

# CHARLES H. ALLEN RESIGNS.

**Retires as President of American Sugar Co. to Seek Rest.**

Charles H. Allen yesterday tendered his resignation as President of the American Sugar Refining Company. He became Treasurer of the company in 1910, and three years later succeeded to the Presidency. He had been desirous for some time of being relieved of the responsibilities of executive work, and his resignation as the active head of the company was accepted by the Directors with regret. Mr. Allen will remain on the board.

Prior to his connection with the American Sugar Refining Company, Mr. Allen had represented the Lowell (Mass.) district in Congress. He had also served as Assistant Secretary of the Navy, first Civil Governor of Porto Rico, and Vice President of the Morton Trust Company and its successor, the Guaranty Trust Company. His successor as President of the sugar company has not been chosen.
