Euro area unemployment rate at 11.2%

EU28 at 9.8%

The **euro area**¹ (EA19) seasonally-adjusted² unemployment rate³ was 11.2% in January 2015, down from 11.3% in December 2014⁴, and from 11.8% in January 2014. This is the lowest rate recorded in the **euro area** since April 2012. The **EU28**¹ unemployment rate was 9.8% in January 2015, down from 9.9% in December 2014 and from 10.6% in January 2014. These figures are published by **Eurostat, the statistical office of the European Union**.

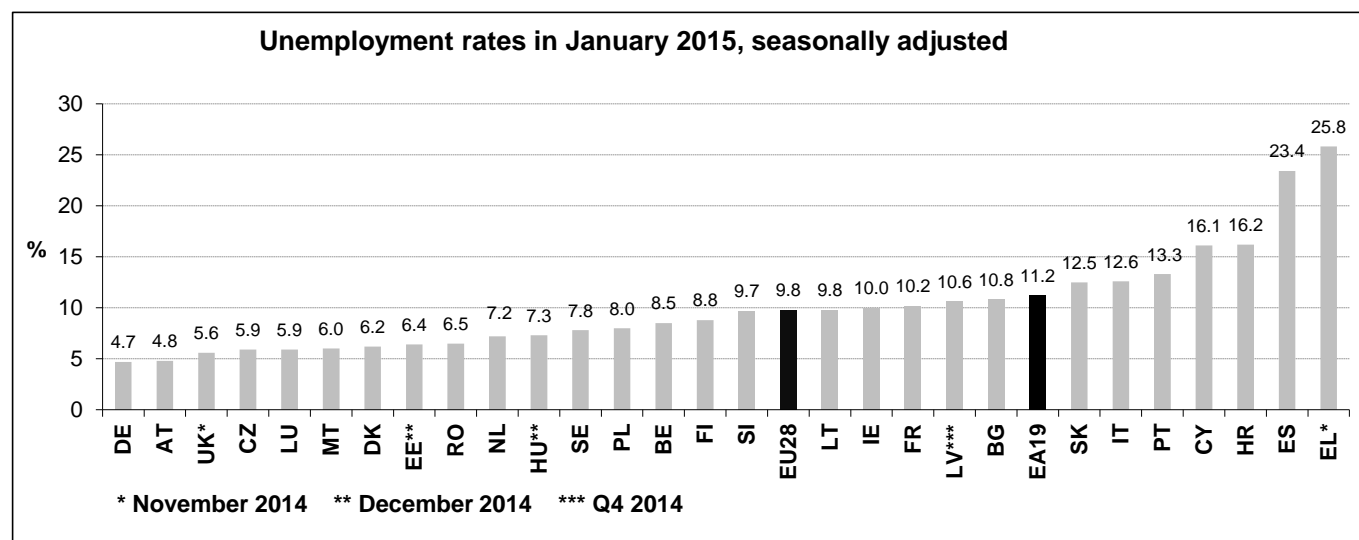
Eurostat estimates that 23.815 million men and women in the **EU28**, of whom 18.059 million were in the **euro area**, were unemployed in January 2015. Compared with December 2014, the number of persons unemployed decreased by 156 000 in the **EU28** and by 140 000 in the **euro area**. Compared with January 2014, unemployment fell by 1.820 million in the **EU28** and by 896 000 in the **euro area**.

Member States

Among the Member States, the lowest unemployment rates in January 2015 were recorded in **Germany** (4.7%) and **Austria** (4.8%), and the highest in **Greece** (25.8% in November 2014) and **Spain** (23.4%).

Compared with a year ago, the unemployment rate in January 2015 fell in twenty-four Member States, remained stable in **Belgium** and increased in **Cyprus** (15.7% to 16.1%), **Finland** (8.4% to 8.8%) and **France** (10.1% to 10.2%). The largest decreases were registered in **Spain** (25.5% to 23.4%), **Estonia** (8.5% to 6.4% between December 2013 and December 2014), and **Ireland** (12.1% to 10.0%).

In January 2015, the unemployment rate in the **United States** was 5.7%, up from 5.6% in December 2014, but down from 6.6% in January 2014.



Youth unemployment

In January 2015, 4.889 million young persons (under 25) were unemployed in the **EU28**, of whom 3.281 million were in the **euro area**. Compared with January 2014, youth unemployment decreased by 562 000 in the **EU28** and by 259 000 in the **euro area**. In January 2015, the youth unemployment rate⁵ was 21.2% in the **EU28** and 22.9% in the **euro area**, compared with 23.3% and 24.3% respectively in January 2014. In January 2015, the lowest rates were observed in **Germany** (7.1%), **Austria** (8.2%) and **Denmark** (10.8%), and the highest in **Spain** (50.9%), **Greece** (50.6% in November 2014), **Croatia** (44.1% in the fourth quarter 2014) and **Italy** (41.2%).

The euro area (EA19) includes Belgium, Germany, Estonia, Ireland, Greece, Spain, France, Italy, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Austria, Portugal, Slovenia, Slovakia and Finland. The EU28 includes Belgium (BE), Bulgaria (BG), the Czech Republic (CZ), Denmark (DK), Germany (DE), Estonia (EE), Ireland (IE), Greece (EL), Spain (ES), France (FR), Croatia (HR), Italy (IT), Cyprus (CY), Latvia (LV), Lithuania (LT), Luxembourg (LU), Hungary (HU), Malta (MT), the Netherlands (NL), Austria (AT), Poland (PL), Portugal (PT), Romania (RO), Slovenia (SI), Slovakia (SK), Finland (FI), Sweden (SE) and the United Kingdom (UK). The tables also include Iceland, Norway and the United States.

3. Eurostat produces harmonised unemployment rates for individual EU Member States, the euro area and the EU. These unemployment rates are based on the definition recommended by the International Labour Organisation (ILO). The measurement is based on a harmonised source, the European Union Labour Force Survey (LFS). Based on the ILO definition, Eurostat defines unemployed persons as persons aged 15 to 74 who:
 - are without work;
 - are available to start work within the next two weeks;
 - and have actively sought employment at some time during the previous four weeks.The *unemployment rate* is the number of people unemployed as a percentage of the labour force. The *labour force* is the total number of people employed plus unemployed. In this news release unemployment rates are based on employment and unemployment data covering persons aged 15 to 74.
4. The data in this News Release can be subject to revisions, caused by: updates to the seasonally adjusted series whenever new monthly data are added; the inclusion of the most recent LFS data in the calculation process; update of seasonal adjustment models with complete annual data; inclusion of new weights in the LFS data due to the 2011 Census. Compared with the rates published in News Release 20/2015 of 30 January 2015, the December 2014 unemployment rates remain unchanged at 11.3% for the EA19 and at 9.9% for the EU28. Among Member States, rates have been revised between 0.2 and 0.4 percentage points for Denmark, Ireland, Italy, Poland, Portugal and Romania. The rate has been revised upwards by 0.6 percentage points for Lithuania. For the Netherlands, the rate has been revised upwards by 0.5 percentage points due to changes in the questionnaire and mode of data collection. The absolute average revision for the complete Dutch time-series is 0.6 percentage points.
5. The *youth unemployment rate* is the number of people aged 15 to 24 unemployed as a percentage of the labour force of the same age. Therefore, the youth unemployment rate should not be interpreted as the share of jobless people in the overall youth population. 6. Latvia: quarterly data for all series.

7. For Germany, the Netherlands, Austria, Finland, Sweden and Iceland the trend component is used instead of the more volatile seasonally adjusted data. For Sweden and Iceland, seasonally adjusted data are available in the online data base on the Eurostat website: <http://ec.europa.eu/eurostat/data/database>
8. For Denmark, Estonia, Hungary, the United Kingdom and Norway 3-month moving averages of LFS data are used instead of pure monthly indicators.

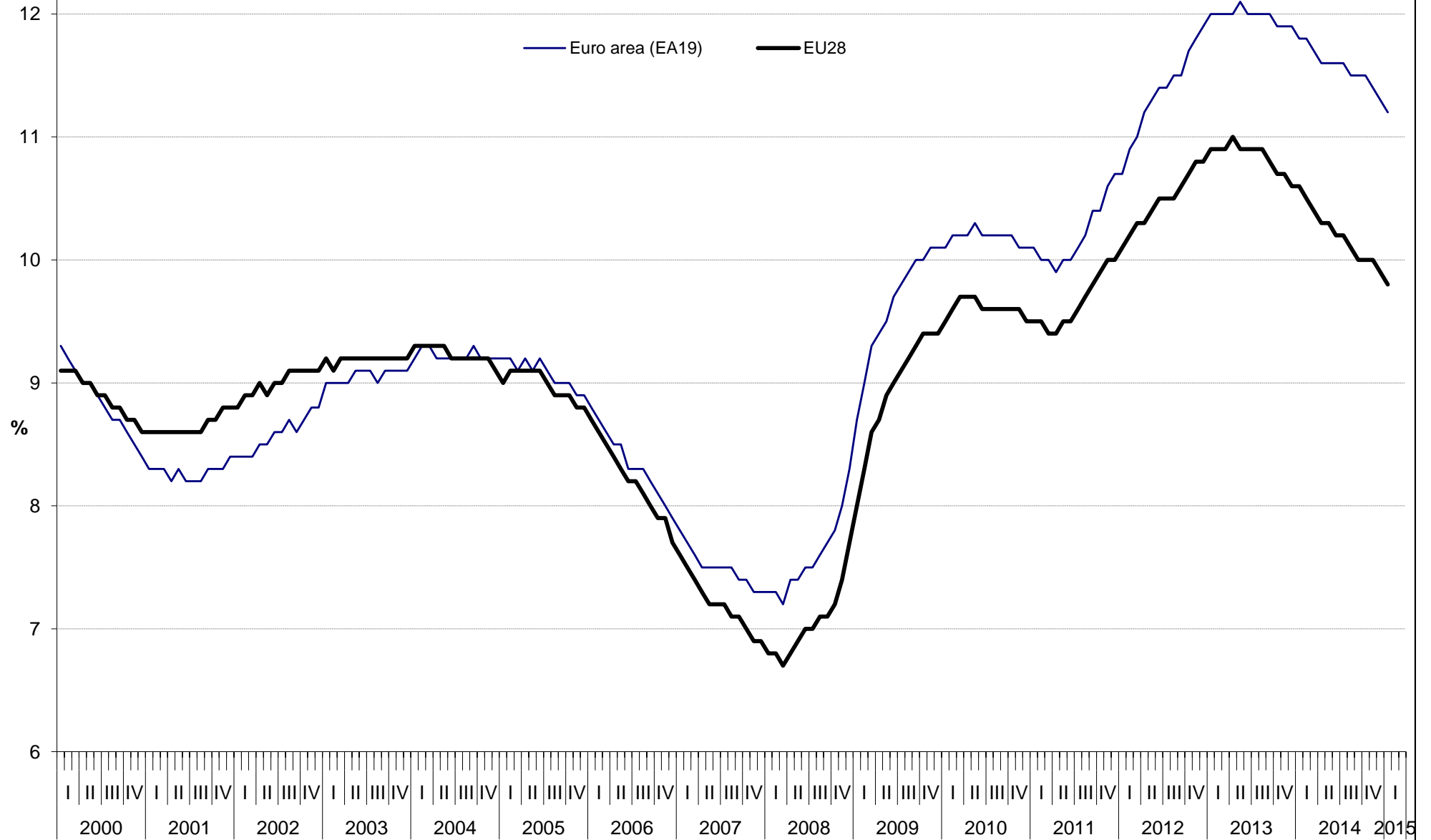
