





THE TEAM BEHIND THE TEAM

Coaching legend John Wooden (1910-2010) served as Chairman of the McDonald's All American High School Basketball Games from 1978 until his death in 2010. Legendary coach Morgan Wootten, a long-time friend of Wooden, chairs the Selection Committee. Coach Wooden, the UCLA coaching legend, guided the Bruins for 27 spectacular years, a period unparalleled in college basketball history. He retired from coaching after leading the Bruins to their 10th NCAA championship in 1975. Coach Wooden previously served as the Advisory Committee Chairman for the



McDonald's All American High School Basketball Games since 1977. Known as the "Wizard of Westwood," Wooden holds a lifetime winning percentage of .815, in addition to records for most consecutive men's victories (88); most NCAA championships (10); most consecutive NCAA championships (7); most consecutive NCAA tournament victories (38); and most undefeated PAC-8 conference championships (8). No other PAC-8 (now PAC-12) team has ever gone undefeated in conference play. In 1932, while at Purdue University, he was named College Basketball Player of the Year and received the Big Ten Medal

for Proficiency in Scholarship and Athletics. He later had successful coaching stints at South Bend Central High School and Indiana State University before departing for UCLA. Two awards have been established in Coach Wooden's honor: the John Wooden Award for the outstanding collegiate basketball star, given by the Los Angeles Athletic Club; and the John R. Wooden Award presented to the outstanding player of the McDonald's All American Game.

Since 1977, Morgan Wootten has served as Selection Committee Chairman for the McDonald's All American Games. In his 46-year

coaching career, Coach Wootten earned recognition as one of America's winningest coaches at any level - including high school, college or professional - with a total of 1,274 wins. He led his DeMatha High School team to five National Championships, the No. 1 ranking in the Washington, DC area 22 times and has won 33 Washington Catholic League Championships. DeMatha won 20 games or more in 44 consecutive seasons under Wootten. He surpassed the 1,000 victory mark in 1993 and it was his 1965 DeMatha team that broke the 71-game winning streak of Lew Alcindor's (Kareem Abdul-Jabbar's) Power Memorial team. In October of 2000, Wootten received the most prestigious basketball honor for all of his accomplishments, being elected into the James Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The Morgan Wootten Award, created in 1997, recognizes the nation's top high school basketball seniors who demonstrate outstanding character, exhibit leadership, and embody the values of being a studentathlete in both his and her school work and community affairs.

THE STARS OF TOMORROW SHINE TODAY IN CHICAGO

Today at the United Center in Chicago, IL, the future of college and professional basketball will be on display helping to raise money for Ronald McDonald House Charities® (RMHC®). The 37th annual McDonald's All American® Boys Game and 13th annual Girls Game will showcase the next generation of basketball superstars.

This year's elite group of 48 promises to carry on the tradition that the very first McDonald's All American Boys Team established more than 35 years ago and that the first Girls Team began in 2002. The McDonald's All American High School Basketball Teams have annually included the country's best high school senior basketball players.

This elite group of McDonald's All American alumni includes Magic Johnson, Michael Jordan, Kevin Garnett, LeBron James, Carmelo Anthony, Kobe Bryant, Derrick Rose, Kevin Durant, Maya Moore and Candace Parker. Odds are good that future NCAA, NBA and WNBA superstars are playing in tonight's Games, as well.

THE BEST OF THE BEST

Since 1977, the top boys high school basketball seniors nationwide have been selected to the McDonald's All American High School Basketball Team. One year after the first Boys Team was named; the McDonald's All American Game was launched. Ever since that first McDonald's All American Game was played in Philadelphia in 1978, the event has provided the only true national showcase for the best young male basketball players in the land. And, with the addition of the Girls Game in 2002, the same holds true for females.

Over 1,100 high school athletes have been named to the McDonald's All American Teams. From the alumni, more than 96 percent have played college basketball for Division I programs. In fact, at least one McDonald's All American contributed to an NCAA Championship in 34 of the past 35 years. In all, 104 different alumni have contributed to a NCAA title, and 64 alumni have played on NBA championship teams. In the past six summer Olympic Games, a total of 30 former

McDonald's All Americans have won Olympic medals – 2012: Carmelo Anthony. THE SELECTION PROCESS

Approximately 1,000 top high school boys and girls basketball players from across the country are nominated to the McDonald's All American Teams. A committee of prominent boys and girls basketball experts select the final team members. Legendary UCLA coach John Wooden was involved in the Games since its inception and served as

chairman of the McDonald's All American Games and as an advisor to the selection committee. Retired DeMatha High School Basketball Coach Morgan Wootten serves as chairman of the selection committee.

Players selected to the McDonald's All American High School Basketball Teams are invited to play in the McDonald's All

American Games, which brings them together to compete against one another in an East vs. West contest.

CHICAGO: SECOND CITY TO NOISE APRIL 2, 2014

CHICAGO – Forever tagged the "Second City," Chicago's historic namesake has never applied to basketball or its players who bring toughness, characterized by a strong, firm approach that oozes with resolve.

This town has a basketball legacy that starts on the asphalt playgrounds, extends to hardwood of the Catholic and Public school leagues, drives under the El to DePaul's campus and swoops up to Chicago's beloved Madhouse on Madison. Its fan base is passionate and, well, fanatical. There's no better place to stage America's most famous high school event than in a city that values perfect form on a jump-shot, an emphatic dunk and properly executed backdoor cut.

Basketball rules the Chicagoland area sports scene and there's history aplenty to back it up. Listen to 2013 boys' basketball national player of the year and he'll divulge what separates a Chicago hoopster from the rest.

"You better be tough or your opponent will take advantage of you and overpower you," said 2013 McDonald's All American Jabari Parker of Simeon Career Academy, who played for Duke University this year.

Mike Flaherty of Mount Carmel, who coached the 2013 Boys' West squad, agrees.

"Players bring a toughness that no matter the differential in talent level the competitiveness permeates. Our

teams may not have the same talent but we won't back down and (we) play with a level of efficiency, limiting our turnovers and playing smart."

Chicago's basketball legacy features iconic names—
Jordan, Mikan, Candace, Isiah, KG, Aguirre—and
history—six NBA World Championships during
the 1990s, several state high school champions,
and an NCAA champion in 1963. It endured
heartache in 1984 when prodigy Ben Wilson (of
Simeon) was taken from us too early. It values a man with a
moral compass, George Ireland, who helped change the game

forever, advancing integration.

The most recent chapter is authored by talented high school seniors who are McDonald's All Americans. In 2011, the nation's premier high school sporting event returned to Illinois after nearly three decades hopscotching around the nation. A record standing-room-only crowd of 20,018 attended the Games. In 2012 and 2013 the turnstiles clicked 16,308 and 15,818 patrons respectively at the United Center. In the four Chicago appearances, the McDonald's All American Games have averaged nearly 17,000 fans—by far the most of any host city.

Of the 79 Illinois McDonald's All American player selections – third most of all time – 61 are from Chicagoland schools, including 14 of the 15 girls selections.

Dorothy Gaters of Marshall, who coached the Girls West squad in 2011 and is Illinois' all-time winningest coach with nearly 950 victories and a record eight state titles, said an urban setting is an incubator for basketball talent.

"All you need are a ball and a rim and kids can have hours and hours of fun," she said.

For the fourth consecutive year, Golden Arch Madness is back in the city where basketball greatness will be on display compliments of 48 of the nation's best. In fact, McDonald's announced in 2012 that the Games would be played at the United Center through 2015.

"If it's springtime, then the 48 best high school basketball players are in Chicago for the McDonald's All American Games," said Douglas Freeland, director of the McDonald's All American Games. "So whether you're rooting for your hometown hero, college recruit or taking in the experience with your family, this annual basketball rite of passage is a can't miss event."

Chicago's influence was evident when four of the 35 Greatest McDonald's All Americans named were local legends. Selected in 2012 in celebration of the 35th Anniversary, Chicago was represented by Isiah Thomas (1979), Glenn "Doc" Rivers (1980), Kevin Garnett (1995) and Derrick Rose (2007).

And that trend of high-profile players continued in January when the 2014 rosters were released. Three of the nation's bluest of blue chip players hail from the Chicagoland area, including two boys who reside within Chicago city limits. Another, Kevon Looney of Hamilton in Milwaukee, Wis., is just a long three-pointer up Interstate 94.

Though there are no girls from Illinois selected this year, Chicagoans Jahlil Okafor of Whitney Young, Cliff Alexander of Curie and Tyler Ulis of Marian Catholic in Chicago Heights will evoke the ooh's and ah's from the United Center faithful on April 2.

Okafor and Ulis will represent the West squad. It's a dream tandem, representing the cerebral Ulis orchestrating the offense as a "pass first" point guard and the 6-10, 265-pound mighty Okafor will own the lane as the nation's top-rated prospect.

"I've only played with Jahlil once and that was in a scrimmage. So I'm really going to savor this opportunity to play with him," said Ulis, a 5-9 whippet who signed with Kentucky. "Even better is that the game is back in Chicago, allowing my family, friends, coaches and teammates a chance to see the game live."

Okafor is one of the most promising recruits in recent years. The Dukebound true center combines strength, skill, innate moves, soft hands and an interior presence to fuel his team. Playing in the McDonald's All American Game fulfills a dream.

"Being selected to this game means so much to me," he acknowledged. "And getting a chance to finally play at the United Center just makes this game more important and special. Now that I'm in the game, I want to win it. That's me just being competitive."

The beneficiary of Ulis and Okafor is West head coach Frank Allocco of De La Salle in Concord, Calif. Allocco, who played basketball and football at the University of Notre Dame (Class of 1976), has coached several national all-star games, but the McDonald's All American Games is at a different level.

"The game speaks for itself," he said. "It's an unbelievable honor to coach these amazing athletes. Trust me, I've done my homework on the West players and we'll be ready to play. In the end, though, it's about the kids having fun and showcasing their talent. I'm just here to manage it."

If the East expects to win, Alexander and Looney will factor in prominently.

Alexander, a 6-9 physical post, played on the summer circuit with the Mac Irvin Fire and signed with the Kansas Jayhawks. He is a double-double player: A dependable scorer and ferocious rebounder. In the up-and-down style that most McDonald's All American Games feature, Alexander's endless motor, transition dunks and length will please the locals.

"Even though our high schools have an intense rivalry, we're friends," Okafor said of Alexander. "We've played against each other and were teammates this summer. Having a big like Cliff in the same city and league [Chicago Public League] makes both of us better. We pushed each other, and not too many cities can say they have two quality posts."

The affable Looney, who is headed to UCLA, relishes the opportunity to play with Alexander and brings versatility to the East team.

"I'll play inside or outside, rebound or shoot threes; whatever it takes to win," Looney said. "I've watched the McDonald's All American Game on TV for years, and getting here was a goal of mine. Getting a chance to play with all the players you grew up with at camp and tournaments is the culmination of a high school career."

Though the McDonald's All Americans have an appetite for success, here's food for thought from one of the greats.

Jay Williams, a McDonald's All American, national champion at Duke and first round pick of the Bulls in 2002, felt his McDonald's All American experience was a "confidence boost." but cautioned:

"When I played against the so-called top point guards in the country, I knew I belonged here. Then you see 6-11 Jonathan Bender dribbling with guard skills and hitting three-pointers and suddenly it made me think, 'I have to get better," he said. "A McDonald's All American has the talent but how hard are you willing to work to set yourself apart? That's probably the most important thing a player here can ask himself or herself after you leave the games."


From MVPs to memorable dunks, Chicagoland players have figured prominently in McDonald's All American Games since the beginning. Here are five magical moments that area hoop aficionados can appreciate.

• In the early 1980s, two players with local ties were named game MVPs. In 1980, the game was staged at the Oakland Coliseum. 8,429 witnessed two Chicagoland products, Russell Cross of Manley Career Academy and Glenn "Doc" Rivers bring their A-games. Both players dropped in 20 points apiece as the West won, 135-111. The 6-10 Cross, who later earned All-Big Ten honors for the Purdue Boilermakers, bagged the MVP award. Rivers would go onto to star at Marquette and in the NBA coached the Boston Celtics to an NBA Championship in 2008. Rivers had six McDonald's All Americans on his Celtics roster that year.

• The Game made its first appearance in Illinois in 1982, a mere jump shot from the corporate headquarters in Oak Brook, Ill. No surprise it attracted a then-record 15,836 fans to the Rosemont Horizon (now Allstate Arena) as a hometown hero put an exclamation point on his schoolboy career. Efrem Winters, who played for legendary coach Landon "Sonny" Cox at King College Prep on the South Side, scored 19 points to land MVP honors. Even more gratifying was that the future Illini helped the West capture a 103-84 win against an East team, featuring future pros Billy Thompson, Johnny Dawkins and Brad Daugherty. The late Wayman Tisdale was the signature player on the West but the 6-10 Winters was the star of stars that night.



The 1979 game was truly a classic. Perhaps
the greatest collection of talent, which included:
Sam Bowie, Ralph Sampson, future Bulls sharpshooter
John Paxson, Byron Scott and Dominique Wilkins. Chicago
featured Teddy Grubbs from King; Isiah Thomas from
St. Joseph's in Westchester; and Raymond McCoy from Bloom in
Chicago Heights. Both guards were touted as top-rated point
guards. In those days, the citywide debate centered on who
was the superior playmaker. West-Siders backed Thomas, while
McCoy was the pride of the South Side.

"Chicago is one of the best cities in the country for basketball ... no, one of the best in the world," Williams said. "When you step on the floor of the United Center as a player you realize it's a special place. The fans are loyal."

The Bulls joined the NBA for the start of the 1966-67 season and though they had marginal success, reaching the Western Conference finals in 1975, things changed forever in 1984.

"With the third pick of the 1984 NBA, the Chicago Bulls select Michael Jordan from the University of North Carolina," the commissioner proclaimed.

Seven years later Jordan and the Bulls captured their first of six titles. Jordan teamed with Scottie Pippen and Coach Phil Jackson, forming the core, which dominated the league while elevating Chicago globally.

The champion Bulls called the Chicago Stadium home for the first trifecta of championships (1991-93) but in 1994 the scene shifted to the United Center or "The House that Michael Built."

Jordan's second stint with the Bulls (1996-98) authored a second threepeat of the decade, defeating the Super Sonics and Jazz (twice) for an even half-dozen Larry O'Brien NBA Championship Trophies.




Bob Geoghan, the founder of the McDonald's All American Games, recalled Jordan as a skinny senior in 1981 when he arrived to Wichita, Kan., site of the Game.

"Michael wasn't even considered the best player there. He was overshadowed by three centers — Patrick Ewing, Stuart Gray and Greg Dreiling. Michael scores 30 points in the game and wasn't even named the MVP. He didn't have that superstar tag coming into the game and who knew what he'd eventually do. The rest is history; he became a global icon."

The Bulls aren't the only NBA team or the first from Chicago. The Washington Wizards were originally the Chicago Packers for the 1961-62 season —calling home the International Amphitheatre on South Halsted Street— before changing their name to the Zephyrs and moving to the Chicago Coliseum. The franchise went 43-117 in their two seasons before bolting prior to the 1963-64 season and becoming the Baltimore Bullets. In Chicago, Don Nelson, Walt Bellamy and Terry Dischinger were notable players.

The women's game also has its place in the basketball annals. The Chicago Hustle played the Milwaukee Does in the first women's professional basketball game in the United States on December 9, 1978. Current DePaul coach Doug Bruno, an excitable 27-year-old, coached the Hustle to a 92-87 win in the inaugural game of the Women's Professional Basketball League. Bruno's squad tied for the Midwest Division crown in his first year but he departed for college a year later. The WPBL lasted only three seasons.

In 2011, DePaul's McGrath-Phillips Arena court was renamed Doug Bruno Court, honoring a pioneer in women's athletics. Bruno, a DePaul alumnus (Class of 1973) and student-athlete under Ray Meyer, is approaching 600 career victories.

In 1977, Geoghan created the McDonald's All American Game, applying the same event model he launched with the Capital Classic. He courted future Hall of Fame coaches John Wooden and Morgan Wootten to bring credibility.

"The main idea was to raise money for the Ronald McDonald House," Geoghan said. "The McDonald's owner/operator group has always been behind it. They promote it and help gather volunteers but the players really make the games go and the fans turn out to watch them."

Wootten, the Hall of Fame coach retired from DeMatha Catholic High School in Hyattsville, Md., continues to serves as the Selection Committee Chairman.

"There's nothing greater than when healthy young men and women are playing for a cause greater than themselves. What they've really done is touch the lives of others. It's God's work at its best," Wootten said.

The event's significance has not eluded Chicago Mayor Rahm Emanuel, who no doubt needed to remain keen on the intricacies on basketball when he served as the White House Chief of Staff under former Chicago resident and President Barack Obama.

"I am delighted the McDonald's All American Games will continue to call Chicago home," he said. "These games have been a springboard for countless young men and women to outstanding athletic careers, while raising money for charity and instilling a spirit of scholarship, character and citizenship both on and off the court."

Last year's games were, well, a slam-dunk for the Ronald McDonald House Charities. The 2013 Games raised nearly \$470,000, and when coupled with funds from 2011 and 2012 helped construct the nation's largest Ronald McDonald House in downtown Chicago, which opened June 2012. The Chicago house maintains 86 guest rooms, providing over 40,000 family nights, saving families more than \$7 million in hotel bills.

Since 1978 the Games have raised more than \$10 million for RMHC.

One of the highlights of the week is when the players visit the young patients at the Ronald McDonald House and area hospitals.

THE FUTURE

Moving forward, Games leadership is confident the next 37 years of the Games will be as successful as the first 37, with an opportunity for growth.

True to its core, the Games will continue to benefit RMHC, but Games leaders have hinted at the possibility of expanding to include regional skills clinics.

While no plans are in place to this point, leadership is eager to jump on the opportunity to positively contribute to dialogue surrounding youth and activity.







"It's usually a touching moment," said Doug Porter, CEO of Ronald McDonald House Charities of Chicagoland and Northwest Indiana. "The players realize how fortunate they are when they meet patients the same age. Once they see what we do, it's like one big family.

"I'll tell the players that you can make a difference and some day if you pick a cause, reach out and do some good. Maybe these games are the catalyst for this."

When Williams visited the Ronald McDonald House in 1999, it was an awakening. "I realized life is a gift and it put things into perspective when you saw the children with illness living with it everyday."

The McDonald's Games are the gift that continues to give back. The RMHC benefits, assisting affected families. The generous Chicago basketball community gains, adding another glorious chapter in the basketball tableau while the next generation of teenage prodigies prepare for the 2015 Games.

The city of Chicago's basketball legacy and the McDonald's All American Games have found common ground, both are second to none.

"The McDonald's All American Games' reputation of basketball excellence is well-established," said Douglas Freeland, director of the McDonald's All American Games, "Our goal is to continue to raise money for RMHC, contribute to the game of basketball, but also positively impact young people through a core focus on a fun, active lifestyle."

Regardless of plans for expansion, the future is bright for the McDonald's All American Games — as bright as the stars that continue to take the court each and every year.








FRANK ALLOCCO, WEST HEAD COACH








LOU WILSON, EAST HEAD COACH

And here we are today celebrating 37 years of the Boys Game and now 13 years of the Girls Game and seeing how both games have evolved into the gold standard of high

school all-star events. It's an incredible feeling.

In addition to showcasing America's finest high school basketball players on a national stage, the Games offer the best student-athletes in the nation an opportunity to experience working with a national charity and learning what it really means to give back to the community. It has been very gratifying to know that the Games have raised millions of dollars for Ronald McDonald House Charities and helped thousands of children and families.

Över the years, I've witnessed some great players and some great games. Michael, Magic, LeBron, Kobe, Dominque, Shaq and Derrick were all exciting players even in high school. The addition


An underdog East Team won a 96-95 thriller in front of a crowd of more than 10,000 at the Henry Levitt Arena when Michael Jordan hit both ends of a one-and-one with 11 seconds left. Local Wichita player Aubrey Sherrod of the West and Adrian Branch of the East shared the Wooden Award for MVP. Jordan netted 30 points in the victory, an All American Games record that stood until 1999 when Jonathan Bender scored 31.

Branch (who played at Maryland) scored 24 points while Sherrod scored 19 points in front of the hometown fans to share West leading scorer honors with Bobby Lee Hurt.

Dream Team member and Golden State legend Chris Mullin registered two points for the East Team.

Michael Jordan and the East team's Milt Wagner went on to be on NCAA National Championship teams: Jordan with the University of North Carolina and Wagner at the University of Louisville.

Jordan has also won six NBA championships with the Chicago Bulls and was named one of the NBA's 50 greatest players.




1982 • Chicago












2006 · San Diego







2013 • Chicago

For the third year in a row, the 2013 McDonald's All American Games took place at Chicago's United Center. The 2013 Games (combined boys & girls) were played in front of a crowd of 15,818. Combined with the attendance figures of the 2011 and 2012 Games, the 2013 Games capped off the highest three-year attendance run in Games history.

The 12th annual Girls Game featured its own bit of history as 2013 Morgan Wootten Player of the Year, Taya Reimer, and her father, 1991 Games alumnus Ben Davis, became the first father/daughter duo in Games history.

On the court, the West team defeated the East squad 92-64. The West team's Mercedes Russell took home MVP honors after tallying a game-high 16 points and 12 rebounds. Russell's

West teammate, Jordan Reynolds, chipped in an additional 10 points and 11 rebounds while Tyler Scaife added 15 points. In a losing effort, Diamond DeShields led the East team with 15 points while Stephanie Mavunga made a run at a number of all-time Girls Game records after corralling 13 rebounds and blocking six shots. Mavunga's performance moved her into second on the McDonald's All American Girls list in blocks and rebounds. With the victory, the West team increased its

lead over the East team in the all-time series 8-4.

At halftime, Linnae Harper, Erica McCall and Kelsey Plum were awarded with the Jack Daly Sportsmanship Award for exhibiting the best sportsmanship during Games week.

2013 • Chicago

The 36th annual Boys Game made history by featuring a record six players on the boy's roster committed to the same university. Twins

Aaron and Andrew Harrison, Julius Randle, Dakari Johnson, Marcus Lee and James Young all went on to attend the University of Kentucky.

In addition to the historic lineup, the Boys Game featured a matchup between Morgan Wootten Player of the Year and local Chicago star, Jabari Parker and top recruit, Andrew Wiggins as well as Randle, a late addition to the team. Randle, who was hurt early in his high school season, was named the 25th player on the boy's squad after returning to true All American form.

Despite these stars sharing the spotlight, highflying Aaron Gordon led the West team to a 110-99

victory. Gordon stole the show and earned MVP honors by scoring 24 points and grabbing eight rebounds. Parker added 10 points and eight rebounds for the West squad while Wiggins and future Kansas teammate Wayne Selden combined for 32 points. Despite the loss, the East squad maintained a 19-17 in the all-time Games series.

Demetrius Jackson brought home two pieces of hardware from his time in Chicago after earning the Jack Daly Sportsmanship Award and winning the skills competition at the POWERADE® Jam Fest. Also at the POWERADE Jam Fest, Nigel Williams-Goss shot his way to the three point contest victory.
