Barry Challenges A. L. P. Congressman Says He'll Run Again

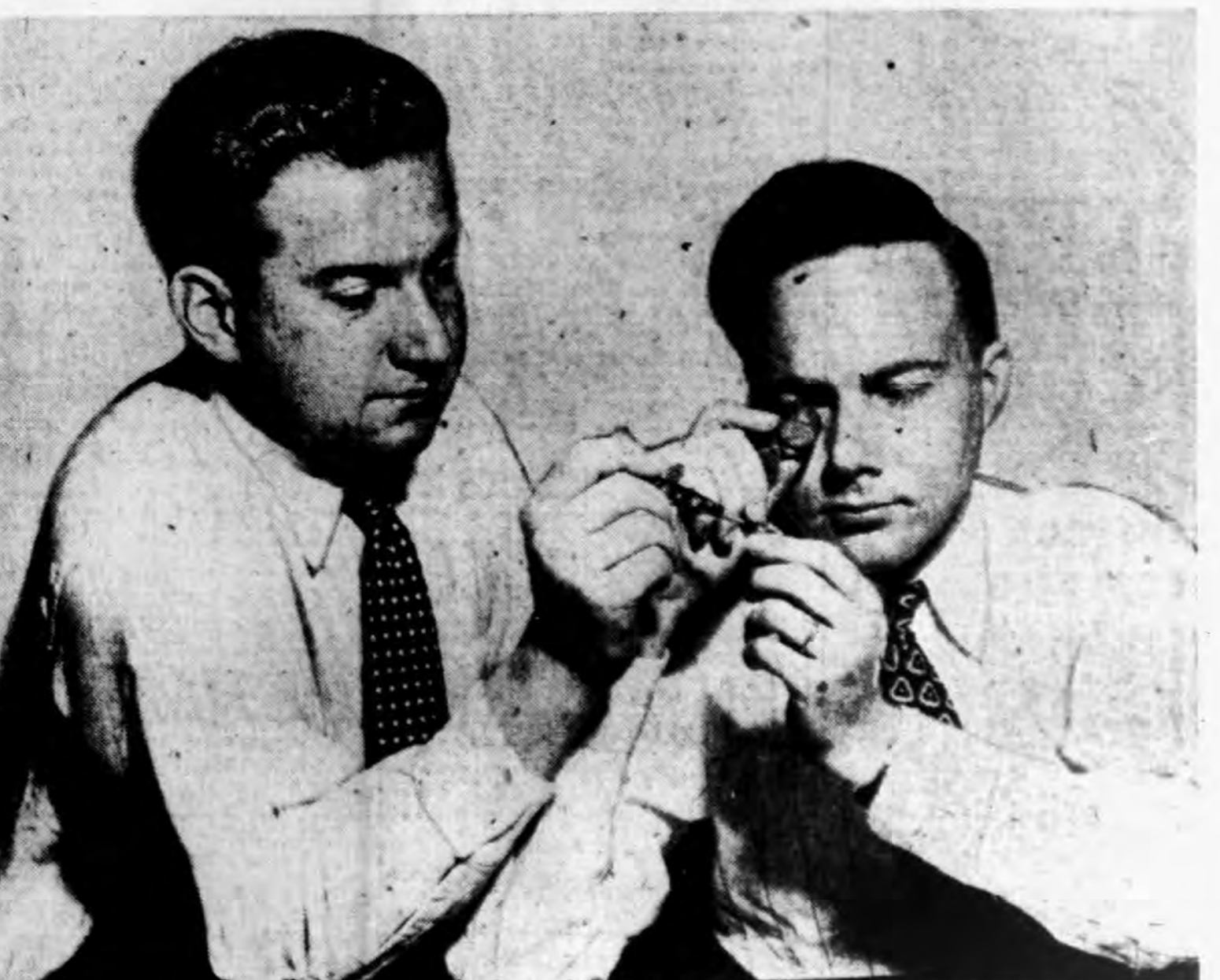
