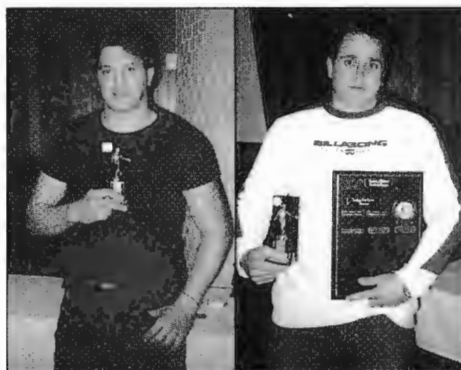

Also, thanks to our many sponsors whose generous contributions are highly valued by the club.

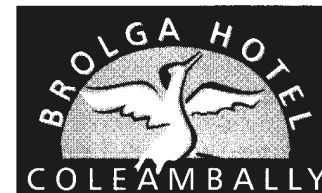
