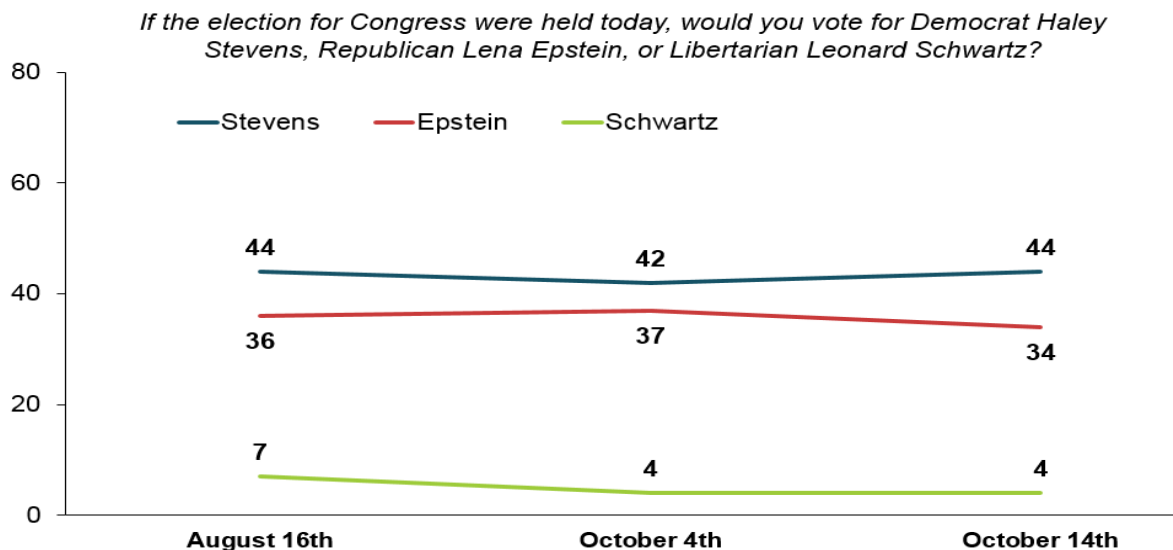

Re: MI CD 11 Tracking Poll Results

Haley Stevens has expanded her lead over Lena Epstein (44% Stevens / 34% Epstein / 16% undecided) in the Michigan 11th congressional race. With three weeks until Election Day, voters like Stevens more than Epstein in a district that prefers to vote for Democrats for Congress.

Key Findings

- **The environment favors a Democrat.** A plurality of voters would support a generic Democrat (46%) over a generic Republican (41%) in a race for U.S. Congress. A majority of voters are also unfavorable to President Trump (46% favorable / 51% unfavorable), including 45% who are very unfavorable to him.
- **Stevens' lead has expanded to an all-time high of 10 points.** She bests Epstein in both 3-way and 2-way contests. The race has consistently favored Stevens since her August primary victory. In a 3-way vote with Libertarian Leonard Schwartz, Stevens holds a 10-point lead (44% Stevens / 34% Epstein / 4% Schwartz / 16% undecided). In a 2-way scenario, Stevens takes a +9 lead (48% Stevens / 39% Epstein / 12% undecided).



The following are key findings from a survey of N=513 likely 2018 general election voters in Michigan's 11th congressional district conducted October 10-14, 2018. 44% of interviews were conducted via cell phone. The margin of error is +/-4.3% at the 95% level of confidence. The margin of error for subgroups varies and is higher.
