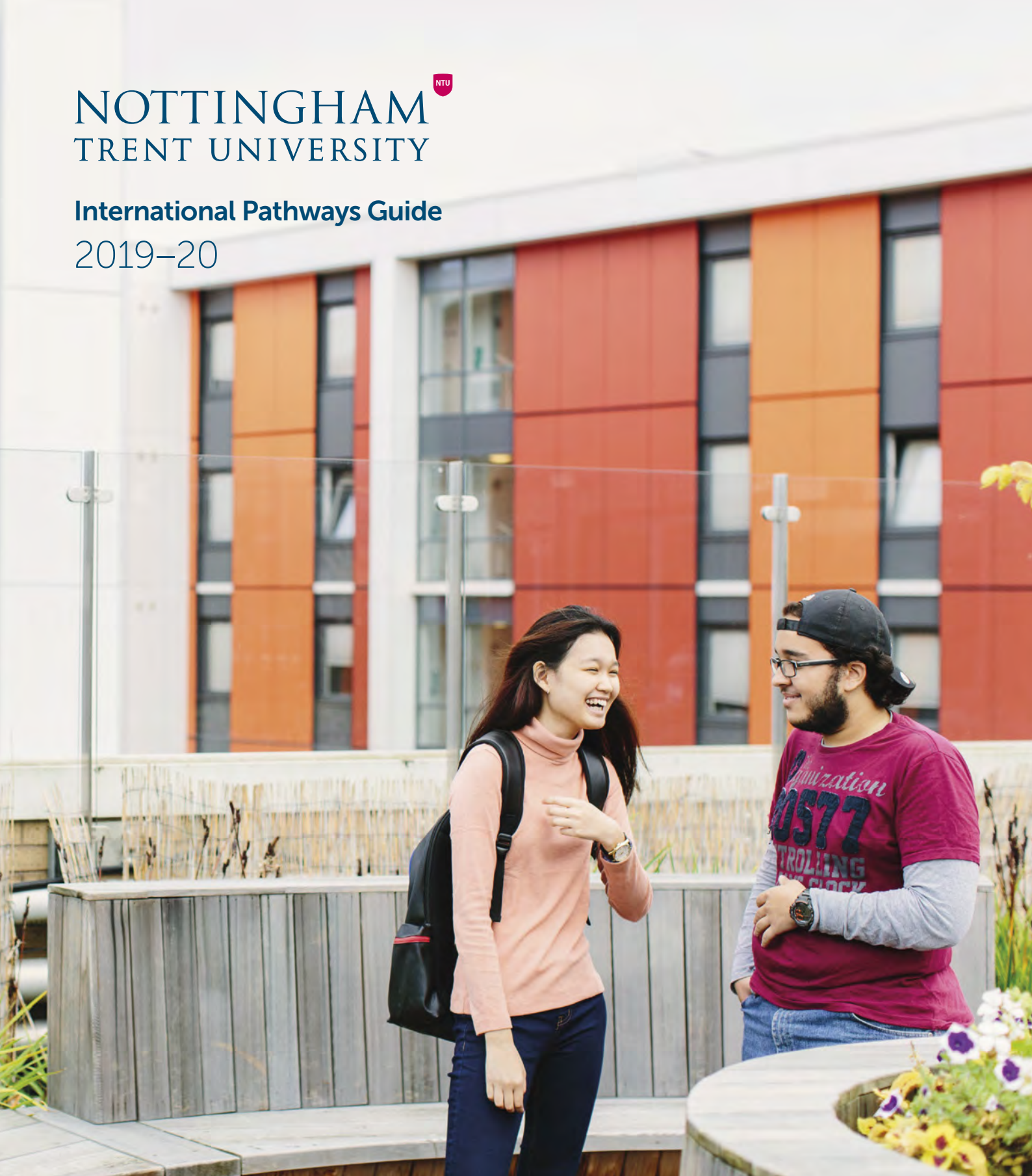

## A city-centre location

NTU's main City Campus puts you in the heart of Nottingham. The second largest, Clifton Campus, is just a short distance away by bus or tram. This gives you easy access to the many and varied attractions of Nottingham, including shops, bars, restaurants, parks, cinemas and more, so you'll always have something fun to do!

## A great environment

By coming to NTU, you'll join one of Britain's most environmentally friendly universities. It is one of the UK's top 3 most sustainable universities according to the 2018 People & Planet University League. NTU generates some of its own electricity on campus, and buys the rest from a green energy provider. This makes NTU a fantastic place to be a student, with an exceptional campus environment.

## A global university

From small beginnings, NTU has become one of the most popular study destinations in the UK, with more than 29,000 students (Higher Education Statistics Agency 2016/17). ## Get involved

## City Campus

Located right in the very heart of Nottingham, the City Campus is home to over half of the total student population. ## Clifton Campus

# Routes to Nottingham Trent University

If you're interested in studying at NTU, a pathway course at Nottingham Trent International College (NTIC) can help you prepare for, and gain entry to, an NTU degree.

## What is a pathway course?

If you've completed high school, but don't quite meet the entry requirements for an undergraduate degree at NTU, you can gain a place through a pathway course. Or if your undergraduate degree doesn't allow you to go directly to a postgraduate degree, a pathway course can help you reach the level required for entry.

You'll take your pathway course at Nottingham Trent International College on the NTU campus. The course will give you the academic skills, subject knowledge and English language level you need to gain entry to a degree. If you pass your pathway course at the required level with good attendance, you're guaranteed entry to NTU.

## On-campus pathway courses

### Foundation Certificate

To help you qualify for entry to an undergraduate degree, you can take a Foundation Certificate. You'll be fully prepared for university, and can progress to the 1st year of your undergraduate degree.

### International Year One (IYO)

The IYO is an advanced pathway to an undergraduate degree. If you have finished high school with good grades, you could study an IYO. This combines university preparation with content similar to that of undergraduate 1st year, so you can progress directly to degree year 2.

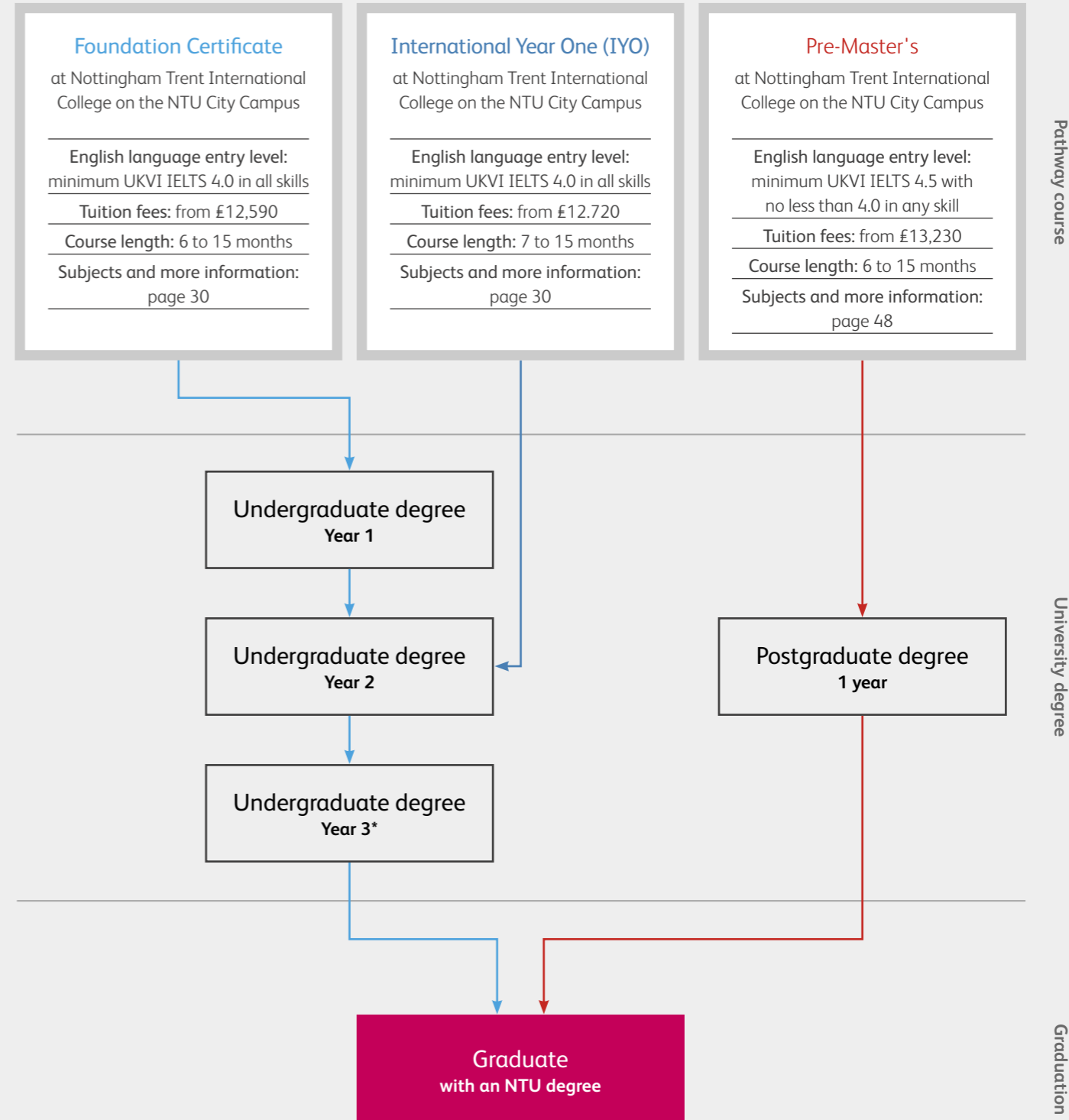
### Pre-Master's

If you have 3 years of higher education or equivalent, but don't quite qualify for entry to a postgraduate degree, take a Pre-Master's. This will bring your skills and knowledge up to the level needed to start a postgraduate degree at NTU.

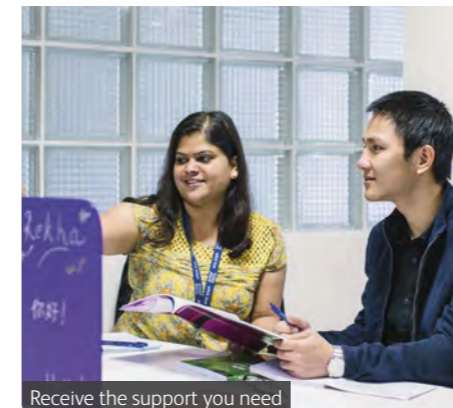

### Guaranteed accommodation

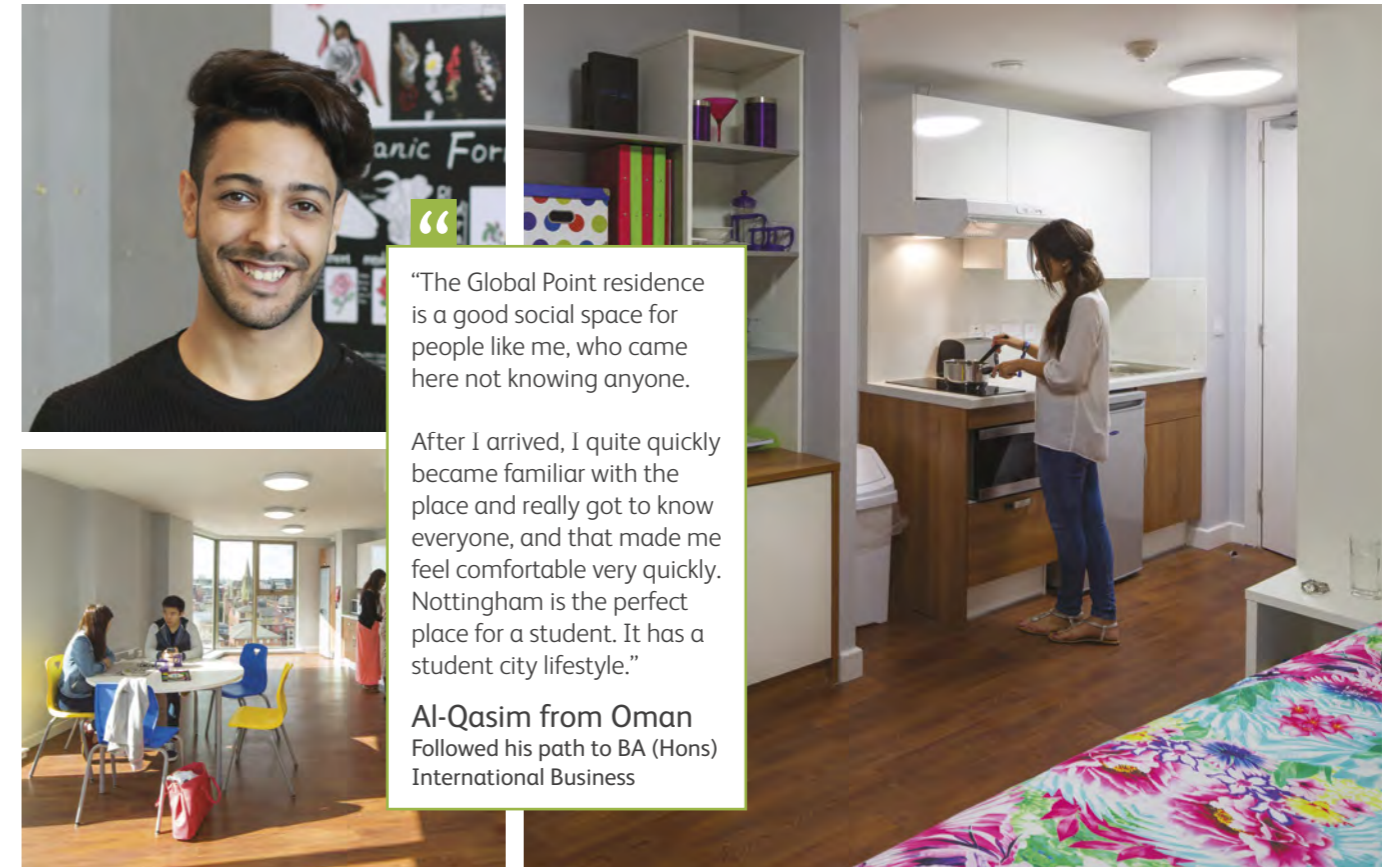
You are guaranteed accommodation during your time at Nottingham Trent International College.\* It's our way of ensuring you have a happy living environment while you study with us.

### How to book

You can apply for accommodation when you apply for your course.

- 1) Indicate on the application form that you require accommodation.
- 2) After receiving your offer to study, book your accommodation by filling in the online form and paying the holding fee (typically £1,000) when you accept your offer.
- 3) You will then receive your accommodation agreement. Read, sign and return this to reserve your room.

\* On the condition that you pay your tuition deposit, accept your study offer and submit the accommodation booking form before the accommodation guarantee deadline date.

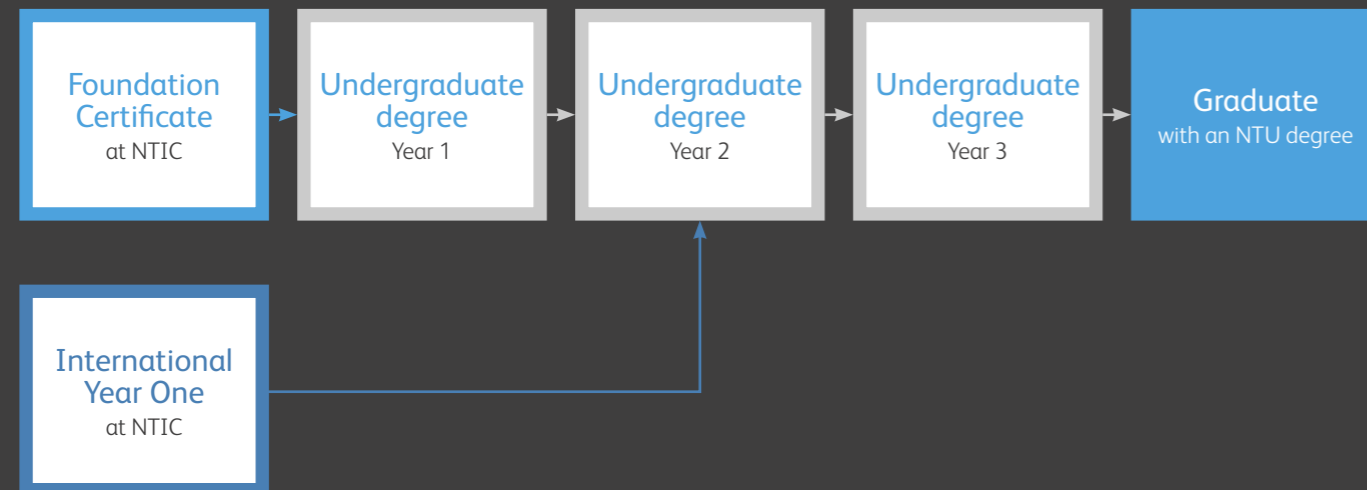

### Your path, your way: a course to fit your needs

- Your Foundation Certificate or International Year One course will have a special combination of modules that's designed to fit your degree and career aspirations. This means that your course is matched to your unique goals.

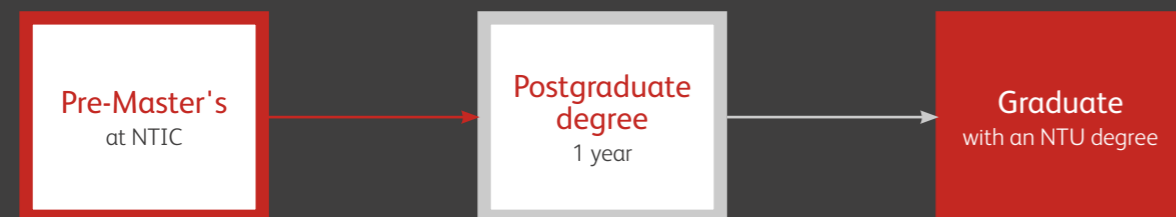

## How much money do I need to study at NTIC?

Studying in the UK is a big investment, so you need to plan ahead. You must have at least £1,015 for each month of your NTIC pathway course, up to a maximum of 9 months, as well as funds to cover any unpaid tuition fees. This money must be held in a recognised bank account for at least 28 days before you apply for your Tier 4 (General) student visa. See the guide below for more information on costs.

## How long does the application process take?

For a complete and successful application, once our Admissions team receives it, they'll issue you an offer within 1 working day. The duration of the process that follows can vary, so you should apply at least a few months ahead. This will give you enough time to apply for your visa, reserve your accommodation and get ready for your trip.

## Are scholarships available?
