and because the subject artist continued to produce recordings at a steady rate. The flood of new issues has now diminished and so, although reissues still appear at a significant rate, I have decided that I should publish what I have and hope that other Tormé enthusiasts will help me to fill in the missing details.

For convenience, I have divided the listing into Parts. Each part is self-contained but complements the others. As time and knowledge permit, I intend adding further parts as shown in the contents list.

Corrections and Additions

If you have any kind of addition, no matter how small, or any corrections, no matter how minor, I shall be delighted to receive them but please tell me the source of your information. I shall incorporate corrections and additions and acknowledge them in the future versions of this discography.

Part 1: Notes

1.1 General Notes

In the listing, the intention is that only American and British issues are shown unless there is a particular reason to include others. For example, where a Japanese issue was the only LP or CD issue. This was easy enough when I started on the discography but it is now increasingly difficult. Towards the end of the life of LPs and, more especially, during the era of the CD, the major producers have tended to make records in one location for distribution throughout a much wider area. For example, EMI and Polygram tend to make records in one country for distribution throughout Europe. Records made available in Europe can also turn out to be either direct imports from the USA or locally made or even a mixture of the two. If I appear to be inconsistent in what I list, then so-be-it, I have done what seems logical at the time and I hope that you will understand.

Notes within the listing are given in the form (a.xyz); where a is the Part number and xyz is the note number within that Part. For Part 2, the notes are numbered separately within each section, e.g. from 100 in Part 2.1 and from 200 in Part 2.2.

1.2 Notes On Record Issues

In a session listing, where a title has been issued on the same record as the previous title, this is often indicated by placing — beneath the appropriate record number, rather than repeating the record number. If there is any possibility of confusion, I have listed the numbers in full for each title.

Where singles have been issued on both 78 and 45 rpm with the same catalogue number but with different prefixes, these are shown, for example, as 78-/ 45-1234. In many cases, the 78 rpm version has no prefix and so the numbers are shown as 9-/ 1234 meaning, 1234 for 78 rpm and 9-1234 for 45 rpm. Similarly, where mono and stereo records have been issued with the same catalogue number but with different prefixes, this is shown, for example, as ABM-/ ABS-12345 meaning two records with numbers ABM-12345 and ABS-12345. This method is never used for equivalent issues on LP and cassette or CD and cassette; the catalogue numbers are always shown in full.

There is a good deal of confusion over the numerical prefixes of the Capitol singles (78 and 45) rpm series. I am listing what I have seen myself or had reported reliably to me. Most singles in the 1948-1952 period were issued both on 78 rpm and 45 rpm. The 57- series which is used for the 78 rpm releases may have a prefix of 54- for the 45 rpm issues. Once the 57- prefix was dropped, the 45 rpm issue has the same number as the 78 rpm issue but with an F- prefix. Only 57-591 does not seem to have been issued on 45 rpm but the same two titles are on 54-583. Some issues (particularly those in the 1700 and 1800 series) are listed in the Capitol logs as having a 5- prefix but the discs themselves do not show this prefix. The significance of the prefix is not known but has been suggested as a book keeping indicator by Capitol that the record was issued on 78 and 45 rpm. This 5- prefix has shown up in other discographies presumably because the information was taken from the Capitol log rather than from the discs themselves.

The only record labels that are not listed in full are Reader's Digest Music which is abbreviated to Read, Vogue Coral which is abbreviated to VgCrI, His Master's Voice which is abbreviated to HMV and Music For Pleasure which is abbreviated to MFP.

1.3 Recording Locations and Dates

Recording locations are generally well known but Columbia, in particular, have been

including contradictory information in the notes to some of their recent CD issues. I have assumed that Tormé, did not fly back and forth across America between takes at the sessions but it is always possible that he did!

Some recording dates are known accurately from previously published information in books, on record sleeves and on CD inserts. Some sessions present more of a problem. The recording dates for the Artie Shaw Musicraft records, in particular, are the subject of a great deal of confusion. I have taken the accurate dates provided by Discovery Records when they reissued the material on the Musicraft LPs and CDs although these are far from complete. The Musicraft work sheets owned by Tony Middleton also provided dates for many of the sessions. The rest of the dates throughout the discography remain my best estimates based on the information that I have been able to obtain.

1.4 Master Numbers and Takes

Wherever possible the master numbers and takes are taken from the actual records. The take number on Musicraft, where it is found on the record does correspond with the take on the work sheet that is marked as "Okay" for release. Similarly on Capitol, at least until mid 1950, the takes agree with the Capitol ledgers. On Columbia, the 45 rpm singles have stamper numbers rather than the master numbers and so, the information I have listed has come from the information that Columbia has published.

1.5 Coverage of The Parts

Part 2: The Commercially Issued Records. This part lists sessions producing two kinds of recordings. Firstly, commercial recordings including those of live performances that were recorded with the intent to issue them. Secondly, motion pictures and broadcasts on radio or television including transcriptions for use on these media. These are only listed where they have been issued on commercial records even where these issues are illegal. A fuller listing of such material will appear later.

In Part 2, a session reference number has been allocated to each session. These reference numbers are used in Parts 3 and 4 for location purposes.

Part 3: The Record Issues. This part is a listing of the issued records (78, 45 and 33 rpm), cassette audio tapes and compact discs. Part 3 also contains track listings of albums with cross references to Part 2 where the related discographical information may be found.

Part 4: Indexes. The Song Title Index is an alphabetical listing of all the songs in Part 2 with cross references to the relevant sessions. The Artist Index is an alphabetical listing of all the artists who participated in the recording sessions in Part 2 with cross references to the relevant sessions.

Part 5: Films. These are the films made for distribution to cinemas or for broadcast on television. Also included are television shows but only where a video cassette has been made commercially available.

Part 6: Books. These are the Books for which Mel Tormé is the author.

Parts 7 and 8 will be added as time allows. It is intended to list transcriptions made for use on radio in Part 7 and the songs composed by Mel Tormé in Part 8.

Appendix 1: Identification Of Alternative Takes

These pieces of information are intended to assist in the identification of the alternative takes that have been issued for records involving Mel Tormé. I am indebted to Tony Cox for this information.

1. What Is This Thing Called Love

Artie Shaw and his Orchestra Musicraft master 5548, recorded 19th June 1946

The take issued on Musicraft 78 and reissues
At about 2' 12", in Tormé's solo vocal, there is a drum break under Tormé singing
..."and threw it away"
At 2' 46", the Mel-Tones sing " what is this thing (pause) called love". The pause is silent

Alternative take, issued on Everest FS-248
There is no drum break under "and threw it away"
In the pause in "what is this thing...called love", there is a distinct drum beat.

2. They Can't Convince Me

Artie Shaw and his Orchestra Musicraft master 5647, recorded 10th September 1946

The take issued on Musicraft 78 and LP MVS507 (take -3 shown on the 78)
At 2' 00", Tormé sings "doesn't she walk and talk, like ordinary people do". The word "and" is clearly enunciated.

Alternative take, issued on Musicraft LP MVS503 The word "and" is almost lost.

Appendix 2: A Blowers Discographical Anomaly

In the biography of Johnny Blowers by Warren W Vaché, * there are two references involving recording sessions with Tormé.

On pages 96-97 is a quotation from Blowers' journal. The year is not stated but, from the context, it is 1949. The relevant entries are:

Oct 28 Played a very nice date for Capitol with Mel Tormé and Pete Rugolo

Dec 11 Date at Decca with Ella Fitzgerald. Sy Oliver has become house leader. We recorded a song called "Smooth Sailing". Ella was backed by the Ray Charles Singers from the Perry Como show with Bill Doggett on organ, bass, guitar, and drums

Dec 12 Decca again, with Gordon Jenkins conducting and Louis Armstrong singing his classic "Blueberry Hill". Only made one side.

Dec 14 Decca with Sy Oliver, Ella and Louis

Dec 19 Another Capitol date with Tormé and Rugolo.

I have the Capitol session sheets for all Tormé Capitol sessions in this period that produced an issued master. There is nothing on October 28 in 1949 nor subsequently. This could however be a session that produced no issued material. On December 19, 1949 Tormé did record for Capitol but not with Rugolo in New York but with Hal Mooney in Los Angeles. Alvin Stoller was on drums. In case the year was incorrect, I looked also at the Decca sessions.

¶ Ella's issued master of "Smooth Sailing" did not come until June 26, 1951. Dec 11, 1949 is not a rejected session. Nothing was recorded at Decca on this date.

¶ Louis Armstrong had recorded the issued masters of both "Blueberry Hill" and "That Lucky Old Sun" with Gordon Jenkins for Decca on September 6, 1949. Blowers was on drums. Dec 12 was a busy day at Decca with four sessions but none involving Gordon Jenkins. Was this Dec 12 session AT Decca but not FOR Decca?

¶ There is nothing listed in any discography for Louis Armstrong and Ella Fitzgerald at Decca on Dec 14 in 1949 nor for any subsequent year. There were three sessions at Decca on Dec 14; one was by Danny Kaye with Sy Oliver. The drummer is not known for this session.

I am completely at a loss to explain the entries in Blowers' journal even by moving the date to a year other than 1949.

On pages 180-181, Blowers is listed as being present on ten Capitol sides with Torme under the leadership of Pete Rugolo. Examination leaves doubts about the accuracy of this claim on all but two of the sides.

¶ On the sides marked (1), Alvin Stoller is the designated drummer and on those marked (2) the drummer is quoted as Mel Zelnick.

¶ While it is not unknown for Capitol to label discs with a band leader other than the one actually on the date, it seems unlikely that this happened in any of the cases where the sides were cut in Los Angeles.

¶ This leaves only Capitol 15428 as a probable Blowers recording; with Capitol 1000 as a remote possibility.

¶ The listing of the two sides on Capitol 880 matches the claim by Blowers to have been on a date on 19 Dec 49 but he says in NYC rather than Los Angeles.

Derek Coller kindly put these anomalies to Warren Vache but Mr Vache was unable to shed any light on the matter as he was not responsible for the discographical matter included in the biography.
