Doris Bausch Wheeler, a cousin of Edward Mallinckrodt, Jr., donated family papers on June 6, 1984. Dr. Paul A. Krueger, author of a history of Mallinckrodt Chemical Works, A Company in Transition (1967), donated company records on December 2, 1985. Patricia F. Hicks, Director of Public Relations at Mallinckrodt, Inc., donated Edward Mallinckrodt, Jr.'s papers to the Western Historical Manuscript Collection-St. Louis at the University of Missouri-St. Louis on October 13, 1986.

Edward Mallinckrodt, Jr., born in St. Louis on November 17, 1878, graduated cum laude with an A.B. in chemistry from Harvard College in 1900. He received an A.M. from Harvard University in 1901. Mallinckrodt wrote his master's thesis on "Dietary Studies with Harvard Students." In 1948, Washington University in St. Louis awarded Edward Mallinckrodt, Jr. an honorary doctorate of laws.

After the completion of his master's degree, Mallinckrodt, Jr. returned to St. Louis to join the family business, the Mallinckrodt Chemical Works. In 1911, he married Elizabeth Baker Elliot (1884-1973). They had three sons, Edward III (1912-1932), Henry Elliot (1914-1945), and George Elliot (1920-1968).

In 1867, Edward Mallinckrodt, Sr. (1845-1928) and his two brothers, Otto and Gustave, founded the Mallinckrodt Chemical Works. The firm became the first to manufacture fine chemicals west of the Mississippi. Original products produced by Mallinckrodt Chemical Works included bromides, iodides, chloroform and spirits of nitrous of ether. Gustave Mallinckrodt died in 1877. Otto Mallinckrodt died in 1878.

Edward Mallinckrodt, Sr. incorporated Mallinckrodt Chemical Works in 1882, the same year it began production of photograph chemicals. By 1889, the company had expanded into offices in New York and New Jersey. In 1889 Edward Mallinckrodt, Sr. joined with four other producers of liquid ammonia to form a separate company, the National Ammonia Company. He served as President of the new company until the DuPont Company bought it in 1928.

Edward Mallinckrodt, Sr. remained chairman of the board of Mallinckrodt Chemical Works, and directed its operation until his death in 1928. However, Mallinckrodt, Jr. also took an active role in the company. He served as director (1901-1965) and as Vice-President and Assistant Treasurer from 1918-1928. Under the guidance of father and son, Mallinckrodt Chemical Works opened branches in Philadelphia (1904) and in Canada (1913). It also

developed barium sulfate for x-ray diagnosis, morphine and codeine. In 1922, the company began to sell analytical reagent chemicals which it had earlier developed for its own use. From 1901-1928, Edward Mallinckrodt, Jr. conducted research on the purification, preservation, and packaging of anesthetic ether. He continued this research through 1960, by then he had sixteen patents, and had written several scientific papers on ether.

Edward Mallinckrodt, Jr. succeeded his father as Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer of the company in 1928. He retained the positions through 1965. During his tenure, sales for Mallinckrodt Chemical Works grew from \$9 million to \$47 million. Edward Mallinckrodt, Jr. also presided over the firm's expansion into other areas of manufacturing including the production and sales of pharmaceuticals and production of purified uranium for atomic energy. In 1942, at the urging of Dr. Arthur Holly Compton, a Nobel Laureate in Physics, Mallinckrodt, Jr. agreed to produce the enriched uranium used in the first self-sustaining nuclear reaction at the University of Chicago. Mallinckrodt operated a uranium plant for the Atomic Energy Commission at Weldon Springs, Missouri beginning in 1955.

Edward Mallinckrodt, Jr. also gained renown as a philanthropist, humanitarian, and conservationist. He served on Washington University's Board of Trustees from 1928-1942. In his father's name, he endowed a Department of Pediatrics, a Department of Pharmacology, the Mallinckrodt Institute of Radiology (1928), and a Professorship of Pathology. In 1947, Mallinckrodt, Jr. also established at Washington University, a Professorship of Anesthesiology in memory of his son Henry Elliot Mallinckrodt.

At Harvard University, Mallinckrodt, Jr. continued a tradition of financial support begun by his father in the 1920s. A \$500,000 gift from Mallinckrodt, Sr. initiated the building of a chemistry laboratory called the Edward Mallinckrodt Memorial Laboratory. Edward Mallinckrodt, Jr. also established the Edward Mallinckrodt III chair of anesthesiology in 1936. Harvard Medical School also benefitted from Mallinckrodt endowments, most notably, the financial support given to Ward 4 at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston. Later renamed Mallinckrodt Ward 4, the project devoted its resources to the study of diseases that are difficult to diagnose and cure. Mallinckrodt, Jr. also donated funds to build an addition to the Harvard Divinity School and revitalize its programs. As a conservationist, Mallinckrodt, Jr. helped to preserve a natural area in upper New York State and the Dinosaur National Monument in Colorado and Utah. The preservation of Tucker Prairie in Missouri also received funds from Mallinckrodt, Jr.

For his work in science, preservation, and education Edward Mallinckrodt received several awards. These included: the 1952 Midwest Award given by the American Chemical Society, St. Louis Section; the Horace Marden Albright Medal for Scenic Preservation by the American Scenic and Historic Preservation Society in 1961; and the 1962 Humanities Award from the St. Louis Globe-Democrat.

Edward Mallinckrodt's social affiliations reflect his interest in astronomy, geology, ballistics, and conservation. Some of these affiliations include: charter membership in American Chemical Society; the Society of Chemical Industries; the Adirondack League Club; the American Alpine Club; the Sierra Club; the Harvard Club in New York; and the Boone and Crockett Club.

In December 1965, Mallinckrodt, Jr. resigned as Chairman of the Board of Mallinckrodt Chemical Works. He served as Honorary Chairman until his death on January 19, 1967.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

The Edward Mallinckrodt, Jr. papers document the Mallinckrodt family history; Edward Mallinckrodt, Jr.'s personal efforts in science, medicine, conservation, and education; his activities as Chairman of the Board of Mallinckrodt Chemical Works, and the corporate operations in manufacturing and product development. The collection contains eight series:

- 3) Contributions 1921-1966
- 4) Harvard University, 1909-1966
- 5) Washington University, 1911-1966
- 6) Mallinckrodt Chemical Works Records, 1846-1980

- 8) Photographs and Glass Slides, 1867-1959

The first series includes legal papers, biographies, correspondence, awards, family genealogies, a cash ledger, an apprenticeship contract, a master's thesis, and social register documenting Mallinckrodt family history. Extensive correspondence with Karl S. Cate reflects Edward Mallinckrodt's efforts to help his German relatives recover from the affects of World War II. The series also contains Edward Mallinckrodt, Jr.'s letter of resignation as Chairman of the Board of Mallinckrodt Chemical Works in December 1965; notification of his honorary law doctorate from Washington University (1948), the Humanities Award he received from the St. Louis Globe-Democrat in 1963.

The personal papers series, divided into eight subseries, documents Edward Mallinckrodt's interest and activities in conservation, photography, travel, and ballistics. Mallinckrodt's work to help preserve natural areas in Upper State New York, Dinosaur National Monument in Colorado and Utah, and Tucker Prairie in Missouri can be found in subseries 3. Subseries 5 contains information on the legal and financial administration of the \$2 million trust fund for educational, humanitarian and philanthropic purposes left by Edward Mallinckrodt, Sr. in 1928. Correspondence makes up the bulk of the material found in subseries 2. Brochures and pamphlets also can be found. The subseries on travel (8) contains maps, financial accounts and a manuscript on brown bears written by Edward Mallinckrodt in the 1920s; plus brochures and correspondence. Subseries IV includes the Special Bullet project.

Series 3, 4, and 5 document the many groups, organizations and individuals who benefitted from Mallinckrodt's financial contributions. The Harvard and Washington University series reflect the largest endowments made from the trust fund and include those for chairs of anesthesiology at both institutions, the Mallinckrodt Institute of Radiology at Washington University, the Mallinckrodt Memorial Laboratory at Harvard, Mallinckrodt "Ward 4" at Massachusetts General Hospital, and gifts to the Harvard Divinity School. Series 4 and 5 also contains more than information on endowments. They reflect Edward Mallinckrodt, Jr.'s activities as a member of the Board of Trustees at Washington University (1928-1942), the visiting committees for Chemistry and Geology at Harvard, the Harvard Board of Overseer

(1927-1933) and the Harvard Class of 1900. Included in the series are correspondence, brochures, memorial plans, publications, reports, and commencement programs.

The Mallinckrodt Chemical Works series are divided into two subseries, corporate records and product development. Subseries one traces the company's history from the late 1890s to 1980s. Correspondence makes up most of the material in the corporate papers, but the subseries also contains legal papers, annual reports, pamphlets, blueprints, publications, manuals, a company history, newsclippings and notices. Topics of particular interest include strikes, lawsuits, the 1933 Century of Progress Exhibit, and labor relations. Subseries one contains the material from Dr. Paul A. Krueger and includes the manuscript, *A Company in Transition* (1967), some historical highlights, and "A Tribute to Edward Mallinckrodt, Jr."

The Product Development subseries documents the company's efforts to produce its line of chemicals, pharmaceuticals, and uranium. The subseries contains correspondence, reagent catalogs, brochures, pamphlets, drawings, plans, regulations, surveys, processes, bulletins, price lists, product notices, and data books, with the production of ether as a primary topic.

Series 7 and 8 contains journals, scrapbooks, photographs, and glass slides. The journals and scrapbooks mostly document Edward Mallinckrodt's interest in chemistry and the Mallinckrodt Chemical Works. Series VII includes journals with chemistry notes, correspondence, a day book, and ether notes. The scrapbooks include programs, correspondence, chemical formulas, and pamphlets. Series VIII has photos and glass slides of the Mallinckrodt family, of Edward Mallinckrodt's trips to Alaska and Yosemite Park, the family residence, the Mallinckrodt Chemical Works, and still photos from the Ether film depicting the first operation using ether.

SERIES 1 - FAMILY HISTORY, 1978-1981, FOLDERS 1-93

Arranged alphabetically. Includes correspondence, legal papers, awards, apprenticeship contract, Edward Mallinckrodt, Jr.'s master's thesis, biographies, a card ledger, and a social register. Folders 87-93 contain the material from Doris Bausch Wheeler and includes a family history, correspondence, newsclippings, and mementos.

In alphabetical order. Divided into eight subseries: 1) Art, f. 94-102; 2) Conservation, f. 103-129; 3) General Correspondence, f. 130-422; 4) Guns, f. 423-432; 5) Legal and Financial, f. 433-471; 6) Memberships, f. 472-531; 7) Photography, f. 532-548; 8) Travel, f. 549-576. Includes correspondence, brochures, pamphlets, reports, legal papers, accounts, maps, and a manuscript on "Brown Bears".

Arranged alphabetically. Contains correspondence, receipts, brochures and pamphlets.

SERIES 4 - HARVARD UNIVERSITY, 1909-1966, FOLDERS 726-876

In alphabetical order. Divided into four subseries: 1) General correspondence, f. 726-798; 2) Chemistry Department, f. 729-831; 3) Division of Geological Sciences, f. 837-851; 4) Harvard Medical School, f. 852-876. Contains correspondence, reports, assignments, newsletters, bulletins, publications, invitations, artifacts.

SERIES 5 - WASHINGTON UNIVERSITY, 1911-1966, FOLDERS 877-917

Arranged in alphabetical order. Contains correspondence, reports, bylaws, minutes, brochures, invitations and pamphlets.

SERIES 6 - MALLINCKRODT CHEMICAL WORKS, 1846-1980, FOLDERS 918-1308

In alphabetical order. Divided into two subseries: 1) Corporate Records, f. 918-1194; and 2) Product Development, f. 1195-1308. Subseries one contains correspondence and the material from Paul A. Krueger. Includes: Correspondence, legal papers, annual reports, blueprints, manuals, pamphlets, publications, company history, newsclippings and the manuscript, A Company In Transition (1967).

Subseries 2 contains correspondence, drawings, price lists, plans, regulations, product notices, data books, processes, reagent catalogs, and brochures.

SERIES 7 - JOURNALS AND SCRAPBOOKS, 1878-1961, VOLUMES 1-17

In alphabetical order. Volume 1 contains a book list. Volumes 2-8 have chemistry notes and volumes 9-11 include correspondence. Volume 12 is a daybook. Volumes 13-14 contain notes on ether. The three scrapbooks, volumes 15-17 include correspondence, notes, programs, chemical formulas, and pamphlets.

SERIES 8 - PHOTOGRAPHS AND GLASS SLIDES, 452.1-452.308 FOLDERS 1309-1320

Arranged by subject. Folders 1309-1310 contain Mallinckrodt Chemical Works photographs. Photographs of the 1933 "Century of Progress Exhibit are in folder 1311. Folders 1312-1314 include photographs documenting ether development. Harvard University, photographs are in folder 1315. Folders 1316-1318 contain Mallinckrodt family, friends and home photographs. Photographs in folder 1319 document Edward Mallinckrodt's party celebrating his fifty years with the company. Folder 1320's photos reflect his travels and include 12 photos made from glass slides. Photo #11688 is oversized and is in the mapcase. Glass slides from the 1920s, numbered 11665-11667, 11689-11726 also depict Mallinckrodt's travels and show some old modes of transportation.
