THE RICH GET RICHER. . . Buffalo-based Rich Communications is selling its "rock network" FM's, classic rock WGRF and album rock WUFX, to ex-Greater Media exec Charlie Banta's Mercury Broadcasting. Terms weren't disclosed. Banta and Greenwich Street Capital Partners have teamed up to acquire properties with a cache of \$450 million. Banta is a Buffalo native and was with Rich earlier in his career. On Rich's AM side, news-talk WGR and business-formatted WWWS have entered into a joint sales agreement with Keymarket's recently-acquired duopoly partners talk/sports WWKB, news-talk WBEN, hot AC WMJQ, all Buffalo, and WKSE, Niagara Falls.

OFTEN SOLD, SELDOM CLOSED WSPD AND WLQR, TOLEDO, TRY AGAIN. . . Noble Broadcasting is doubling up in Toledo by purchasing news-talker WSPD and AC WLQR from Commonwealth Broadcasting. Terms weren't disclosed. Noble already owns CHR WKKS. The trombo wouldn't have gotten past the FCC-imposed 25 percent share audience cap in the summer Arbitron book but fell below it in the Fall book.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The FCC was closed Monday, Feb. 20, for the Presidents' Day holiday. Judging by the number of broadcast items on the public notices, most of the week was a holiday at the Commission. The light week there obviously makes this week Journal a little lighter than most, but we're sure they'll catch up next week.

U.S. Commerce Secretary Ron Brown may be spending more time with his attorneys soon, partially because of his dealings as a partner in Albimar Communications. Reuters reports the Justice Department is launching a preliminary inquiry to determine if a special prosecutor should be named to investigate Brown's business ties before he took office. The Department is concerned Brown may have filed false financial disclosure forms, misled Congress, or illegally evaded taxes.

According to Reuters and the Washington Post, NBC has agreed to forgive most of a seven-year-old \$10 million loan it made to Albimar Communications, a company partially owned by Brown and James Kelly, husband of former Washington, DC mayor Sharon Pratt-Kelly. The loan was made to Albimar to buy WKYS-FM, which is being sold to Cathy Hughes' Radio One for about \$8.5 million less than Albimar paid for it. According to an NBC spokeswoman, the company decided to forgive the debt because the loan was long overdue and the network's lawyers felt the chances of collecting it were slim. The Washington Post said it could not determine from public records how NBC's forgiveness of the debt would affect Brown or the others personally.

ELSEWHERE

By the time you read this, Arbitron will have reissued another fall book. The ratings firm has announced that six of the diaries in the Anchorage survey came from two households which "may have been influenced by media-affiliated individuals." The new report was due out on March 3.

The National Religious Broadcasters Music License Committee has filed a motion in ASCAP Rate Court seeking a "reasonable" per program license for "religious, classical, and other specialty formatted ... stations that make limited use of copyrighted music." The NRBMLC, led by Salem Communications' Edward Atsinger, claims that the per program license is "priced to be more expensive than ASCAP's blanket license..." ASCAP will file its answer on March 20. The NRBMLC will reply within 10 days. This issue initially went to ASCAP rate court in July 1988!

The Chicago-based Museum of Broadcast Communications has announced the 1995 Radio Hall of Fame nominees. Tapped in the pioneer category are Stan Freberg, Wolfman Jack, and the late Bing Crosby, Eddie Cantor, and William Conrad (cited here as the voice of Matt Dillon on the radio version of "Gunsmoke.") Nominated as contemporary network/syndicated personalities are ABC/KIIS Los Angeles' personality Rick Dees, CBS' Jack Buck, NPR's Susan Stamberg, WCLV Cleveland's Karl Haas, and WWL's Bruce Williams. Nominated as regional/local personalities are WTMJ Milwaukee's Gordon Hinkley, KGO San Francisco's Jim Dunbar, WRKO Boston's Jerry Williams, WTIC Hartford's Bob Steele, and the late CKLW Detroit newsman Byron MacGregor. Stamberg, incidentally, will also be one of the hosts of the nationally broadcast Hall of Fame ceremony, which will take place at the Hyatt Regency/Chicago on Oct. 29. (The others are Tom Snyder and Tom Joyner.) For more info, call (312) 629-6000.

Heritage Media's classic rock KCFX, Harrisonville, MO (Kansas City) will get an FM sister as the company announced it will buy Capital Broadcasting's country KK CJ, Liberty, MO. Terms weren't disclosed, but Heritage bought the purchase option from KK CJ's LMA partner Sconnix Broadcasting, which owns country KFKF-FM, Kansas City, MO. The purchase will give Heritage duopolies in five of the seven markets it's in.

Silent Syracuse, NY combo WSCP, Sandy Creek & WSCP-FM, Pulaski, NY have been purchased out of bankruptcy by James Cronk and Richard Stevens' Tri-County Broadcasting for \$170,000. Ray Rosenblum was the broker on the transaction.

Premiere Radio Networks has announced its "entry into worldwide program distribution." Premiere is now providing five programs to VOA Europe: the country shows "Boot Scootin' Saturday Night" and "Country Plain Wrap Countdown" and the oldies shows, "Reflection," "Classic Call," and "Live From The Sixties." Interestingly, those last three shows are no longer in production in the U.S. The VOA is picking up "vintage" episodes. In other Premiere news, E! Entertainment Television gossip host Tonya Hart will host a 2-1/2 minute daily short-form feature called "On Ya With Tonya." And Premiere VP/affiliate marketing Ed Mann adds Senior VP stripes.

In other VOA news, the network has launched its first ever religious-themed broadcast. "Perspectives" was launched on VOA's English-language service on February 17 and concerns "religion, spirituality, ethics and values in contemporary global society." In several published reports following the program's announcement, a VOA spokesperson has claimed that the program has been in the planning stages since last summer and is not the result of the Republican legislative sweep last November.

VirteX Communications, the recently-formed outfit that is the new home of former Gannett honcho Paul Donahue, has announced the acquisition of the digital audio firm CCS Corp. CCS provides digital technology and software to broadcasters including ABC, CBS, and the BBC. CCS founder Dr. Larry Hinderks is named Chief Technology Officer of VirteX. His partner, Tom Chase, will become "Senior Software Scientist" for VirteX.

M Street sends condolences to the family and friends of Ellen Sulzberger Straus, who, with her husband R. Peter Straus, was best known to radio people as the co-owner of New York's legendary WMCA. Straus, who also managed the station in the late '70s, at a time when female GMs were less common, is also known for creating the "WMCA Call For Action" help line, a program which spawned scores of imitators and eventually became the model for a national Call For Action program. She died February 24th of cancer at age 69.

IS IT NOW THE "S" NETWORK? Time's up for Time Warner in the SW Networks partnership. In a story in the Wall Street Journal, rumors were flying that Time Warner was pulling out of the fledgling radio venture. Finally, SW announced in a press release that it has purchased all of Time Warner's equity in the project. SW's President, Susan Solomon, suggests the exit of Time Warner will only help Sony move more strategically. SW currently has one full-time format and several short-form programs on the air and plans to launch one more before the end of the year.

A NEW LMA FOR L.A. Jazz twins KACD, Santa Monica, and KBCD, Newport Beach, CA (Los Angeles), have a new manager as APEX Radio Consultants, a partnership of programmer Rob Edwards and consultant Bob Darling, take over the combo for Kelsho Communications. The two stations were in an sales agreement with Bonneville's KBIG. The LMA began March 1.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The Commission has affirmed the Mass Media Bureau's grant of an application to assign the license of WZPT, New Kensington, PA (Pittsburgh) from Pittsburgh Partners, L.P., to EZ Pittsburgh, Inc., and denied the application for review filed by Allegheny Communications Group, Inc.

Denying review, the Commission found that Allegheny lacked standing to petition to deny the assignment application. Though Allegheny claimed to have standing based on its status as a competing applicant for 93.7 MHz in Pittsburgh, Commission precedent makes clear that "mere status as an applicant in one proceeding is insufficient to confer standing as a party in interest in a different proceeding."

The FCC has granted the application for involuntary assignment of license of KLHI-FM, Lahaina, HI, from Pacific Isle Broadcasting, Inc., to Howard R. Green, receiver, and the application for voluntary assignment of the license of KLHI-FM from Howard R. Green, receiver, to Lahaina Broadcasting Co., Ltd. In taking the action, the Commission denied the application for review and informal objections filed by Dale Parsons, Jr., and a request for emergency consideration filed by Howard R. Green. It also denied the receiver's request for special temporary authority to operate with the existing facilities of KLHI-FM despite certain technical deficiencies and dismissed as moot a request by Parsons for issuance of a cease and desist order and imposition of a monetary forfeiture against the receiver. The Commission also ordered the receiver to bring the station into full compliance with the FCC's technical rules within 30 days.

Green was appointed by a bankruptcy court which ruled that a prior assignment of the station's license from Pacific Isle to Parsons was an impermissible, avoidable, post-petition transfer pursuant to Section 549 of the U.S. Bankruptcy Code. The court also ruled that Pacific Isle was the "alter-ego" of the debtor-in-bankruptcy. The Commission found that the application for review, the petition to deny, and the informal objections were without merit and that there were no substantial and material questions of fact warranting further inquiry. The Commission stated that Lahaina Broadcasting's qualifications have not been challenged. Further, the Commission found Green and Lahaina Broadcasting are qualified to be Commission licensees and that the grant of the two assignment applications were in the public interest.

The FCC has denied WWMY-FM Broadcasting, Inc.'s petition for reconsideration of the Commission's action denying its application for review of the grant of the application for a construction permit to modify the facilities of WWGL, Lexington, NC. WWMY-FM Broadcasting is the licensee of WNEU, Eden, NC. The Commission indicated that WWMY's pleadings repeated contentions made earlier and subsequently rejected, and therefore warrant no further consideration.

KWTR, Georgetown, TX has been granted a license to operate as a non-commercial station. KLVS, Kingsburg, CA has requested to operate as non-commercial.

ELSEWHERE

SFX Broadcasting has announced it will purchase sports outlet KTCK, Dallas, TX, from Cardinal Communications Partners, L.P, for \$8 million. The purchase will give SFX an AM duopoly in the Metroplex with news-talker KRLD. Spence Kendrick, president of Cardinal, will join SFX to run a newly created division called SFX Sports. He'll be responsible for developing sports programming for SFX's Dallas-based Texas State Network and the other SFX stations. The LMA starts immediately.

Paxson Communications is buying Tri-Talk Radio's talk AM WFTL, Ft. Lauderdale for \$2 million. Paxson has three other stations in the Miami-Ft. Lauderdale area--news-talker WINZ, Miami, and rocker WZTA and jazz WLVE, both Miami Beach. The Miami Herald reports Paxson plans to simulcast the two AM's so as to get better coverage into Broward and Palm Beach counties with its broadcast of Miami Heat basketball games.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

Northeastern Back Bay Broadcasters, which operates stations in the Boston and Providence areas, is picking up WICE, Pawtucket (Providence) from TransNet Stations for an undisclosed amount. Back Bay owns business-formatted WBNW, Boston and plans to scrap WICE's sports and talk format for all-business soon. Bloomberg Business News makes up a majority of the programming on the two stations.

Group W's blowtorch WMAQ, Chicago, will welcome new sisters soon as the company announced it will purchase Diamond Broadcasting's sports WSCR and progressive rock WXRT, both Chicago, for a whopping \$60 million. No word on what will happen to Diamond's one remaining station in the Windy City--ethnic AM WSBC. Other than Boston, Chicago is the only top ten market where Westinghouse had no FM. Rumor has it that Group W is looking to fill that hole in Boston soon.

Ragan Henry's US Radio will double up in Little Rock by purchasing stand-alone FM's from two separate sellers. Galaxy Broadcasting will sell US its country outlet KDDK, Jacksonville, AR, while Magic Broadcasting will give up rocker KMJX, Conway, AR. Prices weren't disclosed. KMJX currently controls an LMA with oldies KOLL, Maumelle, AR. No word on what will happen to that arrangement.

NewCity Communications is buying its LMA partner country WCFB, Daytona Beach for \$6 million from Root Communications. The purchase will give NewCity four stations in the Orlando market with news-talker WDBO, country WWKA, and preteen LMA partner WOMX (AM), all Orlando.

The National Religious Broadcasters Music License Committee filed a motion in the ASCAP rate court seeking a "reasonable" per program license on behalf of 380 religious, classical, and other specialty-formatted radio stations that make limited use of copyrighted music. The motion is based upon recent court rulings rejecting ASCAP's proposed television per program license, which was based on its radio licenses. The NRBMLC is arguing that ASCAP's current license is priced to be more expensive than ASCAP's blanket license for stations that use ASCAP music most of the time.

The Country Radio Broadcasters' Country Radio Seminar wrapped up March 4 with a final tally of 2,120 registrants and a record 480 stations participating in the Artist Radio Tape Sessions. This year's show was not without controversy after record company MCA/Nashville literally crashed the opening reception. MCA had a full marching band meet the RCA party boat at the dock of the Wildhorse Saloon, which was shuttling attendees from the Opryland Hotel. CRB Board members were so upset they yanked an MCA/Nashville VP from the panel of one of the sessions. Winners of the Radio Humanitarian Awards were WQCB, Brewer (Bangor), ME (small market), WKHK, Colonial Heights, VA (Richmond) (medium market), and KMPS, Seattle (large market). WSM's Charlie Douglas was inducted into the DJ Hall of Fame, as was the late Slim Willett of Abilene's KCAT.

One politico in, one politico out as Tribune Radio Network announced Ross Perot will leave his syndicated radio show because he just doesn't have time for it any more. His last show will be June 9th. On the other hand, Ollie North will get his own show to be syndicated by Salem Radio Networks. The show will be based at WWRC, Washington, DC.

Even the RAB, which reports the numbers, was impressed by the improvement in January's radio revenues compared to a year ago. National spot dollars rocketed 38%. Local ad revenue grew 11%, which wasn't exactly shabby either, considering that the January, 1994 increase itself was substantial. The combined overall growth rate was 15%. The East and the West led the increases in local radio, while the Southwest was up a whopping 49% in the national revenue figures.

Blues-ologist and original "Blues Brother" Dan Aykroyd, AKA Elwood Blues, will extend his "House of Blues Radio Hour" to Canada. The Sound Source Radio Network, with an exclusive agreement with CBS Radio Programs, will distribute the programs nationally. The series will feature traditional blues and contemporary blues and rock artists. Mix 99.9 in Toronto will flagship the broadcasts beginning March 26 at 11A on Sundays and repeat at 8P. AC has been in second place behind country since we began tracking station totals in 1989. News/Talk has grown from 308 stations in 1989 while AC has dropped from 2,058. AM stations going talk and country music, replacing AC as the middle-American music, can be credited for the trends.

PAT SIGNS OFF... Westwood One will lose talk show host Pat Buchanan April 21. Buchanan is eying the White House, so he's dropping the show to focus on the campaign. The last show for Pat will be April 21. We estimate about 140 affiliates carried the daily 3 hour show.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

Three new appointments at the Commission: Wayne McKee has been named Legal Adviser to Beverly Baker, Chief of the Compliance and Information Bureau. Harvey Lee has been appointed to the post of Deputy Director of the Office of Workplace Diversity. Jennifer Warren has been named Senior Legal Adviser to Scott Blake Harris, Chief of the International Bureau.

If you're looking for new call letters, you'd better find them soon. On March 27, pursuant to a Report & Order issued late last year, low power television stations are now eligible to apply for four letter call signs, rather than the five character alpha-numeric signs. Their processing the requests for new call signs in phases so they don't have to handle everyone at once. Therefore, those stations licensed in 1989 or earlier are eligible to apply on March 27.

ELSEWHERE

In the Morgantown, WV market, Cat Radio is buying easy listening WMMN-FM, Barrackville from Fantasia Broadcasting for \$200,000. Cat also owns country combo WBUC-AM & FM, Buckhannon, and WAFD, a CP in Webster Springs. WMMN-FM had been in an LMA with oldies WTCS, and classic rock WRLF, both Fairmont. Fantasia will keep news-talker WMMN, Fairmont. Fantasia has a contract to buy CHR WFGM, Fairmont, from the Dailey Corp. Broker on the deal was Ray Rosenblum. WMMN-FM becomes WVUC and now simulcasts WBUC-FM in an immediate LMA.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

Las Vegas-based Sports Radio Network announced it will buy headline news outlet KMTW, Las Vegas from Max Radio after Max buys KMTW and its sister station, rocker KKLZ, from Southern Nevada Radio, Inc. Terms were not disclosed.

Chancellor Communications and SFX Broadcasting's quiet discussions about a merger are getting louder and louder after talks that started back in January fell apart recently. The talks had Chancellor offering SFX \$26.00 in cash per share for all of SFX's common stock--a deal worth about \$160 million. When SFX didn't move fast enough for Chancellor's Chairman Steven Dinetz, he fired off a letter proposing a merger that would offer cash and Chancellor stock, as well as a chairmanship for SFX's President Steve Hicks. Robert F.X. Sillerman would also sit on the board of the new company. SFX's board rejected the proposal, stating that "the best way to maximize long-term shareholder value is to remain an independent public company with the present management team."

Katz Media Group has filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission for an initial public offering of nearly \$100 million. The offering of 5.5 million shares of common stock at an estimated \$16 to \$18 per share replaces the previously announced proposed debt offering by Katz Capital Corp. \$75.8 million of the proceeds will be used to repay a portion of the financing of the acquisition of Katz Media by DLJ Merchant Banking Partners last year.

After noticing the format was no longer reported in the music trades, Major Networks has confirmed it has dropped its "Rhythm of the 90's" format. The web had only one affiliate for the dance-CHR format--WCIL-FM, Carbondale, which has since gone to 70's oldies.

Clear Channel is spending \$75 million to buy half of the newly created Australian Radio Network from Australian Provincial Newspapers Holdings Limited. The transaction has to be approved by the Australian Foreign Investments Review Board. The Network owns nine stations and Australia's largest radio rep firm.

NPR remains hopeful it can restore the 30% cuts in public broadcasting's funding. This week, the House of Representatives voted to cut funding by 15% in FY 1996 and 30% in FY 1997. NPR will be talking with Senate decision-makers this week in hopes of heading off the cuts.

ASCAP's members are fighting back against what they term the "deceptively-named" Fairness in Music Licensing Act of 1995, which would allow stores, restaurants and bars to air music without paying the licensing fees. They've asked the National Restaurant Association and other groups to sit at the bargaining table to work things out, but claim no one has taken them up on the offer.

The NAB's take on performance rights legislation supports a "solid broadcaster exemption" because of the "hundreds of millions of dollars in free promotion for artists and record companies."

After 55 years, the Southern California Gas Company has pulled its underwriting from the Evening Concert Series on classical KKGO-FM in Los Angeles. In the really-stupid-reasons-not-to-advertise department, the Los Angeles Sun Daily News quotes a gas company press release, "We are no longer in a monopoly and are responding to new competition in most of our business segments." The station will continue to air the weekday evening program with new advertisers.

Country continues to lead the pack among radio formats, according to studies from both Interep and Katz. The Interep study cites Simmons research showing that country's average daily cume of nearly 30 million adults 18+ far surpasses that of news-talk, the second most listened-to format, which is just under 18 million. However, the Katz study indicates the average market share for country has flattened out. Adult contemporary is third with 17.5 million. In addition, Interep (using M Street data) shows 2,642 stations featuring country music in 1994, 30 more than in 1993.

The Katz study shows the surge in LMA/duopoly arrangements has led more operators to introduce additional FM country stations, especially in markets which traditionally had only one or two competitors. Katz's study shows alternative/modern rock and 70's oldies formats with sizable growth for the Fall Arbitron book.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

The Washington Redskins games will be heard on a new station in Washington soon as Infinity's WJFK signs a new three-year contract with the team. According to the Washington Post, the team was looking for a deal in the \$3.5 to \$4 million range. Infinity's Baltimore station, WLIF, will also carry the games. The rights to the Redskins broadcasts marks Infinity's seventh NFL franchise.

TM Century has tapped Neil Sargent to take over as President of the company. Sargent comes from Westwood One as Director of Affiliate Sales. Sargent is the second exec. to leave Westwood One in as many weeks.

Backstage Productions and Jim Owens & Associates are teaming up to produce "Today in Country Music," a daily country music news update hosted by former "Video PM" and "Nashville Now" staff announcer Gary Beaty. The two-and-a-half minute feature service will launch in 30-60 days. For more info, call (800) 833-1334.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The Commission has denied Fayette Broadcasting Corp. review of its proposed substitution of channel 285 C2 (105.9 MHz) for channel 285 A and reallocation of the channel to Rollingwood, TX. Fayette is the licensee of KBUK, La Grange, TX. Fayette argued that the FCC staff erroneously downplayed the resulting net service gain from the proposed reallocation. Denying the review, the Commission stated that Fayette's proposal to remove service to La Grange to a community within the "Austin Urbanized Area" was not in the public interest.

KLVN, Chowchilla, CA, has applied to change the station to non-commercial status.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)

The FCC has imposed a partial freeze on the processing of mutually-exclusive non-commercial educational (NCE) broadcast applications until it adopts new or revised NCE comparative criteria. The freeze comes after the Commission asked for comments on the NCE comparative process in GC Docket 92-52, the docket that asked for comment on reforming criteria for mutually-exclusive applications for all new broadcast stations. The Commission received only two specific proposals, which were "widely divergent."

The Commission claims the current standard for comparison is "vague and difficult to apply" and concluded it should be eliminated. The freeze will last until the Commission resolves the comparative issues, so it has opened a new public comment window which opened March 17 and will close Apr. 17. Reply comments are due May 1.

The FCC has upheld a decision by the Review Board regarding the proceeding for a new FM station on 106.9 MHz at Round Rock, TX. By upholding the Board's decision, the Commission leaves undisturbed the Administrative Law Judge's refusal to issue a partial initial decision on non-comparative issues while the comparative freeze remains in effect. In taking this action, the Commission denied the motion for leave to file and dismissed the application for review filed by August Communications Group, Inc., a competing applicant in the proceeding. In 1992, a hearing was conducted regarding basic qualification issues of the two applicants. In deference to the freeze, the ALJ refrained from issuing an initial decision. In June 1994, August Communications asked the ALJ to issue a partial initial decision on the non-comparative issues. The ALJ held that such action would be contrary to the freeze. August appealed to the Review Board, which held that August failed to make a showing that would warrant consideration of the appeal, and dismissed it.

The Commission has reduced a fine from \$10,000 to \$2,500 against WREM, Monticello, ME. The fine was levied for unauthorized transfer of control. The tiny AM daytimer is operating in the red and serves a very small market, which helped the Commission to determine the station had an "inherently low value."

The FCC cracked down on a TV station in Lake Dallas, TX, for willful and repeated violations of the main studio, public inspection file, and filing rules. The station, KLDT, Lake Dallas, had a studio completely unattended, and the public inspection file was missing several items, according to a Commission release. The station also failed to file with the Commission an agreement regarding the ownership of the station. The violations cost the station \$15,500.

The Commission has named Charles Iseman to Chief of the Office of Engineering and Technology's Spectrum Policy Branch. Previously, Iseman was a supervisory attorney with the Mass Media Bureau's FM Branch.

The NAB has announced the results of the run-off elections for the Radio Board of Directors. From District 11 (Ohio), Walter Stampfli of WNCO (AM) and FM, Ashland, OH, won. In the District 21 run-off (Minnesota, North and South Dakota), Steve Linder of KWLM/KQIC, Willmar, MN, was elected.

ELSEWHERE

Spanish Broadcaster Heftel Broadcasting Corp. is picking up a top five market station by purchasing WOPA, Chicago from CID Broadcasting. The price wasn't disclosed. The purchase marks the company's fifth top ten market.

Business news KSBN, Spokane has been sold to The Citizens' Committee For The Right To Keep And Bear Arms and The Second Amendment Foundation for \$150,000. T.C.C. broadcasting has owned the station since 1990. The Foundation also owns business news KBNP, Portland. Jerry Dennon of Montcalm was the exclusive broker on the transaction.

Just how much will Congressional funding cuts hurt NPR? Here are the numbers: In FY 1996, \$47 million of the \$312 million appropriated for the Corporation for Public Broadcasting goes away. Of that \$47 million, radio will lose \$10 million, cutting its funding from \$70 million down to \$60 million. In FY 1997, CPB loses \$94 million of the \$315 million appropriated. Radio's loss is \$21 million, cutting its funding from \$71 million down to \$50 million.

Boston-based Superadio is getting into the morning show syndication business by launching Pyramid-owned WXKS a.m. host Matty Siegel. The show will debut on dance CHR WWKX, Woonsocket, RI (Providence), AC WKZS, Auburn, ME (Portland), and CHR WEDJ, Charlotte. The show will allow local affiliates to program all the music for the show as well insert traffic, spots, etc.

Capital Cities/ABC, Inc's WABC, New York, is thinking it was victimized by the old hidden ball(game) trick after shelling out \$10 million for broadcast rights to the New York Yankees baseball games. So, it's suing the franchise for the \$10 million, claiming it is paying for genuine major league players, not "sham competitions" by the replacement players. According to the New York Times, crosstown WFAN has dropped several Mets games it was supposed to broadcast. WABC will continue to air Yankee games.

After a very public battle over an offer by Chancellor Holdings Corp. to buy SFX Broadcasting, an investor in SFX is attempting to file a class-action suit against the company claiming it hurt shareholders by refusing to entertain the offer. According to the Dallas Morning News, the lawsuit was filed last week in Wilmington, DE, by Ari Parnes, who is asking the court to force SFX to "maximize shareholder value" and seeks class-action status. SFX rejected an offer of \$26 per share from Chancellor, saying the company is not for sale.

Interep singles out singles in a study of marketing opportunities and radio's effectiveness in reaching them. The study points out that singles currently represent 41% of all adults, which will grow to 50% by the year 2005. The top three radio formats reaching singles are urban, AOR, and CHR/Rock, according to the study. The study goes on to say that singles are usually the chief decision makers for all household and personal purchases.

The Radio Advertising Bureau took in 983 entries for the RAB Mercury Awards, the \$200,000 competition for the year's best radio spots. The grand prize for the year's top spot is \$100,000. Judging is currently underway. Finalists will be featured on the "Radio Mercury Awards Top 40 of 1994" CD with the best to be awarded cash prizes on the evening of June 14 during a black tie ceremony hosted by Dick Clark in New York.

It's official. The New Jersey rest area dedicated to Howard Stern during NJ Governor Christie Whitman's campaign last year finally got the plaque naming it the "Howard Stern Rest Stop." The plaque was placed on the side of the restrooms at the Springfield Township rest stop with no fanfare as the governor was vacationing in Florida. Stern was promised the plaque after endorsing Whitman during the campaign.

A FROG GOES UP THE RIVER. River City Broadcasting, which has been buying up radio stations on a regular basis over the past year, is jumping in with both feet by buying Keymarket Communications' WOGY-FM, Memphis "Froggy 94", and the rest of the stations in Keymarket's group. The purchase price is expected to be in the \$125-\$150 million range. River City has been big in TV for a long time, currently holding nine stations. Keymarket's senior management will stay in place, and the company will operate as a separate division of River City. The combined value of the companies is approximately \$900 million. The two will own 4 VHF TV's, 5 UHF TV's, 14 FM's and 10 AM's.

NORM!!! Norm Feuer's Force II Communications is buying five stations from Terry Robinson's Pourtales Holdings in Kansas and Nebraska and is assuming a purchase agreement on a sixth station. Force II is picking up talker KFH, news-talk-sports outlet KQAM, and AC KXLK, all Wichita, and rocker KTGL, Beatrice, NE and country KZKX, Seward, NE, (both covering the Lincoln market) for \$12 million. The contract Feuer is assuming is for the purchase of KRBB, Wichita for \$3.3 million from Marathon Broadcasting. At a later date, Feuer has agreed to buy all of the other stations Pourtales holds for \$28.5 million, except for oldies KEYN-FM, Wichita, which Robinson will retain.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The Commission has reopened a proceeding for a new FM on 104.9 MHz in Lompoc, CA, to determine if Lompoc Minority Broadcasters Partnership made a material misrepresentation or lacked candor when it certified in its application that it had reasonable assurance that its proposed transmitter site was available and that funds would be available to construct and operate the station. The FCC also dismissed the application of Lion's Share Broadcasting.

Lion's Share and LMBP were mutually exclusive applicants for the Lompoc facility. LMBP sought review of the Hearing Designation Order which accepted Lion's Share's application and of the Review Board decision, which granted Lion's Share's application on comparative grounds.

The Commission found that Lion's Share's application was unacceptable for filing under the FCC's "hard look" processing guidelines and thus should not be designated for hearing.

Effective April 3, renewal applications for commercial or non-commercial AM, FM, TV, Translator, or LPTV broadcast stations must be submitted on the newly-revised FCC Form 303-S. The old 303-S and Form 348 for renewal of LPTV stations and FM and TV translators have been superseded and may not be submitted after March 31, 1995. The new forms are available by leaving a request on the FCC's answering machine at (800) 418-3676. To simplify the transition, the FCC will mail instruction booklets to licensees about seven months before station license expiration dates.

Mid-West Family Stations has petitioned the FCC to block the sale of Tak Communications' WKOW-TV, Madison, WI to Shockley Communications. Shockley is seeking a waiver to operate the television station along with its oldies outlet, WOLX-FM, Baraboo, WI. Shockley also has a 25% interest in 70's-oldies station WMXF, Sauk City, WI. Both FM's and the TV station cover the Madison market, which would require the FCC to grant a waiver in order for the sale to go through. Shockley is arguing the waiver should be granted partially because Tak is in bankruptcy proceedings.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)

The NAB has asked the FCC to rethink its fine and forfeiture schedule by asking the Commission to include a 50 percent reduction for most fines imposed for what the NAB calls "lesser offenses... (those that do not involve threats to safety, evasion [of] the FCC's regulatory process or serious interference)." In July, 1994, a federal appeals court threw out the FCC's fine schedule because it set the fines without first asking for public comment.

The NAB went on to ask, "For the detection of these often trivial violations, the Commission and its staff should issue a warning and an explanation on how the station can achieve compliance." The NAB was quick to point out that it believes serious violations, like failure to properly light or mark a tower or to operate without an FCC license, should be vigorously enforced.

ELSEWHERE

Henry Broadcasting is doubling up in Omaha by buying classic rocker KNBQ, Nebraska City from a subsidiary of Sunrise Broadcasting for \$3.5 million. Henry already owns 50,000 watt blowtorch news-talk KFAB and gold-based AC KGOR. Sunrise will keep KISP, Blair, NE, which is currently off the air.

Hall Communications is buying again, making two duopolies in as many weeks. According to Radio Business Report, Hall is buying alternative WEXP-FM, Plattsburgh, NY, for \$1.1 million from UBC, Inc. Hall already owns country WOKO and adult standards WJOY, Burlington, VT.

Radio Business Report is reporting that Joplin, MO competitors William Neal and Big Mack Broadcasting are swapping stations to create two new duopolies in that market. Big Mack will buy Neal's hot AC KSYN in exchange for \$1 million and its AM, country WMBH. The deal will give Big Mack two FM's--KSYN and country KJKT. Neal will own news-talker KQYX and WMBH.

Pyramid Communications is starting to nose around the financial community for interest on a possible initial public offering. They've retained Goldman, Sachs & Co. as their financial advisor to "assist the company in exploring strategic alternatives to enhance shareholder value."

Westwood is vacating its two syndicated urban formats. "Sister To Sister" was discontinued about six weeks ago, while "Countdown with Walt Love" will phase out once a new syndicator has been found.

The RAB reports that local and national spot radio revenue in February continued to increase dramatically, combining for a 15% jump over the same month a year ago. Local revenue rose 14%, and while national spot's unbelievable 38% boost in January couldn't be sustained, the 19% increase was very respectable.

Double-digit regional increases were the rule in both local and national spot. The Southwest led the local markets with a 16% gain, a tad ahead of the Southeast at 15%. The East, which slightly trailed the other regions in local revenue hikes, tied for the top with the West with a 23% jump in national spot.

Many NPR stations have been offered a special arrangement with Bloomberg Business News to broadcast four to six :30-:45 business reports twice daily, immediately following the end of the 5:01 AM ET and 12:01 PM ET newscasts. The offer is "special" because the cost to NPR News subscribing stations is ZERO. (The service is also available to the NPR Cultural stations with a charge.)

NPR News has been working with Bloomberg to enhance their business coverage. The new reports are specially prepared by Bloomberg editors for use on NPR member stations. Under the agreement, Bloomberg provides its news service to NPR, including spot news from its reporters, and access to their on-line information and research service. In turn, NPR feeds selected pieces from MORNING EDITION to digital audio-on-demand users of Bloomberg's 40,000 terminals, more than 10,000 of which are outside the US.
