





Population




The 2011 Census population of Portsmouth is 205,100. The population has increased by 18,400 since 2001, approximately 9.8%.

Age Profile




Between 2001 and 2011 there has been an increase in the percentage of the population aged 15-29 years (from 23.3% to 27.2%). There has been a decline amongst adults aged 30-39 (from 16.2% to 13.3%).

Age Groups



Most growth since 2001 has been in the working age groups, the 16-44s increased by 13.1%. There was also an increase in children aged 0-4 years (23.1%).

Ethnicity



84.0% of Portsmouth's resident population are estimated to be of ethnic group 'White British'¹, those in other ethnic groups increased from 8.1% to 16.0% over the period.


Total dependency has declined as a result of the reduction in both child and old age dependency.

Population Density

There are 50.7 people per hectare living in Portsmouth. This is above both the South East and England and Wales population densities of 4.5 and 3.7 respectively.



Marital and Civil Partnership Status



36.9% of the adult³ population are married, a decline from 42.3% in 2001. Those that are single (never married) account for 43.5%, an increase from 36.4% in 2001.




Christianity remains the largest religion in Portsmouth at 52.2% however it has experienced a large decline since 2001. The percentage with no religion has increased by 75.6%.

87.8% of Portsmouth's population were born in the UK, a reduction from 92.5% in 2001. The next biggest region




Household Composition



Households comprised of married or civil partners account for 27.2%. One person households account for 32.1%, of which (37.6%) are occupied by those aged 65 and over.

Tenure



Between 2001 and 2011 the percentage of rented households increased. The percentage of households owned with a mortgage or loan decreased by 20.7% alongisde a reduction in the percentage of households owned outright at 4.8%.
