\$42,290,000 Work Throgs Span Jobs Placed

The Throgs Neck Bridge is off the drawing board and in the building stages today following the awarding of \$42,290,000 in construction contracts by the Triborough Bridge and Tunnel Authority.

Work on the opening phases of the \$90,000,000 suspension span linking Queens with the Bronx, will begin almost immediately, according to Arthur Hodgkiss, assistant general manager of the TBTA.

THE NEW CONTRACTS cover the entire span except the approach viaducts, the suspended structure and the six roadways themselves. Hodgkiss said the contracts were awarded now to give the firms time to fabricate steel parts.
