## 1998 MEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP

Gary Wolstenholme, the 38-year-old former British Amateur champion, made four birdies and no bogeys in a pressure-packed final round to lead Great Britain & Ireland to a 4-stroke victory in the event's 21st playing.

Wolstenholme's 4-under-par 67 at Club de Golf Los Leones pushed GB&I to a round of 5-under 208, a last-day score bettered only by sixth-place finisher Sweden. GB&I completed 72 holes at 6-under 852, passing a faltering Finland over the closing nine holes and outpacing runner-up Australia (856). The United States team lost five places on the final day to finish seventh.

The triumph brought a unique honor to Peter McEvoy, a five-time participant for GB&I who became the first man to play on a winning team (1988) and captain a triumphant squad.

"Peter kept saying during this week, 'I have a feeling we're going to win this,'" Wolstenholme said. "He kept saying it, and kept saying it. And I think we started to believe it."

The winners nearly did not compete in the event over concerns with the evolving court proceedings in London concerning former Chilean leader Augusto Pinochet. The GB&I women's team skipped the previous week's 18th Women's World Amateur Team Championship, but the men elected to make the journey. It was, in the end, the right choice.

Although the United States set the pace after the opening round, the story of the first three days was Finland. Only a triple-bogey 8 suffered by the fourth and final player at the 18th hole prevented Finland from taking the first-day lead from the U.S., which stood at 209. But Finland minimized its losses in the closing holes of the second round to lead the U.S. by three, then repeated the performance in the third round to stand three strokes ahead of Australia, U.S. and GB&I.

The performance by Finland was not wholly unexpected since the team was coming off a fifth-place performance two years earlier in Manila, Philippines. But it was a crushing last day for the team, which was unable to keep pace with the GB&I, who were the finishing



last two days," Finland captain Mika Wikstrom said of his team's combined 11 bogeys, double bogey and triple bogey over the incoming nine. "They are not just yet ready to be winners, but they are improving."

GB&I drew even with Finland about the time it reached the turn, then burst clear on the strength of a birdie at the ninth by Lorne Kelly, birdies at the 11th and 12th by Wolstenholme and birdies by Luke Donald and Paddy Gribben at the 15th. GB&I posted its total before the pairings of Finland, Australia and the U.S. completed their round, and the trailing teams could not match the effort.

The victory was the fourth for GB&I, but its first outside of a European venue. It triumphed in 1964 in Rome, Italy; in 1976 in Algarve, Portugal; and in 1988 in Stockholm, Sweden. In that latter victory McEvoy was the low individual at 4-under 284.

While tournament officials do not recognize an individual winner, the low total belonged to Kim Felton of Australia, who had 11-under 275 for two rounds over Los Leones and two rounds over the other host course, Club de Golf La Dehesa. Mikko Ilonen of Finland was next a 9-under 277.

Two GB&I players were among the top six, Donald and Wolstenholme finishing at 6-under 288

Jenny Chuasiriporn, who earlier in the year was runner-up in the U.S. Women's Open and Women's Amateur, produced the lowest individual total in history as the United States strode to a 21-stroke victory at Prince of Wales Country Club in Santiago, Chile.

Chuasiriporn, a 21-year-old senior at Duke University who is a descendant of Thai ancestors, returned rounds of 71-65-69-71. Her 12-under-par 276 was two better than the total returned four years ago by Wendy Ward in France.

Chuasiriporn's teammates, Kellee Booth and Brenda Corrie Kuehn, both veterans of the 1996 championship in Manila, Philippines, combined for four more sub-par rounds and placed within the top dozen and ties individually.

With those performances, the U.S. totaled 18-under-par 558, easily outdistancing runners-up Italy and Germany at 3-over 579. Australia and defending champion Korea tied for fourth another shot back, followed by France in sixth at 583. The host nation tied for 17th at 606.

The U.S. stood third after the opening round, trailing Australia by two shots and France by a stroke, before Chuasiriporn returned one of the most impressive rounds in the event's history. The resident of Timonium, Md., had only one 5 on her card as she made five birdies and an eagle at the 14th on a hot, breezy afternoon.

"I felt comfortable all day, but I didn't think I was going to shoot a low number until I made the eagle at the 14th," Chuasiriporn said of her 31 on the incoming nine. At the dogleg, 450-yard 14th she laced a 3-wood second shot that rolled up to within four feet of the hole, and dropped the putt for eagle.

Chuasiriporn's 65 tied the record for low individual round, established four years earlier by Se Ri Pak of Korea. It was Pak, who in 1998 was in her rookie professional season, who earlier in the summer defeated Chuasiriporn for the U.S. Women's Open title in a playoff.

Chuasiriporn's 65 combined with a 3-under 69 by Kuehn, of Fletcher, N.C., to give the U.S. a second-round score of 10-under 134. That was four better than the record 138s by Sweden and South African in the closing round in 1994 in France. In addition, the non-counting score of 70 by Booth, of Coto de Caza, Calif., set yet another mark. It was the lowest non-counting score in a format where only a team's two lowest indi-



The discarding of such a low individual score was reminiscent of one of the best rounds ever posted in the four-player men's World Amateur Team Championship. The 1960 U.S. squad that included Jack Nicklaus discarded a 69 by former PGA Tour Commissioner Deane Beman in its round of 203 at Merion Golf Club near Philadelphia.

The U.S. extended its lead to 18 in the third round and left it poised to shatter two of the most impressive records in the competition: widest margin of victory and 72-hole team score. The U.S. squad of Donna Horton, Nancy Lopez and Deborah Massey won by 17 shots over France in Portugal in 1976, a feat duplicated six years later in Switzerland by the U.S. side of Kathy Baker, Amy Benz and Juli Inkster, which outpaced New Zealand. Italy, which stood 20th after the opening round but began the final day in sixth place, roared into the tie for second with Germany on the strength of a 4-under 140. Federica Piovano, a 17-year-old who was the reigning Italian medal champion, and who had never shot lower than 68 in competition, returned a 6-under 66 on a day of exceptionally difficult scoring. Meanwhile, Giulia Sergas, 18, the nation's match-play champ, posted a 74 that included a hole-in-one at the 166-yard 15th hole.

All four days of the competition featured flawless weather of cloudless skies, temperatures in the 80s and 90s and brisk afternoon winds. The entry of 33 teams was one short of the standard set two years ago in Manila, Philippines. Three nations competed for the first time: Bolivia,

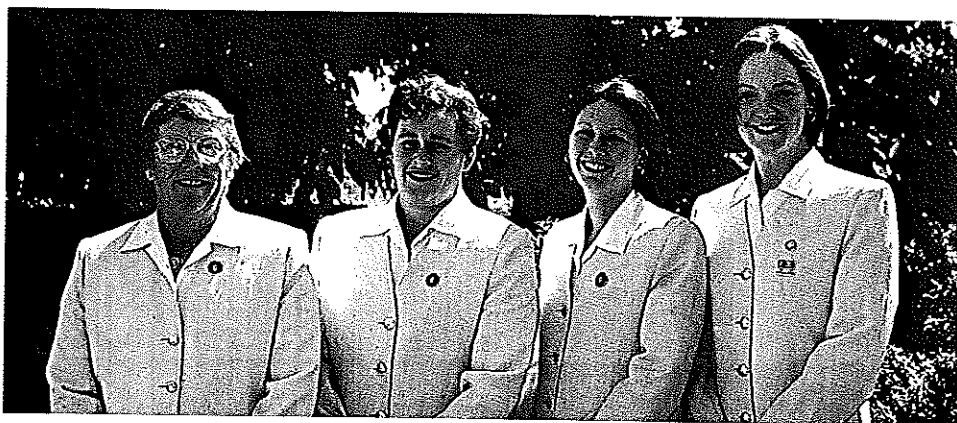

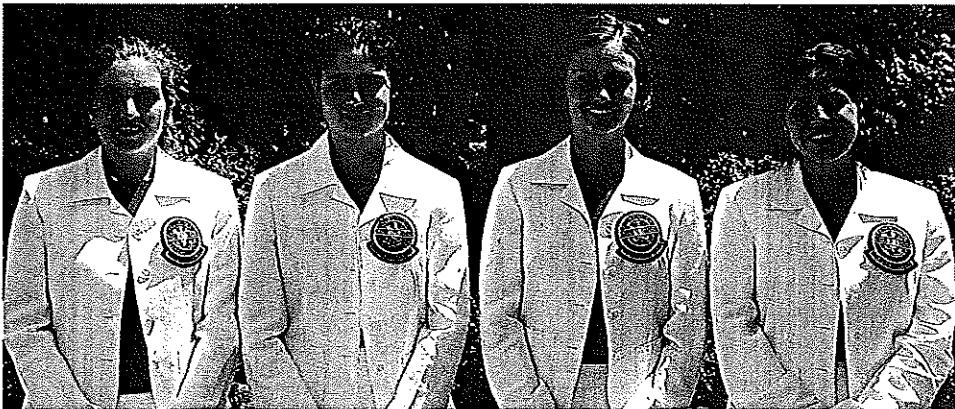

## ARTICLES OF THE WORLD AMATEUR GOLF COUNCIL

### ARTICLE I

The name of this council is THE WORLD AMATEUR GOLF COUNCIL.

### ARTICLE II

#### *Object*

#### Section 1. Friendship and Sportsmanship through Golf

To encourage the International development of golf and to foster friendship and sportsmanship among the peoples of the world through the conduct biennially of Amateur Team Championships for the Eisenhower Trophy and the Espirito Santo Trophy.

#### Section 2. Olympic Games

To promote golf as an Olympic sport and to act as the Federation for golf in the Olympic Games.

#### Section 3. Rules of Golf

The Championship shall be conducted in accordance with the Rules of Golf as approved by The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, Scotland, and The United States Golf Association.

### ARTICLE III

#### *Membership*

#### Section 1. Eligibility

Membership in the Council is open to any organization which:

The National Federation, Association or Union responsible for amateur golf activities in its country; and observes the Rules of Golf and the Rules of Amateur Status of either The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, Scotland, or the United States Golf Association.

#### Section 2. Election

An application for membership shall be supported by copies of the applicant's constitution and by-laws or similar documents and such other data as the Administrative Committee determines.

An applicant may be elected to Membership by the Council after determination by the Administrative Committee that the requirements for membership have been met.

#### Section 3. Finances

(a) Member Organizations shall pay annual dues, as shall be determined by the Council, payable in January of each year in the currency of the country in which the Council's Administrative Office is located - see Article IX, Section 8 - unless prohibited by law or government regulation.

(b) Income from dues shall be used to defray all Council expenses. If expenses in a given year result in a deficit in the Council's account, which shall be maintained in the Administrative Office, the deficit shall be shared by those Member Organizations in the same proportion as their annual dues.

Expenses of the Council shall be limited to the following:

(1) Cost of Administration including staff, office rent, stationery, postage, printing and other communications incurred by the Administrative Office.

(2) Expenses including travel and hotel accommodation authorized by the Administrative Committee.

(3) Insurance and maintenance of the Championship trophies; and

(4) Provision of prizes

No Member Organization may incur any expense for the Council, and no representative of the Council shall have authority to incur any expense except as expressly stated herein.

(c) Any other expense incident to the affairs of the Council shall be borne by the Member Organization whose representative incurs such expense.

(d) The expense of conducting the Championship shall be borne by the Member Organization entertaining it.

#### Section 4. Obligations and Discipline

The acceptance of membership in the Council shall bind each Member Organization to uphold all the provisions of these Articles and any rules or actions of the Council or the Administrative Committee.

Any Member Organization failing in these obligations or ceasing to meet the eligibility requirements may be suspended or expelled by the Council.

#### Section 5. Correspondence with Member Organizations

A Member Organization shall not circulate a memorandum to all other Member Organizations without approval of the Administrative Committee.

#### Section 6. Withdrawal

Any Member Organization may withdraw from membership by notifying the Administrative Office to that effect.

Any Member Organization so withdrawing shall remain obligated for its annual dues for the year in which withdrawal occurred.

### ARTICLE IV

#### *Championship*

#### Section 1. Time

The Championship shall be held biennially, on such dates as the Council shall determine. Normally, the Championship shall be held in the last two weeks of September or the first two weeks in October.

#### Section 2. Place

(a) The Championship shall be rotated among the three following Zones in the order stated:

(1) Australasian Zone - Countries of Asia, Australia, New Zealand and Oceania.

(2) American Zone - Countries of North America, the

(3) European-African Zone - Countries of Europe, Africa and the Middle East.

(b) Invitations to entertain the Championship shall be submitted by Member Organizations to the Administrative Office at least nine months in advance of the Biennial Meeting immediately preceding. The Administrative Office shall inform all Member Organizations of such invitations at least one month in advance of the Meeting. (Note: Invitations may be submitted by any Member Organization in any Zone. Although invitations from the appropriate Zone will, of course, be given first consideration, it is important that invitations from other Zones, particularly the Zone next in order, should be available in case no invitation acceptable to the Council has been received from the appropriate Zone. If no suitable venue is available in the appropriate Zone, invitations from other Zones shall be submitted at least three months in advance of the Biennial Meeting.)

At the time of submitting its invitation the Member Organization shall represent that, subject to any restrictions imposed upon it by the Government of its country, it will allow all other Member Organizations to compete if its invitation is accepted. It shall also present with its invitation a statement from a properly authorized official of the Government of its country that all Member Organizations, other than those (if any) named in the statement, will be allowed to visit the country and to compete in the Championship without any restriction whatsoever.

At a time not more than eight months and not less than seven months from the first of the month in which the Championship is to take place, both the Member Organization and a properly authorized official of the Government of its country shall reiterate the statement made in the paragraph above.

Championship invitations shall not be issued and pertinent advertising/promotion shall not be engaged in more than 3<sup>o</sup> years in advance.

(c) The location of each Championship shall normally be determined by the Council at its Biennial Meeting immediately preceding. In reaching its decision the Council shall have regard to:

- (i) The importance of locating the Championship in the appropriate Zone in accordance with Section 2(a) of this Article;
- (ii) The desirability of distributing the location of the Championship fairly among the Member Organizations in each Zone; and
- (iii) The degree (if any) to which an invitation to entertain the Championship has been restricted by the Government of the country concerned.

If no invitation acceptable to the Council has been received from within the appropriate Zone, the Council may consider and accept any invitation which may have been received from within the Zone next in order of rotation.

However, if the Council at its Biennial Meeting is unable, due to a lack of acceptable invitations or for any other reason finally to decide the location of the next

Championship, the Administrative Committee shall take such steps as are necessary to ensure the continuance of the Championship.

(d) The Council shall have the power to waive the annual dues of any Member Organization which, owing to a restriction imposed by the Government of the country in which a particular Championship is being held, has not been invited to participate in that Championship.

## ARTICLE V

### *Amateur Team Championship*

#### Section 1. Entry Dates

Each Member Organization shall inform the Administrative Office biennially as to whether or not it will enter the Championship; such notification shall reach the Administrative Office not later than six months before the Championship. Later entries may be accepted if the Administrative Committee and the Member Organization entertaining the Championship approves.

Each Member Organization which enters the Championship shall inform the Administrative Office of the personnel of its Team not later than one month before the Championship. Substitutions may be made at any subsequent time at the pleasure of the Member Organization.

#### Section 2. Qualification of Players; Amateur Status

The players comprising each Team shall be:

(a) Amateur golfers under the Rules of Amateur Status of either The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews or The United States Golf Association; and

(b) Citizens of the country of the Member Organization represented, except that in cases where a Team of citizens would be impracticable, players normally resident in the country may be included.

A player with dual nationality who has played for one country in a Championship may, in the immediately following Championship, play for the other country of which he is a citizen, provided he has been a citizen of the other country for at least one year.

Each Team shall have a Captain, who may be either a player or a non-player.

#### Section 3. Form of Play

(a) Prior to the date for closing of entries, the Joint Secretaries shall determine the maximum number of Teams, using two courses, which can be accepted at the selected venue. At the date of closing of entries, if the number of Teams entered does not exceed the maximum acceptable number, the Teams will consist of three or four players. If the number of Teams entered exceeds the maximum acceptable, then the Administrative Committee shall determine a revised format for the Championship, as it considers appropriate.

(b) The Championship shall consist of 72 holes stroke play; 18 holes each on four consecutive days of the Championship period. All the players of each Team shall be eligible for all four rounds; disqualification of a player under the Rules of Golf in any round shall not be effective for any subsequent round unless the Administrative Committee determines otherwise.

The Administrative Committee shall determine the starting times for each country and if two courses are used, the course on which each country plays. They shall also determine the method by which the countries are divided between the two courses for the third and fourth rounds.

In each 18-hole round, the total of the three lowest scores by players of each Team shall constitute the Team score for that round.

The total of the three-player Team scores for the four rounds shall be the Team's score for the Championship.

The Champion shall be the Team with the lowest such total score for 72 holes.

(c) Prior to the start of every Championship, the Administrative Committee shall decide the procedure to be adopted in the event of a tie.

#### Section 4. Prizes

(a) The Eisenhower Trophy, presented to the Council by friends of golf in the United States through The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews and The United States Golf Association, shall be held for the ensuing biennium by the Member Organization whose Team is the winner.

(b) A uniform type of prize for individuals shall be awarded to the players and the Captain of the winning Team, the second-place Team and the third-place Team.

(c) No other prizes may be accepted from any source, except symbolic gifts by a Member Organization to its Team.

#### Section 5. Championship Committee; Course Unplayable

(a) Prior to a Championship, the Administrative Committee shall appoint a Championship Committee to conduct the event. The host Member Organization shall be represented on the Championship Committee.

(b) The Championship Committee shall be authorized to decide when a Championship course is unplayable.

(c) If a Championship course is declared unplayable and as a result it is not possible to complete 72 holes of play in the period in which the Championship is scheduled, the Championship shall not be extended beyond the last scheduled day and the winner shall be the Team which returns the lowest score for the number of stipulated rounds played, except that, if it is not possible to play at least 36 holes in the four scheduled days, the Championship shall be terminated without a Champion being determined.

(d) The Championship Committee shall be authorized to schedule in advance a round of less than 18 holes, i.e., the Committee shall be authorized to declare before play begins on any day that the stipulated round for that day shall be, for example, nine holes; the Committee shall not be authorized to declare during play of a round that the stipulated round for that day shall be, for example, nine holes if the stipulated round when play began was to be 18 holes.

## ARTICLE VI

### *Arrangements for Championship*

The Member Organization entertaining the Championship shall have the honor of and be responsible for planning and arranging for the Championship, subject

to the applicable provisions of these Articles and approval by the Administrative Committee, and for all the expenses in connection therewith except the expenses of the Teams. Such Member Organization may charge admission to spectators and otherwise raise income as it may desire, and any excess of the proceeds over the expenses shall be disposed of as the Council may determine.

No financial liability shall attach to either the Council or to any Member Organization other than the Member Organization entertaining the Championship.

## ARTICLE VII

### *Expenses of Teams*

Each Member Organization shall be responsible for the expenses of its Team's players and Captain.

## ARTICLE VIII

### *Council Meetings*

#### Section 1. Biennial Meeting

The Council shall meet biennially on the day before the start of the Championship and at the place of the Championship.

At a Biennial Meeting of the Council each Member Organization shall be entitled to be represented by one Delegate, who shall be a citizen or normally a resident of the country of the Member Organization, and who shall be present at the Meeting in person. Appointment of Delegates shall be certified to the Administrative Office in advance.

#### Section 2. Quorum

Twelve Member Organizations represented by Delegates present in person shall constitute a quorum at a Biennial Meeting of the Council.

#### Section 3. Action Without Meeting

Between Biennial Meetings, the Council may take action by mail vote on resolutions submitted to the Member Organizations by the Administrative Office pursuant to direction of the Administrative Committee.

#### Section 4. Majority Decision

A majority vote of the Delegates at a Biennial Meeting of the Council at which a quorum is present, or a majority vote of the Member Organizations in cases of action by mail, shall determine any question before the Council, subject to any additional requirements of other provisions of these Articles.

## ARTICLE IX

### *Administrative Committee*

#### Section 1. Composition

There shall be an Administrative Committee of thirteen persons, composed of the Chairman of the Women's committee and twelve other persons representing ten Member organizations; three Member Organizations in each of the three respective Zones shall be represented, together with one additional representative from the Continent of Africa. Each such person shall be a citizen or normally a resident of the country of the Member Organization he represents. If the country entertaining the next Championship is not represented in the Administrative

Committee, it shall appoint a fourteenth person to serve on the Committee in a non-voting capacity.

## **Section 2. Nomination; Election**

(a) The Administrative Committee shall serve as a Nominating Committee and shall propose to the Biennial Meeting eight Member Organizations to receive the right to appoint one representative each to the Administrative Committee. Additional nominations may be made by Delegates to the Biennial Meeting.

(b) At each Biennial Meeting eight Member Organizations shall be chosen, by ballot, to receive the right to appoint one representative (or substitute) each to the Administrative Committee, to serve for the ensuing two years. The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews and The United States Golf Association shall be permanently entitled to appoint two representatives.

(c) Each Member Organization so chosen shall promptly appoint its representative to the Administrative Committee and give the Administrative Office notification of the appointment. If a Delegate of any Member Organization so chosen is present at the Biennial Meeting, he shall thereupon become the appointee of his Member Organization to the Administrative Committee.

(d) A Member Organization shall have the right to change its appointee to the Administrative Committee, any such change shall become effective when the Administrative Office receives notification thereof.

## **Section 3. Duties**

The Administrative Committee shall conduct the affairs of the Council, subject to the provisions of these Articles and to directions of the Council.

## **Section 4. Meetings**

The retiring Administrative Committee shall meet immediately prior to the Biennial Meeting of the Council.

The Administrative Committee newly determined at the Biennial Meeting of the Council shall meet immediately after the Biennial Meeting of the Council.

## **Section 5. Quorum**

Four members present in person representing at least six Member Organizations shall constitute a quorum of the Administrative Committee.

## **Section 6. Action Between Meetings**

Between meetings, the Administrative Committee may take action by mail vote on resolutions submitted to the representatives to the Administrative Committee by the Administrative Office.

## **Section 7. Majority Decision**

A majority vote at a meeting at which a quorum is present, or a majority vote of the entire Administrative Committee in case of action by mail, shall determine any question before the Administrative Committee.

## **Section 8. Administrative Office**

The Council's Administrative Office is located at Golf House, Far Hills, N.J., U.S.A. The Administrative Office shall keep the records of the Council and of the Administrative Committee, give notices of all meetings and conduct all votes by mail, carry on the correspondence of the Council, and perform all other customary duties.

## **ARTICLE X**

### *Officers*

### **Section 1. Titles; Election**

The officers of the Council shall be two Joint Chairmen, who shall be representatives of and appointed by The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews and The United States Golf Association, and two Joint Secretaries. The Joint Chairmen shall each be one of the representatives to the Administrative Committee. The Joint Secretaries shall be appointed by the Administrative Committee.

### **Section 2. Chairman**

One of the Joint Chairmen shall preside at meetings of the Council and of the Administrative Committee, and in general shall perform the customary duties of his office.

## **ARTICLE XI**

### *Language*

The official language of the Council is English.

## **ARTICLE XII**

### *Care of Trophy*

### **Section 1. Protection**

The United States Golf Association shall retain title to the Championship Trophy, and shall make arrangements for its insurance and for its safekeeping during any suspension of the Championship.

### **Section 2. Dissolution of Council**

In the event of dissolution of the Council, such use or other disposition of the Championship Trophy shall be made as The United States Golf Association may in its discretion determine.

## **ARTICLE XIII**

### *Amendments*

These Articles may be amended by action of the Council, provided, however, that the provisions of these Articles with respect to the Rules of Golf and the Rules of Amateur Status shall not be amended without the unanimous affirmative vote of the Member Organizations; that the provisions of these Articles with respect to permanent representation to the Administrative Committee shall not be amended without the affirmative votes of the respective Member Organizations concerned; and that the provisions of these Articles with respect to the ownership and custody of the Championship Trophy shall not be amended without the affirmative vote of The United States Golf Association.

## **ARTICLE XIV**

### *Women's Amateur Team Championship*

### **Section 1. Regulations**

The Council shall conduct biennially a Women's Amateur Team Championship for the Espirito Santo Trophy, open to Teams representing Member Organizations of the Women's Division.

All relevant provisions and principles of Articles IV, V, VI, VII and XII shall apply except as follows:

Each Team shall consist of two or three players. In each 18-hole round, the total of the two lowest scores by players of each Team shall constitute the Team score for that round.

### **Section 2. Place and Time**

The place and the time of the Women's Amateur Team Championship shall be determined by the Council. The Championship shall be held as near as feasible geographically to the Men's Championship and in an adjacent week or concurrently but preferably before the Men's Championship.

### **Section 3. Prizes**

The Espirito Santo Trophy, presented to the Council by the family of Ricardo Espirito Santo through the Portuguese Golf Federation, shall be held for the ensuing biennium by the Member Organization whose Team is the winner.

In the event of abandonment of the Women's Amateur Team Championship, such use or other disposition of the Espirito Santo Trophy shall be made as the Portuguese Golf Federation may in its discretion determine.

## **ARTICLE XV**

### *Women's Division*

All relevant provisions and principles of the Articles shall apply to the Women's Division except as follows:

### **Section 1. Membership**

Membership in the Women's Division is open to any organization which either:

(a) Is a Member Organization of the Council and has jurisdiction of women's amateur golf in its country. An application from a Member Organization of the Council for membership in the Women's Division shall be granted automatically.

-OR-

(b) Is responsible for women's amateur golf in its country and observes the Rules of Golf and the Rules of Amateur Status of either The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, Scotland, or The United States Golf Association. An application from such an organization shall be supported by copies of the applicant's constitution and by-laws or similar documents and such data as the Administrative Committee determines. Such an applicant may be elected by the Council after determination by the Administrative Committee that the requirements for membership have been met.

### **Section 2. Finances**

The principles of Article III, Section 3, shall apply to Women's Division Members to defray all Council expenses relating to women's events.

### **Section 3. Biennial Meeting**

The Women's Division shall meet biennially two days before the start of the Women's Amateur Team Championship and at the place of the Championship.

At a Biennial Meeting each Member Organization of the Women's Division shall be entitled to be represented by one Delegate, who shall be present in person and whose appointment shall be certified to the Administrative Office in advance.

Eight Member Organizations of the Women's Division represented by Delegates present in person shall constitute a quorum at a Biennial Meeting.

### **Section 4. Women's Committee; Chairman**

#### **Women's Committee**

There shall be a Women's Committee of ten persons, composed of the Chairman of the Women's Division and the Women's Committee, and nine other persons representing nine Member Organizations. Three Member Organizations in each of the respective Zones will be represented.

At each Biennial Meeting there shall be chosen, by ballot, the nine Member Organizations which shall be entitled to appoint representatives to the Women's Committee, to serve for the ensuing two years.

#### **Chairman**

A woman from one of the nine Women's Committee Member Organizations shall be chosen by ballot to serve as Chairman of the Women's Division and the Women's Committee for up to a maximum of six years. The Member Organization of the Chairman shall be entitled to two representatives, including the Chairman.

The Chairman shall be chosen among the three Zones on a rotational basis.

### **Section 5. Duties of Women's Committee**

The Women's Committee shall conduct the affairs of the Women's Division, subject to directions of the Council, and shall advise the Council on matters relative to the Women's Amateur Team Championship. Matters of policy shall be determined by the Council.
