You have requested public records concerning automatic license plate readers (ALPRs), software, data storage, etc. which are owned/purchased by Lexington Police Department (LPD).

- 1) Policies and procedures for

 - b) The storage of data collected by ALPRs; when the storage of data collected by ALPRs;
 - c) Data sharing of information collected by ALPRS

We do not have any policy or procedures concerning ALPRs. The documents you have requested do not exist.



The Technology

With the use of up to 3 cameras, license plate images are transmitted to the processing unit at a rate of 25 frames per second. Each plate capture is then compared to Hot List databases. Vehicles found in a database will alarm in milliseconds.




