BULLS VS. PISTONS – ALL-TIME PLAYOFF SERIES NOTES

Chicago and Detroit meet in the NBA Playoffs for the sixth time in 2007 and the first meeting since the 1991 Eastern Conference Finals when the Bulls swept the Pistons in four straight. The Pistons currently hold a 15-14 (.517) advantage in the 29 playoff meetings. Chicago is 9-5 in games played in the Windy City and 5-10 in meetings in the Motor City. The 2007 meetings in Chicago will be the first playoff appearance by Detroit at the United Center, after the Bulls hosted the Pistons at Chicago Stadium in all previous home meetings (1974, 1988-91). The Pistons have hosted the Bulls in the playoffs at three different Detroit venues: Cobo Arena (1974), Pontiac Silverdome (1988) and The Palace of Auburn Hills (1989, 1990 & 1991).

SHUT 'EM DOWN On the year, the Bulls limited their opponents to .435 shooting from the field (second in the NBA), while the Pistons shot .454 (20th). Chicago went 3-1 in its four games against Detroit this season and the Bulls held the Pistons to .384 shooting overall (Game 1: .348, Game 2: .378, Game 3: .413, Game 4: .405). The Bulls also held Detroit 7.7 points below their season average of 96.0 ppg.
