CHAIRMAN REPORT



Welcome to the AFL Barwon Annual General Meeting for 2017. This will be the 5th annual report to our affiliates since the formation of the Commission in 2012. The report will outline the progress made during the 2017 season and provide direction for the journey ahead.

We continue to enjoy the outstanding work of our club volunteers. The Football and Netball games we present are of the highest standard in regional Australia and the benefits that flow to our community as a result should never be under-estimated. It is the excellence of the sporting performance we strive for that drives the continuous improvement of our clubs – and it is the high quality of leadership and governance in our clubs that enables sporting excellence.

In 2017 AFL Barwon updated the Strategic Plan of 2014-2017 which has morphed into the 2017-2020 version. This plan has been communicated to stakeholders throughout 2017 and provides a clear vision for our region affiliates and their communities to engage with in order to ensure the growth and prosperity of our affiliates.

Participation

Participation is a key objective for AFL Barwon. The major focus this year has been the reviews of Junior Football and Netball. The work has been largely completed in these areas and the actions identified have been communicated to stakeholders. These actions will be developed and prioritised in the coming months and will provide the right environment to encourage growth in participation and better manage our competitions.

Umpiring remains a key focus for the Commission. There is a need to invest in Umpiring to ensure that our Umpires are well supported and resourced across the AFL Barwon region. The participation growth for football and netball umpires needs to meet or exceed the growth in our games. The appointment of the Regional Director of Umpiring, along with some innovative and specific program development, is crucial to achieving the required increase in both the number and quality of umpires. AFL Barwon is prepared to further increase the funding commitment to Umpire coaching and recruitment in 2018.

The Competition Restructure start date for 2019 draws ever nearer. The Commission has engaged with all affiliates to ensure a smooth transition in 2019 and beyond. This engagement is key to the success of the plan and will continue to be a focus for AFL Barwon Commissioners and staff over the next 12 months. The Commission is determined to promote vibrant and sustainable Clubs and Leagues that are at the heart of the Community in which they reside.

The growth in female participation in Football and Netball in the AFL Barwon region is massive. On the back of the inaugural AFLW season the interest in female football is expected to be a key focus moving forward. Clubs are encouraged to embrace the concept and the number of teams and competitions is forecast to continue to grow in 2018 and beyond. One of the significant challenges to build on this growth is the scheduling and infrastructure necessary to support female footy. AFL Barwon will work with our clubs to facilitate these competitions.

The Netball review has identified many of the issues that are challenging to the continued growth of participation in Netball. Our junior competitions face challenges in finding appropriate facilities to accommodate the games and the scheduling of games is a multi-faceted problem that will require careful planning and significant consultation with our clubs.

AFL Barwon is committed to finding solutions to these problems to meet the key objectives of Participation and Club sustainability.

Community:

AFL Barwon affiliates are well known to be leading organisations in the community. It is important that we uphold the values of AFL Barwon - Accountable, Progressive, **Respectful** – to ensure that our clubs retain that prominence and respect in our wider communities. Community awareness, behavioural standards and good governance and leadership will assure that our clubs support quality management and provide an environment that will motivate volunteers, umpires, coaches, teachers and fans for all levels of Football and Netball.

Integrity & Sustainability:

Our integrity measures in the areas of on field discipline have been strengthened and the Match Review Panel and Tribunal changes implemented have ensured a fair and proper process to enforce the integrity measures. The Commission has flagged changes to some of the Appeal processes and is working with the peak bodies to make the system more consistent and accountable. This will be a priority in the coming months with a view to implementation for the 2018 season. Off field integrity and governance measures are constantly changing along with the expectations of our society. The Commission is, and will remain, vigilant to challenges that arise from advances in technology and communication media.

The continued evolution of the Club Sustainability measures will provide a template for clubs to monitor and control player payments and ensure that compliance with the CCSP rules is not too onerous for our club volunteers. The Player Payments and Player Points System (PPS) are central to club sustainability and AFL Barwon will absolutely uphold the integrity of these programs. The range of sanctions available to the Commission in these matters is wide ranging and will be enforced with rigour in the event of any breaches.

AFL Barwon is developing policies to enable similar sustainability measures to be applied to our Netball competitions. This is being undertaken with the co-operation and input of all clubs and Netball Victoria. This will be a major project to be undertaken in the coming months and will require much consultation with all stakeholders.

I would like to acknowledge the great work of the leaders in our sports who accept the responsibility to govern and operate our organisations with both passion and integrity. Our community is well served by the volunteers at our clubs and leagues and on behalf AFL Barwon and the wider Community I thank you all.

In closing I would like to thank all of the AFL Barwon staff, under the leadership of GM Lee Hartman, for their tireless efforts that often go above and beyond the call of duty.

Last but not least the AFL Barwon region is fortunate to have nine committed Commissioners who make a significant and selfless contribution to achieving the mission and vision outlined in the strategic plan.

OPERATIONS MANAGER REPORT



With our Region in the 2nd year of operation under a Salary Cap and the Points system, the landscape at club level with regard to player recruitment strategies was evident. It is hoped that clubs will experience some form of relief with the need to raise excessive revenue and all sides will eventually have equal access to the recruitment of quality players.

AFL Victoria conducted a thorough review of their policies and has made some minor amendments emanating from this feedback.

Colts

The Under 18 ½ Colts structure continued to flourish this year, with 36 teams representing a total of 28 clubs registered for the start of the 2017 season.

We again conducted 4 divisions with 10,8,10 & 8 teams competing respectively in each division. Unfortunately Winchelsea were forced to withdraw their team halfway through the season due to a lack of players. This was again an evenly contested year in most grades including hotly contested finals series in all grades with players from 18 different clubs experiencing finals football. This age group will be changing to Under 19 in 2018, as requested throughout the junior review, but will continue to be a graded competition.

Interleague

The GFL again successfully defended their mantle as the number one League in the state, by defeating the Mornington Peninsula-Nepean FNL at the MCG to retain their position as the undisputed champions of Victorian Football. The game was played as a curtain raiser to the AFL's Country Round Clash between Essendon and Geelong. The Bob Cahir Memorial Medal for best player on the

ground was awarded to Newtown & Chilwell stalwart Matthew McMahon. Unfortunately due to the fixturing of the game at the MCG, there was no under 19 football or Netball played. Similarly there was no interleague for the BFNL due to the late withdrawal of their scheduled opponent the Sunraysia FNL. I would again like to thank our head GFNL football coach; Jeremy Dyer and his coaching staff for the time and effort that they provided during the preparation and on match day. I would also like to thank the support staff who volunteered their time and effort to ensure the players and leagues had all they needed to get the teams onto the field.

BFNL

In what was another extremely close season, Barwon Heads proved to be the early ladder leaders, but Torquay and Geelong Amateur also produced consistent performances and at the end of the home and away season, Torquay led the way, closely followed by Geelong Amateur and Barwon Heads. Last year's Grand Finalist Modewarre played the highly fancied Ocean Grove in the elimination final. The first weekend saw strong wins to Geelong Amateur and Modewarre. The Ammos accounted for Torquay in the 2nd semi final to storm into their fourth consecutive Grand Final, whilst Barwon Heads pushed passed Modewarre to play Torquay in the Preliminary Final. Some poor kicking by Barwon Heads cost them dearly with Torquay earning another crack at Geelong Amateur in the Grand Final. It was then Ammos turn to be wasteful in front of goal, and a hard fought well drilled performance saw Torquay win their first senior flag in eleven years. Ammos power forward Mitch Day again won the BFL League goal kicking with 70 goals, whilst Torquay mid fielder James Darke returned from a brief stint in the GFL to

easily win his 2nd Les Ash Medal from last year's runner-up James Linton from Ocean Grove.

GFNL

St Joseph's dominated the home and away season finishing on top, undefeated on 18 wins. Bell Park & St Mary's were next having lost only 3 games each, they were closely followed by Colac who only lost 4 games. Last year's premiers Leopold made up the final five with 4 less wins. The rest of the teams were well back, but a vastly improved season from North Shore saw them finish 7th with plenty of optimism for the future. Colac continued their success on the open spaces of Simonds Stadium by winning their way through to the preliminary final, pushing past Leopold and Bell Park who both went out in straight sets. St Mary's inflicted defeat on St Joseph's for the first time this year in their 2nd semi Final clash. St Joseph's then rebounded against a confident Colac to record a convincing victory that took them to the Grand Final. Apparently stung into action, St Joseph's took control of the match early and cruised to an emphatic victory over a youthful, but gallant St Mary's side.

The Mathieson medal was yet another thrilling count, with one round to play, any one of 4 players were in a position to win, but Newtown & Chilwell's Matthew McMahon polled 3 votes in the last round to leap frog over Bell Park's Jarrod Garth, St Joseph's Lech Fetherstone and last year's winner Nathan Deans from Grovedale to take out the medal, with the other 3 players joint runners up. Jarrod Garth won the Goal kicking with 90 Goals.

CDFNL

The Colac & District FNL had another very successful year, with many quality players finding their way to CDFNL teams.

Last year's Premiers Birregurra were again the pace setters, finishing the Home & Away season undefeated, with their closest rivals Lorne & South Colac well back with 3 and 4 losses respectively. Alvie and Simpson filled the remaining positions in the final five. Lorne and Alvie won their way through the first weekend of the finals. The 2nd week saw Lorne put an end to Birregurra's unbeaten run and South Colac account for a much improved Alvie. Birregurra responded strongly with a good win over South Colac to set up an exciting Grand Final with Lorne. Birregurra took control early and went onto score a comfortable back to back win.

The Mahoney Medal was again an amazing count with 5 players entering round 18 separated only by 3 votes. A tense last round was called with none of these 5 players polling a vote, resulting in a tied win for Apollo Bay's Jarrod Wight and Lorne's Mark McCormack. Birregurra spear head Christian Kelly won the goal kicking trophy with 87 goals in the home and away games.

Interleague was played at Horsham with a clash against the Horsham & District Football League led by coach Steve O'Dowd. Unfortunately the boys started slowly and were unable to claw their way back into the game. Seven straight points without a goal in the 3rd term were extremely costly. Birregurra's Josh Weatherhead was named the CDFNL's best player.

As always, I would again like to thank Lee Hartman for his ongoing support and professional leadership. I would also like to thank and acknowledge the rest of our staff, in particular our Operations team of Sean, Sarah, Tayla and Jock, as well as Deb who keeps it all together for us. The contribution made by the FDMs is an extremely important component in the service we are able to provide for the clubs, and their work has been outstanding this year. It is always a pleasure working with such a cohesive, hardworking and competent team. Each year it is the same message, but I would like to express again my appreciation to all the club volunteers for their hours of work committed to ensuring all the required tasks are performed in a timely and efficient manner. They are more often than not thankless tasks, but are vital and very much appreciated by all here at AFL Barwon.

JUNIOR NETBALL REPORT



In total for our Geelong Junior Netball competitions this year we had 63 teams participate on a Tuesday night in the 11 & Under comp (45 at Kardinia Park and 18 at Ocean Grove) and on Friday night we had 72 teams participate from 13 & Under (31 teams), 15 & under (26 teams), 17 & Under (9 teams) and All Abilities (6 teams).

I would like to give a massive thanks to Matt Lindsay for assisting me every Friday night, and running the Ocean Grove 11 & Under competition. Matt is an immense help and it would be impossible to run the competitions without him.

Thank you to our Friday night umpire supervisors Shirley Fagan and Ange Cripps, and to the many Friday night mentors throughout the year. We have had a large number of new umpires begin in our Friday night competition this year and many have started to move up to be trainees, and then on to working to become badged umpires.

Our Friday night umpire mentoring program saw our 11 mentors provide training, feedback and encouragement for our junior umpires throughout the season. Working with 80 junior umpires, we were able to develop their skills and confidence to work their way back to their clubs to umpire. Many of our umpires are now permanent fixtures each week at their clubs as club umpires, and majority of our umpires were able to progress through to the next level throughout the season.

Although we are still working on improving our Panel umpire program, we managed to ensure all games had two umpires on the court. Thank you to all clubs who supported AFL Barwon with Panel umpiring this year, with last minute changes and calling upon club umpires to help fill spots. This year we worked very hard in developing and gaining new younger members onto our panel. This program will continue in 2018 where we are in the process of adding more umpires to our Panel list.

This year I would like to congratulate 3 of our AFL Barwon Panel members for obtaining there B badge accreditation for umpiring. Karen Green, Katie Castle, and Nikita Page have worked tirelessly for many years to get their umpiring up to this standard. Congratulations to you all.

With the support of these ladies not only have we allocated panel every week, but have work with umpires to get there umpiring badges.

UMPIRING REPORT



It gives me great pleasure to present my annual report for 2017.

Firstly I would like to thank all the AFL Barwon umpire coaches and support staff in Geelong and Colac for their commitment and efforts in delivering coaching programs that has delivered improvement for all umpires, we saw improved umpire performances in all finals games across the Region, I am very proud of the people who umpire games each week, I am particularly proud of the club affiliated umpires who, without you many games would not go ahead, so from all your peers and to every person involved in umpiring well done.

Umpire numbers across Geelong and Colac were stagnant in 2017, with Geelong reaching **365** (+3) umpires, coaches and support staff, while Colac grew from 69 umpires to **71** (+2) including coaches. We have had another **48** (-1) people registered as participating in umpiring which was made up from registered club appointed umpires through to School based umpire academy participants.

Umpiring needs more people involved as the rapid growth of the game is still well ahead of any growth of umpires numbers. **Geelong Umpires** have a bold target of 700 umpires while Colac Umpires need 100+

We must continue to encourage people to **"give umpiring a go"**, it's one of the best seats in the house and a way to stay in the game and former footballers are strongly encouraged to try umpiring, in a supporting and welcoming environment and bring your valued experience back to the game.

As per the table below it is evident that we do have a very diverse age group of people who participate in umpiring for the AFL Barwon Region. Umpiring does offer opportunities to people of all cultures, ages and gender, with strong accredited coaching and support personal for anyone that wants to be part of the game as an umpire

Our internal data from 2017 show an 8/1 ratio of male to female umpires, yet our new umpires for 2017 was a staggering 4/1 ratio male to female umpires, a trend and direction that we need to keep going in 2018 and beyond.

The AFL Barwon Region was again very well represented with umpires and umpire coaches from Geelong and Colac in the AFL Victoria 2017 Worksafe Country Championships, V/Line Umpire Academy, V/Line Cup and TAC Cup matches.

Over 50 umpires were involved in these programs which allowed for greater development of individual umpires by being exposed to higher opportunities similar to that as offered to players. The Geelong Umpires also have 2 umpires nominated for AFL Vic. Trials for the upcoming 2018 season. AFL Barwon was also very proud with Geelong Umpire members Nick Ross-Watson (Field), Max Visintin (Boundary) appointed to the AFL Vic Country v AFL Vic Metro match, a great accomplishment for them personally and very significant appointments for the Region, Joshua and Max went on to umpire in the GFNL Grand Final. Goal Umpire Cohen Shannon was named as one of the umpires of the Carnival at the 2017 V/Line Cup.

Sian Atkins and Nick Steel were elevated to the VFL Squad in 2017 with Sian going on to the VFL Women's Grand Final, former Colac Umpire Locky Harty was appointed to the AFLW Grand Final, Simon Blight (Boundary) and Paul Trotter (Goal) the TAC Cup Grand Final and on the biggest stage former Geelong Umpires Shaun Ryan (Field) and Adam Wojick (Goal) officiated in the 2017 AFL Grand Final. Most outstanding Umpires for Geelong Umpires were Jarrod Waight (Field), Patrick Cannard (Boundary) and David House (Goal) while the Golden Whistle in Colac went to Joshua Facey Our AFL Barwon School Based Umpire Academies again proved valuable with students participating in an umpiring specific program through GISSA and Trinity College (Colac). Eleven students went on to join Geelong Umpires during 2017, all of whom were appointed to Finals and some Junior Grand Finals which endorses the effectiveness of the program, whilst many of the other students have indicated they would look to umpire in 2018.

The highlights of the AFL Barwon School Based Academies would be our Clonard College Academy where 15 girls participated across the 6 week program with 4 girls joining Geelong Umpires (2x Field and 2 x Boundary) for the regular season, Trinity College (Colac) participants were able to umpire the U12 (Friday night) competition as part of their Academy, CDFNL arranged generous sponsorship through Fonterra Foods and Wettenhalls Transport allowing the students to gain the best match learning experience, this was a fantastic outcome for the U12 competition and the umpires, hopefully this concept can continue in 2018. St Joseph's College and Christian College Academies were well supported with several students joining Geelong Umpires as a result. We look forward to continuing these Academies and incorporating further Academies in 2018. AFL Barwon became responsible for the employment and management of umpires and umpire coaches during 2017 once the umpire affiliation agreements were finalised, we invested in more people across the coaching of umpire disciplines to further help and develop umpires in the Region, Geelong Field Umpires for the first time were coached by dual coaches Davin Reid and Steve Keating, being well received by the group allowing more versatility in delivery of sessions, Jarrod Waight came to us from the VFL and was appointed as a Senior Skills and Development Coach and also umpired games throughout the year as a regular field umpire.

AFL Umpire David Harris was added to our Junior Field Development each Wednesday night in Geelong providing unique coaching to our junior field umpires under the guidance of Darren Santospirito (Head Field Development Coach) and Joshua James (Assistant Development Coach). Rod Davies (AFL Goal Umpire Coach) assisted our Goal team lead by Colin Hood and Rob Steel with specialised skills training throughout the season. We also had seven match day observers assisting the umpire coaches with greater performance feedback. Colac umpires saw Allan Grant appointed as Head Coach after many years in Geelong assisted by Adam Edwick to develop the Colac group specifically in culture, approach and performance, challenging the status quo and produce opportunity for Colac umpires within the AFL Barwon Region. AFL Barwon High Performance Umpire Academy was established and partnered with the Geelong Falcons giving young umpires who have been identified as future VFL trialing umpires being given the chance to be introduced to a "high Performance" environment and equip them with the skills an culture that will be needed as they progressed, David Harris (AFL) lead the group on 12 umpires over 4 sessions assisted by Jarrod Waight, they all officiated the Falcons trial matches in February. As we move to 2018 umpiring will have many challenges across the Region, with the change in structure of junior football, the inclusion of a senior women's competition, all demanding the need for more umpires, Colac umpires in particular need a stronger drive from clubs to assist in the recruitment of field umpires for their group, we are all in this together and together we can grow umpire numbers. I continue to look forward to an exciting future for AFL Barwon, Geelong and Colac umpire groups as we establish strategies that will recruit and most importantly retain community umpires, provide pathways for our talent umpires and deliver strong umpire coaching which will give us greater umpire performances to each game that is officiated in the AFL B

In closing I would like to thank the AFL Barwon Commission, AFL Barwon Staff and Geelong Umpires BoM, CDFUA, AFL Victoria Umpire State Development Manager Russell O'Toole, GDFL executive, and all AFL Barwon/GDFL clubs.

TRIBUNAL REPORT

A review of the current Tribunal, MRP, Appeals and Investigations process and structure was conducted at the end of 2016. Extensive research was conducted to explore "best practices" at a number of other Major Regional Centres, Metropolitan Leagues as well as AFL Queensland. The information gathered from these visits was presented at a round table consultation with 6 of our most experienced and respected Club Advocates as well as our Investigations officer and operational staff. The findings that best suited our individual circumstances and perceived deficiencies were combined to create a revised structure and process.

The revised process gave the MRP more scope to lay or withdraw charges and offer penalties as deemed appropriate. We also sourced a paid professional Tribunal Chairman & League Prosecutor, as well as introducing the requirement to gain accreditation before acting as an advocate for a player. A Pool of trained advocates was also introduced to provide a service to clubs in need of support. Levies were introduced for players found guilty at tribunal and also as a result of involvement in Melees as deemed appropriate by the MRP. The feedback received from the clubs was positive with the perception of a more common sense, consistent and fair approach being followed.

There were a total of 120 reports laid across these leagues in the 2017 season. This was a slight drop from last year.

These reports comprised 55 Senior Grade, 14 Reserve Grade, 37 Colts, 14 from Junior Grades, and included 2 charges carried over from last year. This includes 6 reports heard at Tribunal as a result of investigations at the request of Clubs, Umpires or League for various incidents, and 20 that were referred by the Match Review Panel.

82 players accepted the set penalty option, which is almost double the number from last year. A total of 252 matches will be or have been missed by players through suspensions received in 2017.

Our Match Review Panel assessed 72 requests of which they found 20 reportable offences. 12 of these players accepted set penalties, one was sent straight to tribunal and the other 7 challenged their charge at Tribunal with 7 found guilty. Our appreciation is extended to the members of the MRP who volunteered their time on a weekly basis to assess relevant footage as requested and provide their judgements. Tribunal results would indicate that their judgements were appropriate.

I would like to congratulate Chairman Peter Murrihy and his panel members for their work and measured but consistent approach. Arthur Hodgson also did a great job as our League Prosecutor.

I would like to thank Rob Drew for his work as Tribunal Secretary with the co-ordination, scheduling and running of the Tribunal sessions, I would also like to thank our Director of Umpiring Jock Hillgrove for his work co-ordinating and organizing the umpires and their advocates.

FOOTBALL DEVELOPMENT REPORT

Development

As Football Development Managers we have successfully delivered Development Programs for AFL Victoria, as well as producing critical outcomes for the AFL Barwon Region through targeted League/Club Development Programs and strategies throughout 2017.

Participation

Our continued focus of developing and supporting all pillars of the game, from NAB AFL Auskick to Open-Age football, ensured that participation across the State and Region continued to develop:

- We were able to support 3121 NAB Auskick participants, an increase of 250 participants from the previous year.
- We supported all of our 130 AFL School Ambassadors and School Competitions including primary and secondary SSV and GISSA competitions.
- We continued to promote the game of AFL to school participants through the Sporting Schools Program.
- We conducted School Holiday Programs for 127 participants, as well as a Footy Frenzy promotions.

<u>Community</u>

We supported all of the AFL Barwon affiliated Leagues in regard to the management, structure and best practices of all our Clubs, as well as developing environments that seek to motivate committee members, volunteers, umpires and coaches at all levels in the Barwon region:

- We worked with all of the GFNL, BFNL, GDFL, CDFNL, GFUL and CFUL Football and Netball Clubs to implement outcomes that are outlined in the recently released G21 and AFL Barwon Strategic Plan.
- We conducted Facility Audits at 82 venues across the AFL Barwon Region.
- We facilitated and organised community education presentations for AFL Barwon aligned Clubs, which included topics consisting of: Vilification and Discrimination, Cyberbullying, Respect and Responsibility, Gambling and Drug & Alcohol Awareness.

- The Geelong Diverse Academy continued, giving approx. 70 players from diverse backgrounds the opportunity to learn the skills of AFL and develop as players and people.
- AFL Barwon and the Geelong Cats continued to strengthen its relationship with the Next Generation Academy program, and together introduced the Buddy Program for primary school aged students from diverse backgrounds.
- We established a Girls Under 15 competition, and grew the total number of female teams from 17 teams in 2016 to 44 teams this season.
- We conducted gala days with AFL Barwon clubs to promote students to transition to club football for over 1300 primary aged students.
- We ran the Geelong Cats Community Camp in the Northern Suburbs of Geelong, where we engaged with indigenous and multicultural groups.

<u>Fans</u>

We worked hard to develop our 'fans of the game' by working closely with the Geelong FC:

- We coordinated all of the AFL Player Appearances for Geelong FC players at approx. 90 schools, 40 junior clubs and 40 NAB Auskick centres and extra visits.
- We ran a NAB Auskick Superclinic for approx. 1,500 participants at Simonds as well as the Geelong FC Junior member's clinic for approximately 800 kids.

<u>Talent</u>

- We successfully managed and coordinated the V/Line Cup program for 49 Under 15 boys and 25 Under 16 girls.
- We were involved with the organization and running of the Worksafe Community Championships, Herald Sun Shield School football competitions and other representative games at club and school levels.
- In it's second year, the Colac Academy consisted of 44 boys from the Colac region who participated in the 8 session program.
- We accredited 219 coaches through our Senior, Youth and Junior/Auskick Coaching Courses.
- The Annual Coach of the Year Dinner for 178 guests was held, recognising the outstanding work of our Coaches and Volunteers in the AFL Barwon Region.
- Three coaches/coordinators were also recognised at state level. Congratulations to Dom Gleeson (Senior Coach of the Year Nominee), Ryan Mackay (WINNER of the State NAB Auskick Volunteer of the Year) and Barry Orvis (Allan Jeans Lifetime Achievement Award, rewarding contribution to coaching).

Engagement

We developed engagement initiatives, particularly within the multicultural and indigenous areas, as well as continuing to engage girls into football to grow female environments into the future:
