Delsea Regional High School serves the students of Franklin, Elk, and Newfield Townships. The regional district, located in the southern part of Gloucester County, spans 78 square miles. ACADEMIC FACILITIES

Delsea utilizes state of the art technology. Each classroom in the high school has Internet access. Our school houses traditional classrooms, science labs, technology labs modern physical education and exercise facilities, performance art facilities, and studio art rooms. All computer systems are tied into a central network. Three science labs use MAC computers for data collection and analysis. A TV studio is in operation and offers students the opportunity to obtain technological communication skills associated with TV cameras, monitors, and editing machines. Our Business and Technology departments offer courses which use state of the art technology and software. Our district's wireless LAN allows for the school's laptop and tablet devices to be utilized anywhere throughout the building. With the 1:1 personal student technology initiative all students in grades 7-12 have a school issued Chrome Book. Delsea Regional High School was recently named a 2018 Future Ready School.

PROGRAM

The district is a collaborative learning community that is passionately committed to educating all students; our mission is to develop life-long learners who demonstrate character and become valuable members of our community, country, and world. The philosophy of education is based on the concept of a total and equal education for each student and is achieved through a balanced curriculum in both scope and sequence. Delsea is a comprehensive school system, which provides multiple track programs to meet the various individual needs of students. In the core areas of math, science, social studies, language arts, and foreign language courses, students are grouped into subject levels according to their interests, past academic achievements, and standardized test scores. Our program levels are considered open enrollment and a student may, with parental permission, pursue a level for which he/she is not recommended. The curricular tracks and descriptions include: Honors and Advanced Placement: Accelerated and fast-paced programs emphasizing independent work; A Level Program: Four-year college and career readiness sequence with an in-depth approach to units of study; B Level Program: prepares students for two and four-year colleges as well as other venues of post-secondary education.
