Nose bite 'attack' ends in hail of shots from AK-47

A MEMBER of the Namibia Defence Force who shot and killed a fellow soldier with an AK-47 after the man allegedly bit him on the nose was on Friday sentenced to an effective 15 years in jail.

Sacky Ipinge (43) originally pleaded guilty to the charge of shooting and killing Thomas Sakeus at the Nepara base in Kavango on June 7 last year. However, when his statement was read out in court Ipinge could not agree with a section which stated that he knew that he could kill Sakeus when he started firing shots.

The court then entered a plea of not guilty.

According to Ipinge, they were at a cuca shop when Sakeus allegedly "started making trouble and bit me on the nose".

He went to the military sick bay to receive treatment. Sakeus followed him and confronted him when he left again.

Sizzling strike stopped

THE Namibia Wholesale and Retail Worker's Union (NAWRWU) managed to avert a strike at Kentucky Fried Chicken in Windhoek at the end of last week when the management agreed to backdate wage increases to July.

According to NAWRU President Aloysius Yon, management had confirmed that the increases would be paid in time to prevent the entire

workforce from going on strike.

"They are already paying the outstanding increases for the month of August and we felt we could now give them some time to settle the amounts outstanding for July," Yon told The Namibian. The confrontation between the union and Kentucky Fried Chicken was caused by delays in implementing a 19 per cent increase for the workers which had been agreed to in July. Yon also said the union was negotiating possible new wage agree-

Savimbi's 'peace offer' dismissed

LISBON: Angolan General Higinio Carneiro said over the weekend that an announcement by Unita leader Jonas Savimbi on plans to propose a ceasefire for the war-torn country was a ploy.

Carneiro, the Angolan military government's negotiator in the last peace talks in Abidjan, said in an interview with the private Lisbon radio TSF: "It's an attempt to try to prevent the next meeting of the (UN) Security Council" scheduled for September 15, which could act against Unita.

He added that the proposal did not mean that Savimbi's National Union for the Total Independence of Angola was willing to hold new talks.

The Portuguese presidency announced on Friday that Savimbi had said he was planning to propose a ceasefire in Angola for which the United Nations could set the date.

Savimbi said in a telephone call with Portuguese President Mario Soares that he would put the proposal to UN Secretary General Boutros Boutros-Ghali Friday, the president said in a statement Friday.

Savimbi also told Soares that Unita would

supervise the security and repatriation of some 50 Portuguese nationals trapped in Kuito, the main city in the Angolan province of Bie which has been under Unita siege for eight months.

Carneiro added that the government would only undertake new talks if both sides agreed to respect the terms of a peace treaty signed in Portugal in 1991 as well as the result of legislative elections in September 1992 and the Security Council resolutions.

Meanwhile armed forces spokesman Brigadier General Jose Manuel "Jota" said over

the weekend that government forces retook the town of Cuvelai in southern Cunene province early last week.

The Angolan Military High Command has also announced that Unita killed the commander of government troops in Kuito on Thursday, only hours after he was promoted to General. General Alfredo Kussumua was killed by grandes thrown by troops belonging to Unita.

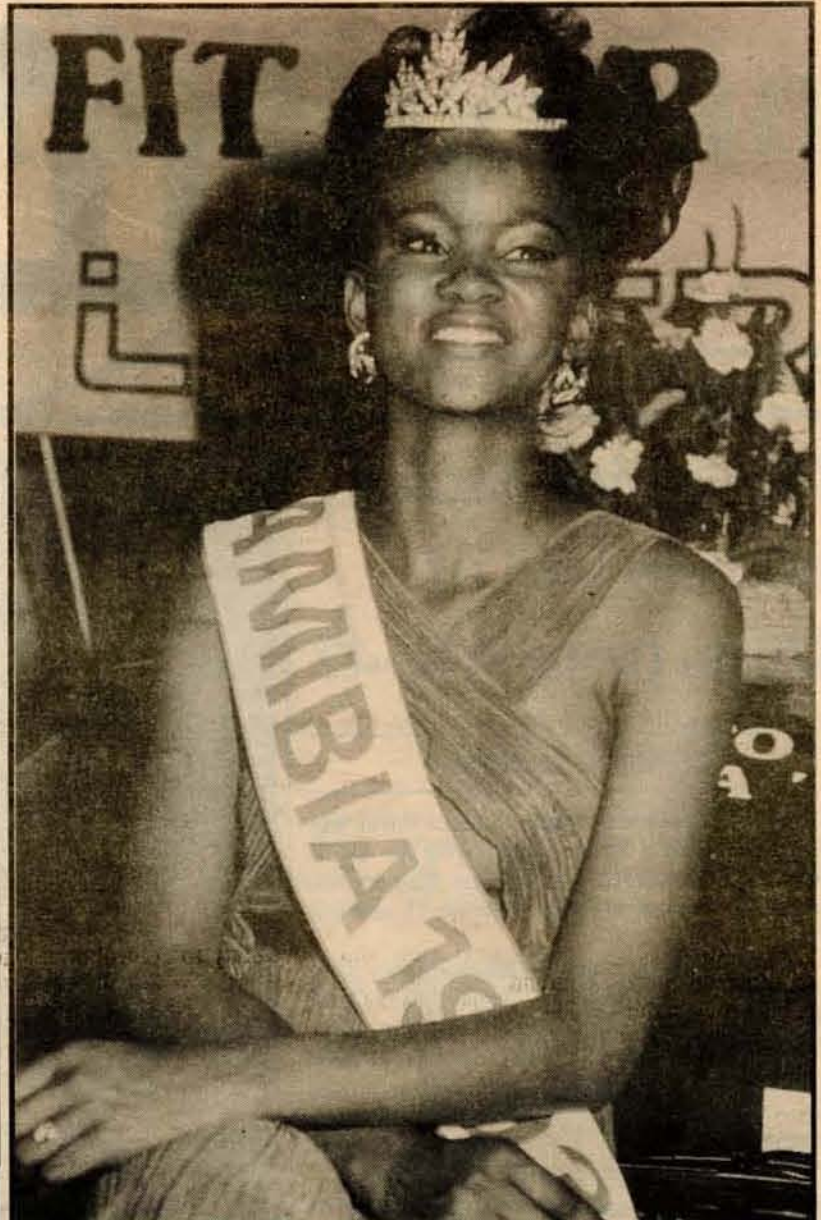
Namibian wins American/Swiss competition

Sakeus allegedly said: "I will show you who I am," before brandishing a knobkierie at him. Ipinge then went to fetch his AK-47 rifle and fired several shots at Sakeus "to scare him away". As Sakeus fled, he was hit all over the body.

who had 17 years experience with weapons, he did not think the weapon was set on automatic. "I was thinking that I was aiming low and using single shots but after a few shots I realised it was on automatic.

I then decided to continue as it was already done," Ipinge told the court.

Before he was con-

victed of murder, Judge Johan Strydom told Ipinge that everything appeared to point to the fact that he had deliberately aimed at Sakeus. "If you had intended to scare him away then surely the shots should have been fired in the air," the Judge added.

Ipinge was sentenced to an effective 15 years in prison.

Court reserves judgement in key Skeleton Coast hearing

JUDGEMENT in the highly publicised Skeleton Coast tender case was postponed on Friday. In a key court bid, Namibian company Skeleton Coast Safaris is challenging a controversial Tender Board decision to award exclusive tourism rights for the park to German company Olympia Reisen.

Arguments were heard in the High Court by Judges Theo Frank and Nic Hannah who on Friday indicated that they would need some time to consider the evidence before them.

Skeleton Coast Safaris, instrumental in opening up the unique area to visitors from around the world more than a decade ago, urged the court to set aside or review the Tender Board's decision.

The Namibian company argued that Olym-

pia Reisen had no extensive knowledge of the ecologically fragile wilderness area, one of the stipulations of the tender.

Further, they questioned the right of the Tender Board to make the decision, which ironically had been opposed by the Ministry of Wildlife, Conservation and Tourism.

Skeleton Coast Safaris argued that the Board had acted outside of its right in a matter that should

have been decided by the Cabinet.

They further submitted that the information presented in Olympia Reisen's tender and associated documentation was materially misleading.

"It is a proposal made to a lay board, and the question in each instance, must... be how that board would reasonably understand the information put to it. The proposal is not to be read as if (it was) some statutory provision," Skeleton Coast Safaris said.

"If this Honourable Court holds that Namibia Tender Board is the correct body to control access to and activities within a national park, and to do so moreover in terms of the Tender Board regulations, and the

aforegoing attacks on the way it exercised its powers are not sustained, then it is contended further and in any event, that the Board failed duly to apply its mind and act reasonably, and in particular to act in accordance with the tenets of the statute in the decision-making evidenced in its own document act," they concluded.

In response, Olympia Reisen asked the High Court to dismiss the appeal, arguing that the Namibian company had no right to take the matter to court and that the tender award had been legal. The German company also submitted that what it described as the "entire unwarranted attack" upon their director and attorney is "deserving of the strictest cen-

sure, and that costs should be awarded against the applicant".

The court challenge was fought against a background of widespread concern, both in Namibia and internationally, over the future of the ecologically fragile park, one of the last wilderness areas in the world. It has also been marked by personal tragedy. Skeleton Coast Safari's Louw Schoeman, who opened up the area and pioneered eco-tourism there, unexpectedly died from a heart attack not long after the Tender Board decision.

NDAWU moves to empower Namibia's domestic workers

THE Namibian Domestic Workers Union (NDAWU) has vowed to fight apathy among domestic workers by launching an intensive educational campaign country wide aimed at empowering some of the most exploited workers in Namibia.

At a special congress held in Katutura over the weekend, NDAWU went ahead with elections of office bearers although a quorum of 40-80 voters was not present as stipulated in their constitution.

Sara Nambahu was re-elected as general secretary, Hileni Ilonga as chairperson and Naomi Elia as national secretary.

The congress also elected Selma Ndjendjera as deputy chairperson, Festus Wanailonga as treasurer and Constancia Engelbrecht as deputy treasurer.

The first congress held in June this year also failed to hold elections because of the low turn-out of members. Nambahu attributed this apathy to "a lack of understanding of trade union issues" by the members.

In order to alleviate the problem, the congress resolved to launch intensive educational campaigns countrywide to empower domestic workers.

The meeting noted that circulation of relevant information was lacking amongst Namibian domestic workers, and stressed that the workers should keep abreast of changes which affected their lives.

By their absence from the union's meetings and classes, domestic workers became their own worst enemy.

The congress noted that most of the employees took advantage of workers lack of knowledge by employing casual workers on a long term basis in order to avoid benefits which permanent domestic workers are entitled to receive. It was resolved to demand double pay for casual labourers as a deterrent.

Speaking at the same occasion, the chairperson of NDAWU, Hileni Ilonga said times were hard and many workers has lost their jobs but warned that the union needed co-operation and support from members in order to deliver the goods.

The congress approved a model of an employment contract for domestic workers and employers. NDAWU will witness the signing of the contract and retain a copy of the contract for record purposes.

The contract will also guarantee that monthly membership fees of NDAWU members could be channelled to NDAWU by the employers.

According to the new Labour Act, if a member was not up-to-date with her membership fee, she would cease to be a member of the union.

Capital hosts major summit on farming

THE land question in southern Africa and the role of governments in agricultural development will feature in discussions at an important international conference on small farming which starts in Windhoek today.

The summit will end on September 14. About 80 delegates from Southern Africa Development Community (SADC), and Preferential Trade Area (PTA) countries will deliberate on small-holder farmers' organisations.

The gathering is aimed at giving support, information, and experience to new and emerging farmers' organisations, and at linking them to other African countries.

It is sponsored by Oxfam Canada and has been organised by the Namibia National Farmers' Union (NNFU).

NNFU Vice-President Hudson N'embongi told the press that the conference would start with a briefing on the state of organised agriculture in Namibia.

Topics to be discussed include problems of food security; management and administration of farmers' organisations, and the involvement of these in agricultural development projects; motivating farmers for self-help and community projects; the impact of agriculture on the ecology; and the involvement and plight of women in agriculture.

After the conference delegates will visit agricultural projects in the northern areas.

Fighting illiteracy

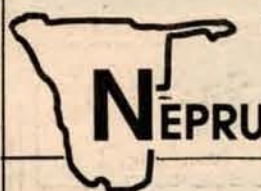
THE National Literacy Programme in Namibia (NLPN), which kicked off with only 15 000 learners in 1992, will have 35 000 participants by October.

This is due to increased participation by the Government, according to the latest progress report on literacy, released last week to mark the opening of Literacy Week which runs until September 8.

The report noted that 2 000 literacy promoters will have been trained by October, while the drop-out rate of learners has dropped to only 2 per cent.

Under Secretary for Adult and Non-formal Education, Justin Ellis, said the campaign to involve non-governmental institutions and individuals in the campaign was because the task was too

great for Government to tackle alone.

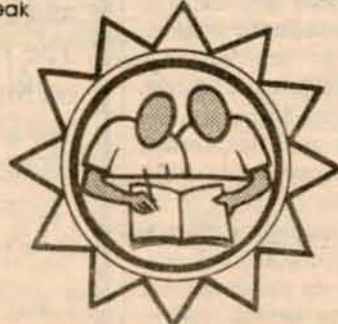

Germany/Nam to sign investment agreement

VISITING German Minister of Economic Co-operation and Development, Carl-Dieter Spranger is impressed by the Namibian Government's efforts to create a stable environment in the country.

Spranger rounded off his four-day visit by holding a joint press conference with Minister of Trade and Industry, Hidipo Hamutenya, after a visit to Walvis Bay and Swakopmund.

The German Minister assured Namibia of continued German aid and announced that he and Hamutenya would discuss future plans at a meeting scheduled for October in Germany.

An agreement to encourage and protect investments in both countries will also be signed in the near future, paving the way for German investment in Namibia.

The investment agreement would provide an indispensable basis to attract much-needed foreign capital.

It covers risks for German capital expenditure in Namibia, provides guarantees for the trans-

fer of receipts to Germany and ensures investors of the smooth administration of their money.

Spranger noted that the promotion of small business was important in the private sector and also a key factor in the future prosperity of the country.

Investment would help alleviate the problems of unemployment "and therefore we agreed on the importance of promoting the private sector".

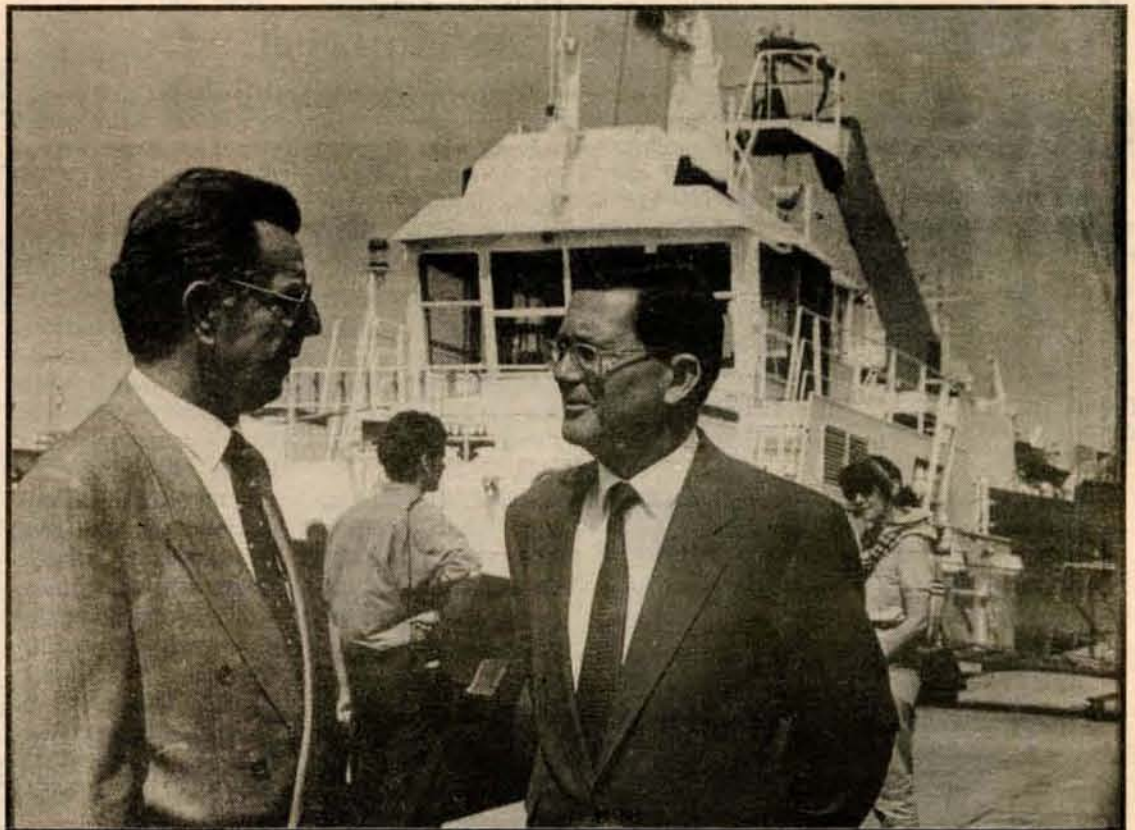
He expressed his support for SADC as he was confident that the organisation would bring economic and political co-operation to the sub-region.

Further, Germany would support the policy of co-operation on the question of Walvis Bay. During his visit to Walvis, Spranger told Nangolo Mbumba of the JAA that Germany felt a particular

responsibility for the region and hoped the re-integration of the port would have a happy ending.

During his visit, the German Minister also met a number of business people and representatives of opposition parties. The protection of minorities in Namibia came up for discussion when Spranger met President Nujoma. He said the talks had been of great value and Germany felt very close to the German population in Namibia.

Spranger also expressed his hope for a speedy solution to the problems in Angola and South Africa.

'Aid still on tap'

NAMIBIA is the biggest recipient of German aid. Germany has pledged DM 300 million to the country since independence in 1990, with DM 70 million distributed by the end of last year. Spranger assured Namibia that German aid would not dry up in the near future, despite Germany's domestic problems caused by the collapse of communism.

The German Minister also said it was gratifying to note the determination with which Namibia complied with German criteria for development aid, including respect for human rights, popular participation in decision-making, rule of law and development-oriented activities by government. - Sapa

The east to go electric

AN electrification project for areas in eastern Namibia will be launched next month, the Ministry of Mines and Energy announced in a statement on Friday.

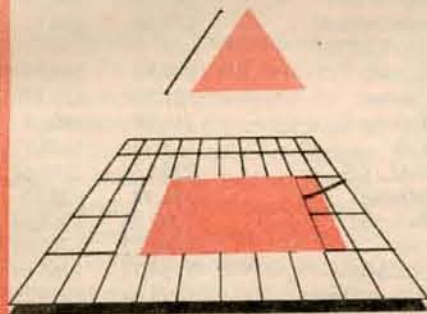
The project, scheduled for completion before March next year, will benefit residents of Drimiopsis, Epukiro, Aminuis, Corridor and Otjituwo. Electrification in these areas was budgeted for in the 1993/94 financial year.

During the 1994/95 financial year,

the Government plans to electrify Okondjatu, Okamatapati, Ovitoto, Coblenz, RC Mission, Du Plessis farm and also the southern and western regions of the country.

Swawek has been contracted by the Ministry to do the High Tension (HT) work while Contractors will be appointed for the Low Tension work.

The Ministry has also called on the public to give the necessary support and co-operation to the Construction Crews.

Market round-up

LONDON - Book last Friday. FRANKFURT - German shares ended a volatile session barely changed from Thursday after new orders failed to emerge to sustain an early rise in the DAX to within a few points of its 1993 high. The DAX index ended 0.46 points lower at 1,925.16. This was 20.56 points up on last Friday.

PARIS - Consolidation of the bourse's recent gains took hold and French shares ended sharply lower. Dealers say the move could continue next week as operators lock in profits. The CAC-40 index ended down 29.03, at 2,156.09 a drop of 27.79 on last week.

ZURICH - Profit taking - which started in bank shares and then spread to other sectors - pushed the Zurich bourse lower. Chemicals, which were firm in the first half of the session, also came under pressure as the dollar began to weaken. The broad SPI was 12.24 points lower at provisional 1,545.71 down 21.41 from last week.

TOKYO - Stocks ended firmer, and the Nikkei average closed up 133.01 points or 0.63 percent at 21,116.21, setting a new closing high for 1993. Active buying by foreign investors encouraged domestic investors and individual shares with themes rallied. This was 324.53 points up on last Friday.

HONGKONG - Stocks retained their modest gains at the close with the key index finishing above the 7,500 level despite profit-taking. The blue chip Hang Seng index rose 18.68 points, or 0.25 percent, to finish the week at 7,512.13, up 89.15

points on last Friday. **SYDNEY** - Australian shares continued their downward run, hit by the slide in the Australian dollar, bullion prices and offshore markets. The All Ordinaries index closed 16.4 points down at 1,952.0. This was 3.4 points up on last Friday.

JOHANNESBURG - South African gold shares finished sharply lower across the board on Friday despite a slight improvement in the price of gold after Thursday's overnight plunge. The gold index lost 77 points to 1,645 down 69 points on last Friday, while industrials lost 21 points to 4,599. The overall index lost 53 points to 3,957 down 60 points on last week.

SADC hears call for peace and stability

MBABANE: Swaziland King Mswati III yesterday urged for peace and stability in Southern Africa to bolster the region's economic fortunes.

Opening the Southern African Development Community (SADC) heads of state annual summit outside Mbabane, King Mswati said national turbulence would seriously harm the developing economies of all regional states.

"The potential for huge economic growth is undoubtedly at our doorstep, but we will not realise that full potential while our people suffer from instability and uncertainty."

The ongoing war in Angola held severe consequences for the region, while South Africa's democratic transition needed to be accelerated.

King Mswati expressed concern at South Africa's continuing violence and the non-participation of some political groups in constitutional talks.

"Empty chairs at the negotiating table will mean an incomplete solution, and the future of a new South Africa will be in doubt."

There was no doubt the future of SADC hinged on a successful new South Africa, he said.

"Our community appreciates the valuable role to be played by the region's most powerful country, and we offer our full support and encouragement towards the establishment of peace and stability, for the benefit of us all."

The heads of state summit is being attended by African National Congress deputy president Walter Sisulu and Pan Africanist Congress president Clarence Makwetu. They were seated alongside the presidents of Zambia, Tanzania, Botswana, Mozambique, Namibia and Zimbabwe as well as the Angolan foreign minister, King Mswati and senior government ministers from Lesotho and Malawi.

The ANC and PAC have been working with the SADC over the last two years to facilitate post-apartheid South Africa's entry into the trade body.

King Mswati applauded the efforts towards peace and democracy in Mozambique which were gathering momentum. SADC was ready to support the reconstruction process in Mozambique.

In reply, Mozambique president Joaquim Chissano said the ceasefire between his government and Renamo troops was holding.

Following his meeting with rebel leader Alfonso Dhlakama over the past 10 days, Chissano said democratic change in Mozambique was "irreversible".

He looked forward to democratic South Africa's inclusion within the SADC saying the increased level of regional co-operation would be mutually beneficial.

Delivering a statement on behalf of South Africa's liberation movements, Sisulu said the SADC was a vital organ for the economic transformation of the region.

He said South Africa would not seek to dominate regional economic affairs but would be an equal partner in promoting balanced Southern African development.

"We have the possibility of transforming the region of Southern Africa into a region of peace, democracy and prosperity". - Sapa

Malawi strike grounds flights

HARARE: Malawi's president Kamuzu Banda yesterday ordered air traffic controllers from the army to assist with duties at the country's two international airports as a nationwide strike by most of Malawi's 105 000 civil servants entered its fourth day.

According to a despatch received here from the government-run Malawi News Agency (MANA), Banda, who is the army's commander-in-chief, said the army personnel will stand in for as long as the civil aviation staff remain on strike.

The Kamuzu International Airport in Lilongwe and the Chileka airport in Blantyre were closed last week in a strike for higher wages and better working conditions by the country's single largest group of workers, the civil servants.

The workers who initially turned down a government 10-15 percent salary hike, Saturday were reported to have reduced their 150 percent demands by about half.

By Saturday, some 200 foreigners were stranded as they could not leave the country due to the closure of the airports. - Sapa-AFP

Shonekan told to handover power

LAGOS: Pro-democracy groups here called yesterday on the Interim National Government (ING) to resign by October 1 and hand over power to the presumed winner of June's presidential election.

The Campaign for Democracy (CD), which groups pro-democracy and human rights organisations, said it would intensify its programme of "civil disobedience and mass action" across the country until the ING, head by Ernest Shonekan, handed power to Moshood Abiola.

The southern Moslem millionaire businessman is widely credited with having won the June 12 poll, annulled by former military junta leader General Ibrahim Babangida due to alleged irregularities.

The October 1 date was chosen because of its symbolic significance: Nigeria, a former British colony, gained its independence on October 1, 1960.

CD chairman Beko Ransome-Kuti told a news conference.

Rallies, demonstrations and marches would be staged to demand Shonekan's resignation and the inauguration of a "people's government", based on the results of the June election, said Ransome-Kuti.

Abiola, candidate of the progressive Social Democratic Party (SDP), is currently abroad to drum up international support for his claimed victory.

Present at the press conference were lawyers Gani Fawehinmi and Femi Falana, human rights activists released by Shonekan last week along with Ransome-Kuti in an apparent goodwill gesture to the opposition. The proposed "people's government" would be broad-based, comprising representatives of labour organisations, professionals, farmers, students and youths, said Ransome-Kuti. - Sapa-AFP

WORLD BRIEFS

Aideed gunmen kill nine

MOGADISHU: Gunmen loyal to warlord Mohamed Farah Aideed killed seven Nigerian UN troops and wounded nine yesterday in Mogadishu in an attack that provoked a row between Nigerian and Italian contingents in the UN force.

Residents said between 20 and 30 Somalis were also killed but reporters who visited the scene said they saw only seven Nigerian bodies, stripped of their uniforms and equipment by their attackers.

UN officials said one Nigerian soldier was missing after the attack, which took place in the early morning at Checkpoint Pasta, a flashpoint in south Mogadishu at the heart of territory controlled by Aideed loyalists.

Fundamentalists slam PLO

CAIRO: Two Egyptian Muslim fundamentalist groups yesterday denounced the Palestinian self-rule accord and accused the PLO of surrendering to Israel.

"We denounce this agreement which erases the history of struggle and the blood of martyrs spilled to liberate Jerusalem," al-Gamaa al-Islamiya, or Islamic Group, said in a statement from Assiut. In Cairo, the moderate Muslim Brotherhood accused the Palestine Liberation Organization of surrendering to the "Zionist enemy" by agreeing to the autonomy plan which provides Palestinian self-rule in Gaza and the West Bank town of Jericho.

Rushdie defends Moslems

PRAGUE: Author Salman Rushdie whose book "The Satanic Verses" has forced him to spend four years in hiding from Moslem fundamentalists hit out at the treatment of Bosnian Moslems during a three day seminar on racism and nationalism here, the CTK news agency said yesterday.

Rushdie, who was sentenced to death by the late Iranian leader Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini in 1989 for writing the allegedly blasphemous book, said that "the only ethnic group in former Yugoslavia working towards a state not founded on religion and based upon tolerance and pluralism is the Moslems."

Massacre blamed on cops

RIO DE JANEIRO: A Military Police captain was arrested on Saturday and accused of ordering the massacre of 21 people in a shantytown in western Rio, police said.

A lower-ranking officer was also arrested, police said. Authorities announced the arrests of five low-ranking police officers on Friday.

The arrests were the first since masked gunmen armed with assault rifles stormed the Vigario Geral shantytown in western Rio before dawn August 30 and fatally shot 21 people, many of them in their beds.

Rivals find agreement

MAPUTO: Mozambique's president and the opposition leader formally signed an agreement on Friday on ways to speed the country's peace process though the final document has no timetable, leaving space for more such delays which have blocked progress for 10 months already.

The opposition Mozambique National Resistance (Renamo) had initially demanded autonomy in areas it controlled during its 16-year war against the government, but the document signed Friday states that the government will now appoint three Renamo advisors to each of the 10 provincial governors.

Amnesty acts on E Timor

JAKARTA: Amnesty International has called on authorities to allow independent groups to visit captured East Timorese pro-independence leader Xanana Gusmao as there are growing concerns for his health. A spokeswoman of the London-based human rights group said the organization would call for him (Gusmao) to "have proper regular access to the ICRC (International Committee of Red Cross) and independent lawyers."

Kenyan MPS arrested

NAIROBI: Some 13 Kenyan opposition members of parliament have been arrested in Rift Valley province and charged for trying to enter an area hit by ethnic clashes, Kenyan newspapers reported on Saturday. The 13 MPs from opposition FORD-Asili, FORD-Kenya and Democratic Party were arrested Friday inside an hotel in Nakuru, 160 kms west of here, as they were preparing to address journalists before embarking on a fact-finding tour of Molo South.

NZ plan toxic 'export'

AUCKLAND: A New Zealand company is stockpiling the deadly toxic waste polychlorinated biphenyls (PCB) here in preparation for shipping it to France for destruction, the Sunday Star newspaper reported yesterday. The New Zealand Dairy Group corporate affairs manager Creena Gibbons told the Star they were collecting up supplies of PCBs and stockpiling them in a secret location in Auckland ahead of shipping them to France. Environmental group Greenpeace have condemned the planned shipments noting that New Zealand has in the past condemned waste shipments to and through the Pacific.

Gulf states warm to PLO deal

RIYADH: Oil-rich Gulf Arab states moved here yesterday toward supporting a PLO-Israeli accord, a decision which could lead to crucial financial backing for Palestinian autonomy.

Foreign ministers of the six Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) states overcame doubts and began to draft a statement of support following prodding by Washington, the key sponsor of the Middle East peace talks, a GCC source said.

Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, the United Arab Emirates (UAE), Qatar, Bahrain and Oman would release the statement late Sunday or early Monday, said the source who requested anonymity.

"The United States made contact with several Arab capitals in the Gulf to urge them to adopt a position of support for the Israeli-Palestinian accord," which calls for autonomy starting in the Gaza Strip and West Bank town of Jericho, he said.

Gulf states are concerned the accord may saddle them with 600 000 Palestinians as permanent residents because it makes no provision for those made refugees when Israel was founded in 1948, a GCC official said earlier.

GCC chairman Fahem al-Qassimi said in an opening speech that he hoped to see the "latest developments in the peace process lead to the attainment of all Arab and Palestinian rights."

The only means to recover these rights as well as occupied Arab land was to take a united Arab stand, he said.

Diplomats said GCC approval of the accord was crucial for the Palestine Liberation Organisation as it was counting on the Gulf states to provide an estimated 100 million dollars in financial aid.

Gulf states, which support the Middle East peace talks, cut off aid to the PLO following its perceived support for Iraq after the 1990 invasion of Kuwait. - Sapa-AFP

NP's 'friends' get the blame

NELSPRUIT: "Friends of the National Party" were responsible for the killing of innocent black people, African National Congress president Nelson Mandela charged at an election rally in KaNgwane yesterday.

"The NP is a polecat, it smells," Mandela said to applause from an enthusiastic crowd of more than 10 000 which packed a soccer stadium at Msogwaba village.

Referring to a statement at the weekend by Law and Order Minister Hennis Kriel in which the Minister wanted to know how many murders the ANC was responsible for in their fight against the Inkatha Freedom Party, Mandela said:

"If they (NP government) think it is the ANC killing people, why aren't they arresting (us)?"

"They have not arrested (any of us) because the people who are killing innocent people...are the friends of the NP," Mandela said.

"When a government starts working

with criminals then that government is no government at all. That is what is happening," the ANC leader charged. - Sapa

Reward sought for trackers

SYDNEY: Two descendants of the Aboriginal trackers who found Australian outlaw Ned Kelly over a century ago, are demanding the reward which was never paid to their ancestors. And they calculate the 50 pounds which their grandfathers should have been given by the Victorian government is now worth a cool three million pounds.

May McBride, 76, and Maude Bell, 83, have written to the current Premier of Victoria, demanding the initial reward - plus compound interest. Their spokesman claimed the trackers played a key role in finding the legendary bushranger, who was later hanged for his misdeeds.

Ipinge vyftien jaar na gevangenis

'n LID van die Namibiese weermag wat na bewering 'n kameraad doodgeskiet het is verlede Vrydag in die Windhoek Hoërhof effektiewe tronkstraf van vyftien jaar opgelê.

Sacky Ipinge (35) het aanvanklik skuldig gepleit op die klag dat hy op 7 Junie verlede jaar by die Nepara-basis in die Kavango, Thomas Sakeus doodgeskiet het. Die pleit is egter verander nádat hy in die hof aangedui het dat hy nie besef het dat sy optrede tot die dood van sy kameraad sou lei nie. Die hof het hierna 'n pleidooi van onskuldig ingedien. Volgens die getuienis van Ipinge, wat ook die

enigste getuie was, was hy saam met Sakeus by 'n cuca-winkel toe die oorledene moleste veroorsaak het en hom, soos hy beweer, op die neus gebly het. Hy sê, hy het hierna na die militêre basis gegaan om mediese behandeling te ontvang. Sakeus het hom weer konfronteer toe hy uit die siekeboeg kom. In die stryery wat gevolg het, het Sakeus na bewering 'n knopkierie te voorskyn gebring om Ipinge mee te slaan.

In reaksie hierop, sê Ipinge, het hy gegaan en sy AK-47 aanvalsgeweer gaan haal en verskeie skote in die rigting van die oorledene geskiet met die doel om hom af te skrik. Sommige van die skote het die oorledene getref. Ipinge sê hy was nie

bewus dat die geweer op outomatics gestel was nie. Hy het gedink hy korrel laag en skiet enkelskote maar het eers na 'n paar oomblike tot die besef gekom die geweer was op outomatics. Regter Johan Strydom het vóór vonnisoplegging gesê die omstandighede

dui daarop dat Ipinge na Sakeus geskiet het met die doel om te tref en dat hy indien hy net die oorledene wou afskrik in die lug sou geskiet het. Advokaat Pat van Wyk het vervolging en Ipinge se verdediging is hanteer deur advokaat Cobus Potgieter.

Skedelkusverhoor moet wag vir beslissing

DIE beslissing in die veelbesproke tendersaak van Skeleton Coast Safaris teen die tenderraad en verskeie ander is verlede Vrydag in die Hoërhof weerhou tot 'n latere datum. Die saak het sy oorsprong in die kontroversiële toekenning van 'n kontrak aan die Duitse maatskappy Olympia Reisen om eksklusiewe regte te hê vir toerisme in die Skedelkuspark. Die toekenning van die tender het in omstredeheid verval nádat bewerings gemaak is dat dit nie op die standaardwyse verloop het nie en dat Olympia Reisen bevoordeel is. Skeleton Coast sê die inligting wat vervat is in die tenderaanbieding van Olympia Reisen is misleidend en kwalifiseer nie vir die vereistes van die tender nie. Regter Nic Hannah en Theo Frank het Vrydag beslis dat die hof tyd nodig het om tot 'n beslissing te kom.

Twyfel oor Unita se vredesaanbod

JONAS Savimbi, Unita-rebelleier het Vrydag in 'n telefoongesprek met die Portugese President Mario Soares beloof om in te stem tot 'n volskaalse vredesooreenkoms in Angola. Hy het ook beloof om die belofte te maak aan die VV se Sekretaris-Generaal, Boutros Boutros Ghali. Dié belofte is egter deur Generaal Higino Carneiro van die Angolese weermag bestempel as nog een van Unita se manoeuvres en as nie opreg nie. Carneiro, die hoof van die Angolese

regeringspan by die laaste vredesonderhandelings by Abidjan, sê Savimbi se plan is daarop gemik om die hou van 'n vergadering van die VV se Veiligheidsraad wat vir 15 September beplan is te verhoed. Die VV het vroeër 'n ultimatum gerig aan die strydende partye in Angola om vóór die datum vredessamesprekings te hervat. Carneiro het bygevoeg dat die aankondiging van Savimbi nie beteken dat Unita gewillig is vir 'n hernude gesprek nie. Die kantoor van President Soares het Vrydag aangekondig dat Unita gewillig is vir die vredessamesprekings en dat die VV kan bepaal op

Pockets full of gold for best athletes

RAF CASERT

BRUSSELS, Belgium: Michael Johnson, Noureddine Morceli, Sonia O'Sullivan, Maria Mutola and Trine Hattestad each earned four kilograms of gold Friday by capturing their events at the Van Damme Memorial Golden Four track meet.

Algerian Morceli was on world record pace with one lap to go in the mile, but weakened in the final straight to finish in 3 minutes 47,30 seconds, just .98 seconds outside the mark of Britain's Steve Cram.

He wasn't sad. "I got the gold, that's what I came for... Preparing as an athlete is an investment that needs rewarding," Morceli said.

Ireland's O'Sullivan beat Yvonne Murray in cool and windy conditions and was also assured of gold. The total of 20 kilograms, worth about dfls 265 000, was offered as a reward to be won outright or shared by anyone who could win the same event in Oslo, Norway; Zurich, Switzerland; Berlin; and Brussels.

US world champion Johnson had to catch up with Quincy Watts for most of the 400 meter race, but his final kick gave him the edge and a share of the gold.

Mutola of Mozambique left her charge very late in the 800 meters but overtook three challengers in the final straight to win in 1 minute 57,90.

Norwegian Hattestad also brought a perfect Golden Four record to Brussels and kept it intact with a throw of 67,92 meters, far off her best. Natalya Shikolenko of Belarus finished second, almost two meters back. Jamaican sprinter Merlene Ottey was also in line for the top prize, but withdrew from the meet with an injury.

Apart from the events for the gold, British world champion Sally Gunnell suffered her first defeat of the season

Morceli. "The pace makers didn't really do their job well."

Colin Jackson reasserted his supremacy in the 110 meters hurdles, finishing in 12,99 and winning by a wide margin over Canadian Mark McKoy and US runner Jack Pierce. After setting a world record of 12,91 in Stuttgart to take the world title, Jackson was beaten in Berlin last week, the third of the Golden Four meetings.

World champion Linford Christie beat US rivals Leroy Burrell and Jon Drummond in the

straight. For once, her famed finish failed her.

In the women's sprinting events, Gwen Torrance scored an impressive double, twice beating Russia's Irina Privalova.

In the 100 meters, she equaled her personal best of 10,86 seconds to come from behind and beat Privalova. Neither world champion Gail Devers or Ottey took part.

In the 200, she set the second-fastest time of the year, clocking 21,92 seconds. Only Ottey did better this year.

No one could stay close to Morceli in the mile, as two hares brought him to the 1 100 meter mark on world record pace. But the road was too lonely despite the cheers of the 40 000-strong crowd at the Heysel Stadium.

"It's too windy and rather cold," said

100 meters, giving the Briton revenge for a loss in Berlin last week.

In the 10 000, Moroccan Khalid Skah and Kenyan Richard Chelimo faced each other for the first time over that distance since their Olympic clash last year, and again Skah prevailed.

But it was far less controversial. Skah was never in trouble since the Kenyans could not muster a world record pace. In the last lap, Skah simply outsprinted everyone, with Moses Tanui finishing second and Chelimo fourth.

In Barcelona, Skah was first scrapped from the results because a teammate allegedly impeded Chelimo, the runner-up. But Skah was later reinstated as Olympic champion, to the chagrin of the Kenyans. - Sapa-AP

It's a breeze for Sampras

NEW YORK: A determined Pete Sampras didn't give France's Arnaud Boetsch much of a chance on Saturday night at the US Open, wasting no time in securing a 6-4 6-3 6-1 third-round victory.

The 22-year-old reigning Wimbledon champion, who rocketed onto the scene when he became the youngest US Open men's champion in 1990, played a quick, decisive, serve-and-volley match.

"I thought I started off pretty well," Sampras said. "It was a cool night and the court played a little bit slick. I played the big points pretty well and returned well."

Sampras offered the 25th-ranked Boetsch only one chance to break serve, an opportunity he converted in the first set.

The second-seeded American didn't want to end up like the seven other men's seeds who exited here by the second round, led by two-time defending cham-

pion Stefan Edberg. Seventh-seeded Michael Chang also made sure he would hang around a while longer. Chang finally figured out the puzzle of Bernd Karbacher of Germany to capture a 4-6 6-4 6-3 6-4 third-round match.

The American had lost their three previous encounters, taking only one set prior to their Saturday evening match.

"It's a real big deal," Chang said. "Down a set and down a break, I was fortunate to squeak out the second set."

In the round of 16, Sampras meets Thomas Enqvist of Sweden, who upset 16th-seeded Andre Agassi in the first round. The 61st-ranked Enqvist earned his berth with a 6-3 6-1 6-1 decision over Byron Black of Zimbabwe.

Chang will next tangle with 19th-ranked Wayne Ferreira of South Africa. Ferreira struggled for three hours, 17 minutes on Saturday for a 6-4 6-7 (1-7) 3-6 6-4 6-3 third-round win over Marc Goellner of Germany.

The day's session was almost an entire wash-out due to repeated periods of rain.

Players would occasionally take to the court to play a couple of games and then head back to the locker room to wait out the rain.

Luck loser Mary Jose Gaidano of Argentina, who dropped in at the last minute when sixth-seeded Mary A. Joe Fernandez took sick with a stomach problem, remained alive at the Open.

"This has been one of the biggest emotions I have ever felt," Gaidano said. "It's one of the most beautiful ones." - Sapa

way in which the Sri Lankan spinners had been allowed to assume control.

"I realise it is always difficult against the new ball," he added. "But if you consider that we only had 56 runs - and about 18 of those were wides - on the board after 20 overs, then something must have been very wrong."

And that, he said, is precisely what he had pointed out to his men. "Pretty fair criticism under the circumstances, I think," he added, in responding to Wessels' post-match argument that his players can seemingly do no right.

"If we try and build an innings, we're told we're too slow," he said. "But

if we lose wickets in going for runs we get hammered. Either way we just can't win."

Caught more than slightly off-guard by Wessels' bouncer, Procter said that ultimately he and the team skipper had the same objective: To mould the chaps into a winning combination.

"There are bound to be differences of opinion on how one should go about achieving that," he added, "but I reckon in the long run we will succeed."

Right now, however, both are more concerned at winning the final two fullscale Tests, which literally flow into each other.

"That's what we came

here for," said Wessels. "and I reckon that we've got a better than 50/50 chance of winning the series."

The Sri Lankans obviously feel otherwise. "You chaps had to savage the first Test," says manager Duleep Mendis. "We were in with a very real chance of winning it and I reckon that gives us the edge."

The pitch will obviously be a key factor in the next five days' proceedings, and here again Mendis believes his side is best equipped to handle what he believes will be a slow surface kind of spinners virtually from the word go.

"It would definitely help to win the toss and bat first," he said.

While the Lankans, according to unofficial reports, have included

Champaka Ramanayake in their Test squad of 14, Mendis hinted that Saturday night's four-wicket hero might not get a game.

"Maybe Chandika (Hathurusinghe) will be asked to open with Wickramasinghe," he said, "but in the end we will be looking at our spinners to do the job."

In that regard the ace in the Lankan pack is Muttiah Muralitharan, whose prodigious turn had the Boks in knots in the first Test.

But "Marvellous Murali" has also shown a tendency to be a bit stereotyped in his bowling, and while the SA batsmen might have their faults, they are also very quick learners.

In sharp contrast the tourists will be relying almost solely on seam.

South Africa have selected a squad of 12 and will only be naming their final XI shortly before the start of play.

But with Clive Eksteen on the bench along with Fanie de Villiers and Steve Palframan, they will definitely only be going into the Test with one spinner - Pat Symcox.

They know they could be courting disaster, but are still prepared to place their faith in pace and seam - no matter how slow the pitch might be.
