# GEORGII III. REGIS.

### Cap. 59.

An Act for vesting a Workhouse and Premises, situate in the City of Londonderry, in Trustees, to be sold, and for applying the Purchase Money in building another School House, and for better regulating the same.

[12th May 1809.]

HEREAS there is and has been, for a Series of Years, a School, called a Free School, in the City and County of Londondon. School, called a Free School, in the City and County of Londonderry, which School was erected on a Scite or Plot of Ground, given by the Society of the Governor and Assistants, London, of the New Plantation of Ulster, in Ireland, for that Purpose; and the said Society, besides the Gift of the said Scite or Plot of Ground for a School House, has uniformly paid a Sum of Twenty Pounds per Annum, as a Salary to the Teacher or Master of the said School, out of its own private Funds; which Sum is totally insufficient to support the Establishment in such Way as to render it of any significant public Utility, as a Seminary of Education for the Youth of that Part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, called Ireland: And whereas the Honourable and Right Reverend William Lord Bishop of Derry, and the said Society of Governor and Assistants, London, of the said Plantation of Ulster, in Ireland, and the Twelve principal Companies of the said City of London, and the Corporation of the City, [Loc. & Per.] 1.3 A:

of Londonderry, taking into their Consideration the great Increase of Population throughout Ireland, and more especially in the said Province of Ulster, and the Advantages that must arise from a more extended Scale of Education than the present Establishment is capable of embracing, have come to a Determination to provide a Fund, by Voluntary Contribution of their own private Property, and by such Subscriptions as may be voluntarily made by others, and thereout to form a Seminary amply sufficient for the Purpose of extended Education, in all its necessary Branches: And whereas the Scite or Plot of Ground whereon the present School House now stands, is situate within the Walls of the said City, and is very much out of Repair, nor is there sufficient Space on the said Scite or Plot to build a proper School House, in case the present one was to be pulled down: And whereas the faid Scite or Plot of Ground being situate. in the said City is very valuable, and might be sold for a considerable Sum of Money, or, until sold, let beneficially; and it would be highly beneficial to the said Establishment if the same was sold or let as aforesaid; and that the Trustees herein-after named were enabled to purchase, or erect or complete a Messuage or School House, with suitable Offices and Conveniences thereto, and to purchase proper Fixtures and Furniture for the same; and also to purchase or rent a Piece of Ground suitable thereto, to be situate within the City and Liberties of the said City of Londonderry, for the Residence and Use of the Master, Asfistants, and Children of the said intended Establishment, and for other Purposes; but in as much as the same cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament, Therefore Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the said William Lord Bishop of Derry, and the said Governor and Assistants, London, of the New Plantation of Ulster, in Ireland, do most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and immediately after the passing of this Act, all that Messuage or Tenement, and School Houseand Hereditaments, with their and every of their Rights, Members, and Appurtenances, situate and being in the said City and County of Londonderry, and more particularly mentioned and described in the First Schedule to this Act annexed, and the Reversion and Reversions, Remainder and Remainders, yearly and other Rents, Issues, and Profits thereof, shall be vested in the Lord Bishop of Derry, and the Dean and Chapter of Derry for the Time being, and their respective Successors, for ever freed and absolutely discharged of, from, and against all Claims, Estate, and Interest of the said Society of the Governor and Assistants, London, of the New Plantation of Ulster in Ireland, their Heirs, Successors, Executors, Administrators, and Assigns; but nevertheless upon the Trusts, and to and for the Intents and Purposes hereafter expressed and declared of and concerning the same, (that is to say), upon Trust, that they the said Lord Bishop of Derry, and the Dean and Chapter of Derry for the Time being, and their respective Successors, do and shall, with all convenient Speed. after the passing of this Act, absolutely make sale and dispose of the said Messuage or Tenement, and School House and Hereditaments, with the Appurtenances so vested in them as aforesaid, either by public. Sale cr private Contract, unto any Person or Persons who shall be willing to become the Purchaser or Purchasers thereof, for the most Money that can be reasonably had or gotten for the same; and upon Payment of the Purchase.

Vesting the School House in Bishop and Chapter of Londonderry.

Purchase Monies in Manner herein-after mentioned, do and shall convey and affure such Messuage or Tenement, and School House and Hereditaments, with the Appurienances, unto and to the Use of the Purchaser or Purchasers thereof, his, her, or their Heirs or Assigns, or as he, she, or they shall direct or appoint, freed and discharged as aforesaid.

II. And be it further enacted, That all and every Sum and Sums of Money to be Money to arise by the Sale of the said Messuage or Tenement, and School House and Hereditaments, shall be paid by the Purchaser or Purchasers land. thereof into the Bank of Ireland, in the Name and with the Privity of the Accountant General of the High Court of Chancery in Ireland, without Fee or Reward, to be placed to his Account there, ex parte the Purchaser or Purchasers of the Estate of the Society of the Governor and Affistants, London, of the New Plantation of Ulster in Ireland, purfuant to the Method prescribed by the Irish Statute of the Twenty-third and Twenty-fourth Years of His present Majesty's Reign; Chapter Twenty-second, and the General Orders of the said Court; and that the Money, when so paid in, shall be laid out in the Purchase of Irish Government Debentures, or Irish Treasury Bills, and the Interest arising from the Money so laid out in the Purchase of such Debentures or Treatury Bills, and the Money received for the same, as they shall be respectively paid off by Government, shall be laid out in the Name of the said Accountant General, in the Purchase of other like Debentures or Treasury Bills, and that all the said Debentures and Treasury Bills shall be deposited in the said Bank, in the Name of the said Accountant General, and shall remain there until the same shall, upon a Petition to be preferred to the said Court of Chancery in Ireland, in a summary Way, by or onthe Behalf of the Lord Bishop of Derry, and the Dean and Chapter of Derry for the Time being, and their respective Successors, be ordered to be fold by the said Accountant General; for carrying the several Purposes; of this Act into Execution.

III. And be it further enacted, That the Certificate or Certificates of the Certificate faid Accountant General, together with the Receipt and Receipts of the Cashier of the Bank to be thereto annexed, and therewith filed in the Register Office of the said Court of Chancery, of the Payment into the Bank Receipts of the Carnier of Ireland, by the Purchaser or Purchasers of the Hereditaments hereby directed to be sold, of his, her, or their Purchase Money respectively, or to be sufficient of any Part of fuch Purchase Money, shall from Time to Time, and at all Times thereafter, be a good and effectual Discharge, or good and effectual Discharges, to such Purchaser or Purchasers, and to his, her; or their Heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns, for the said Purchase Monies, or so much thereof for which such Certificate or Certificates, and Receipt or Receipts, shall be respectively given; and, after filing such Certificate or Certificates, and Receipt or Receipts of the Cashier of the Bankas aforesaid, such Purchaser or Purchasers shall be absolutely acquitted and discharged of and from the same Monies, and shall not be answerable or accountable for any Loss, Misapplication, or Non-application thereof.

IV. ter of Derry for the Time being, or their respective Successors, to order and direct the Accountant General of the said Court to sell and dispose of the said Debentures and Treasury Bills, to be purchased by virtue of this Act, or of any Part or Parts thereof; and also to order and direct the Application of the Whole, or any Part or Parts, as to the said Court shall seem right and prope, of the Monies herein-before directed to be paid into the Bank, or of the Monies to be produced by Sale of the said Debentures or Treasury Bills, or of any other Sum or Sums of Money as shall from Time to Time remain or be in the Hands of the Trustees or Treasurer for the Time being, to the said School, for or towards the Purchase or Erection of a Capital Messuage or School House; and also for or towards the Purchase of sufficient Land and Ground suitable thereto, to be situate within the said City and Liberties of Londonderry, and for or towards the Purchase, building, erecting, or making, altering, or repairing of proper Offices, Out-houses, Buildings, Yards, and Gardens thereto, for the Residence and Use of the School-Master, Affistants, and Children of the said School; and also for or towards the Purpose of providing proper Fixtures and Furniture for such Capital Messuage, or School House and Buildings, in such Manner as the said Court shall, from Time to Time, upon a Petition to be preferred in a summary Way, by or on the Behalf of the said Lord Bishop of Derry, and the Dean. and Chapter of Deiry for the Time being, or their respective Successors, order and direct; and that all and fingular the said Capital Messuage or School House, Offices and Bui'dings, Lands and other Hereditaments, Fixtures and Furniture which shall be so purchased as aforesaid, shall thereupon be immediately settled, conveyed, and assured unto and to the Use of the said Lord Bishop of Derry and the Dean and Chapter of Derry for the Time being, and their respective Successors for ever, to, for, and upon such Uses, Trusts, Intents, and Purposes as shall be from Time to Time expressed, declared, and contained of and concerning the same, in and by the Orders, Rules, or Bye-Laws intended to be made for the Management and Regulation of the said School.

Prefent School House may be leased.

V. Provided always, and he it further enacted, That in the mean Time, and until such Sale shall be made of the said School House and Hereditaments hereby vested in Trust to be sold as afcresaid, it shall and may be lawful to and for the said Lord Bishop of Derry, and the Dean and Chapter of Derry for the Time being, and their respective Successors, from Time to Time, by Indentue under their Hands and Seals, to demise or lease the said Messuage, or School House and Hereditaments hereby vested in Trust to be sold as aforesaid, in Fee Farm, or for any Number of Lives, or for any Term of Years, at and under the best improved Rent that can be got for the same, and without Fine, and so as such Leases shall not be made dispunishable for Waste by any expiels Words. therein, and so as in such Leases there be reserved a Clause of Re-entry for Non-payment of the Rent or Rents to be thereby reserved, and so as the Lessee or Lesses seal and execute Counterparts thereof, a Copy of which shall be fairly written in the Registry Book to be kept by the. School-master for that Purpose.

VI. And be it further enacted, That the Lord Primate of Ireland for the Time being shall be the Visitor of the said School; and that the Lord Bishop of Derry, and the Dean and Chapter of Derry for the Time being, and

and their respective Successors, shall for ever hereaster be the Trustees of and Dean the said School, and of its Estate and Essects; and that all Lands, Tene- and Chapter ments, Hereditaments, Sum and Sums of Money, and other Effects that Trutees. shall come to the Hands of the said Trustees, or any of them, to be applied in any Manner for the Use of the said School, and which they or any of them may lawfully take by the Statute of Mortmain, or by any other Means whatsoever, shall be by them applied and disposed of in the Manner and for the Uses and Purposes appointed and directed for the Application thereof, be the same by Deed, Will, Donation, Gift, Agreement, or otherwise, and to no other Use and Furpose whatsoever.

VII. And be it further enacted, That all Lands, Tenements, Heredita- Lands, &c. ments, Sum and Sums of Money, and other Effects, that shall come to to be conthe Hands of any Person or Persons in Trust for the said School, to be Bishop and applied in any Manner for the Use thereof, and which he, she, or they Dean and may lawfully take by the Statutes of Mortmain, or by any other Means whatfoever, shall be by him, her, or them conveyed, affigned, and paid to the faid Lord Bishop of Derry, and the Dean and Chapter of Derry, for the Time being, or their respective Successors, and shall be by them: applied and disposed of in the Manner, and for the Uses appointed and directed for the Application thereof, be the same by Deed, Will, Donation, Gift, Agreement, or otherwise, and to no other Use and Purpose whatfoever...

VIII. And be it further enacted, That the General Land Agent, for the Appointment Time being, of the said Society of the Governor and Assistants, London, of the New Plantation of Ulster, in Ireland, shall be the Treasurer to the faid School, so long as he shall continue to reside in Ireland; and in case of his Non-residence therein, then, and as often as, and during the Time the same shall so happen, it shall and may be lawful to and for the Lord Bishop of Derry, and the Dean and Chapter of Derry, for the Time being, and their respective Successors from Time to Time, to nominate and appoint a Treasurer to the said School, in his Pace and. Stead; and also, from Time to Time, to displace or remove such Treasurer, according as the Lord Bishop of Derry, and the D an and Chapter of Derry, for the Time being, and their Successors, shall judge. of his well or ill Demeanor.

IX. And be it further enacted, That for the Purpose of erecting a Mes-power to suage or School House, with suitable Offices and Conveniences thereto, Bishop of the Derry to and of providing a Piece of Ground, to be held and enjoyed with the grant a Lease same, it shall and may be lawful to and for the Lord Bishop of Derry for of Land for the Time being, and his Successors, at any Time or Times after the passing the Scho of this Act, and he and they is and are hereby authorized and empowered, from Time to Time, to grant and convey the Inheritance in Fee-farm; or to make any Demise or Lease for Nine hundred and ninery-nine Years, or any other less Term or Number of Years, of all or any Part of the Piece or Parcel of Ground, more particularly mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Act annexed, (being Part of the Lands belonging to the See of Derry), unto any Person or Persons whomsoever, so as in and by each and every such Grant or Conveyance, Demise or Lease respectively, there be reserved and made payable Half-yearly or oftener, clear of all Taxes and Deductions whatsoever, such yearly Rent or Rents in Fee-farm, or dur-

Grant or Conveyance, Demise or Lease respectively, as can be reasonably obtained for the Hereditaments and Premises to be thereby granted or conveyed, demised or leased respectively, and without taking any Sum or Sums of Money, or other Thing by Way of Fine or Foregist, for or in respect of any such Grant or Conveyance, Demise or Lease respectively, and so as the Grantee or Grantees, Lessee or Lessees, execute a Counterpart or Counterparts of such Grants or Conveyances, Demises or Leases respectively, and so as in every such Grant and Conveyance there be contained Powers of Distress and Entry, and Perception of Rents and Profits, and in every such Demise or Lease a like Power of Entry and Perception of Rents and Profits for securing the Payment of the Rent or Rents thereby to be reserved or limited respectively.

The Bishop and Dean and Chapter may make Bye.

Laws.

X. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful to and for the Lord Bishop of Derry, and the Dean and Chapter of Derry for the Time being, and their respective Successors, from Time to Time to make, ordain, and establish such Rules, Orders, Regulations, and Bye-laws, and from Time to Time to amend, alter, or repeal the same, or any of them, for the regulating, governing, and managing the faid School, and all Erections, Buildings, Works, Matters, and Things thereunto belonging; and also for the regulating of the Master, Assistants, and Teachers, and all other Persons to be employed, or in anywise concerned in fuch School, and for the granting of, and regulating Salaries and other Allowances as to the said Lord Bishop of Derry, and the Dean and Chapter of Derry for the Time being, and their respective Successors, shall feem just and reasonable: Provided always, that no such Order, Rule, Regulation, or Bye-law, be repugnant to, or inconsistent with the Laws of that Part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, called Ireland, or contrary to the Directions and Provisions in this Act contained.

Byc-laws to be approved by the Lord Lieutenant.

XI. And be it further enacted, That no such Order, Rule, Regulation, or Bye-law, shall be good, valid, or effectual; nor shall any such Order, Rule, Regulation, or Bye-law, be amended, altered, or repealed, unless fuch Order, Rule, Regulation, or Bye-law, or any Amendment, Alteration, or Repeal of any such Order, Rule, Regulation, or Bye-Law, shall have been submitted to, and allowed, and approved of by the Lord Lieutenant, or Governor or Governors and Privy Council of Ireland, for the Time being, who are hereby empowered and required, on Request, from Time to Time made, by or on Behalf of the Lord Bishop of Derry, and the Dean and Chapter of Derry, for the Time being, or their respective Successors, to peruse and examine all such Orders, Rules, Regulations, or Bye-laws, as shall, from Time to Time, bemade, amended, altered, or repealed, by the Lord Bishop of Derry, and the Dean and Chapter of Derry, for the Time being, or their respective. Successors, in pursuance of this Act, and laid before them the sad Lord: Lieutenant, or Governor or Governors and Privy Council of Ireland, for the Time being, and to allow and approve of, or to disallow and. disapprove of the same, or any Part thereof, or to allow and approve of, or to disallow or disapprove of the Repeal of the Whole or any Part. thereof, as to them shall, from Time to Time, seem proper and expedient; and for doing thereof, no Fee or Reward shall be paid or taken.

XII. Provided always, and it is hereby further enacted, That it shall be Expenses of lawful for the Lord Bishop of Derry, and the Dean and Chapter of Derry, for the Time being, and their respective Successors, to defray the Costs, Charges, and Expences, attending the applying for and obtaining and passing this Act, by and out of the first Monies that shall come to their Hands for the Use of the said School, or shall happen to be in the Hands. of the Treasurer to the said School for the Time being; and also that it shall and may be lawful to and for the High Court of Chancery in Ireland, from Time to Time, to make such Order or Orders, as to the fame Court shall seem fit for ascertaining and settling the Costs and Expences of the Sale of the said School House and Hereditaments, hereby vested in Trust, to be sold as aforesaid, and the Costs of the several Applications to be made to the faid Court, respecting the Matters aforesaid, and the Costs of taking the Monies out of the said Bank, and investing. such Monies in such Purchase or Purchases as afcresaid, and also the Costs and Expences attending the Execution of all other the Trusts of this Act, and also of soliciting obtaining, and passing the same (in case fuch Costs and Expenses shall not be paid by the said Lord Bishop of Derry, and the Dean and Chapter of Derry, and their Successors, as ... herein-before is directed).

XIII. Saving always to the King's most Excellent Majesty, His Heirs and General's Successors, and to all and every other Person and Persons, Bodies Politic Saving. and Corporate, his, her, and their Heirs, Successors, Executors, and Administrators, (other than and except the said Society of the Governor and Assistants, London, of the New Plantation of User in Ireland, and their respective Heirs, Executors, Administrators, and Successors) all such Estate, Right, Title, Interest, Claim, and Demand whatsoever, of, in, to, or out of the Hereditaments hereby vested in Trust to be sold as aforesaid, as they or any of them had before the passing of this Act, or could or might have had, held, or enjoyed, in case this Act had not been made.

XIV. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be printed by the Ast may be Printer to the King's most Excellent Majesty, and a Copy there f, so given in Eviprinted, shall be admitted as Evidence thereof, by all Judges, Justices, denceand others.

### SCHEDULE (A.)

A Capital Messuage or School House, with the Out Buildings and Appurtenances thereto belonging, situated in the City of Londonderry.

#### SCHEDULE (B.)

A Piece or Parcel of Ground, containing about Four Acres, (more or lefs,) fituate within the North Liberties of the City of Londonderry, about One Half Mile from the faid City, and lying between the Road leading to Buncrana, and the Road leading to Muff.
