A bill forbidding the sale of hamburgers containing an excessive amount of fat has been passed unanimously by the City Council and needs only the formality of a public hearing set for next Friday before it is signed into law.

The measure makes it a misdemeanor to: sell hamburger not made of chopped fresh beef, sell chopped meat containing more than 30 per cent fat or sell packaged chopped meat minus a label specifying the kind of meat it contains.

Mayor Wagner lauded the Council for "prompt, effective action" on the bill and declared that the proposed local law was essential to consumers."

ALBERT S Pacetta, of Holtion of the 7th Assembly Disiswood, commissioner of markets informed the council's restrain butchers from mixing another meat with the beef.

Meat grinders should be deained in the refrigerators of butcher shops, according to Joseph Cohen, representing the Amalgamated Meat Cutters and Butcher Workers of North America. The union aide contended that grinders in the public part of a shop could be a health hazard because they
