INTRODUCTION

This report contains detailed population figures and core employment and economic statistics from the 2021 Isle of Man Census. A second report containing household and further economic will be published in June 2022.

The 2021 Census was the first census on the Isle of Man to have employed a 'digital first' strategy. Under this strategy, households were sent a unique code that enabled them to complete their census return using an online form developed especially by the Isle of Man Government's Technology Service.

Alternative methods of completing a census return were made available to those who were unable or preferred not to use the online system. These included: being issued a paper copy of the form; completing the census over the phone; and completing the census in-person at the census office. The aim of this strategy was to reduce the reliance of the census on paper documents, and hence also the associated costs and waste associated with printing, postage, and storage, while also increasing both the reliability of the data and the ease with which the census results could be analysed.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The following definitions relate to headings and terms used throughout the tables in the report, and to concepts underlying the Census analysis.

Population Base

The primary purpose of taking a Census is to gather information on the Island's resident population. To enable historical comparisons, it is necessary to also examine the figure for the Census population, as shown in the historical section of this report. There is also the *de facto* population, defined as the number of people physically on the Island on Census Night.

The following are the various population definitions used in this report:

Resident population: Isle of Man residents present on Census Night plus residents

absent from the Island on Census Night

Census population: Resident population plus visitors in the Island on Census Night

De Facto population: Residents present on Census Night plus visitors on the Island on

Census Night

Visitors

For Census purposes, a visitor is defined as a person whose usual place of residence is outside of the Isle of Man. This includes persons who are visiting the Island on holiday and those on business who are working for a temporary period but who do not intend to take up residence on the Island in the immediate future.

Resident Households

A household comprises of either one person living alone, or a group of persons (who may or may not be related) living at the same address and who share cooking facilities and a living room, sitting room or dining room.

Statistics concerning resident households exclude persons in communal establishments such as Noble's Hospital or the Isle of Man Prison.

Dependency Ratio

The dependency ratio is the number of people under 16 years old and the number of people above retirement age as a percentage of the working age population.

The working age group consists of all adults above the age of 15 and under the age at which they are entitled to receive their state pension.

Place of Birth and Previous Country of Residency

For tables relating to place of birth and residency, many countries have been grouped together. The groupings are shown in Appendix 1.

Employed and Economically Active

Statistics concerning the employed population refer to the number of those in the resident population employed at the time of the Census.

The economically active population is comprised of the employed population and the unemployed who are 16 and older and either seeking work or waiting to start work already obtained.

KEY DEMOGRAPHIC & ECONOMIC STATISTICS

Population Growth & Age

- The resident population of the Island has risen 0.9% since 2016 to 84,069 people, partly compensating for the -1.4% fall that occurred between 2011 and 2016.
- The average age of the population has risen from 42.5 to 44.4. The median age is 46.5.

Economic activity

- The economically active population increased from 42,777 in 2016 to 44,875 in 2021. The number of these in employment also saw an increase, rising from 41,636 to 43,566.
- The dependency ratio has fallen 5.64% to 58.31%, although this is largely due to the drop in the number of residents under the age of 16 and recent increases in the state pension age.
- The number of women who are not in work because they look after the home or family has fallen slightly from to 2,268 in 2016 to 2,181. The number of men not in work for the same reason has however risen sharply from to 213 to 322, though this still accounts for only 8.5% of the total.
- 69.8% of those classified as not economically active cite retirement as the reason for not being in or seeking work.

Citizenship and Countries of Birth

- 10.3% of the resident population was born outside of the Isle of Man, United Kingdom, and Republic of Ireland, rising from 8.3% in 2016.
- Compared with 2016, the percentage of the resident population born on the Isle of Man fell slightly from 49.8% to 49.6%. By comparison, the percentage born in the United Kingdom fell by 1.7%.
- The resident population whose nationality corresponds to a country in the European Union has risen from 4,184 to 4,728.

Vacant Properties

 As at the 30th/31st May 2021, a total of 5,695 residential properties were recorded as being vacant. This figure includes flats, houses, and cottages used as holiday accommodation, but excludes hotels and other commercial properties.

COMMENTARY¹

¹ This section consists of a brief commentary on a selection of the statistics generated by the 2021 Isle of Man Census and focuses only on some key social and economic indicators. A full collection of tables containing data from the Census can be found in subsequent sections.


POPULATION

Since April 2016, the resident population of the Isle of Man has increased by 755 to 84,069 people. This is an increase of 0.9% over the past five years, which represents a partial recovery of the population total after a fall of 1.4% in the five years between 2011 and 2016.

The net inward migration rate over the five year period is approximately 1,600. This is despite 6,782 current residents stating that their residence on the Isle of Man started in 2016 or later, suggesting a significant level of outward migration has occurred over the same period.

Resident Population totals since 1961




Age Structure and Dependency Ratios

The average age of residents has continued to rise since 2016, increasing by 1.9 to 44.4. Additionally, those over the age of 64 account for 22% of the resident population, increasing slightly on the 21.7% found in the 2016 Census. As such, the resident population remains skewed towards higher age bands: half of the population is older than 46.5 years of age and the single largest 10-year age group consists of residents in their 50s.

Despite this, the dependency ratio has in fact fallen by 5.64%, partly due to increases in the retirement age and a fall in the share of the resident population made up by those under the age of 16.

RESIDENCY & NATIONALITY

41,658 residents were born on the Isle of Man and a further 32,153 in the United Kingdom, accounting for 49.6% and 38.3% of the resident population respectively. Compared with 2016, the percentage of residents born in the United Kingdom has fallen by 1.7%, while that of those born in the Isle of Man is largely the same.

Approximately 76% of the remaining 10,258 residents originate from just twenty countries, as shown in the table below:

A total of 4,728 residents hold nationality from a country in the European Union.

Of those who were not born on the Island, by far the highest percentage is made up of those who came to take up or seek employment or self-employment, followed closely by their partners and dependents.

Those stating that they came to the Island to live in retirement make up 4.2% of the resident population and 8.2% of those not born on the Island.

Approximately 10.4% of those not born on the Island report that the Island is not their sole place of residence. The majority of these, accounting for 81.3%, state that the Island is their primary place of residence, with the remainder reporting that either the Island is a temporary place of residence or that they typically spend less than half the year living on the Island.

EMPLOYMENT

Economically Active Resident Population

The number of economically active residents, defined as the number of residents in or seeking employment, stands at 44,875.

Of this total:

- 43,566 residents are employed or self-employed; and
- 1,309 residents are unemployed and looking for work.

This represents an increase in the number of economically active residents compared with both 2016 and 2011, despite the slightly lower population compared with the latter year.

The category 'unemployed and looking for work' includes all individuals who are actively seeking work, or who may be waiting to start work, regardless of whether or not they are registered to claim job seeker's allowance².

Residents not currently in Work

26,730 residents over the age of 15 reported that they were not currently in work. Of these, 66.4% are retired from paid work and 9.8% are unable to work because of a permanent or long-term illness, condition, or disability.

Of those looking after the home or family, 87.1% are women.

DISABILITY AND CARERS

Long-term disability or illness.

10,038 residents state that they have been professionally diagnosed with a long-term physical or mental condition or disability that limits their day-to-day activities to some degree. This represents 11.9% of the overall population. Of these, 2,461 reported that their condition or disability severely limits their day-to-day activities.

As reported in the section on employment, 2,631 residents reported that they are unable to work due to a long-term illness or disability.

Carers

4,869 residents over the age of 10 years old reported that they provide care or support to someone living with a long-term illness, condition, or disability. Of these, 1,699 do so for 35 hours a week or more.

Those acting as carers or providing support for others are predominantly female, with women accounting for 58% of the overall total and 59.2% of those providing at least 35 hours a week of care or support.

A further characteristic of those acting as carers for others is their age, with 48.5% falling between the ages of 45 and 64. Even so, over 5% are under the age of 25, with 260 residents in that age bracket reporting that they regularly provide some form of care or support to another person.

ETHNICITY, RELIGION, GENDER IDENTITY, & SEXUAL ORIENTATION

Ethnicity

Residents from ethnic groups other than white account for 5.3% of the resident population, an increase of 1.7% since 2011. Of this, the biggest increase relative the whole population is seen in those of Asian ethnicity, although the number of residents those of black ethnicity have more than doubled in absolute terms.

Religion

The 2021 Isle of Man Census is the first Manx census to ask about the religious beliefs of the population of the Island. Of the 74,487 residents who answered the census question regarding religious affiliation or belief, 54.7% reported that they were Christian.

A large number of respondents, accounting for 38.8% of the resident population, report having no religious beliefs. The table below provides the number of people of each faith (and no faith) as a percentage of all who answered the question on religion.

Sexual Orientation

62,208 residents over the age of 15 stated their sexual orientation³ on their census return. Of these, the vast majority reported that they are heterosexual, with less than three percent stating a different sexual orientation.

Residents who are Gay, Lesbian, or Bisexual make up 2.2% of the population over the age of 15. This is slightly less than the UK as a whole, but roughly the same as has been reported for the North-West of England⁴

Gender Identity

132 people over the age of 15 reported that they do not identify with the sex assigned to them at birth. Of these, just over half (52.9%) were born male.
