The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS it has been represented to His Majesty at this Board, that the malignant and contagious Fever of the Nature of the Plague, which some Time since manifested itself at Philadelphia, in the State of Pennsylvania, and in certain Towns of the State of New Jersey, in the United States of America, has totally ceased; His Majesty taking the same into Consideration, and being desirous to remove all Restraints upon Trade, so far as may be consistent with the Safety of His Subjects, is pleased, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine laid, by His Majesty's Order in Council, bearing Date the Sixth Day of November, 1793, upon all Ships, Vessels, Persons, Goods, and Merchandize, arriving or to arrive from any of the Ports of the State of Pennsylvania, or of the State of Delaware, or of the State of New Jersey, in the United States of America, be taken off; and that all such Ships and Vessels be permitted to discharge their respective Ladings without unpacking, opening and airing, and without performing any Quarantine, as freely as they might have done in case such Order of the Sixth Day of November, 1793, had not been made, any Thing in the said Order contained to the contrary notwithstanding:— And the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the

Cinque Ports, the Master General of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors or Commanders in Chief of the Isles of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
