TITLE:	Renaming of Duschene Building	
DESCRIPTION:	In October 2018, the Vice Chancellor – Professor Paul O'Prey set up a working group to review the names of University buildings following a conversation at University Senate; when it was decided that we would name the new Media Centre (Harvey) – The David Bell Media Centre.	
	The working group consisting of Gilly King (University's History and Heritage Promotions Adviser), Eleanor Merrick (University's Director of Alumni, Development and Careers), Liam Hurley (University's Director of Strategy and Communications), Professor Paul O'Prey (Vice Chancellor) and myself (Students' Union President)	
	The working group met three weeks ago and the name of the Law Building (Duschene) came up; as the Vice Chancellor had expressed his desire for us to review the name of the building. Prior to our meeting, Gilly King had a conversation with the Society of the Sacred Heart (Founding Body of Digby Stuart College) and the sisters had expressed that they would like a building to be called Mandela because there was a Mandela House on Digby Stuart College, but it was pulled down in 2002 to build Shaw House, and it saddened them deeply.	
	We decided that it would be fitting at the meeting to propose that the building called Duschene should be renamed the 'Nelson Mandela Building'. Nelson Mandela was a Lawyer and fundamentally we felt it would be symbolic to have the building that inhabits our Law School named him but also an individual that stretches past law into Humanitarianism and more.	
	The proposal has been taken to Student Senate for consultation and endorsement, I am pleased to say that the students supported this proposal. I have now received responses from Gulliver Ralston (Head of Digby Stuart College) and Giles Proctor (Head of Law School), they have both given their endorsement to the proposal. In regard to the next steps, I am taking this proposal to University Senate in January 2019 to hopefully get their endorsement and recommendation to University Council; as it's University Council that holds the power to change the name of a university building.	
	I shall keep you up to date with developments

TITLE:	RSU Part Time Officer to become member of RSU Board of Trustees
	The Students' Union by the nature of being a charity and limited company has a Board of Trustee's/Directors. The board comprises of the three Officer Trustees (Sabbatical Officers) – President (who also is the Chair of the Board), Vice President Community and Welfare, and Vice President Education. Two students are appointed onto the board – One undergraduate (Jeffrey Arthur) and One postgraduate (Hameed Mozaffari). The Board have four external (independent to the RSU/University) trustees, who have a wealth of knowledge from different sectors – Our current external trustee's are Ian Robinson (Former Chief Executive of University of Bath Students' Union), Tess Willy (Former member of Roehampton staff and now Department Head at Kingston University), Tracey Ford (Founder of JAGS Foundation and Roehampton alumni) and Guy Drury (Former Chair of NUS Democratic Procedures Committee).
	The recent changes to the Students' Union Articles and Byelaws now give provision for an additional student representative to join Students' Union Council. The position is reserved for an elected officer (other than the Sabbatical Officers)
	The responsibilities of the RSU Part Time Officer Trustee include joining the other members of the board to ensure that the Union is sticking to a clear vision, mission and values. As well as ensuring alongside the other Trustee's that the Students' Union complies with all legal, financial and regulatory requirements.
	We have two individuals who have expressed interest in running — Following today's meeting of SUC, all elected officers will be invited to vote on their preferred candidate via a poll (link to be sent out shortly). The deadline to vote is Wednesday at 12noon and the elected individual will be announced at 3pm on Wednesday before the Students' Union closes for Christmas.

	Background In October 2016, the Students' Union and Jack De France (President 2016-2018) introduced the 'Ideas platform' as an additional layer to engaging students in the democratic processes of the Students' Union on top of General Meetings, Students' Union Council and RSU Elections.

In accordance to the Byelaws of Roehampton Students' Union, Ideas that reach the threshold of 1% of the student population (85 votes) and with 51 of those 85 being up votes will pass and will be taken to Students' Union Council at the earliest convenience for RSU Elected Officers to decide



whether to accept or reject the idea. If SUC decide to accept the idea, then it becomes official RSU policy and we are mandated to work on that idea.

As the ideas above have not reached the threshold to pass, the Byelaws of the RSU states that we should bring these ideas to SUC to discussion on whether we would like to adopt them as policy anyway. We shall now go through every policy, discuss them and decide whether we accept or reject them.
