#### Introduction

In the electoral division of Edmonton-Highlands, a vacancy was created by the resignation of Pamela Barrett on February 2, 2000.

In the electoral division of Red Deer-North, a vacancy was created by the resignation of Stockwell Day on July 11, 2000.

The resulting by-elections were held pursuant to the provisions of the *Election Act*, Chapter E-2 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1980, including amendments. The electoral division boundaries described in the *Electoral Divisions Act*, proclaimed in force February 11, 1997, were used at these by-elections.

#### **Edmonton-Highlands Confirmation of Elector Information**

In accordance with Section 11(2)(c) of the *Election Act*, the Chief Electoral Officer directed that information contained in the Register of Electors was to be confirmed prior to the by-election.

Information contained in the Register of Electors was confirmed by electors through door-to-door visits from Confirmation Officials in the period from March 8 to March 20, 2000. The direct elector contact ensured that electors were given the opportunity to add, delete or revise personal elector information contained in the Register of Electors, as appropriate. Electronic updates to the Alberta Register of Electors System were completed in April, 2000.

There were 18,855 electors on the List of Electors following the Confirmation Process. The total cost to conduct the Confirmation was \$41,001. A summary is presented on Page 7.

#### **Edmonton-Highlands By-election**

By order of the Lieutenant Governor in Council, a Writ of Election, dated May 15, 2000, was issued by the Chief Electoral Officer to the Returning Officer, Nancy Barr, pursuant to Sections 36 and 37 of the *Election Act*.

Nomination Day was May 29, 2000, and Polling Day was June 12, 2000. Six candidates, each registered under the *Election Finances and Contributions Disclosure Act*, were nominated. Advance Polls were held on June 8, 9 and 10, 2000.

The Returning Officer announced the Official Results on June 22, 2000. Brian Mason, representing the Alberta New Democratic Party, was declared duly elected. The Writ of Election and the Returning Officer's Certificate and Return, certifying Mr. Mason's election, were returned to the Chief Electoral Officer on June 22, 2000. No appeal for a judicial recount, or from any decision of the Returning Officer concerning any of the ballots, was applied for pursuant to Section 142 of the *Election Act*.

The Chief Electoral Officer arranged for the publication of the By-election return in the July 15, 2000 issue of the Alberta Gazette.

Nomination deposits were forfeited by five of the six candidates. The forfeited deposits, totalling \$1,000, were paid through the Office of the Chief Electoral Officer to the Provincial Treasurer for deposit to the General Revenue Fund.

An overview of results indicating the total votes obtained by each candidate and a statement of results by poll are presented on Pages 3 through 5. A map of the Electoral Division of Edmonton-Highlands is presented on Page 6.

The total cost of the By-election was \$73,098. A summary is included on Page 8.

Registered candidates were required to file By-election Campaign Period Financial Statements with the Office of the Chief Electoral Officer, not later than October 12, 2000. The information, which pertains to candidates' election expenses, was published in the Edmonton Journal and the Edmonton Sun in accordance with Section 3(1)(d) of the Election Finances and Contributions Disclosure Act.

Registered political parties which participated must file audited financial statements not later than December 12, 2000. These financial statements will list contributions, receipts, transfers of funds/materials and expenditures concerning the campaigns. In accordance with Section 10 of the *Election Finances and Contributions Disclosure Act*, all financial statements will be available for inspection in the public files maintained by the Chief Electoral Officer and pertinent data will be published in the Twenty-fourth Annual Report of the Chief Electoral Officer for the 2000 calendar year.



#### **Red Deer-North Collection of Elector Information**

In accordance with Section 11(7.1) of the *Election Act*, the Chief Electoral Officer entered into an agreement with the City of Red Deer to obtain elector information for the purpose of updating the Register of Electors. The agreement allowed the Chief Electoral Officer to obtain elector information collected by City of Red Deer census workers from April 1 to 18, 2000. The sharing of information represented a significant cost saving and, more importantly, it eliminated the need to obtain similar information from residents of Red Deer twice during a short timeframe.

The possibility of shared data collection was explored with city municipalities, and the recently incorporated Municipal District of Wood Buffalo. To ensure currency of the Register information, agreements were considered only in areas in which census information was being gathered in the time period between April and June, 2000. Additional requirements were congruence with the standards for data integrity set by the Chief Electoral Officer, and data provision at a fiscally responsible cost. Following discussions with a number of municipalities, agreements were concluded with both Red Deer and the Municipal District of Wood Buffalo for the former city of Fort McMurray.

The information was then entered into the electronic Alberta Register of Electors System using the provincial polling subdivisions defined during the February 2000 map review.

There were 20,118 electors on the List of Electors following the Confirmation Process. The total cost to update the Register of Electors was \$26,618. This represents a significant cost savings when compared to Edmonton-Highlands, where independent data collection was required. A cost summary is presented on Page 15.

#### Red Deer-North By-election

By order of the Lieutenant Governor in Council, a Writ of Election, dated August 28, 2000, was issued by the Chief Electoral Officer to the Returning Officer, Mary Lawrence, pursuant to Sections 36 and 37 of the *Election Act*.

Nomination Day was September 11, 2000, and Polling Day was September 25, 2000. Four candidates, each registered under the *Election Finances and Contributions Disclosure Act*, were nominated. Advance Polls were held on September 21, 22 and 23, 2000.

The Returning Officer announced the Official Results on October 5, 2000. Mary Anne Jablonski, representing the Progressive Conservative Association of Alberta, was declared duly elected. The Writ of Election and the Returning Officer's Certificate and Return, certifying Ms. Jablonski's election were returned to the Chief Electoral Officer on October 5, 2000. No appeal for a judicial recount, or from any decision of the

Returning Officer concerning any of the ballots, was applied for pursuant to Section 142 of the *Election Act*.

The Chief Electoral Officer arranged for the publication of the By-election return in the November 15, 2000 issue of the Alberta Gazette.

Nomination deposits were forfeited by two of the four candidates. The forfeited deposits, totalling \$400, were paid through the Office of the Chief Electoral Officer to the Provincial Treasurer for deposit to the General Revenue Fund.

An overview of results indicating the total votes obtained by each candidate and a statement of results by poll are presented on Pages 11 through 13. A map of the Electoral Division of Red Deer-North is presented on Page 14.

The total cost of the By-election was \$49,456. A summary is included on Page 16.

Registered candidates are required to file By-election Campaign Period Financial Statements with the Office of the Chief Electoral Officer, not later than January 25, 2001. 
