CHAIR REPORT AGM 2021

This 9th Annual General Meeting of the AFL Barwon Football Commission Ltd signifies the formal completion of the 2021 season of Football and Netball. Unfortunately, other important elements of our Community sport season have again been missing as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic. Whilst we did get to complete some games and some finals in a truncated draw, the intervention of Covid outbreaks and the ensuing restrictions necessary to protect the health of our communities, means that we end 2021 in the most part unfulfilled. It is of great credit to our army of volunteers that we have managed to provide the structure and environment to keep our clubs stable and viable whilst at the same time affording our 23,000 participants with the opportunity to actively participate in our great games of Football and Netball in a time when active participation was needed more than ever before. The legacy of the work by our volunteers is that we can and will bounce back from the two seasons decimated by the pandemic.

Having managed to steer a course through lockdowns and pandemic induced restrictions throughout 2019 and 2020, AFL Barwon will now focus on the need to bounce back to full participation and to unlock the growth potential of our leagues and clubs. The 2020 Covid operational plan has served its purpose in enabling us to navigate through the past year but the strategic direction of AFL Barwon will be redeveloped in the coming months to set the plan for our future. The Strategic Plan will chart the course for the next 3-5 years and beyond.

I must acknowledge the great work of our AFL Barwon team. They have performed brilliantly in very difficult circumstances and as a result the organisation is well placed to reboot into season 2022. The work of both Georgia Hillman and Sean Atkinson during the year has been both impressive and appreciated. They each took on the Acting Region Manager role during 2021 and have steered AFL Barwon with great care and skill throughout. They deserve our highest praise.

We have learned a lot about dealing with adversity in recent years. Now is the time to use the learnings of 2019 and 2020 to be better in 2022. Many new technologies and methods have been fast tracked and embedded into our lives that will be of ongoing benefit to our operations at Club, League and Commission level. There will be significant investment into the bounce back from Covid from all levels of Government and from our peak sporting bodies. AFL Barwon is cognisant of the need to support our volunteers to enable them to continue to engage with our stakeholders and will continue to advocate for further investment into Community Clubs. It is expected that there will be announcements in the coming months that

will be well received by all stakeholders. It is appropriate to acknowledge the financial support received during the pandemic from the AFL and all levels of Government. Without the injection of grants and funding over the past year it would have been impossible to maintain our workforce and operations which would have left us unable to quickly build our capacity to bounce back from the pandemic.

With the appointment of Bruce Harwood to the role of Region Manager AFL Barwon will rebuild our team to full strength and provide the capacity to deliver the best service to our stakeholders and to our partners.

AFL Barwon will engage with our Umpires to find new ways to build the support needed to enhance the vital role Umpiring plays in our game. We will continue to look at ways to grow our football and netball participation and work with AFL Victoria to achieve that goal. The development team led by Harry Sleigh is doing great work and our junior participation numbers remain strong and despite the pandemic are still growing. We have a strong netball community and work effectively with Netball Victoria to ensure the growth in participation continues. Netball is a pivotal part of AFL Barwon and our stakeholders.

I would like to thank the AFL Barwon Commissioners for their professionalism and dedication to the governance of Football and Netball in the region. I think we are all very fortunate to have Commissioners with the skill sets to provide sound governance and strategic direction to the organisation. In particular I would like to thank Deputy Chair Michelle Gerdtz for her great support to me as Chair and to the Commission.

2022 is the time for us all to “bounce back” into Community sport. I look forward to seeing all of our stakeholders back at our Community clubs to enjoy the fruits of our labour. There is nothing better than the thought of getting back together at the Football or Netball and enjoying a day out at any one of our great clubs. Good luck to all clubs and participants for 2022. We will be back bigger and better than ever.

GENERAL MANAGERS REPORT

2021 was another season of challenges and uncertainty with the Covid-19 pandemic impacting on our community football and netball competitions across the AFL Barwon Region. What started as a positive outlook that the dramas of 2020 were behind us, it ended up the reason for us putting a halt to our seasons at the most frustrating point in time. The positive that we were able to get participants of all ages back playing community sport this year outweighs the disappointment of non-completed season.

In similar circumstances to the 2020 season, there was a constant monitoring of State Government announcements and consultation with local health experts meant AFL Barwon staff had to continually provide updates to clubs on the state of play. The AFL Barwon region was one of the final regions to declare a cancellation to our seasons after Victorian Government's Roadmap to deliver the National Plan didn't allow community sport to continue within the timeframes of our season dates. Whilst we continued to push the season dates back, unfortunately time eventually was against us.

It can't be underestimated the amount of work and time it required for volunteers to make sure football and netball was able to be played in 2021. There were extra responsibilities and requirements enforced on clubs each training night or match day as per Government restrictions. Every club volunteer from the President through to the COVID marshals need to be thanked for their efforts this season. We thank the clubs for their continuous support of AFL Barwon this year.

Whilst there wasn't a full season of Football and Netball completed, there were some key projects that took place throughout the season. The G21 & AFL Barwon Regional Strategy – Towards 2030 received final approval and adoption by all 5 local government areas. This strategy will give the region a full understanding of the investment requirements into infrastructure and the strong plans to be put in place to drive our sports forward. There were also projects undertaken looking at the junior netball competition structures and junior football pathways in the Colac Region. This two projects are key for the long-term sustainability of the region and to ensure participation and enjoyment continues to thrive.

AFL Barwon is fortunate to have many long-term and loyal partners who have shown unwavering support in 2021, despite the tough economic climate, we are extremely grateful for this. To all of our valued partners who make significant contributions, we cannot thank you enough and we hope to continue to strengthen these relationships into the future as we strive to create safe and inclusive environments at all clubs.

We could not be prouder of AFL Barwon's staff over the last twelve months. The level of commitment each staff member has shown to their position, the organisation and the wonderful clubs and volunteers that make up our region has enabled us as an organisation to get through this challenging period and begin to plan for the future. All staff have gone above and beyond while feeling the challenges and they should be commended for the role they have played. The staff at AFL Barwon are not only fantastic at what they do, but are great people which is benefit to the Region.

We would also like to thank the AFL Barwon Commission, led by Chairman Craig Keating and Michelle Gerdtz. The Commission has made sound governance decisions and continue to provide outcomes that have the best interest of the entire region at the forefront of their minds. Our region is a strong one, and a sound financial position will continue to progress the future of football and netball well beyond 2021. This year there have been many learnings and the challenges will continue, but the learnings will allow us to improve and refine our practices.

A further thank you to AFL Victoria and Netball Victoria on their guidance and support over the past 12 months in navigating through updated restrictions and protocols. The Colac & District FNL Board, in particular to Chairmen Peter Hickey. Thank you also to Neville Whitley and the GDFNL Board for their collaboration this season. A special thank you also to Rob Vines and the Geelong Cricket Association Board for their collaboration.

We look forward to returning to a 2022 season where we see our community enjoying the great games of football and netball back to some normality.

FOOTBALL OPERATIONS REPORT

MICHAEL LIMB

SENIOR FOOTBALL & UNDER 19 FOOTBALL

After the disappointment of 2020 where we were unable to play any Senior football, 2021 commenced with great excitement and measured optimism. Whilst some protocols were still required, a sense of “normality” began to emerge, and it was extremely rewarding to have footy back. Sadly, the events that followed created an incredibly difficult situation with ongoing uncertainties and interruptions to playing and training. All clubs did an amazing job to remain positive, patient, and compliant with each of the challenges that were presented. The resilience of all involved is to be commended. Unfortunately, only the BFNL Seniors, Reserves and Under 19 Division 2 were able to commence a final series, but after one week were unable to progress any further. The highest ranked teams at the time all seasons were cancelled will be acknowledged.

UNDER 19S

We conducted 3 divisions with 10, 8 & 4 teams competing respectively in each division. At the time seasons were cancelled, St Joseph's were ladder leaders in Division 1, Drysdale were on top of Division 2 and Belmont Lions led Division 3.

There was a significant drop in team numbers with only 22 teams entered after having 28 teams in 2019. No club entered a 2nd team in their own right, Sth Barwon and St Joseph's entered a combined 2nd team, 14 clubs were unable to field a team in that age group, Modewarre & Queenscliff entered a combined side. Whilst there were a range of mitigating factors for this year's decline in numbers following the Covid affected 2020, it continued a disturbing trend at this age level.

Data has been reviewed and feedback sought during the course of 2020 to determine the success of the changed age groups. It was concluded from all the evidence provided that this age group was not a viable option, and it was determined that we will revert to Under 18s for 2022 and beyond. All other age groups below will also be amended accordingly to provide two year age differences.

BFNL

Torquay finished the BFNL Seniors 12 home and away games on top of the ladder undefeated. Modewarre, Barwon Heads, Ocean Grove and Anglesea were hard to separate filling the other finals spots. Torquay capped off a dominant season with their spearhead Lucas Anderson winning the BFNL League goal kicking with 56 goals, Midfielder James Darke taking out the Les Ash Medal. Mitch Taylor from Ocean Grove was recognised as the BFNL Rookie of the year.

GFNL

St Mary's and Colac were again the dominant sides in GFNL Seniors, with Colac experiencing their only loss for the season to St Mary's in the 11th and ultimately final completed round. St Mary's finished the season undefeated on top of the ladder with only a draw to Newtown & Chilwell breaking their winning streak. Sth Barwon, Bell Park, Geelong West Giants & St Joseph's were the other finals contenders with Grovedale not far behind them. The Mathieson medal was an emphatic victory to St Mary's young gun Harry Benson. Rookie of the year winner Tom Gillett from Grovedale also won the Goal kicking with 42 Goals.

CDFNL

The Colac & District FNL season started brightly, but a related Covid scare resulted in the round 3 clash between Simpson and Alvie being postponed until later in the season.

At the conclusion of 12 completed rounds Alvie headed the ladder with them and South Colac only experiencing one loss each. They were the dominant teams in the Senior competition being six points head of nearest rival Irrewarra-Beeac.

The Mahoney Medal was won by Apollo Bay recruit Brad King who narrowly edged out another seasoned campaigner in Irrewarra-Beeac's Ben Lavars by one vote. Alvie spearhead Dominic Dare took out the Goalkicking award with 59 goals and Tyler Black from South Colac was selected by the coaches as the recipient of the Max Gray award for best Under 21 player.

I would like to acknowledge the amazing efforts of our staff, our Operations team in particular worked tirelessly to maximise the opportunities for us to conduct a season through extremely difficult and uncertain times. With an inordinate amount of personnel changes and limited experience, all staff stepped straight up to the plate and displayed incredible professionalism throughout the year. The difficulties and challenges were equally shared at club level, and I would again like to express my appreciation to all the club volunteers for their hours of work, patience and understanding as they ensured all the required tasks were performed in a timely and efficient manner. They are often thankless tasks but are vital and very much appreciated by all here at AFL Barwon.

FEMALE FOOTBALL REPORT

MEG HUTCHINS

The growth of Female Football in the region continued to rise with 68 Teams entered across 9 divisions, competing within the following: 3 Senior competitions, 1 Under 18 competition, 3 Under 15 competitions and 1 competition respectively for both the Under 12 and Under 10 Divisions. These numbers demonstrate a 5% increase in Female teams entered to compete since 2019.

Talent pathways are strong with the Falcons, VFLW and AFLW competitions all tapping into the talent we are uncovering and nurturing.

The season itself was challenging, with several COVID-19 enforced lockdowns to navigate through. In total, 4 regulation rounds were cancelled due to lockdowns – and the final 2 games of the finals series were ultimately lost. This meant we were unfortunately not able to award a Premier for the 2021 Season.

It is important however, to acknowledge the teams who finished the season as the highest ranked in their respective competitions at the time the seasons were cancelled. AFL BARWON PARTICIPATION REPORT

The future of football in the AFL Barwon region has never been stronger, this year local Auskick participants grew by over 20% from 2019 to their highest ever level 3,932, the largest regional growth across the whole of Australia. AFL Barwon club participation saw similar levels of participation as the 2019 season which is a testament to all clubs providing a safe environment after a Covid effected year. The growth of participation in the region can be attributed to all the amazing work of volunteers across the region. Volunteers did a remarkable job of ensuring all participants had a safe and successful return to the football field.

The key focus areas for the AFL Barwon Participation strategy for 2021 have been to build the participation base at Auskick level, work on transition and retention programs within our junior competitions and look to embed diversity and inclusion in everything we do.

BUILDING THE BASE

The key to us building a successful base with the local clubs at grass roots level this year has been through the engagement of primary school children. Our team were able to deliver in school programs promoting Auskick to over 70 Schools across Term 1, 2 & 3, handing out flyers to approximately 5,500 kids.

TRANSITION AND RETENTION

A main focus of our team is keeping our participants engaged year on year. This season we worked with a number of junior clubs aiding in the transition of Auskick participants to Junior Football next season, our aim is to ensure parents and the participants feel prepared and have a clear idea of what the junior pathway is available to them. In addition to this we want to ensure our participants are enjoying their experience, after completing a survey and receiving live feedback we were able to work with clubs in the Barwon region to run Gala events to help retain participants for future seasons.

DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

We have been working closely with the Geelong Cats this season in the North Geelong community running a number of different programs. Running a 4 week after school program with the Northern Bay Campus' transitioning a large portion of these participants into their local Auskick Centre, allowing many children who had never played football the opportunity to develop new skills. Additionally, 'Welcome to Geelong' was a huge success with 150 participants coming down to GMHBA to learn about Australian Rules Football! We would like to thank Geelong Football Club for all their support this year.

HIGHLIGHTS

Record Auskick Participation - AFL Barwon boasted their highest participation in the Auskick program ever, up 672 participants on 2019.

Record Female Participation - AFL Barwon hit their highest ever participation in Female Football with 2,031 participants and 66 teams taking part in AFL Barwon competitions.

Footy4Fun Project - Running an Auskick to Junior Football transition program/competition with neighbouring clubs looking to improve the number of kids making the transition into junior football.

Project 50 - 130 Kids participated in an After School Auskick Program ran at Northern Bay College, with majority of these children transitioning to the Northern Stars Auskick Centre.

Auskick Centre Check In - Our Local Participation Coordinators made over 60 visits to local Auskick centres in 2021, providing Auskick centres valuable support, feedback and advice to ensure the best possible experience to participants.

The AFL Barwon Participation team would again like to thank all the volunteers they have worked with in 2021. After a Covid effected year in 2020 participation in the region this year was about clubs and Auskick centres getting football back up and running in a safe environment for participants. Volunteers did a fantastic job of letting football in the region prosper in 2021. We cannot wait to start working on participation in the region for 2022!

TRIBUNAL REPORT

MICHAEL LIMB

In 2021 the Covid lockdowns resulted in 33% of scheduled rounds not being conducted and only one weekend of finals for female football and BFNL being played. There were 22% less reports laid than in 2019, so the net number demonstrates a small increase in reports laid across the competitions in games played.

There was a total of 60 reports laid across AFL Barwon Leagues in the 2021 season. This was a drop of 17 from 2019 (no games played in 2020).

These reports comprised

**43 Senior Grade 3 Reserve Grade,
2 Under 19s 10 from Junior Grades,
0 Netball 2 from Female Football**

They include 5 reports referred as a result of investigations, 25 that were referred by the Match Review Panel and 30 that were reported by the officiating umpires.

35 players accepted the set penalty option. A total of 90 matches will be or have been missed by players through suspensions received in 2021. A significant increase of 19 from last year given there was only 67% of matches played.

Our Match Review Panel assessed 108 requests. 25 of these were of incidents reported on the day by the officiating umpire.

**No vision – 21
Inconclusive vision – 3
Not reportable – 48**

They found 16 reportable offences. 13 of these players accepted set penalties, 3 players challenged their charge at tribunal, 4 clubs were fined for engaging in Melee. Of the 3 that were heard at Tribunal, 2 were found guilty.

Our appreciation is extended to the members of the MRP who volunteered their time on a weekly basis to assess relevant footage as requested and provide their judgements. Tribunal results would indicate that their judgements were appropriate.

I would like to congratulate and thank Amanda Evans who took on the role of Tribunal Chairperson for 2022. Amanda provided professional leadership that complemented the astute and consistent delivery of fair and reasonable judgements by all panel members. Arthur Hodgson continued his excellent work as our League Prosecutor and ensures the most informed and balanced decisions can be made by the Tribunal Panel..

I would again like to thank Rob Drew for his work as Tribunal Secretary with the co-ordination, scheduling and running of the Tribunal sessions, I would also like to thank our Director of Umpiring Jock Hillgrove for his work coordinating and organizing the umpires in their role.

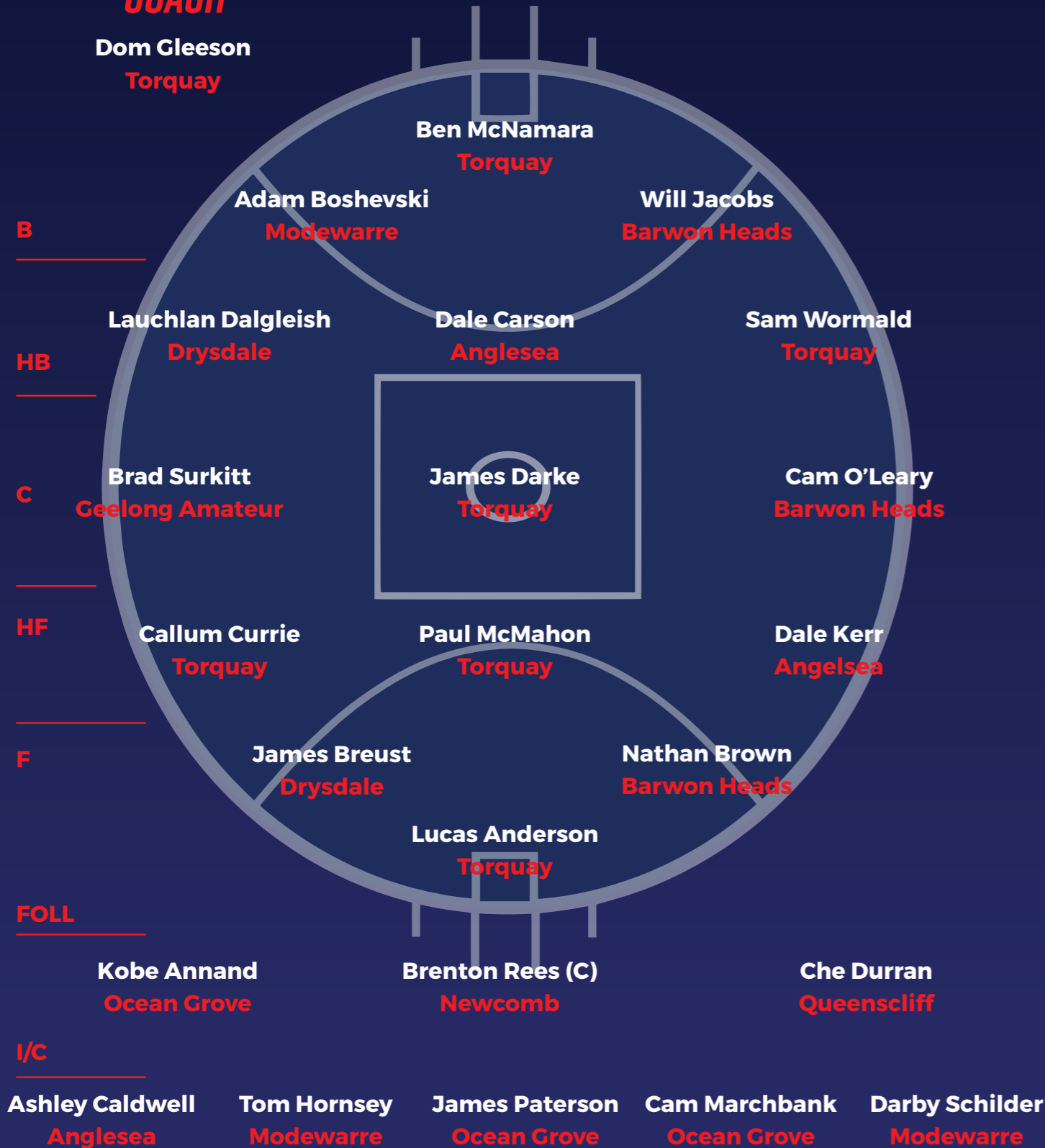

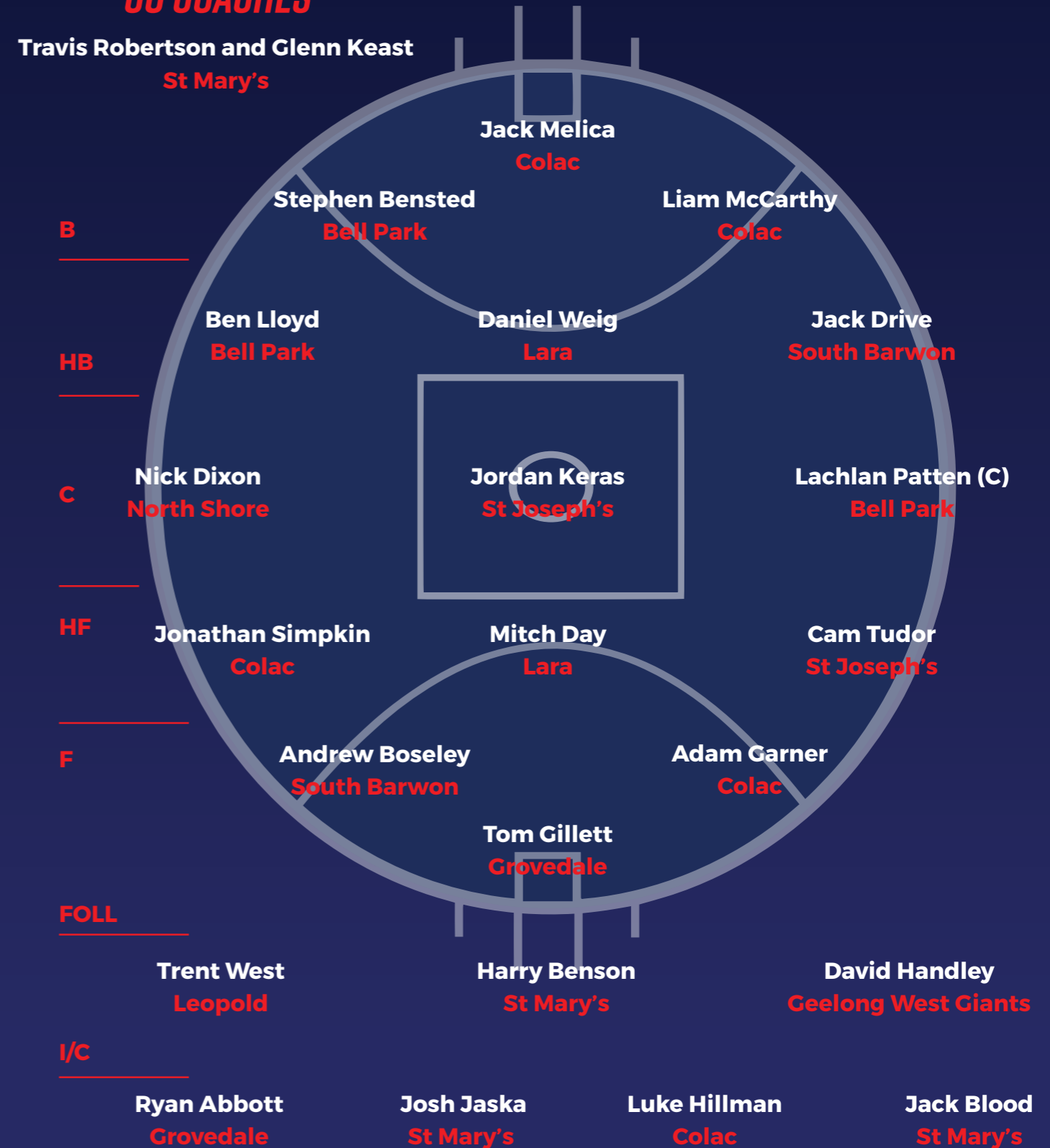

Results

The current year net profit amounted to \$199,182 (2020: loss of \$53,729).

Short term and long-term objectives

The short term and long-term objectives of the company are to deliver on the Vision, Mission and Values as well as action the strategic plan, focusing on; Participation, Community, Engagement, Development and Welfare, Facilities, Sustainability and People & Culture.

Performance measurement

The company uses the following key performance indicators to measure performance;

- The net profit for the year amounted to \$199,182 (2020: loss of \$53,729).
- Cash flow from operating activities for the financial year was \$69,605 (2020: \$123,121).
- Membership for the financial year was 51 (2020: 51).

Review of operations

The company continues to engage in its principle activity, the results of which are disclosed in the attached financial statements.

Significant changes in state of affairs

AFL Barwon has been impacted significantly by COVID-19 with all senior football and netball seasons (including juniors) being disrupted greatly, eventually causing the cancellation of finals series. This impacted our revenue which impacted the organisations operating model.

Principal activities

The principal activity of the company during the year was the promotion Football and Netball in the AFL Barwon region.

No significant change in the nature of these activities occurred during the year.

After balance date events

The Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic continues to impact Metropolitan Melbourne, Regional Victoria and Nationally where the company has operations.

The association has responded to all Government measures and has COVID-safe plans. The potential impact on the association's operations, cashflows and financial position cannot be reasonably estimated.

No other matters or circumstances have arisen since the end of the financial year which significantly affected or may significantly affect the operations of the company, the results of those operations, or the state of affairs of the association in future financial years.

Likely developments

The company expects to maintain the present status and level of operations until COVID-19 restrictions are eased which will allow sport to be played and the resumption of our main principal activity.

Environmental regulation

The company's operations are not regulated by any significant environmental regulation under a law of the Commonwealth or of a State or Territory.

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are for AFL Barwon Football Commission Limited an individual entity, incorporated and domiciled in Australia. AFL Barwon Football Commission is a company limited by guarantee.

(a) Basis of preparation of the financial report

These general purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards – Reduced Disclosure Requirements and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') and the *Corporations Act 2001*, as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities.

Historical Cost Convention

The financial report has been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Australian Accounting Standard's set out accounting policies that the AASB has concluded would result in financial statements containing relevant and reliable information about transactions, events and conditions. Material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are presented below and have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise.

The financial statements, except for the cash flow information, have been prepared on an accrual basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities. The amounts presented in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest dollar.

(b) Revenue

Revenue, including government grant funding that is subject to a funding arrangement that is both enforceable and sufficiently specific regarding its purpose, is recognised at a point in time or over time, when (or as) the company satisfies performance obligations by transferring the promised goods to its customers.

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customers.

Government grant funding provided to the company in accordance with a funding arrangement that is not both enforceable and sufficiently specific regarding its purpose, is recognised as revenue in the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income when the company obtains control of the grant and it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the company and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

Interest revenue is recognised when it becomes receivable on a proportional basis taking in to account the interest rates applicable to the financial assets.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

(c) Income tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the company is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(d) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand and at banks, short-term deposits with an original maturity of three months or less held at call with financial institutions, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2021

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(e) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(f) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses.

Plant and equipment

Plant and equipment is measured on the cost basis.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by directors to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over their estimated useful lives commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(g) Trade and other payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the company during the reporting period that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(h) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the company has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

(i) Employee benefits

(i) Short-term employee benefit obligations

Liabilities arising in respect of wages and salaries, annual leave, accumulated sick leave and any other employee benefits expected to be settled within twelve months of the reporting date are measured at their nominal amounts based on remuneration rates which are expected to be paid when the liability is settled. The expected cost of short-term employee benefits in the form of compensated absences such as annual leave is recognised in the provision for employee benefits. All other short-term employee benefit obligations are presented as payables.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2021

NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

(ii) Long-term employee benefit obligations

Liabilities arising in respect of long service leave and annual leave which is not expected to be settled within twelve months of the reporting date are measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflow to be made in respect of services provided by employees up to the reporting date.

Employee benefit obligations are presented as current liabilities in the balance sheet if the entity does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the reporting date, regardless of when the actual settlement is expected to occur.

Contributions are made by the company to an employee superannuation fund and are charged as expenses as incurred.

(j) Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs can include interest, amortisation of discounts or premiums relating to borrowings, ancillary costs incurred in connection with arrangement of borrowings, foreign exchange losses net of hedged amounts on borrowings.

Borrowing costs are expensed as incurred, except for borrowing costs incurred as part of the cost of the construction of a qualifying asset are capitalised until the asset is ready for its intended use or sale.

(k) Leases

The company has adopted AASB 16 from 1 November 2019. The standard replaces AASB 117 'Leases' and for lessees eliminates the classifications of operating leases and finance leases. Except for short-term leases and leases of low-value assets, right-of-use assets and corresponding lease liabilities are recognised in the statement of financial position.

Straight-line operating lease expense recognition is replaced with a depreciation charge for the right-of-use assets (included in operating costs) and an interest expense on the recognised lease liabilities (included in finance costs). For lessor accounting, the standard does not substantially change how a lessor accounts for leases.

The company has elected not to apply the recognition and measurement criteria above to:

- (i) *Short-term leases* – where the lease term does not exceed 12 months;
- (ii) *leases of low value assets* – leases for which the underlying asset has a fair value below \$10,000.

Lease payments for leases that have been designated as *short-term leases* or *leases of low value assets* are expensed on either a straight-line basis over the lease term or another systematic basis.

(l) Comparatives

Where required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

(m) Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts in the financial statements. Management continually evaluates its judgements and estimates in relation to assets, liabilities, contingent liabilities, revenue and expenses. Management bases its judgements, estimates and assumptions on historical experience and on other various factors, including expectations of future events, which management believes to be reasonable under the circumstances. The resulting accounting judgements and estimates will seldom equal the related actual results.

The judgements estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities (refer to the respective notes) within the next financial year are discussed below.

Employee benefits provision

As discussed in note 1(i), the liability for employee benefits expected to be settled more than 12 months from the reporting date are recognised and measured at the present value of the estimated future cash flows to be made in respect of all employees at the reporting date. In determining the present value of the liability, estimates of attrition rates and pay increases through promotion and inflation have been taken into account.

Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic

Judgement has been exercised in considering the impacts that the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic has had, or may have, on the Company based on known information. This consideration extends to the nature of the services offered, customers, and staffing. Other than as addressed in specific notes, there does not currently appear to be either any significant impact upon the financial statements or any significant uncertainties with respect to events or conditions which may impact the Company unfavourably as at the reporting date or subsequently as a result of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

Key estimates

Impairment

The company assesses impairment at the end of each reporting period by evaluating conditions and events specific to the company that may be indicative of impairment triggers.
