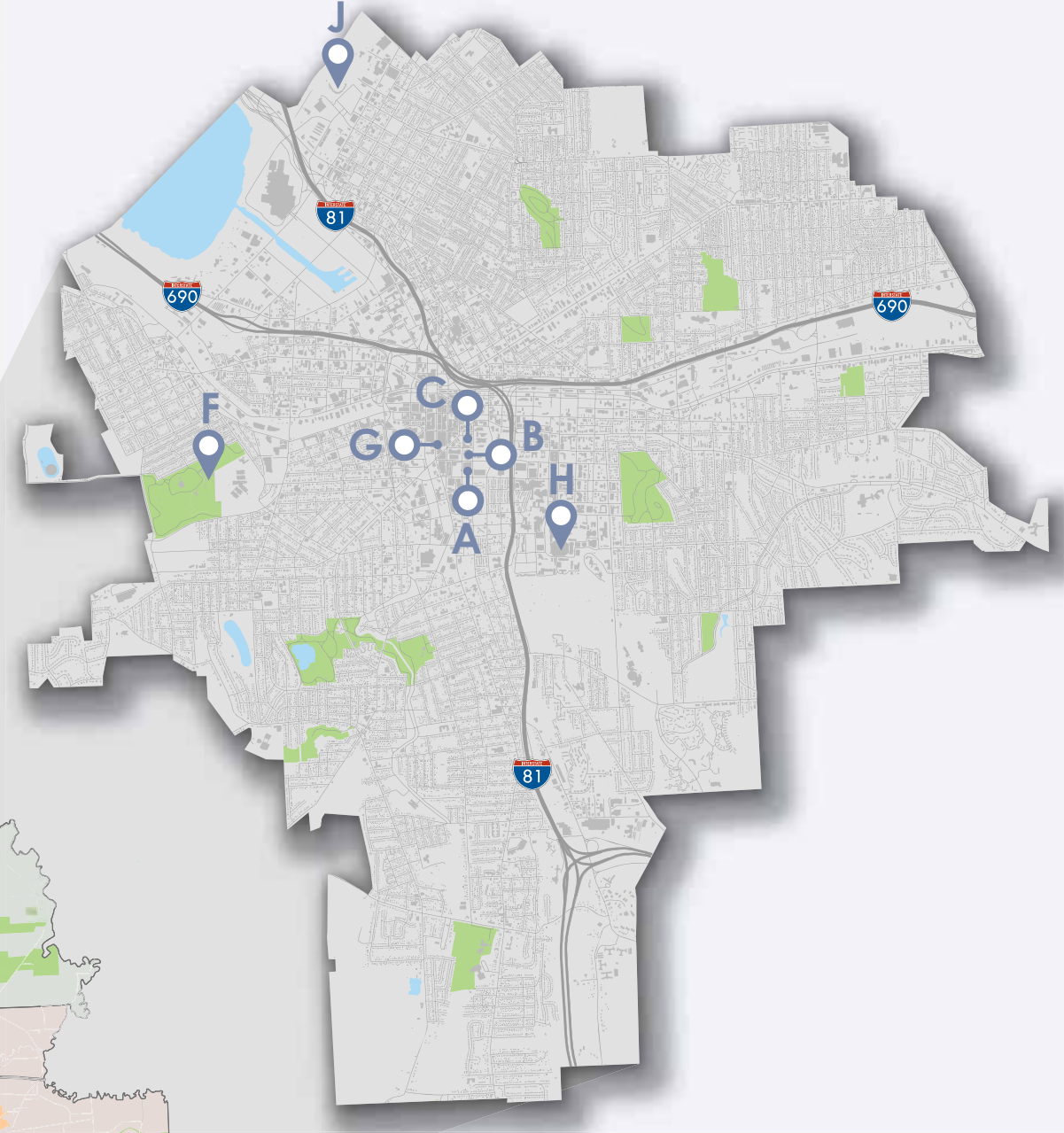
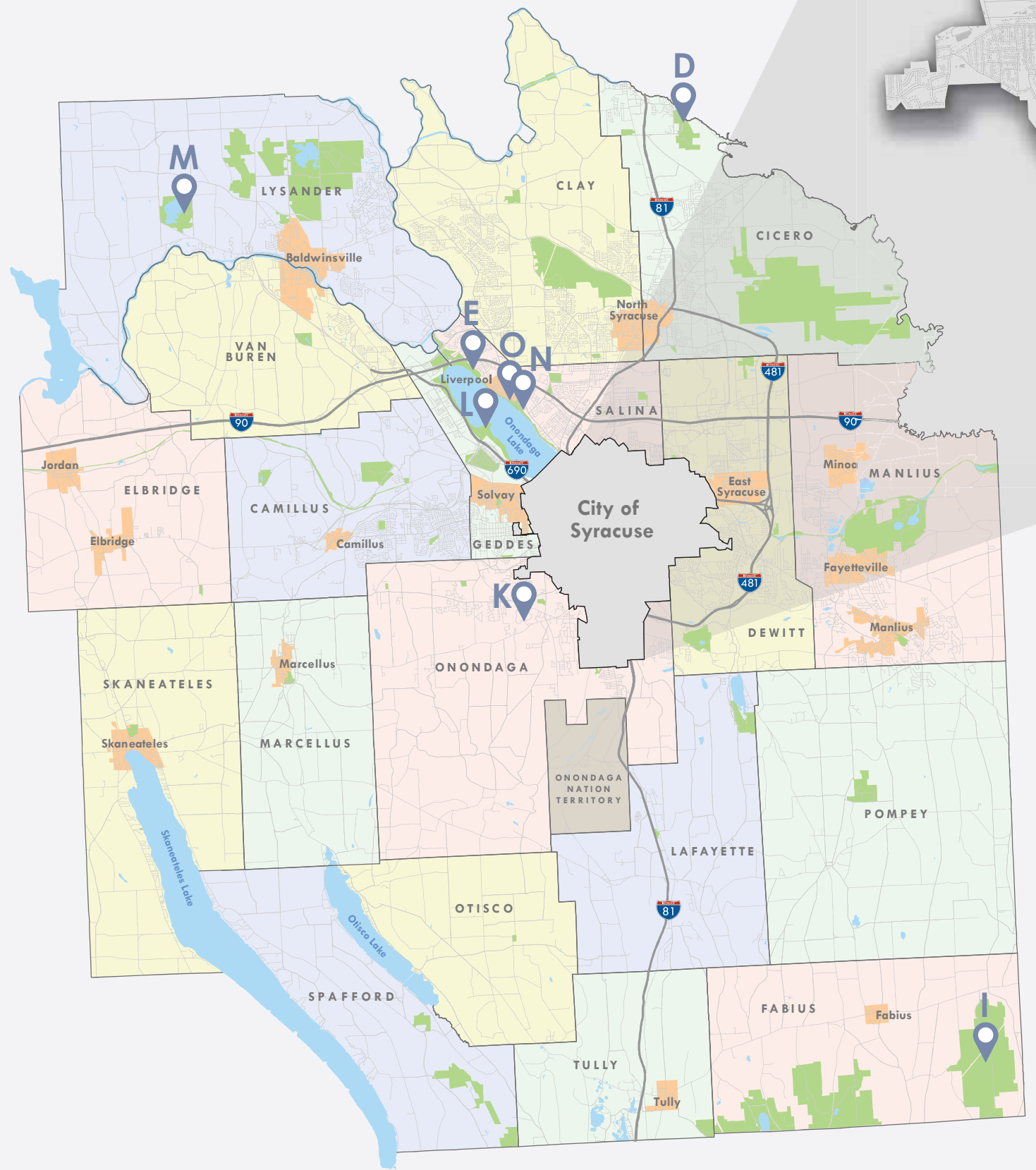

Located in the center of New York State, Onondaga County is home to the city of Syracuse. We are within 350 miles of all major cities in the Northeast, conveniently situated at the intersection of Interstate Highways 81 and 90 (I-190). Local America and Georgetown terminals provide air service to major cities. The new Center Airway by air brings you to the newly remodeled Hancock International Airport while the New York State Barge Canal System provides local connection by boat to the Great Lakes and the St. Lawrence River.

- Area: 454,731 acres
- Population: 448,796 (2014 EST)
- Established originally in 1794, covering about 1,000 square miles, boundaries revised to the present size in 1816.
- Charter government since 1922, with 17-member legislature.
- Economic and industrial center of New York State (Interstate Route 90, the New York State Thruway, and Interstate 81) cross Onondaga County's early economy was based on the salt springs found here. Later, the Erie Canal helped make the County the State's industrial hub, a role in which it is still growing. Agriculture and industry, with approximately 100,000 acres of the County's acreage devoted to farming.

## A Nicholas J. Pirro Convention Center

(State & Harrison Street) – One component of the Oncenter Complex is the Onondaga County Convention Center at Oncenter. It is equipped to host a variety of events ranging from conventions and trade shows to banquets and meetings. Inside and out, great care was taken in the building's design to accommodate its customers with 99,000 square feet of available space along with an enclosed walkway, connecting the Convention Center to a 1,000-car parking garage. ## B War Memorial at Oncenter

(Montgomery Street) – A second component of the Oncenter Complex is the Onondaga County War Memorial at Oncenter. It is a tribute to the men and women of Onondaga County who served in America's military. Inside, you will find historical exhibits located throughout the building as well as the 43,000 square foot arena that has the ability to accommodate up to 8,000 people, depending on seating arrangement. ## C John H. Mulroy Civic Center

(Montgomery Street) – The John H. Mulroy Civic Center office building is made up of sixteen floors of county offices, as well as the Mulroy Civic Center Theaters at Oncenter. The theaters make up the third component of the Oncenter Complex. The Crouse-Hinds Theater structured with orchestra, mezzanine, and balcony levels, seats up to 2,117 people. For more intimate presentations, the Carrier Theater seats up to 463, while the BeVard Studio accommodates 162. From concerts and theatrical performances, to conferences and business meetings, the theaters provide the perfect setting for an outstanding event. ## D Oneida Shores

This radius includes the populations of Boston, New York City, Philadelphia, Baltimore, Pittsburgh, Toronto and Montreal. The County's central location is enhanced by its excellent transportation infrastructure and systems.



## E Onondaga Lake Park

The "Central Park" of Central New York, this 7.5 mile linear greenway is bustling year-round with great trails, special events, waterfront picnics, and boating action at Onondaga Lake's only marina, launch, and rowing facilities. Signature activities are inline skating and family excursions on the Wegman's Trams which travel from the Salt Museum to the Willow Bay Café, where refreshments, bicycles, and skates are available. ## F Rosamond Gifford Zoo at Burnet Park

## I Highland Forest

## K Onondaga Community College

Onondaga Community College, with a 181-acre campus on Onondaga Hill, was founded in 1962. This two-year college has nine buildings on campus that house over 50 different programs. The college offers two-year degree programs that serve as transfer opportunities to baccalaureate degree programs at four-year campuses or for direct entry to the workforce. Students can also earn a bachelor's degree on the Onondaga campus through innovative partnerships with other institutions. Enrollment at Onondaga Community College has grown to over 12,000 students per year.

 The County Parks system provides the community with a nature center, beaches, forested areas and natural feature parks, a centrally located multi-use park with intensive recreational opportunities, a marina, athletic fields, fish hatchery, and other historic facilities. Annual attendance at the County's parks is approximately 3.0 million.



## L Lakeview Amphitheater

Built in 2015, the Lakeview Amphitheater is a state of the art facility and Onondaga County's only large open-air concert venue. ## M Beaver Lake Nature Center

Beaver Lake Nature Center offers 9 miles of trails and over 400 annual programs. A rich mix of habitats creates the possibility of seeing more than 200 species of birds and over 800 varieties of plants. Beaver Lake features winding trails that are designed to be enjoyed in all seasons. The 200 acre glacial lake is a migratory stop for thousands of Canada geese that migrate through, as well as an opportunity for summertime exploration by canoe. ## N Skä•noñh

Great Law of Peace Center - Skä•noñh, is an Onondaga welcoming greeting meaning "Peace and Wellness." Onondaga Lake is one of the most important and sacred places for the founding of the Haudenosaunee, or "People of the Longhouse", with the coming together of the Peacemaker, Hiawatha and the Tadodaho thousands of years ago. Skä•noñh introduces visitors to the oral history tradition and the importance of language in maintaining a culture. The Center's exhibits present the Haudenosaunee perspective on European and Native American contact and colonialism, with an emphasis on local contact represented by the recreated 17th century Jesuit Mission of Sainte Marie de Ganentata. The Center also exhibits the many ways in which the Haudenosaunee have contributed to, and influenced, our American way of life.

## O Salt Museum

Syracuse is the "Salt City", and the Salt Museum, with a fully reconstructed salt boiling block, provides a fascinating insight into the area's lifestyle in the 1800's. All aspects of the salt industry, from tapping the brine springs, to how our ancestors spent their cherished free time, are unveiled through original artifacts, colorful graphics, and a slide theater.
