

Biography Guido Ravoet

Guido Ravoet is currently the Secretary General of EMMI – European Money Markets Institute and Chairman of the Market Committee of the STEP (Short Term Paper) Label, administrated by EMMI.

EMMI is the administrator of several interbank rates as Euribor and Eonia. Its Members are the national banking associations of the European Union.

From 2005 and until 2014 he was the Chief Executive of the European Banking Federation (EBF). EBF represents, through its membership (the 32 national banking associations of the EU and EFTA countries), more than 5000 banks. Large and small, wholesale and retail.

Guido Ravoet was also Chair of the European Parliamentary Financial Services Forum until 2014.

For 10 years Guido Ravoet was at the helm of the Association of Belgian Banks and Febelfin (Belgian Finance Federation). He was also member of the Board of the Belgian Deposits' Guarantee Scheme and a member of the Belgian Supreme Council of Finance. From 1986 to 1994 he was Secretary General of the European Association of Cooperative Banks (EACB) and has remained throughout his career, focused on European affairs, e.g. as a former member of the European Economic and Social Committee. In addition, Guido has about 15 years of banking experience, working with CERA bank (now KBC Bank) as Head of its Research Department and then member of the Management. He is the Chairman of the Board of a French and a Belgian Bank and a non-executive Director in a non-financial company and in an international association (WWF).

Guido has a PhD in Law and a Postgraduate Degree in Business Economics.
